PROPOSAL DROP-OFF AND PROPOSAL OPENING INSTRUCTIONS <u>Sewer System Evaluation Surveys</u>

PROPOSAL OPENING: Tuesday, September 22, 2020 at 2:00 P.M. local time

Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, the Clayton County Water Authority (CCWA) is currently closed for public bid/proposal openings; however, we are still working to serve our community, while following State and Local mandates, as well as taking all necessary precautions to stay safe and healthy during this crisis. For this reason, CCWA has issued the following bid/proposal drop-off and bid/proposal opening instructions:

PROPOSAL DROP-OFF for Proposal Opening Day, Tuesday, September 22, 2020:

Sealed proposals may be dropped off at our main office with the receptionist, located at 1600 Battle Creek Road, Morrow, GA 30260, on or before Tuesday, September 22, 2020 at 2:00 p.m. (local time). Any and all proposals received after this date and time will be considered unresponsive.

Masks are strictly enforced. Therefore, you must wear a mask if you will be dropping off your sealed proposal at our main office with the receptionist.

As an option, you may also drop your proposal package off at CCWA, Building B, located at 7340 Southlake Parkway, Morrow, GA 30260 (Building B-Warehouse which is on same campus as the main office). See attached map. When using this location, please keep in mind to press the gate call button to allow entrance. Do not follow the car in front of you to get through the gate, as the gate closes after each car. The gate call button looks like follows:



Once you hit the call button, please respond to the CCWA warehouse staff member with your name, company name and that you are dropping off your proposal. CCWA staff will activate the gate to open and you can proceed to the Building B - Warehouse to hand your proposal submittal package to a CCWA warehouse staff member.

Masks are strictly enforced. Therefore, you must wear a mask if you will be dropping off your sealed proposal at our Building B Warehouse.

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QUESTIONS:

1. Is it possible to obtain the plan holders list for the subject bid?

Answer: Vendor list is provided on page 7 of this Addendum.

2. Do you anticipate extending the bid due date?

Answer: No.

3. What additional details are you willing to provide, if any, beyond what is stated in bid documents concerning how you will identify the winning bid?

Answer: Refer to the RFP documents, Division 1 Section 2 – General Overview.

4. Was this bid posted to the nationwide free bid notification website at www.mygovwatch.com/free?

Answer: No.

5. Other than your own website, where was this bid posted?

<u>Answer:</u> The solicitation was also posted on the Georgia Procurement Registry, Vendor Registry, and the local newspaper (legal notices).

6. I'd like to confirm since there is no construction associated with this contract, that a contractors or underground license will not be required?

<u>Answer:</u> A Utility Contractors License is not required.

7. Page two of the spec book mentions no bonds are required, yet page 12 states a bid bond of 5% is required of any PW contract in excess of \$100,000. I'd like to confirm whether a bid bond is needed or not?

Answer: A Bid Bond is not required.

8. On Division 2, Section 4: Cost Proposal Form – Pay Item Schedule; Line Item #36, I/I Analysis Report, lists a quantity of 5. Does the County want I/I Analysis Reports monthly, or is the I/I Analysis Report done once at the end of the flow monitoring period? Please clarify.

<u>Answer:</u> The I/I Analysis Report is prepared once at the end of the Flow Monitoring Period.



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9. Will Clayton County make pricing available from the last time this Sewer System Evaluation project was bid?

Answer: See pages 8 – 10 of this Addendum.

10. To clarify, are the following documents all that is required for subcontractors? - The subcontractor affidavit and agreement form, the three SLBE forms, and summary resumes of key personnel. Is a W-9 only needed for the prime or sub-contractors as well?

<u>Answer:</u> Please refer to Division 2 Section 3 – Required Submittals. These requirements apply to the proposers (prime contractors).

11. Do you anticipate the majority of the dye floods involve plugging and filling storm sewers for cross connections?

<u>Answer:</u> Dye Flood Testing will be performed by introducing dye water into a storm sewer or drainage ditch to simulate a storm water runoff condition.

12. Page 2-1.2, Item 6. States "Unless otherwise requested, one (1) original and at least two (2) copies of the proposal Form need to be submitted". Please confirm all forms need to be submitted with the response as one (1) original and four (4 copies), (excluding the Cost Proposal Form, and the SLBE Forms).

<u>Answer:</u> One (1) original and four (4) copies of all required submittals must be provided, with the exception of the Cost Proposal Form and the SLBE forms, which need to be provided as one (1) original in a separate envelope.

13. Does the Vendor Information Form need to be included in the proposal response in addition to providing an email copy to the Procurement Department?

<u>Answer:</u> As part of the proposal process, the Vendor Information Form needs to be provided in the proposal response only.

14. Georgia Security and Immigration Compliance Act of 2006 form, Item A. "Contractor's fully executed affidavit is attached hereto as Exhibit ____ and is incorporated into this Agreement by reference herein." Please confirm the Exhibit reference of information will be filled in during the Agreement Stage?



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<u>Answer:</u> The Georgia Security and Immigration Compliance Act of 2006 must be completed, signed, and dated. The Exhibit reference can be completed during the Agreement state.

15. What is the smallest expected pipe in the study area?

<u>Answer:</u> 6-inch diameter.

16. Can the historical debris dumping information be provided to assist with cost analysis?

<u>Answer:</u> Historical debris dumping information is not available. Current contract work orders total 65,315 linear feet of Grease/Root Removal paid to date over three-year period.

17. What is the average dollar amount of a work order that will be released?

<u>Answer:</u> Average work order of current contract is \$79,000.

18. Will work orders be continuous so crew can move from one task to the next to minimize mobilizations?

<u>Answer:</u> All items in a Work Order do not necessarily have to be adjacent to each other, however it is the intent that each work order will be authorized as a part of a mobilization to a single, common geographic location.

19. It states that no access roads will be provided for sanitary sewers located in remote areas, which may eliminate the ability to clean. If location is outside of easement cleaning capabilities, will a CCTV inspection without cleaning be permitted? What if segments cannot be completed without cleaning?

<u>Answer:</u> Please refer to Division 4: Section 2 – Work Assignment and Payment, Item F for description of CCTV Only, No Cleaning.

20. Can the pricing for each line item of the current contract be provided?

<u>Answer:</u> See pages 8 – 10 of this Addendum.
