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BID 2021050 QUESTIONS RECEIVED THROUGH 08/30/2021

- Q- **The contract drawings depict access corridors approaching the dredge borrow area. Please clarify whether these corridors are the only way for dredges to access the borrow areas or if alternate routes may be used to approach it?**
- A- *The access corridors shown on the plans have been permitted by the FDEP and USACE and are the only permitted and allowable corridors for dredges to access the borrow area.*
- Q- **What are the slope allowances/parameters for the dredge cut in the borrow area?**
- A- *All dredge operations must occur within the permitted boundary of the borrow area and not exceed limits provided within the plans. The specifications do not dictate the means and methods to be used by the contractor.*
- Q- **On Addendum 2, the last question submitted about the posts and rope and their specs. There is no information about how many posts and how much rope is needed, or how far apart the posts are to be placed, etc. Looking for clarification.**
- A- *Length and number of posts will be determined based on field conditions and coordinated with the County and Engineer. Fence posts shall not be more than 8 feet apart along each fence line. Fence posts shall be positioned to create an even spacing along the fence line*
- Q- **Will you accept a digitally signed bid bond?**
- A- *Indian River County does not yet have procedures in place to accept digitally signed bonds, however electronic notarizations, as authorized under F.S. is acceptable.*
- Q- **It has been brought to our attention that due to truck shortages in the current market we may not be able to make the production required to finish the project by April 30th. If this is the case will a time extension be provided by the county, or are there other options for completion of the project without the accrual of liquidated damages? Please advise.**
- A- *An expanded response to that issued in Addendum 2 under a similar question. It is anticipated that minimal resources will be required to complete the Sector 3 Phase 1 project. The sand for the Phase 1 project is already stockpiled and will not impact production for the Sector 3 Phase 2 project. The timeline set forth in the Sector 3, Phase 2 project is adequate to complete the project, even if competition for resources takes place.*
