QUESTIONS:

1. Is there a project estimate available?

Answer: Yes. Refer to the RFB documents.

2. What is their rate of service?

Answer: \$43.00 per wet ton.

3. Where is their disposal location?

Answer: Main Office – 402 Line Creek Drive, Peachtree City, GA 30269.

ERTH Products Composting Facility is in Plains, GA.

4. Do they land apply?

Answer: Yes.

5. Are any bid tabs available?

Answer: A bid tab is provided with this addendum on the last page.

6. Are any sludge test results available? 503 regs? VAR tests?

Answer: Yes. See Attachment “A” and Attachment “B” provided with the RFB documents.

7. Please provide the monthly volumes for Shoal Creek and Northeast Plants for 2015 & 2016.

Answer: Approximate volumes - Northeast WRF = 337 wet tons/ Shoal Creek WRF = 231 wet tons.

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- 8. In regards to the 5% evaluation discount, would the County consider this to firms who propose beneficial reuse as a Class B material? If not, why only offer to Class A options?**

Answer: Class "A" only. It is CCWA's policy for beneficial reuse.

- 9. How many trailers are staged at each plant currently?**

Answer: Casey = 0, Northeast WRF = 1, Shoal Creek = 1.

- 10. Are yard dogs required by the proposer for each plant?**

Answer: No.

- 11. Has the Casey Plant pelletizer gone down in the last 2 years where trailers were required to haul the biosolids? If so, how many time and for how long?**

Answer: Yes. Recently for 2-4 weeks trailers were brought in to help process biosolids from the Water Reclamation Facility.

- 12. Where is the material going now, and who is the current vendor?**

Answer: ERTH Products Composting Facility is in Plains, GA.

- 13. What is the current price of the contract?**

Answer: Please refer to answer on question #2.

- 14. Who pays the tipping fees?**

Answer: Vendor.

- 15. How many trailers do you want on site and who moves the trailers around the yard?**

Answer: Answer: Casey = 0, Northeast WRF = 1, Shoal Creek = 1. However, there may be times when one is needed at Casey, which will require a trailer.

Each trailer is delivered and put under the chute by the contractor; CCWA will not move the trailer.

- 16. Please provide the actual monthly tonnage for each plant for 2015 & 2016.**

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- 17. Does the County have any analysis for fecal coli form or salmonella testing from each plant? If so, please provide.**

Answer: No.

- 18. Does the County have any analysis in regards to volatile solids reduction from each plant? If so, please provide.**

- 19. In regards to the 5% evaluation bid price discount, will the County also offer this to a bidder that is proposing beneficial reuse as a Class B land application program versus only a Class A option?**
