Questions Received

1. How does the City want to manage closure of the road?

The road may be closed for the duration of the project since there are two paths to exit the neighborhood on each end. Refer to Scope section “Traffic Control”. Submit to City traffic control with locations of signage and barriers but maintain residents’ access to their driveways and homes.

2. How deep is the sewer line?

The sewer line running along the middle of the street is approximately 8 ft. below grade and should pose no interference to the new work. Contractor to notify City Staff if there is any impact during excavation. Refer to “General Provisions-G” and Scope section “Excavation and Shoring”.

3. Is the waterline running parallel to the road on the northeast side going to be in the way?

Waterline is believed to be located at a depth of approximately 3 feet and running over top of the current CMP drain pipes and parallel to the northeast curb of Hollywood Blvd. Contractor to verify location and work around existing line carefully. Refer to “General Provisions-G” and Scope section “Excavation and Shoring”.

4. How far should the new pavement extend?

Extent of pavement replacement may be to existing utility cuts. See Scope section “Pavement and Concrete Restoration” paragraph A.

5. The scope shows one section of sidewalk to be replaced. There appears to be another section on the southwest side; should we replace that section too?

Yes. Scope section “Pavement and Concrete Restoration” paragraph B should read TWO sections of sidewalk. See Figure 2 schematic to see sidewalk on southwest side of road.

6. Can we use 14 gauge Aluminum CMP?

Yes, as long as it conforms to the ASTM specification in Scope section "CMP Piping".
