ITEM 2 - Questions Received from Potential Bidders

1. Will any additional clearances be needed besides what is needed to get a badge for entry? Such as Q-Clearance?

Answer: The instructions in the document advised bidders to contact badging office for instructions however I do not know of any additional requirements other than those stated. A Q clearance is not required.

2. Can a list of security requirements be provide?

Answer: See page 5 of the contract and section 1.1 of the project specifications

3. The documents state that the vault is traffic bearing. Can the road be closed at the vault during construction?

Answer: The road is not a city street but a gravel patrol road. NNSA has actually already closed it due to a culvert failure. This is the reason the site will have to be accessed thru the water plant site.

4. How long can the water line be shut down for water valve replacement?

Answer: The water can be shut off for the time necessary to do the project.

5. How far away are the valves that will be used to isolate the valve vault?

Answer: The south valve is approximately 1000', east 850' & north 500'.

6. How deep is the valve vault?

Answer: + 8'

7. Will contractor need to provide concrete testing?

Answer: No

8. Will city coordinate all material deliveries for material they purchase? (Pipe, Stone, Concrete, etc.)

Answer: Yes

9. Will City Pay for the One Day Training needed to garner Contractor Badges with Y-12, and if they will not how much will the class cost the contractor per person or season.

Answer: There is no charge from DOE for the training. There is not a separate pay item for personnel cost associated with training.
