The Board of County Commissioners of Curry County, State of New Mexico, has issued the following Addendum #3 to the Request for Proposals No. 2023/24-05 Virtual Reality Training Systems for the Sheriff's Department and Adult Detention Center.

Clarification Only: This addendum will need to be submitted with your RFP response.

1. Is there any flexibility in the requirement that the VR system support the rifle and shotgun models used by the agency? Or would TASER and handgun support be sufficient?

Submit the proposal as you normally would and include any exceptions from the scope of work on the exceptions form of the proposal package.

2. When the County states "allows the trainer to manipulate the scenario to elicit responses from the officer going through the scenario", is it sufficient to allow the trainer to configure some parameters (e.g. environment, subject appearance, etc.) before the VR scenario starts or is it a hard requirement that the trainer needs to be able to modify the scenario real-time while the trainee is going through the scenario?

Submit the proposal as you normally would and include any exceptions from the scope of work on the exceptions form of the proposal package.

3. The scope states the County is procuring two (2) VR systems, does that mean the county is only planning to buy two sets of VR hardware? How many sworn officers at the agency will be training with VR?

The County will procure as many units as the undisclosed budget will allow for. Curry County has 14 budgeted Patrol Deputy positions and 12 budgeted Court Deputy positions.

4. Does the workstation need to be a laptop or desktop? Is a tablet acceptable?

A tablet is acceptable.

5. What is the anticipated start date of this VR program?

The County's VR training program will begin as soon as the units arrive and training is received on their operation by the successful offeror.

6. Is the intention for this to be a standalone program/contract?

This will be a standalone program/contract.
