Clarification of Contract Documents and Specifications:

The following are responses to questions received from potential bidders:

Questions

1) During a site visit for the subject project we noticed there's evidence of recent geotechnical borings. Will the City provide a copy of the Geotechnical Report for this project during the solicitation so we may consider that information in our response?

We plan to select the team based on their experience and qualifications. The answers to this questions should not affect who you select for your team.

- 2) In the scope of services, it is mentioned that the engineering services will provide designs for repairing the greenway, riparian repairs, habitat restoration and permits. With as broad of a scope as this is, are there any particular issues of focus, or immediate concerns that need to be addressed?
 See answer to question #1. The repair priorities will be determined by the selected team and city staff.
- 3) As a minority, woman-owned small business, we will likely be sub-contracting out certain services. How would you like us to address this in our letter of intent? We want to make sure to provide all of the information you require, without overburdening you with unnecessary details.

Any information that you believe is pertinent should be presented within the limits of your proposal.

- 4) Can the City provide the locations of all the required repairs along the greenway section?See answer to question #1.
- 5) Can the City define 'habitat restoration' as it applies to this project in order to better define the type of habitat the design is focused on? Is this referring to instream structures for aquatic habitat?
 It is habitat improvements that complement and come secondary to the stream bank stabilization work.
- 6) What type of construction support services will be required from the consultant? Is the City providing any construction observation and inspections services inhouse (for example compaction testing, etc.) that are not required to be considered by the consultant?

The City has construction inspection staff. The consultants are retained for advisory support through construction for submittal review and to be available for questions that arise in the field.

- 7) Are public or stakeholder input meetings required by the City as part of the project?At this time, no.
- 8) Are surveying services to be provided by the consultant in addition to engineering design?Yes.
