Thank you for your letter of July 5 requesting approval to use Pedestrian-Actuated Rectangular Rapid-Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at uncontrolled marked crosswalk locations on a City-wide basis on City-maintained roadways throughout the City of Hanahan, South Carolina. Your request is made under the provisions of Section 1A.10 of the 2009 edition of the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways* and the Federal Highway Administration's Interim Approval memorandum (IA-21) dated March 20, 2018, for the optional use of RRFBs.

Your request is approved. This approval is granted for all locations where the City of Hanahan installs RRFBs under the technical conditions contained in IA-21. Per Paragraphs 20 and 21 of Section 1A.10, please inform the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) of the locations of such use and please check for any State laws and/or directives covering the application of the MUTCD provisions that might exist in the State of South Carolina. Please note installations on State roadways will require the approval of the SCDOT and they request that you follow SCDOT Traffic Guideline 33 for any new installations.

For recordkeeping purposes, we have assigned your request the following number and title: "IA-21.135 –Rectangular Rapid-Flashing Beacons at Crosswalks – Hanahan, South Carolina". Please refer to this number and title in any future correspondence.
