The following are a list of questions and responses that were submitted regarding the above-referenced RFP.

Question No. 1: As there was not a single audit in 2019 but there was in 2018, does the County expect a single audit to be required in 2020 and what are the major federal grants for 2020?

Response No. 1: The County does expect to have a single audit conducted for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. Some of the major federal grants the County has administered are the Operation Stonegarden Grant (DHS/FEMA), Emergency Management Salary Grant (DHS/FEMA), Public Transportation Grant (DOT), and Airport Grants (FAA).

Question No. 2: Have there been changes in federal or state grant sources as compared to FY18 or FY19?

Response No. 2: No, the funding sources have remained the same.

Question No. 3: Has there been turnover in financial management personnel in the last year?

Response No. 3: Yes, there have been personnel changes.

Question No. 4: What software applications are utilized for financial reporting, tax and fee collections, and grant compliance (if any)?

Response No. 4: The County uses Tyler Technologies, Inc. for our accounting system software.

Question No. 5: How long has the County utilized the software?

Response No. 5: The County began using this software in 2009.

Question No. 6: Are there any accounting software changes expected in future years.

Response No. 6: The County does not intent to change accounting software.

Question No. 7: Are any accounting functions outsourced to a third-party (ex: payroll)?

Response No. 7: No, the County does not outsource any accounting functions.

Question No. 8: How many auditors were onsite during field work for the prior year and how many weeks were they onsite?

Response No. 8: The County's contracted firm had four (4) members and approximately four (4) weeks on-site.

Question No. 9: Would you like us to include the certificate of insurance in the proposal, or upon contract award?

Response No. 9: The Certificate of Insurance must be submitted upon an award of a contract.
