STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

IN ORDER TO SUBMIT A RESPONSIVE BID, IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS, SPECIFICATIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS ARE READ THOROUGHLY.

Bid response envelopes shall be properly identified on the front with the invitation to bid number, opening date and time. Each individual invitation to bid shall be submitted in a separate sealed envelope. Multiple bid responses submitted in the same envelope/courier package (that are not in separate envelopes properly identified) shall be rejected. The Purchasing Department assumes no responsibility for late bid responses that occur due to the U.S. Postal Service or private courier service.

Bid responses and signature page must be submitted, on this form, in ink or typewritten, or the bid will be rejected.

For a "no-bid" response, return the signature page signed and marked "no bid". Non-response may result in removal from active bidders list.

The attached specifications are being provided to potential bidders as guidelines that describe the type and quality of equipment, supply, and/or service the City of Decatur is seeking to purchase. The bidder must indicate compliance or list exceptions to each specification item for consideration. Failure to comply with this provision could be cause for rejection of the bid.

Descriptive Literature: Reference to brand names and numbers is not restrictive, unless otherwise specified. Bids on equivalent items meeting the standards of quality indicated will be considered, providing the bid clearly describes the item offered and indicates how it differs from the referenced brands. Descriptive literature on any supplemental information necessary for comparison purposes shall be submitted with the bid or the Purchasing Agent may reject the bid for that item. Reference to literature submitted with a previous bid, or on file with the Purchasing Department will not satisfy this requirement.

Bid responses must be received in the office of the Purchasing Department not later than the date and time specified.

The Purchasing Department cannot accept fax or e-mail transmissions of bids.

Changes or modifications of this Invitation to Bid are allowed only by written authority of the Purchasing Agent.

Non Appropriation of Funds: Continuation of any agreement between the City of Decatur and a bidder beyond a fiscal year is contingent upon continued legislative appropriation of funds for the purpose of this bid and any resulting agreement. Non availability of funds at any time shall cause any agreement to become void and unenforceable and no liquidated damages shall accrue to the City as a result. The City will not incur liability beyond the payment of accrued agreement payment.

The City of Decatur reserves the right to modify all or any portion of this Invitation to Bid when the best interest of the City is involved.

The City of Decatur is exempt from all Federal, sales and use taxes.

When required, bidders shall furnish a bid bond of 5% of the total bid on any bid of \$10,000 or more. The Bid Bond may be in the form of either a Cashiers Check or a Bid Bond. The bid bond may be set aside on bids for sale of certain standard manufactured products that are readily available from multiple sources. (See Price Sheet)

All bidders shall maintain such insurance as will protect bidder and the City of Decatur from claims under Workman's Compensation Acts and from claims for damage and or personal injury, including death, which may arise from the operation and/or fulfillment of the resulting contract of this Invitation to Bid. Insurance shall be written by companies authorized to do business in Decatur, Alabama. Evidence of insurance shall be furnished to the City of Decatur Purchasing Department with submitted bids when requested.

Any individual, company, or corporation doing business with the City of Decatur must possess and show proof thereof all proper licenses and/or proper certifications required by Federal, state and local statutes and regulations prior to award. Any project valued at \$50,000 or more involving permanent improvement to a structure must comply with Code of Alabama §34-8-8.

The City of Decatur reserves the right to terminate any contract resulting from this bid for just and reasonable cause whereby it appears to be in the best interest of the City.

Any alterations, deletions, additions or other changes that materially change the intent of the bid could be considered grounds for rejection of the bid response.'

The successful bidder agrees, by entering into this contract, to defend, indemnify, and hold the City of Decatur harmless from any and all causes of action or claims of damages arising out of or related to bidder's performance under this contract.

Section 34-8-1

Definitions.

(a) For the purpose of this chapter, a "general contractor" is defined to be one who, for a fixed price, commission, fee, or wage undertakes to construct or superintend or engage in the construction, alteration, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, remediation, reclamation, or demolition of any building, highway, sewer, structure, site work, grading, paving or project or any improvement in the State of Alabama where the cost of the undertaking is fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or more, shall be deemed and held to have engaged in the business of general contracting in the State of Alabama.

(b) For the purpose of this chapter, a "general contractor" is defined to include one who, for a fixed price, commission, fee, or wage exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000), undertakes to construct, superintend the construction of, repair, or renovate, any swimming pool, and anyone who shall engage in the construction, superintending of the construction, repair, or renovation of any swimming pool in the State of Alabama, where the cost of the undertaking exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000), shall be deemed and held to have engaged in the business of general contracting in the State of Alabama and shall be subject to this chapter.

(c) For the purpose of this chapter a "subcontractor" is defined to be one who constructs, superintends, or engages in the construction, alteration, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, remediation, reclamation, or demolition of any building, highway, sewer, structure, site work, grading, paving, or project or any improvement in the State of Alabama where the cost of the undertaking is fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or more under contract to general contractor as defined in subsection (a) or another subcontractor. *(Acts 1935, No. 297, p. 721, §1; Code 1940, T. 46, §65; Acts 1959, No. 571, p. 1429, §1; Acts 1989, No. 89-648, p. 1278, §1; Acts 1996, No. 96-640, p. 1013, §1; Acts 1997, No. 97-270, p. 486, §1; Act 2003-142, p. 441, §3; Act 2009-725, p. 2168, §1.)*

Section 34-8-8

Copy of chapter to be included in plans of owners, architects, and engineers; inclusion of license number on bid.

(a) All owners, architects, and engineers preparing plans and specifications for work to be contracted in Alabama pursuant to this chapter shall include in their invitations to bidders, including but not limited to all public and private advertisements, and their specifications a copy of this chapter or the portions thereof as are deemed necessary to convey to the invited bidder, whether he or she is a resident or nonresident of this state and whether a license has been issued to him or her or not, the information that it will be necessary for him or her to show evidence of license before his or her bid is considered. Any person including an owner, architect, or engineer who violates this section shall be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor and shall for each offense of which he or she is convicted be punished, fined, or both, in accordance with Sections 13A-5-7 and 13A-5-12.

(b) All owners, architects, and engineers receiving bids pursuant to this chapter shall require the person, firm, or corporation to include his or her current license number on the bid. The owner, architect, and engineer shall reject all bids that do not contain the current license number of the general contractor submitting the bid. All persons who violate this subsection shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and shall for each offense for which he or she is convicted be punished, fined, or both, in accordance with Sections 13A-5-7 and 13A-5-12. *(Acts 1935, No. 297, p. 721; Code 1940, T. 46, §79; Acts 1959, No. 571, p. 1429; Acts 1996, No. 96-640, p. 1013, §1.)*

SPECIAL TERMS:

Any questions regarding these specifications or work to be performed shall be directed to Mr. Paul Floyd, Decatur Parks & Recreation, by calling (256) 341-4761, or emailing your questions to pfloyd@decatur-al.gov.

The Contractor will be responsible for all work performed, any repairs to equipment and any damages caused to City property or a citizen's personal property/vehicles; this includes, but is not limited to: broken car windows, broken windows at a place of business, any slung rock related accidents, any accidents caused by the tractors or mowing equipment and accidentally mowing over items that aren't suppose to be cut. These incidents shall also be reported to Parks & Recreation Department.

Equipment will comply with all safety regulations while mowing (such as flashing lights, reflector signs, etc.) The contractor is responsible for establishing mowing zones, signs, etc. in place, where mowing is being done. Contractor is responsible for ensuring that the roadway is clear of excessive cut grass/debris within 24 hours of mowing. Contractor shall perform their work in a manner that the traveling public safety is not compromised. Contractor's proposal to use subcontractors shall be presented to the project manager and approved before proceeding with such agreements.

The Decatur Parks & Recreation Department will approve mowing/cutting prior to each start. Contractor will notify the City representative weekly of areas to be worked. In the event that excessive rain occurs or some other natural event occurs that keeps this work from being performed, the Contractor must report this delay to the Parks & Recreation Department and work must be re-scheduled immediately after the natural event has ended or within a reasonable amount of time has passed to resume mowing/cutting.

If any areas cannot be mowed due to non-weather reasons, such as large obstacles or damage to terrain, these items should be reported to the Parks & Recreation Department. Small obstacles in the way of mowing shall be removed by Contractor to continue mowing/cutting.

Contractor will be notified in writing of any work that is deemed unacceptable and shall have 72 hours to remedy the deficiencies. In the event that Contractor fails to do so, the City will have the right to terminate the contract, cease all payments to Contractor, and contract with the next low bidder.

AWARD:

Bidder may submit prices for one or more line items listed on the "Price Sheet". Bid award will be based on individual line items, or total bid, whichever is deemed to be in the best interest of The City.

Proposals will be considered only from those contractors who regularly perform the type of services described in the scope of work and who are financially responsible and have the necessary equipment and facilities required by this proposal to provide said services and to meet the standards as stipulated in these documents. The City of Decatur may request information substantiating the above requirements. Failure to provide such information may result in the bid being considered non-responsive. It is understood that the right is reserved by the City of Decatur to thoroughly inspect and investigate the establishment, facilities, equipment, business reputation, and other general qualifications of any contractor and to reject any bid irrespective of bid prices, if it shall be administratively determined.

CONTRACT TERM:

The term of this agreement will commence from the date the council awards this contract, for a period of 1 year, with the option to renew for 2 additional 1-year periods, provided the terms of the contract do not materially change.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

The Contractor will be responsible for any damage caused by the contractor, its employees or equipment while engaged in this contract. Bidder must be covered by Workman's Compensation Insurance, and Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and a general aggregate limit of at least \$2,000,000.

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS:

Successful bidder shall indemnify and hold harmless the City of Decatur, its officers, agents and employees from:

1. Any claims, damages, costs and attorney fees for injuries or damages arising, in part or in whole, from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Contractor, its officers, employees and/or agents, including its sub or independent contractors, in connection with the performance of the contract, and.
2. Any claims, damages, penalties, costs and attorney fees arising from any failure of contractor, its officers, employees and/or agents, including its sub or independent contractors, to observe applicable laws, including, but not limited to, labor laws and minimum wage laws.

Right-of-Way mowing includes all Right-of-Ways, Holding or Retention Ponds & Ditches listed at the locations below.

Frequency of mowing is once a month for the period between April 1st & October 31st. This equals to 7 mows in a calendar year. The cost of each mowing per acre or per liner foot shall remain the same. The City also reserves the right to add/modify/delete work sites and/or specific services.

The contractor shall mow the ROW's down to a height of five to six inches, so that line of site will not be compromised in any area.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR HAND DITCHES/ISLANDS/GUARDRAILS

Price Sheet Line No. 2

Hand Ditches are ditches that require weedeating. They are generally too small for use of a mower and mostly can only be correctly mowed by hand using weed eaters or other hand mowing tools.

Frequency of cutting is expected to be 3 times/rounds during the period between April 1st & October 31st. The City reserves the right to increase or decrease the number of cuttings in a given year for any reason.

Herbicides should be used at the locations NOT marked by ***. An Aquatic Glyphosate Isopropylamine must be used in Ditches and non-aquatic Glyphosate can be used on Concrete Islands and guardrails. DO NOT Spray Herbicides at locations marked by ***.

Alley cutting requires cutting back all underbrush that has grown over the City Alley property and weedeating/mowing any grass that may be along fence lines or in the middle of the alley road way. Handsaws, Chainsaws, Pole Saws, Laupers may be used to cut underbrush and weedeaters and mowers may be used to cut grasses. The Contractor is NOT responsible for maintenance of the alleyway gravel road or trash leftover from garbage pick-up.

Frequency of cutting is expected to be 1 time/round during the period between November 1st & February 28th. The City reserves the right to increase or decrease the number of cuttings in a given year for any reason.
