Sealed bids subject to the <u>General Terms and Conditions</u> of this Formal Bid Invitation to Bid, and any other data attached or incorporated by reference. Bids will be received in the Union County Finance Office until the date and time specified above and at that time publicly opened and read aloud.

The Bid envelope must show the Bid Number, Name and Opening Date

Bid documents must be completed in ink or typed, signed in ink, and free from alterations, erasures or mark-throughs.

SECTION 1 - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1.1 <u>ALTERATIONS OR AMENDMENTS</u>: Alterations, amendments, changes, modifications or additions to this solicitation shall not be binding on Union County without prior written approval.
- **1.2 NO CONTACT POLICY**: After vendor receives a copy of this bid, any contact initiated by any vendor with any Union County representative, other than the Finance Department, concerning this invitation for bid is prohibited and agreements made thereto will not be considered binding on Union County. Any such unauthorized contact may cause the disqualification of the bidder from this procurement transaction.
- 1.3 <u>QUESTIONS</u>: Any questions concerning the bid document must be submitted to <u>purchasing@ucps.org</u> no less than ninety-six (96) hours before bid opening date.
- 1.4 BID STAMP: The bid/time stamp in the Union County Finance office will be the time of record.
- 1.5 <u>TAXES</u>: Union County is not liable for Federal excise or State sales tax. Tax exemption certificates will be provided upon request.
- 1.6 <u>CONFLICT OF INTEREST</u>: If requested by the Director of Finance, vendors must complete and submit a "Conflict of Interest Affidavit Statement" prior to contract award, see T.C.A. 5-14-114 and T. C. A. 12-4-101.
- 1.7 NON-COLLUSION: Vendors, by submitting a signed bid, certify that the accompanying bid is not the result of, or affected by, any unlawful act of collusion with any other person or company engaged in the same line of business or commerce, or any other fraudulent act punishable under Tennessee or United States law.
- 1.8 NON-DISCRIMINATION: Vendors, during the performance of this contract, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, sex, national origin or disability except where religion, sex, national origin or disability is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the contractor.
- 1.9 SAME AS OR EQUIVALENT TO: Vendors are to bid as specified herein or propose an approved equal. Determination of equality is solely Union County's responsibility. The designated brands are for reference purpose only, not a statement of preference. When an alternate manufacturer, brand, model or make is bid, Union County will determine if the item bid does meet or exceed the items as specified. If the bidder does not indicate that an alternate manufacturer, brand, model or make is being bid, it is understood that the item(s) bid are the same manufacturer, brand, model or make as was requested in the Invitation to Bid. Comparable products of other manufacturers will be considered if proof of comparability is contained in the bid. It shall be the responsibility of the vendors, including vendors whose product is referenced to furnish upon request catalog pages, brochures or other data as will provide an adequate basis for determining the quality and functional capabilities of the product offered. Failure to provide this data may be considered valid justification for rejection of bid.
- **1.10 MULTIPLE BIDS/AWARDS:** Union County will consider multiple bids that meet specifications. Bid awards may include multiple approved vendors and the list of approved vendors may be added to or deleted from at anytime.
- 1.11 STATE OF TENESSEE CONTRACTORS' LICENSE LAW (T.C.A. 62-6-119 b): No bid will be opened or considered for which the total cost of the project is twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) or more, unless the outside of the sealed bid envelope/package containing the bid provides the following information: the Company Name, the Contractor's license number, license classification, the date of the license expiration and that part of each license classification applying to the bid. In addition, each heating ventilation or air conditioning, plumbing and electrical subcontractor's license number, date of the license expiration and that part of each classification applying to the bid if the value of the work is \$25,000 or greater, must be notated. If the value of either the contractor or the subcontractor's work is less than \$25,000, the bid envelope/package containing the bid is to be notated with the phrase "Contractor or Subcontractor's Bid is Less than \$25,000" after each appropriate heading. In the case of joint ventures, each party submitting the bid must provide this information. If no subcontractors are being used, the outside of the envelope/package containing the bid must state, "No Subcontractors are being used on this project."
- 1.12 ACCEPTANCE: Vendors shall hold their price firm and subject to acceptance by Union County for a minimum period of sixty (60) working days from the date of the bid opening, unless otherwise indicated in their bid. to be supplied,

their conformity with specifications, their suitability to the requirements of Union County and the delivery terms. Any or all bids may be rejected for good cause.

- **1.13 BID AWARDS:** Bids will be awarded to the lowest and best bidder, taking into consideration the qualities of the articles to be supplied, their conformity with specifications, their suitability to the requirements of Union County and the delivery terms. Union County also reserves the right to not award this bid.
- 1.14 PROTEST: Any vendor wishing to protest the bid award shall notify in writing the Union County Director of Finance, 300 Main Street, Maynardville TN 37807. No protest will be accepted, except those protests made in writing and received within (10) ten calendar days of the bid award. Protests must be in writing and envelopes/package containing protest must be clearly marked with bid number and words "BID PROTEST". The Director of Fianance, in conjunction with the Finance Committee, and with the advice and counsel of the County Attorney, shall review and make a final decision as to any bid protest. Appeals shall be filed in the Circuit or Chancery Courts of Union County within sixty (60) days of the final decision.

VENDORS PLEASE NOTE: UNION COUNTY WILL NOT STOP THE PURCHASE PROCESS. THE PURCHASE MAY BE COMPLETED OR THE PROJECT MAY BE RE-BID WHILE THE PROTEST PROCEDURE IS STILL IN OPERATION. IF A RE-BID IS MADE, THE PROTESTING VENDOR SHOULD SUBMIT A NEW BID. OTHERWISE, THEY WILL BE WITHOUT A BID ON THE RE-BID. FURTHER, THE RE-BIDDING WILL NOT END THE APPEALS PROCESS. IT WILL CONTINUE UNTIL A FINAL DECISION IS REACHER OR THE COMPLAINANT WITHDRAWS THE APPEAL.

- **1.15 DELIVERY:** Bid pricing is to include complete supply and delivery to Union County, Tennessee. Vendors are to state the delivery time in the bid. Union County requires that vendors deliver all products "free on board" to final destination unless indicated otherwise in their bid, reference Terms & Conditions section 2.4.
- **1.16 PROOF OF FINANCIAL AND BUSINESS CAPABILITY:** Bidders must, upon the request of Union County, provide satisfactory evidence of their ability to furnish products or services in accordance with the terms and conditions of these specifications. Union County will make the final determination as to the bidder's ability.
- 1.17 <u>VENDOR'S DEFAULT:</u> Union County reserves the right, in case of vendor default, to procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the defaulting vendor responsible for any excess costs occasioned thereby.
- 1.18 <u>DUPLICATE COPIES</u>: Union County requires that all vendors submit one original and one exact copy of their bids, including brochures; unless additional copies are requested in bid specifications.
- 1.19 <u>DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE</u>: Under the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated §50-9-113 enacted by the General Assembly effective 2001, all employers with five (5) or more employees who contract with either the state or a local government to provide construction services are required to submit an affidavit stating that they have a drug free workplace program that complies with Title 50, Chapter 9, in effect at the time of submission of a bid at least to the extent required of governmental entities. The statute imposes other requirements on the contractor and contractors should consult private legal counsel if legal questions arise under this section or any other provision of this document. All contractors shall provide a written affidavit signed by the principal officer of a covered employer acknowledging that the contracting entity is in compliance with the Drug Free Workplace laws of State of Tennessee.
- **1.20 RESTRICTIVE OR AMBIGUOUS SPECIFICATIONS:** It is the responsibility of the bidder to review the entire Invitation to Bid document and to notify the Finance Department if the Invitation to Bid is formulated in a manner that would unnecessarily restrict competition or if it is ambiguous in what is being requested. The Director of Finance must receive questions regarding the specifications or bid procedures not less than seventy-two (72) hours prior to the time set for the bid opening.
- 1.21 <u>SCHOOL CAFETERIA BIDS:</u> If this bid is for Union County School's Cafeteria Food Service Department, bidders must be in compliance with Section 104(d) of the William F. Goodling Child Nutrition Reauthorization Act of 1998 which requires school and institutions participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) to "Buy American" to the maximum extent practicable.

- **1.22 <u>TERMINATION</u>**: Union County reserves the right to terminate this contract in whole or in part with thirty (30) days written notification to the contractor. In the event of termination, the County shall not be liable for any costs other than the cost of services performed and materials delivered and accepted prior to termination date.
- **1.23** OSHA SAFETY: The Contractor is responsible for training their employees in Safety and Health Regulations for the job, assuring compliance with Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health regulations and any other Regulatory Agency.
- **1.24 PERFORMANCE BOND:** A standard surety or performance bond or an irrevocable letter of credit in favor of Union County Government at a federally insured financial institution will be required to be submitted with bid, if indicated in section four, item six insurance requirement checklist.
- **1.25** BACKGROUND CHECKS: Contractors shall comply with Public Chapter 587 of 2007, as codified in Tennessee Code Annotated Section 49-5-413, which requires all contractors to facilitate a criminal history records check conducted by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for each employee prior to permitting the employee to have contact with students or enter school grounds when students are present.
- **1.26 <u>AWARD RESULTS:</u>** As soon as practicable after proposal or bid evaluations, interested parties may view results of bid on the Vendor Registry website or contact <u>purchasing@ucps.org</u>. Individual notices are normally not mailed or emailed except to the successful vendor.
- **1.27 PRICE INCREASE/DELIVERY CHARGES:** Request for price or delivery charge increases must be received in writing 30-days prior to implementation. The Union County Director of Finance will review requests and make a determination to continue or cancel services.
- 1.28 INDEMNIFICATION/HOLD HARMLESS: Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless Union County and, its officers, agents and employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages of any nature brought because of, arising out of, or due to breach of the agreement by Contractor, its subcontractors, suppliers, agents, or employees or due to any negligent act or occurrence or any omission or commission of Contractor, its subcontractors, suppliers, agents or employees.
- **1.29 <u>DECLARATIVE STATEMENT:</u>** Any statement or words (i.e.: must, shall, will, etc) are declarative statements and the proposer must comply with the condition. Failure to comply with any such condition may result in their bid being non-responsive and disqualified.
- 1.30 <u>WAIVING OF INFORMALITIES:</u> Union County reserves the right to waive minor informalities or technicalities when it is in the best interest of Union County.
- **1.31** APPROPRIATION: In the event no funds are appropriated by Union County for the goods or services in any fiscal year or insufficient funds exist to purchase the goods or services, then the Contract shall expire upon the expenditure of previously appropriated funds or the end of the current fiscal year, whichever occurs first, with no further obligations owed to or by either party.
- **1.32** ASSIGNMENT: Contractor shall not assign or sub-contract this agreement, its obligations or rights hereunder to any party, company, partnership, incorporation or person without the prior written specific consent of Union County.
- 1.33 **QUANTITIES:** Union County does not guarantee quantities to be purchased off this bid.
- **1.34 UNIT PRICE:** Unit price for each unit bid shall be shown and such price shall include packing unless otherwise specified. A total shall be entered in the amount column of the pricing page for each item bid. In case of discrepancy between any unit price and an extended price, the unit price will be presumed to be correct, subject, however, to correction to the same extent and in the same manner as any other mistake.
- 1.35 MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS When it is certain that a mistake has been made in the preparation of the bid, a request will be made to the bidder to confirm the bid. Provisions must be made so that mistakes can be taken care of and the ambiguity resolved satisfactorily. Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received in the Finance Department prior to the time and date set for the bid opening. The changes or withdrawal of the bids should be in writing and signed by an official of the company. The envelope containing the modification should clearly state "modification to bid: Either the entire bid or a particular item may be withdrawn or modified in this manner.

<u>1.36</u> <u>PRE-BID CONFERENCES</u> — Attendance at Pre-bid Conference is strongly encouraged. When deemed necessary a Mandatory Pre-bid Conference will be held. A company representative MUST be in attendance and sign the Pre-bid sign-in sheet in order to be awarded the bid.

1.37_ADDENDUM -Union County Government reserves the right to amend this solicitation by addendum. Addendum will be emailed up to 48 hours in advance of the bid/proposals due date and time. It is the bidder's responsibility to check for addendum. If in the County's opinion revisions are of such a magnitude, the deadline for this solicitation may be extended in an addendum. In addition, addendum can change specifications, reply sheets, and times and dates for pre-bid meetings as well as due dates/deadlines for questions and bids/proposals.

BID SPECIFICATIONS

VENDOR QUALIFICATIONS

Potential bidders must meet the following criteria:

- Be able to provide a quality product as specified
- Offer reasonable pricing
- Provide dependable delivery of items ordered
- Meet specifications and bid conditions
- Demonstrate successful past performance

A potential bidder may be rejected for one or more of the following reasons:

- Inadequate or unacceptable product lines
- Inadequate facilities with respect to excess capacities, capable of accommodating surges in volume
- Inadequate sanitation
- Documented unacceptable product

BID AWARD

Bids are to be opened at 2:00pm on May 14, 2024. Only the bottom line total figure will be read at the bid opening. Bids will also be examined for compliance with specification and conditions outlined in the Bid document. If a bidder fails to provide required information with the bid submission or the information is inaccurate or inadequate, the bid will be deemed non-responsive and will bot be evaluated for award.

Consideration will be given to all bids properly submitted. Bids will receive appropriate confidentiality before awarding. Upon award, bid documents and tabulations will be available for review. Errors discovered after public opening cannot be corrected, and the bidder will be bound to honor bid as submitted.

BID RENEWAL

The Union County School Nutrition Program reserves the right to renew all aspects of the bid one year at a time for an additional three (3) years based on a firm fixed price with escalated and deescalated clause. The Union County School Nutrition Program reserves the right to add/or delete products during the contract period. Pricing for added products will be based on a comparison of pricing offered by vendor to the pricing of the same item offered on the open market prior to adding an item to the contract listing. The Union County School Nutrition Program will notify the contractor of their intention to renew this contract no later than March 15, 2025. A written response will be due from the contractor no late than April 1, 2025.

BID PREPARATION

Each Supplier should bid on all items on the bid document. Total bottom line cost will be determined by multiplying each item bid price times the estimated usage figure and adding the extended dollar figures. In the event a vendor fails to quote a price on an item, the highest price for that item from all bids will be inserted to calculate the bottom line price. Union County School Nutrition will recalculate usage and line extensions to make necessary conversions for differences in pack size. The bottom line total will be adjusted if mathematical conversions and extensions indicate the need for correction. All bids shall be in accordance with the instructions to bidders and specification as attached. Specifications are intended to be open and non-restrictive. Nutrition information on all products is required to be submitted with the bid on May 14, 2024. (Nutrition Fact Labels, Ingredient statement and/or CN Label, or product information on manufactures letterhead.)

All food products must contain zero grams trans fat (less than 0.5 gm) per serving and nutrition information provided.

Estimated usages are given for each item for the vendor and for the purpose of bid evaluation. The estimated usages do not indicate the actual quantity which will be ordered, since such volume will depend upon requirements which develop during the contract period. Estimated usages are based on last year's purchases and are estimated for the bid period. For New/Never Used item's estimated usage, the amount is a projected amount based on anticipated acceptance by students. Inclusion of items on bid does not guarantee purchase.

All columns of the bid document must be completed in ink or type written. The bottom line total (sum of extended prices) must also be printed in ink or typewritten on the proposal form. No erasures shall be permitted.

Mathematical calculation involving decimals should be carried to two (2) places.

Should a bidder find discrepancies or omissions from the bidding document or be in doubt as to their meaing. He/she shall at once request clarification from Crystal Flatford, Purchasing Agen, at purchasing@ucps.org.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the bidder to make certain that all bids in proper form are submitted by 2:00 P.m. May 14, 2024, to Union County Finance, 300 Main St, Maynardville, TN 37807. Item cost must include delivery to schools.

The bid document, contract agreement, debarment/suspension certification statement, By American waiver form, and bid form must be filled out and signed. All bids must be signed by a person with authority to bind the bid. The bid must be sealed in an envelope that is labeled according to the direction stated below.

Delivery

Deliveries shall be made to the school Monday thru Friday between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Exceptions to this time frame must be approved on a case by case basis by the School Nutrition Program Supervisor.

The School Nutrition Supervisor shall arrange delivery schedule and schedule shall remain constant from delivery to delivery. Deliveries shall NOT be made after 2:00 p.m. <u>Managers will not be expected to extend working hours to receive late deliveries!</u>

Products must be delivered inside the cafeteria/food preparation area and placed in the cooler rotating stock. The managers or designee will check the items delivered against the requisition/purchase order and invoice at the time of delivery with both the manager or designee and the driver signing the appropriate forms for shortages and errors, and/or obviously damaged goods.

All foods are to be delivered with no evidence of damage. The successful bidder agrees to be responsible for damaged packaging and to pick up and replace any products that are damaged, stale, or out of date, at no charge.

If foreign objects are found in foods purchased from vendor and such objects result in injury or sickness to customers, vendor will be responsible for all claims resulting from this injury or sickness and the Board of Education and their employees will not be held responsible.

The School Nutrition Program shall retain the right to reject any or all of a delivery that does not meet product specifications. Rejected items are to be picked up at the supplier's expense and credit memo issued.

Delivery schedules will be altered to meet holiday and inclement weather schedules. Holiday shall be defined as any week that has less than five (5) school days. If the holiday falls on a scheduled delivery day, the delivery shall be made on a day to be mutually agreed upon by the school district and the successful contractor. School year calendars for all systems participating in the bid are included in the bid packet.

Adjustments for inclement weather, national or local emergencies will include each school utilizing any product delivered prior to school closing. The system will notify the vendor as soon as possible about necessary delivery delays.

The School Nutrition Program reserves the right to reject the use of any equipment by a carrier if it is not in a clean, sanitary condition and suitable for hauling of all items.

The successful bidder shall provide the name and telephone contact number of a company contact person, along with a delivery schedule that includes the delivery person's name and contact number.

Milk that is below temperature will not be accepted.

Pickups and out of dates should be credited to our account.

VENDOR PERFORMANCE

If the Vendor fails in full or part to perform or comply with any provision of this contract or the terms or conditions of any documents referenced and made a part hereof, The Union County School Nutrition Program may terminate this Contract, in whole or in part, and may consider such failure or noncompliance a breach of Contract. Vendors with poor performance will be notified at the time of such performance and be given opportunity to correct the problems. Documentation will be kept on file. Any vendor with continued poor performance will be removed from the potential vendor list for one year.

Failure to deliver within the time specified or within a reasonable amount of time, or failure to make replacements of a rejected commodity immediately will constitute authority to purchase on the open market so as to replace the item(s) rejected and/or not received. On all such purchases, the Vendor agrees to promptly reimburse schools for excess costs caused by such a purchase.

Reasons for product rejection may be any one of the following:

Quality

Serviceability of Item (damage)

Product does not meet bid specifications

A party shall be deemed to have breached the contract if any of the following occurs: Failure to provide products or services that conform to contract requirements or

Failure to maintain/submit any report required hereunder; or Failure to perform in full or in part any of the other conditions of the contract Violations of any warranty.

SCHOOL SYSTEM ACTIONS IN EVENT OF A BREACH

Upon the occurrence of any event of breach, the School system may take any one, or more, or all, of the following actions:

- 1. Give the Vendor a written notice of the breach requiring it to be remedied within (30) days from the date of the notice, unless another time line is specified; and if the event of breach is not remedied within the time limit, terminate this contract with notice provided to the Vendor
- 2. Give the Vendor a written notice specifying the event of breach and suspending all payments to be made under this contract and ordering that the portion of the contract price, which would otherwise accrue to the Vendor during the period from the date of such notice until such time as the School System(s) determines that the Vendor has cured the breach, shall never be paid to the vendor;
- 3. Set off against any other obligation the School System(s) may owe to the Vendor any damages the School System(s) suffers by reason of any event of breach;
- 4. Treat the contact as materially breached and pursue any of its remedies at law or in equity, or both.

CONTRACT TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

If the Contractor fails to properly perform its obligations under this contract in a timely or proper manner, or if the Contractor violates any terms of this contract, the School District(s) shall have the right to terminate the contract and withhold payments in excess of fair compensation for completed services.

In the event the contract is terminated for due cause by the System, the System shall have the option of awarding the contract to the next lowest bidder or bidding again.

CONTRACT TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE

The School District(s) may, by written notice to the Vendor, terminate this Contract without cause for any reason. Said termination shall not be deemed a Breach of Contract by the School System(s). The School System(s) must give notice of termination to the Vendor at least 3() days prior to the effective date of termination. The Contractor shall be entitled to receive compensation for satisfactory authorized service completed as of the termination date, but in no event shall the School District be liable to the Contractor for compensation for any service which has not been rendered. Upon such termination, the Contractor shall have no right to any actual general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount.

INVOICES AND STATEMENTS

All monthly statements are to be issued to include and end with the cut-off date which will be the LAST DAY OF THE MONTH.

Two (2) invoices must be furnished to each school at the time of delivery. Invoices must be signed by the cafeteria manager or designee; show purchase order number, quantity, and price of each item delivered and total amount of the order. <u>Unsigned invoices will not be paid</u>. If an item must be returned or is rejected, the invoice must be signed by the manager or designee and the person delivering.

At the end of each month, a separate statement showing invoice numbers and dates of delivery for each school shall be mailed to the following addresses:

PAYMENTS

Invoices will be balanced with the statement and processed for payment. Statement should include any credits issued during the month.

All schools serviced under this contract are tax exempt.

REGULATION COMPLIANCE

- All contracts awarded in excess of \$10,000.00 by grantees and their contractors or sub-grantees shall comply with Executive Order 11246, entitled "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Executive Order 11375, and supplemented by the Department of Labor regulations (41CFR, Part 60).
- All contracts over \$100,000.00 will require compliance with the Clean Air Act issued under Section 306, Section 508 of the Clean Water Act., Executive Order 11738 and Environmental Protection Agency regulations.
- Bidders must comply with mandatory standards and policies related to energy efficiency which are contained in the State Energy Plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (PL94-163,89 Stat. 871). A Certificate of Lobbying must be signed for all contracts over \$100,000.00
- A Certificate of Debarment/Suspension must be signed for all contracts over \$25,000.00
