

ADDENDUM NUMBER NO. 2

Bidders are advised that bidding documents on the above-named project are amended as follows:

PRE-BID MEETING DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. As stated in the Pre-Bid Meeting, two bound copies of the bid and the required attachments shall be submitted, and one copy shall be submitted on a removable (flash) drive in pdf format. No unbound bids will be accepted. Acceptable methods of binding bids include spiral binding, staples, 3-ring binders, etc. Spring clips and paper clips are not acceptable.
2. The easements depicted on the drawings have been obtained by Peach County. The easement documentation and homeowner information for those homeowners affected by the work will be provided to the successful bidder by Peach County.
3. Twilight Drive may be closed by the Contractor for construction. The Contractor shall submit a detour plan to Peach County for approval prior to closing the road (to include proposed closure dates, sign types, detour route, and sign placement.) The road may be closed beginning 7 days following approval of the detour plan by Peach County.
4. A revised bid form is attached. Please use this bid form when submitting your bid. Changes from the previous bid form include:
 - a. A \$22,000 allowance has been added as Item #7c. This money may only be applied to the project following receipt of and approved change order.
 - b. The Units for Item 6a. Earthwork and Item 6b. Import Fill Soil have been revised to Lump Sum (this is a Unit Price contract). Please note that the Contractor is responsible for acquiring, providing, hauling, supplying, placing, and compacting fill soil needed for the project.
5. A staging area will be made available to the Contractor at the Peach County – Taylor’s Mill Road borrow pit, located approximately 6.2 miles from the construction site across Taylors Mill Road from 2629 Taylors Mill Road (Peach County Parcels 022 027 & 022 026). The Contractor must coordinate with Peach County prior to utilizing this property for staging. The County requires that the Contractor keep the gate to the borrow area closed and locked when not in use.
6. The successful bidder shall coordinate with the Peach County Engineering Department at 478-827-3531 for traffic control and road closures. If excessive vehicle speed is an issue at the work site, the contractor shall request that the Peach County Engineering Department contact the Peach County Sherriff’s office.
7. Any personnel working on Peach County Right-Of-Ways shall take appropriate safety precautions and shall wear ANSI Class 2 or Class 3 high visibility outer clothing at all times.
8. The Contractor shall coordinate with utility owners for temporary removal or relocation of utilities during and after construction as necessary.
9. No working hour restrictions have been imposed for this project.
10. Bids will be determined to be responsive only if all the requirements listed in the Instructions to Bidders (Section 00100) are met, including submittal of the Required Submittal Documentation and the Additional Information to be Submitted. Responsive bids will be scored per paragraph 17.4 of Section 00100, Instructions to Bidders.
11. A bid tabulation will be provided to all bidders following a decision by the Board of Commissioners to award the project.
12. All questions must be directed to Triple Point Engineering, Inc. in writing by 5:00 PM April 2, 2020. Bidders shall not contact Peach County employees regarding this project. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- Q1. What is the distance for the Fine Grading pay item along West Valley Drive?
- A1. On the west side of West Valley Drive, the Fine Grading pay item will include the area between Storm Inlet 8 and the first driveway culvert encountered in the existing ditch (approximately 20 L.F.) On the east side of West Valley Drive, the Fine Grading pay item will include the area between Storm Inlet 7 and a point along the West Valley Drive ditch located 5 feet upstream of the southernmost guy wire (approximately 30 L.F.). The purpose of the fine grading is to create a conveyance channel for water to enter the new storm inlets from the existing ditches that run parallel to West Valley Drive.
- Q2. On page 00100-2 It states Bidders must be General contractors in the State of Georgia. We bid a project a couple of months ago with Peach County and the accepted GDOT Certification and Utility Contractors license. Please clarify.
- A2. Per § 43-41-17. (d), "Any person qualified by the Department of Transportation to perform construction work on roads, streets, bridges, highways, sidewalks, or other grading, paving, or repaving projects; airport runways or taxiways; or railroads, and services incidental thereto, for the department shall not be required to be licensed under this chapter in order to perform any such work for the department or for any other owner requiring similar work to be performed. The general contractor division of the board, in agreement with the Department of Transportation, shall, by rule, define "services incidental thereto" for the purposes of this subsection only and shall likewise define any other necessary terms as to the scope of the exemption provided by this subsection." Therefore GDOT Certification in the areas outlined above and a Utility Contractors License will be accepted in lieu of a General Contractor's License.
- Q3. Will COVID-19 or a pandemic be adequate reason to delay the performance or progress of the work?
- A3. Yes, Article 12.03A of the Standard General Conditions states, "Delays beyond the control of Contractor shall include, but not be limited to, acts or neglect by Owner, acts or neglect of utility owners or other contractors performing other work as contemplated by Article 7, fires, floods, epidemics, abnormal weather conditions, or acts of God."
- Q4. The Class A Pavement Replacement is typically used for pipe road crossings. Is the intent to use this spec for such large areas?
- A4. The Class A Pavement Replacement (including the concrete patch) shall be used directly over the pipes as shown in the detail. If additional pavement needs to be replaced, Peach County's standard pavement section is 5" GABC compacted to 100% modified Proctor (ASTM D 1557) overlain by 2" of 9.5mm Superpave.
- Q5. Will this be a unit price contract or lump sum? If unit price what will the contractor need to furnish for payment of the earthwork quantities?
- A5. The Units for Item 6a. Earthwork and Item 6b. Import Fill Soil have been revised to Lump Sum (this is a Unit Price contract). Please note that the Contractor is responsible for acquiring, providing, hauling, supplying, placing, and compacting fill soil needed for the project.
- Q6. Should the trees be removed at the driveway at 1009 Beverly Road?
- A6. Yes, the two trees indicated on the attached photograph shall be removed.

- Q7. Do we have to submit the qualifications of Bidders with the bid?
- A7. Yes. In Section 00100, Instructions to Bidders, Paragraph 3.1 the following is stated, "To demonstrate qualifications to perform the work, each Bidder must submit with the Bid the following information:..."
- Q8. Is there any change in the bid submission procedure or we can just drop off the bid packet in-person before bid opening?
- A8. There is no change in the submission procedure. Arrange for delivery of bids per Section 00020 – Advertisement for Bids. Each bid must be stamped in; someone will be available at the office to receive and stamp the bids as they arrive. Bid delivery via carrier (UPS, FedEx, USPS, etc.) is acceptable as long as the bid is received by the time that it is due.
- "Closing date for Sealed Bids responding to Request for Bid (RFB) No. 20-003 shall be April 7, 2020 at 2:30 p.m. Bids will be opened in public without discussion on April 7, 2020 at 2:45 p.m. at the Peach County Board of Commissioner's Office, 213 Persons Street, Fort Valley, GA 31030. Bid amounts will not be released until the Board of Commissioners has awarded the project to the winning contractor."
- Q9. My ADS supplier just informed me they don't manufacture 54 inch HDPE or a 54 inch mitered end section. They go from 48 inch to 60 inch. How shall we proceed with the bid?
- A9. The plan does not specify ADS pipe, but it does specify 54-inch HDPE. Suitable substitutions for 54" HDPE will include 54" RCP and 54-inch Polymer Coated Steel Pipe with 10 mil polymer coated thickness (trenchcoat) on 14-gage pipe meeting GDOT specifications.
