Page 12, Section 2.21 LOCAL PREFERENCE is not applicable to this proposal. Please strike this section.

~~For all competitive solicitations in which objective factors are used to numerically evaluate the responses from vendors by the selection committee, and price is one of several of the criteria for award among otherwise qualified vendors, where a non-local business is the highest ranked proposer and the ranking of a local proposer is within five (5%) of the ranking obtained by the non-local proposer, the highest ranked local proposer (within 5%) shall have the opportunity to proceed to negotiations with the City upon approval of such ranking by the City Commission (or staff if the award does not need commission approval). If the City determines that it is, in its sole and exclusive discretion, unable to negotiate an acceptable contract, then it shall proceed to negotiate with the next highest ranked proposer, whether local or non-local.~~

~~The City has the sole discretion in determining whether a business meets the criteria to~~

~~qualify for a local business preference and reserves the right to revoke this preference at any time if the City determines the business no longer meets the following criteria:~~

- ~~(a) The principal place of business is located in the City of Parkland; and~~

Questions/Clarifications and Answers:

The following question(s) (shown in italicized text) were submitted by prospective proposer(s). The City's responses are presented here (shown in bold text). The submitters' names and email addresses have been removed due to privacy requirements.

1. *Section 2.23 has a local preference clause in it. Given that this contract is being procured with the intention that federal funds will be utilized, can the City confirm that there will be no local/geographical preference for this solicitation in accordance with 2 CFR 200.319(b) which prohibits the use of in-state or local geographic preferences in the evaluation of bids or proposals?*

That is correct, the local preference section is not applicable due to the requirement of 2 CFR 200.319(b).

2. *Can the City clarify if this paragraph was meant to be included with the solicitation?*

" 2.1.3 SOLID WASTE CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL REQUIREMENTS FOR BIDDING JOBS IN THE CITY OF PARKLAND The City of Parkland has an exclusive solid waste franchise agreement with Waste Management, Inc. of Florida for the collection and disposal of all solid waste including construction and demolition (C & D) debris as defined within Florida Statutes Chapter 403. All applicants for bids to perform construction work for the City of Parkland shall be subject to the requirements found in the City's exclusive solid waste franchise agreement and must contract with Waste Management for the collection and disposal of all construction and demolition debris generated at such construction job sites."

This solicitation is not a construction contract and wanted to verify that it would not apply to this procurement and resulting contract?

Correct. This provision is part of our general conditions and was left in the RFP in the event demolition debris collection was needed resulting from a natural disaster.

3. *Schedule 2. Unit Rate Price Schedule Item #3 – Can the City clarify if the Debris Removal from Canals/Waterways is intended to be removed with equipment that has to go in the waterway or equipment that can remove it from land and reach into the waterway?*

The City does not have a preference of land or water based equipment, so long as the work can be properly performed.

4. *Is there a bid bond that is required for this bid?*

A bid bond is not required for this proposal. However, the City requires Performance and Payment Bonds prior to award.

5. *Please provide the current contract pricing for disaster debris management and removal services.*

Please see the attached fee schedule from the current contract.

6. *“How many other contracts does your firm have in the Southeast United States?” Can the City clarify what the Southeast United States entails?*
