- 4. The bid schedule has no measurements on it and so I assume we have to add up the given lengths on the plans? Yes
- 5. Are the man hole depths known for this job? If so, can those be provided? The exact depths are not known; however, the majority are only slightly deeper than the diameter of the pipe.
- 6. Is steam curing allowed for this job? Yes
- 7. On page 7 under section 4.1 it states that the liner can contain either carbon or fiberglass reinforcement. Does that mean we have to have one or the other? Yes
- 8. Is there any flow data and previous inspection of the lines available? No
