#### **INTRODUCTIONS / SIGN IN SHEET**

Eric Charest started the meeting at 2:00 with a request for those in attendance to announce their names and organizations represented, as well as for those calling in to do the same. After the brief introductions Eric Charest provided an overview of the Sector 3, Phase 2 Beach and Dune Restoration Project in accordance with the Pre-Bid agenda.

## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

<u>Phase 2</u> of the project entails a re-nourishment of approx. 2.9 miles of the southern section of the County's Sector 3 Beach and Dune Restoration Project via placement of about 280,000 cubic yards of beach-compatible sand fill and about 302,820 native dune plants. Construction shall occur between R-Monuments R-40 and R-55. The length of the original project has been reduced into two phases, Phase 1 and Phase 2. Sand fill is proposed to be obtained from either (a) the County's Offshore Borrow Area, or (b) an upland sand source pre-qualified by the County, and/or (c) an upland sand source separately approved by Florida Department of Environment Protection. To avoid adverse impacts to nesting sea turtles, construction is expected to be completed during the period from November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 and April 30, 2022.

#### PROJECT OVERVIEW DISCUSSION

 Review and comment with questions and clarification as soon as possible, no further comments 10 days prior to bid opening.

Eric Charest provided the schedule that no questions will be responded to if received after the Monday, August 30, 2021 cut-off date in accordance with the bid timeline.

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- Anticipated Bid Award in September.
- The Notice to Proceed tentative issuance is TDB
- Project must commence within 14 days of Notice to Proceed
- Contractor will need to comply with conditions and requirements of ALL permits.
- Work hours IRC work hours are from 7 AM to 5 PM. Night time operations, work on weekend or holidays will need approval from IRC.
  - If a Dredging operation is selected, it may necessitate 24 hours/day and 7days/week operations. Due to these types of operations some limitations may apply.

Eric Charest stated that even with if a dredge operation was selected as the contract award recipient, environmental restrictions would still apply such as the noise ordinance). Compliance with such restrictions would need to be further discussed at the pre-construction meeting with the County.

- Beach fill material must come from a permitted source.
- Non-compliant fill material placed on beach must be removed at Contractor expense
- Driveway, business and road access shall be maintained at all times
- The Contractor will only be permitted to close the beach in the area where sand placement work is being immediately performed or where equipment is operating/staging. Contractor shall be required to phase their work in such a manner to minimize impacts to local businesses and residents and maintain existing beach access.
- Regular communication between the Contractor, County and Consultant will be necessary to ensure minimal closure times to sections of the beach being restored.
- Contractor shall be responsible for removing any construction related debris by the end of each work day
- Maintenance of Traffic:
  - Contractor shall submit a Maintenance of Traffic Plan to the Indian River County Traffic Division for approval
  - The Maintenance of Traffic Plan shall meet the FDOT index 600, January 2018
     Edition and shall be signed and sealed by a Florida P.E.
- Late Season Sea Turtle Nesting and Nest Relocation:
  - Nests laid within the project are as of August 27, 2021 have been relocated to one of two locations (N or S of project area). Relocations will occur until nesting is complete.

Eric Charest explained further that sea turtle nests between R-Monument 40, 500' and R-48 were the only areas where the County was having sea turtle nests

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relocated, and therefore would need to be the area focused on by the successful contractor to start the nourishment project.

- Late Season Nest Monitoring will occur until all nesting is complete. Regular coordination with the County's Marine Turtle Permit Holder is necessary until all nest evaluations are complete.
- The Contractor is required to submit the Daily Reports by noon the following day to the County and Engineering Consultant. Failure to do so could result in work shutdown at the Contractor's expense.

Eric Charest added emphasis to the importance of adhering to the daily report submittal schedule, and that work shutdowns were a real possibility should the successful contractor not meet the report submittal deadlines.

### PROJECT TECHNICAL DISCUSSION - Nicole (APTIM)

- Project Construction Schedule
- Project Construction Access and Staging Areas (Map and Plans)

Nicole Sharp identified the 3 access points for the project as Wabasso Beach Park, Sea Grape Beach Access and Turtle Trail Beach Access.

- <u>Due to sea turtle nest relocations, all mobilization/work must begin from Wabasso Beach Park between R-40, 500' and R-48</u>
- Project Specifications (Surveys, Outfalls, Buildings, Limit of Fill, Daily Report)

Nicole Sharp stated that not all properties within the Sector 3 Phase 2 project area had signed easements allowing for the work to be performed on their property, and that the successful contractor would be responsible for not placing fill on those properties without a signed easement, as well as not traversing landward of the Erosion Control Line or Mean High Water Line on those properties.

Project SOW (Bid Items)

Nicole Sharp made note of all the requested bid submittal items that are required.

Sediment QA/QC Plan

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Nicole Sharp made note that the conversion factor from cubic yards to tons was a 1.5 multiplier.

#### **QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS**

- Q Based on the required daily submittals, how many truck haul tickets will need to be supplied by the sand supplier?
- A The County/Engineer will accept electronic tickets, with the Contractor being required to maintain an inventory of the tickets daily. Arrangements with requirements for the truck haulers to maintain tickets will be worked out between the contractor/sand source and truck hauler.
- Q Section 1.3 under Technical Provisions states a 150-day timeframe for project completion, yet the pre-bid meeting notes identifies a shorter, 130-day timeframe for final completion. Which one is correct?
- A 150 days
- Q If the contractor shuts down operations for recognized holidays, will the days be added to the end of the contract terms?
- A Please refer to Contract Specifications General Prevision GP 17.3 titled "Holidays".
- Q Contractors are aware of the recommencement phase for the incomplete Sector 3, Phase 1 project, and the demand on resources to complete that job (sand, trucks, etc.). Will the County allow for any additional time due to this?
- A The timeline set forth in the Sector 3, Phase 2 project is adequate to complete the project, even if competition for resources takes place.
- Q Will Saturday work be allowed?
- A Please refer to Contract Specifications General Prevision GP 17.1 titled "Upland Sand Source Project Time" or GP 17.2 "Offshore Sand Source Project Time".
- Q Contractors are aware of the prior bid in which the initial award was not accepted by the contractor, and the subsequent rebid which put a tight crunch on a timeframe for project completion. What actions does the County have in place to prevent this from occurring again?
- A Per Indian River County Purchasing Manual, Section 4.3, Award of Bid:
  Award Authority. A bid shall be awarded by written notice to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder. Awards exceeding \$75,000 shall be awarded by the Board. The Board is authorized to waive technicalities and irregularities and to reject any and all bids, or

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any portion of a bid. After an award is made, the Purchasing Manager shall issue a purchase order or a "Notice of Award" as applicable. If, within 60 days after bids are opened, or within such other time period specified in the bid documents, the bid of the lowest responsible and responsive bidder is withdrawn or not honored, the County may award the bid to the next lowest responsible and responsive bidder. After 60 days or such other time period specified in the bid documents, the Board may award to the next lowest responsible and responsive bidder only if the next lowest responsible and responsive bidder agrees, in writing, to extension of the bid price for the additional period of time. These processes may be repeated until an award is made to a responsible and responsive bidder.

Sections 00100 and 00310 of the bid documents require bidders to honor their bids for 90 days.

- Q- Where is the list of Pre-Approved Sand Sources?
- A- Pre-Approved sand sources are found in the FDEP Permit #0285993-009-JC for the project included in Appendix A of the bid document.

The pre-bid meeting ended at 14:28.

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#### BID 2021050 QUESTIONS RECEIVED THROUGH 08/27/2021

Q- In sections 16.5.2 and 12.5.2 it states "Unvegetated areas for pedestrian access across dunes shall be roped off by the CONTRACTOR to prevent trampling of plants. The CONTRACTOR shall furnish and install rope and wood posts at the expense of the CONTRACTOR."

#### What are the specs for the post and rope?

A- The wooden posts used to create the post and rope fencing shall be 4x4 posts and 7 feet in length. The posts shall be pressure treated southern pine #2, surfaced to be peeled and de-barked, or better. The minimum retention of the CCA shall be 0.40 pcf. All cuts and drill holes shall be treated according to AWPA standard M4-91.

The ropes between the fence posts shall be ¾ inch tan/beige polypropylene rope. The rope shall be heat treated to seal the ends and prevent the rope from becoming unraveled. Knots will be used to secure the ends of the ropes in the fence. Ropes established between fence posts will not sag, but will be taut, threaded through the one (1) inch holes drilled into the wooden posts. Ropes will be approximately parallel to the ground.
