RESOLUTION NO. 22-190

A RESOLUTION AWARDING THE BID FOR MEDICAL ARTS BUILDING RENOVATION TO FINISHING SOLUTIONS, L.L.C. IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$549,612 AND PER UNIT PRICING FOR A TERM OF ONE YEAR

FINDINGS:

- 1. Bids for Medical Arts Building Renovation were received and opened on September 5, 2022.
- 2. The Project Engineer has recommended award to the lowest bid meeting specifications from Finishing Solutions, L.L.C., in the amount of \$529,612.00 for the Base Bid Total, which includes reroofing the clearstory roof, reroofing the low slope roof with a PVC membrane system, and renovation of the exterior wall. The Project Engineer has also recommended acceptance of Alternate No. 2 in the amount of \$20,000 for a structural retrofit roof sub-framing system over the upper clearstory roof and acceptance of unit pricing for removal and replacement of any existing damaged wall sheathing in the amount of \$145 per sheet.
- 3. City Council finds that the lowest responsible bid was submitted by A Finishing Solutions, L.L.C.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORANGE BEACH, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the bid for Medical Arts Building Renovation, as specified by the bid documents, is awarded to Finishing Solutions, L.L.C., for the Base Bid Total and Alternate No. 2 in an amount not to exceed \$549,612.00 with unit pricing for removal and replacement of any existing damaged wall sheathing at \$145.00 per sheet when needed as determined by the Project Engineer;
- 2. That the City Council authorizes the Mayor and City Clerk to execute and attest, respectively, a contract between the City of Orange Beach and Finishing Solutions, L.L.C., subject to final review by the City Attorney; and
- 3. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
