The EO minimum wage rate will be adjusted annually. 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WELDERS - Receive rate prescribed for craft performing operation to which welding is incidental.

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Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

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The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

#### Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or "UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing

this classification and rate.

#### Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

#### Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

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#### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

**PRE-BID MEETING MINUTES**

**GENERAL**

The Pre-Bid Meeting for the above-mentioned project was held at the Moccasin Bend WWTP on Wednesday, July 27, 2016. An attendance list with names, company affiliation, and phone numbers is attached for reference. During the meeting, the following subjects were covered.

**DISCUSSION TOPICS**

1. Introductions – Members of the project team were introduced. This project is a Consent Decree project and is being funded through SRF loans.
2. Bid Opening Date and Time: August 18, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. (changed in Addendum No. 1)
3. Planned Addendum
  - a. Addendum No. 3 will be issued after this meeting and will include minutes from this meeting as well as updated wage rates.
4. Instructions to Bidders (Section 00 21 13)
  - a. Questions during bidding directed to City Purchasing Department
  - b. Bid Forms – Specification Division 00
    - ◆ Preferred Equipment / Pre-negotiated Allowances – Refer to Bid Forms for pre-negotiated equipment allowances and for list of base bid manufacturers for certain equipment. Refer to Section 01025 for descriptions of Bid Form items.
    - ◆ Temporary Bypass Pumping / Piping – Temporary bypass pumping, or temporary bypass piping, will be required to divert flows for replacing the EQ Pump Station discharge piping. As described in Section 01025 and other Specification Sections, the Contractor shall select either bypass pumping or bypass piping, and fill in the items noted on the Bid Form.
    - ◆ The Bidder's identification information in Section 00 45 97 will need to be filled out in its entirety as required in the Instructions to Bidders, and shall be affixed to the outside of the sealed bid envelope. If the Bidder's identification information is not affixed to the outside of the sealed envelope, the bid will not be opened.
  - c. SRF Requirements (Section 00 30 00, Section 00 80 00, and other Division 00 Specifications) – These requirements include the American Iron and Steel requirements.
    - ◆ Prevailing Wage Rates – Section 00 80 00 – The wage rates will be updated through addendum.
5. Bonds and Insurance
  - a. Bid Security – Section 00 43 13
  - b. Bonds – Performance and Payment – Sections 00 61 13.13 and 00 61 13.16
  - c. Insurance – Sections 00 72 00 and 00 73 00



6. Agreement (Section 00 52 00)
  - a. Schedule
    - ◆ Substantial Completion 480 days after Notice to Proceed
    - ◆ Final Completion 540 days after Notice to Proceed – This deadline is based on the regulatory deadline in the Consent Decree.
7. Permits Provided by City – Appendix A – City has received TDEC/SRF approval; NOI is still in progress and Contractor will assume control during construction; City Building Department review is in progress (Contractor to obtain and pay for permits during construction).
8. SWPPP – Appendix B
9. Geotechnical Information – Appendix C
10. Summary of Work – Section 01010
  - a. Summary of Work Elements
  - b. Work hours – 7:00am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday, limited to 40 hours per week, except where otherwise specified, as noted in the Contract Documents.
  - c. Coordination of work with other projects
    - ◆ Other projects that will be ongoing during the Secondary Clarifier Upgrades project including rehab improvements to the primary clarifiers and the grit detritors. The primary clarifier rehab project is expected to start in October 2016 with a duration of one year. The grit detritor rehab project is expected to start approximately two months after the start of the Secondary Clarifier Upgrades project with a duration of one year.
    - ◆ Contractor for Secondary Clarifier Improvements project will be expected to coordinate maintenance of operations, shutdowns, bypass pumping operations, etc. with activities of other ongoing projects as specified.
11. Progress Meetings & Construction Schedules – Sections 01200 and 01300
  - a. This project is a Consent Decree Program project and is subject to strict deadlines. Project will have to be completed in the time allowed.
12. Shop Drawings – Section 01300
13. Maintenance of Utility Operations During Construction – Section 01520
  - a. A summary of major constraints specified in Section 01520 was reviewed. Generally, the overhead power and communication lines will be relocated before starting work on the new Chlorine Contact Tank No. 7 and the new Secondary Clarifiers Nos. 15 and 16 and RAS Pump Station. The new Dechlorination Facility will need to be operational before the existing Dechlorination Facility can be removed and construction can start on Chlorine Contact Tank No. 7.
  - b. Temporary bypass pumping / piping
  - c. Temporary electric / generator – Some temporary power may be needed to maintain operation of plant facilities to meet the specified constraints.
