The purpose of this Addendum #01 to IFB 24-B0019 for Parallel LDM Water Transmission Main Phase 1 dated November 22, 2023, is to list the key points of discussion from the pre-bid meeting, provide the pre-bid meeting sign-in sheet, the SCIIP Contractor Pay Request Certification, and the Small Business Survey that is attached to and hereby made a part of this addendum.

- This project is being funded by the South Carolina Infrastructure Investment Program (SCIIP), which is administered by the South Carolina Rural Infrastructure Authority (RIA) and funded by Federal, State, and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
- All federal SLFRF and SCIIP requirements will apply.
- The deadline for completion is June 1, 2026.
- Liquidated damages are \$500.00 per day.
- This is a Unit Price contract.
- The Prime Contractor is responsible for 70% of the work.
- Work shall be conducted between 7:00a.m. to 7:00p.m. If necessary, some work may be conducted after 7:00p.m.
- All bidders must be registered and in good standing with the federal System for Award Management (SAM).
- Bidders shall base their bid prices on steel pipe. Other types of materials may be negotiated with the City after award, however there are no guarantees that the materials will be altered.
- Bid prices for alternates will have no bearing on the award of this contract.
- When the work of this contract enters Horry County and/or SCDOT jurisdictions, the awarded Contractor must obtain and/or maintain the proper permits, insurances, inspections, and licenses applicable to those jurisdictions.
- Davis-Bacon requirements will apply to this project, however payroll reporting is <u>not</u> required.
- Build America, Buy America requirements are **not** applicable to this project.
- Soils will require select fills throughout the work area. The City will provide 3rd party inspections for soil compaction, concrete, and asphalt.
- There are **no** DBE nor WBE requirements for this project.

All questions must be received by the Buyer, in writing, no later than 5:00P.M. on Tuesday, November 28, 2023. All addenda will be issued no later than 5:00P.M. on Tuesday, December 5, 2023. Bid submissions must be received by the Procurement Office prior to 2:00P.M. (local time) on Tuesday, December 12, 2023.

 - Exercise every precaution at all times for the prevention of accidents and the protection of persons (including employees) and property.
 - o Maintain at the construction office or other well-known place on the job site, all articles necessary for giving first aid to the injured and make standing arrangements for the immediate removal to a hospital or to a doctor's care those persons (including employees), who may be injured on the job site. In no case shall employees be permitted to work at a job site before the employer has made a standing arrangement for removal of injured persons to a hospital or doctor's care.
- 3. Davis-Bacon Wages: For projects using over \$10 million of SLFRF funds (SCIIP and/or local ARPA funds) or those that are funded in any part with federal, non-SLFRF funds where the Davis-Bacon Act and other related labor standards are required, then the whole construction project is subject to the applicable provisions of the Davis-Bacon Act, 40 USC 3141 3144 and 3146 3148, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations located at 29 CFR Part 5. All laborers and mechanics employed by contractors and subcontractors must be paid prevailing wages.
- **4. Debarment and Suspension:** In accordance with 2 CFR Part 180 and Treasury's implementing regulations at 31 CFR Part 19, SCIIP funds may not go to individuals or entities that are prohibited from doing business with the federal government. *Debarment status can be checked on the System for Award Management (SAM) website at www.sam.gov.*
