- The anticipated Notice to Proceed (NTP) date for this project is **November 22, 2019**. However, Owner-initiated permit reviews by regulatory agencies are ongoing. NTP will not be issued to Contractor until approval of all owner-initiated permits.
- 5. Will the Owner/Engineer please confirm if there are any prevailing wage requirements for this job?
- The minimum wages to be paid on this project are governed by the Davis-Bacon Act. Refer to Specification 00 73 00 (Supplemental Conditions) for additional information regarding prevailing wage rate requirements.
- 6. Will the Owner/Engineer please clarify whether air inversion and steam curing is acceptable?
 It is beneficial/cost effective to the Owner especially for lining small diameter scope of works like this project.
- The preferred method of installation and cure for CIPP is inversion using hydrostatic head (water column) pressure and curing with heated, circular water. The use of air inversion/steam cure will only be considered on a case-by-case basis only. Contractor should not assume in preparation of their bid that the use of pressurized air/steam will be approved by the Owner/Engineer.

- 7. As we walk the job we have observed that the access through industrial establishments is physically blocked, locked up and our walk cannot be completed. Will the Owner/Engineer please clarify whether it is the Contractor's responsibility to sort out this matter or any assistance from the Owner/Engineer can be provided?
- Contractor is responsible for coordinating their site access with affected property owners.
