SECTION 1.0: Advertisement

VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

Call to Artist – Conceptual Design, Engineering, Fabrication and Installation of Public Art at a Roundabout on 168th Street and 82nd. Avenue Intersection- **RFP # 1718-07-015**

The Village of Palmetto Bay, a municipality located in Miami-Dade County, Florida, seeks to commission an artist or team of artists, **not** limited to Florida, for Outdoor Interpretive Artwork(s) at the intersection roundabout on 168th Street and 82nd. Avenue.

Sealed proposals shall be received by the Village Clerk, 9705 East Hibiscus Street, Palmetto Bay, FL 33157, **on or before Friday, July 27, 2018**, no later than 3:00 pm, at which time they will be publicly opened and announced. To be considered, all interested parties must request a copy of the Request for Proposal or download the pdf file from our website at www.palmettobay-fl.gov (click Bids & RFP's on the "business" tab). The documents will be readily available to download on Tuesday, June 26th 2018. Full submittals shall consist of one (1) original and one (1) copy of the required information along with a flash drive or CD of the submittal. Submittals must be placed in a sealed envelope, entitled "**Call to Artist- Conceptual Design, Engineering, Fabrication and Installation of Public Art at the Roundabout on 168th Street and 82nd Avenue- RFP # 1718-07-015.**" Late submittals and facsimile or emailed submissions will not be considered. The respondent shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of the response to this RFP.

The Village reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to terminate the process at any time (and recommence it at a later time from the beginning), to waive any informalities or irregularities in any submittal, to award in whole or in part to one or more respondents or take any other such actions that may be deemed in the best interest of the Village.

SECTION 2.0: Introduction

The Village of Palmetto Bay Art-in-Public Places (AIPP) Advisory Board, in partnership with the Village Departments of Planning and Zoning and Public Works are seeking a qualified artist or artist teams whom specialize in mosaics, metals, relief’s and/or stone to create a conceptual/schematic design, fabrication and installation of public art to be integrated into traffic roundabout. This project provides an opportunity to develop a public art piece that creates a strong visual identity, and contributes to the overall experience and perceptions of the area in a memorable and vital way. The art piece shall be incorporated into the existing roundabout center (Appendix A and site photos), which shall serve as a blank canvas for the artist. The design shall provide a physical link between the existing roundabout art piece located at 168th Street and 87th Avenue and surrounding neighborhoods, Biscayne Bay and US1 Commercial Corridor. Funding for this project shall be provided by the Village of Palmetto Bay AIPP Fund.

SECTION 3.0: Terms and Conditions for Receipt of Proposals

3.00 Requirement to Meet All Provisions

Each artist or artists submitting a proposal (proposer) shall meet all of the terms, and conditions of the Request for Proposals (RFP) specifications package. By virtue of its proposal submittal, the Artist (s) acknowledges agreement with and acceptance of all provisions of the RFP specifications.

3.01 Errors and Omissions in RFP

Proposers are responsible for reviewing all portions of this RFP, including all terms. Proposers are to promptly notify the Village's Procurement Specialist, in writing, if the proposer discovers any ambiguity, discrepancy, omission, or error in the RFP or forms. Any such notification should be directed to the Procurement Specialist (LPittser@palmettobay-fl.gov) in writing promptly after discovery. Modifications and clarifications will be made by addenda as provided below.

3.02 Inquiries Regarding RFP

3.03 Objections to RFP Terms

Should proposer object on any ground to any provision or legal requirement set forth in this RFP, the proposer must need not apply.

3.04 Addenda to RFP

The Village may modify the RFP, prior to the submittal due date, by issuing written addenda.

3.05 Proposal Withdrawal and Opening

A proposer may withdraw its proposal, without prejudice prior to the time specified for the proposal opening, by submitting a written request to the Village Clerk for its withdrawal.

3.06 Revision of Proposal

At any time during the submittal evaluation process, the Village may require a proposer to provide written clarification of its submittal.

3.07 Laws and Ordinances

The proposer shall observe and comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and proposer standards that would apply to this contract.

3.08 Reservations of Rights by the Village

The issuance of this RFP does not constitute an agreement by the Village that any award will actually be issued by the Village. The Village expressly reserves the right at any time to:

- Waive or correct any defect or informality in any response, proposal, or proposal procedure;
- Reject any or all submittals;
- Reissue a Request for Proposals; and
- Prior to submission deadline for submittals, modify all or any portion of the selection procedures, examiners, including deadlines for accepting responses, services to be provided under this RFP, or the requirements for contents or format of the submittals.

3.09 No Waiver

No waiver by the Village of any provision of this RFP shall be implied from any failure by the Village to recognize or take action on account of any failure by a Proposer to observe any provision of this RFP.

3.10 Cone of Silence

Pursuant to Section 2-138 of the Village Code, all procurement solicitations once advertised and until written award recommendation has been forwarded by the village manager to the village council, are under the “Cone of Silence.”

Any communication regarding this solicitation shall be made in accordance with the Cone of Silence, the entirety of which is incorporated as if fully set forth herein.

Communication between a potential vendor, service provider, Contractor, lobbyist, or Contractor and the Procurement Specialist named herein

Contractor solicitation is exempt from the Contractor Cone of Silence, provided that the communication is limited strictly to matters of process or procedure already contained in the solicitation document.

3.11 Submittal and/or Presentation Costs

The Village of Palmetto Bay assumes no responsibility or liability for costs incurred by the proposer prior to the execution of a contract. This includes costs incurred by the proposer as a result of preparing a response to this RFP.

3.12 Certification

The signer of the Response (to this RFP) must declare by signing the required forms that the person(s), Proposer(s) and parties identified in the Response are interested in and available for providing the services; that the Response is made without collusion with any other person(s), Proposer(s) and parties; that the Response is fair in all respects and is made in good faith without fraud; and that the signer of the cover letter of the Response has full authority to bind the person(s), Proposer(s) and parties identified in the Response.

3.13 Public Records

Florida law provides that municipal records should be open for inspection by any person under Section 119, F.S. Public Records law. All information and materials received by the Village in connection with responses shall become property of the Village and shall be deemed to be public records subject to public inspection.

3.14 Retention of Responses

The Village reserves the right to retain all Responses submitted and to use any ideas contained in any Response, regardless of whether that Proposer is awarded.

3.15 Village Authority

Proposals will be awarded at the sole discretion of the Village. The Village reserves the right to waive any irregularities in the request process, to reject any or all proposals, or to reject a proposal which is in any way incomplete or irregular. Proposals received after the deadline will not be considered.

3.16 Insurance

Upon Village's notification of award, the proposer shall furnish to the Procurement Division, Certificates of Insurance that indicate that insurance coverage has been obtained which meets the requirements as outlined below:

- Liability Insurance - One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury liability and property damage liability and shall contain minimum limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per aggregate – designating the Village as Additional Insured
- Workers Compensation - Statutory Limits
- Automobile Liability - One Million Dollars (\$300,000.00) per occurrence for all claims arising out of bodily injuries or death and property damages.
- Errors and Omissions or Proposer liability insurance - One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00)

All insurance policies must be issued by companies authorized to do business under the laws of the State of Florida. The companies must be rated no less than "B+" as to management and no less than "Class V" as to strength by the latest edition of Best's Insurance guide, published by A.M. Best Company, Olwick, New Jersey, or its equivalent, or the companies must hold a valid Florida Certificate of Authority as shown in the latest "List of All Insurance Companies Authorized or Approved to do Business in Florida," issued by the State of Florida Department of Insurance and are members of the Florida Guaranty Fund.

Certificates of Insurance must indicate that for any cancellation of coverage before the expiration date, the issuing insurance carrier will endeavor to mail thirty (30) day written advance notice to the certificate holder. In addition, the Proposer hereby agrees not to modify the insurance coverage without thirty (30) days written advance notice to the Village.

Compliance with the foregoing requirements shall not relieve the Proposer of this liability and obligation under this section or under any other section in the Agreement.

If the insurance certificate is received within the specified time frame but not in the manner prescribed in the Agreement, the Proposer shall be verbally notified of such deficiency and shall have an additional five (5) calendar days to submit a corrected certificate to the Village. If the Proposer fails to submit the required insurance documents in the manner prescribed in the Agreement within fifteen (15) calendar days after Village notification to comply, the Proposer shall be in default of the contractual terms and conditions and award of the Contract will be rescinded, unless such time frame for submission has been extended by the Village.

The Proposer shall be responsible for assuring that the insurance certificates required in conjunction with this Section remain in force for the duration of the contractual period of the Contract, including any and all option years or extension periods that may be granted by the Village. If insurance certificates are scheduled to expire during the contractual period, the Proposer shall be responsible for submitting new or renewed insurance certificates to the Village at a minimum of thirty (30) calendar days in advance of such expiration. In the event that expired certificates are not replaced with new or renewed certificates which cover the contractual period, the Village shall suspend the Contract until such time as the new or renewed certificates are received by the Village in the manner prescribed herein; provided, however, that this suspended period does not exceed thirty (30) calendar days. Thereafter, the Village may, at its sole discretion, terminate this contract.

3.17 Statement of Contract Disqualifications

Each proposer shall submit a statement regarding any past government disqualifications on the form provided in the RFP package.

3.18 Submittal of One Proposal Only

No individual or business entity of any kind shall be allowed to make or file, or to be interested in more than one proposal, except an alternative proposal when specifically requested; however, an individual or business entity that has submitted a sub-proposal to a Proposer submitting a proposal, or who has quoted prices on

materials to such Proposer, is not thereby disqualified from submitting a sub-proposal or from quoting prices to other Proposers submitting proposals.

3.19 Exceptions to Specifications

Exceptions to these specifications shall be listed and explained on a separate page titled “Exceptions to Specifications”, which shall be prepared by the proposer. This page shall then be attached to these documents and submitted at the same time as the proposal. Each exception must refer to the page number and paragraph to which it is relevant. The nature and reasoning of each exception shall be explained in its entirety. Any exceptions to these specifications may be cause for rejection of the proposal.

3.20 Non-Appropriation of Funds

The Village of Palmetto Bay reserves the right to terminate in whole or in part the contract in the event that sufficient funds to complete the contract are not appropriated by the Village of Palmetto Bay’s Village Council.

3.21 Property of the Village

All discoveries and documents produced as a result of any service or project undertaken on behalf of the Village of Palmetto Bay shall become the property of the Village.

3.22 Disclosures and Potential Conflicts of Interest

The Village of Palmetto Bay Code of Ethics prohibits public officials or employees from performing or participating in an official act or action with regard to a transaction in which he has or knows he will thereafter acquire an interest for profit, without full public disclosure of such interest. This disclosure requirement extends to the spouse, children and grandchildren, and their spouses, parents and the parents of a spouse, and brothers and sisters and their spouses.

To ensure full and fair consideration of all proposals, the Village of Palmetto Bay requires all Proposers including owners or employees to investigate whether a potential or actual conflict of interest exists between the Proposer and the Village of Palmetto Bay, its officials, and/or employees. If the Proposer discovers a potential or actual conflict of interest, the Proposer must disclose the conflict of interest in its proposal, identifying the name of the Village of Palmetto Bay official or employee with whom the conflict may exist, the nature of the conflict of interest, and any other relevant information. The existence of a potential or actual conflict of interest does NOT, on its own, disqualify the disclosing Proposer from consideration. Information provided by Proposers in this regard will allow the Village of Palmetto Bay to take appropriate measures to ensure the fairness of the proposal process.

3.23 Litigation

All Proposers shall describe any prior or pending litigation or investigation, either civil or criminal, involving a governmental agency or which may affect the performance of the services to be rendered herein, in which the Proposer, any of its employees, or sub Proposers has been involved in within the last three (3) years.

3.24 Sub-Contractors

If any proposer intends on subcontracting out all or any portion of the engagement, that fact, and the name of the proposed subcontracting Proposer(s) must be clearly disclosed in the proposal. Following the award of the contract, no additional subcontracting will be allowed without the prior written consent of the Village of Palmetto Bay.

3.25 Anti-Discrimination

The proposer certifies that he/she is in compliance with the non-discrimination clause contained in Section 202, Executive Order 11246, as amended by Executive Order 11375, relative to equal employment opportunity for all persons without regard to race, color, religion, sex or national origin.

3.26 Legal Requirements

Federal, state, county and Village laws, ordinances, rules and regulations that in any manner affect the items covered herein apply. Lack of knowledge by the proposer will in no way be a cause for relief from responsibility.

3.27 Protests, Appeals and Disputes

A contract may not be awarded to the proposer, unless the RFP tabulation is posted at Village of Palmetto Bay Municipal Center, 9705 E. Hibiscus Street, Palmetto Bay, Florida, ten (10) days prior to award of contract. Protests must be submitted in writing to the Village Manager or his designee no later than ten (10) days prior to scheduled award by the Village Council. Should the matter not be resolved to the satisfaction of the proposer, the appeal shall be heard by the Village Council. The Village Manager or his designee shall act as the Village's representative, in issuance and administration of all contracts, and shall issue and receive all documents, notices, and all correspondence. Any documentation not issued by or received by the Village Manager or his designee shall be null and void. All costs accruing from a Bid or award challenged as quality, etc. (test, etc.) shall be assumed by the challenger. The decision of the Village Council shall be final and conclusive. Their decision shall be binding on all parties concerned, reviewable by a court of competent jurisdiction in Miami-Dade County, in accordance with laws of the State of Florida.

3.28 Disclaimer

The Village Council of the Village of Palmetto Bay may, in its sole and absolute discretion accept or reject, in whole or in part, for any reason whatsoever any or all proposals; re-advertise this RFP; postpone or cancel at any time this RFP process; or, waive any formalities of or irregularities in the solicitation and proposal process. Proposals that are not submitted on time and/or do not conform to the Village of Palmetto Bay's requirements will not be considered. The issuance of this RFP constitutes only an invitation to make presentations to the Village of Palmetto Bay. The Village of Palmetto Bay reserves the right to determine, at its sole discretion, whether any aspect of the proposal satisfies the criteria established in this RFP. In all cases the Village of Palmetto Bay shall have no liability to any proposer for any costs or expense, incurred in connection with this RFP or otherwise.

3.29 Business Entity Disclosure Statement

Proposer or Proposer hereby recognizes and certifies that no elected official, or employee of the Village of Palmetto Bay (the "Village") shall have a financial interest directly or indirectly in this transaction or any compensation to be paid under or through this transaction, and further, that no Village employee, nor any elected or appointed officer (including Village board members) of the Village, nor any spouse, parent or child of such employee or elected or appointed officer of the Village, may be a partner, officer, director or proprietor of Proposer or Proposer, and further, that no such Village employee or elected or appointed officer, or the spouse, parent or child of any of them, alone or in combination, may have a material interest in the Proposer or Proposer. Material interest means direct or indirect ownership of more than 5% of the total assets or capital stock of the Proposer or Proposer. Any exception to these above described restrictions must be expressly provided by applicable law or ordinance and be presented in writing by Village. Further, Proposer or Proposer recognizes that with respect to this transaction or bid, if any Proposer or Proposer violates or is a party to a violation of the ethics ordinances or rules of the Village, the provisions of Miami-Dade County Code Section 2-11.1, as applicable to Village, Village Charter Section 7.6 (Lobbyist), or the provisions of Chapter 112, part III, Fla. Stat., the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, such Proposer or Proposer may be disqualified from furnishing the goods or services for which the bid or proposal is submitted and may be further disqualified from submitting any future bids or proposals for goods or services to Village. Proposer or Proposer must complete and execute the Business Entity Affidavit form. The terms "Proposer" or "Artist," as used herein, include any person or entity making a proposal herein to Village or providing goods or services to Village.

3.30 Force Majeure

The performance of any act by the Village or Proposer hereunder may be delayed or suspended at any time while, but only so long as, either party is hindered in or prevented from performance by acts of God, the elements, war, rebellion, strikes, lockouts or any cause beyond the reasonable control of such party, provided however, the Village shall have the right to provide substitute service from third parties or Village forces and in such event the Village shall withhold payment due Proposer for such period of time. If the condition of force majeure exceeds a period of 14 days the Village may, at its option and discretion, cancel or renegotiate this Agreement.

3.31 Copeland "Anti-Kickback"

Proposer and all sub-contractors will comply with the Copeland Anti-Kickback Act (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3).

3.32 Debarment and Suspension

Proposers are required to certify that they are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntary excluded from covered transactions by any governmental agency.

SECTION 4.0: Scope of Services

The following are the services necessary to satisfy the terms of agreement between the Village and the successful proposer.

Site Description

The traffic roundabout will be reconfigured to maximize traffic calming initiative at the junction of SW 168th Street (Richmond Drive) and SW 82nd. Avenue. This is a high volume intersection, one of the Village's primary East to West corridors between the US-1 Commercial Corridor, coastal neighborhoods, Biscayne Bay, Biscayne National Park, Thalatta Park and Deering Estate, a National Historic & Archeological Site. The primary intent of the existing roundabout is to improve the intersections while increasing capacity and volume. The roundabout is primarily surrounded by single-family residential neighborhoods. The immediate area is encompassed by Colonial Ranch and Mediterranean style homes. The median household income is approximately \$ 100,000.00. Onsite water and power connections will be available. Lighting should be considered as an element of this project.

Project Goals

The project goals are to develop a comprehensive and integrated design for public art to include the following:

- Provides a visual link, axis, focal-point, and connects the viewer to and from Biscayne Bay, the Deering Estate and the US-1 Commercial Corridor.
- Effectively engages the public in a dynamic and elegant visual place making experience.
- Provides continuity and similar language with the existing art intervention located at the western roundabout at 168th street and 87th avenue.
- Highlights the Village's history, natural beauty and ecological diversity and its proximity to Biscayne Bay and Biscayne National Park.
- Is compatible to the surrounding urban build environment.

Project Detail Scope

Phase 1

- Working with staff and the AIPP Advisory Board committee to, develop a conceptual/schematic design for public art integration into the roundabout.
 - Design must:
 1. Focus on meeting project goals as described above.
 2. Be consistent with fabrication budget, as determined through discussions with staff and subcommittee.
 3. Provide smooth integration into project construction plans.
-

4. Be completed within a tight timeframe, in order to integrate fabrication into the overall roundabout reconfiguration project timelines.
 5. Media use should have the capacity to withstand extreme temperatures and weather conditions.
 6. Media use should have the capacity to withstand extreme temperatures and weather conditions.
 7. The proposed artwork should be compatible to the surrounding architecture.
- Create a fabrication and installation budget.

Phase 2

- Fabrication and installation.

Project Budget

The budget for this project is between \$ 45,000-\$ 50,000 inclusive of all designer fees, administrative costs, travel, research, design, materials, fabrication, engineering, transportation and installation/construction. Lighting should be considered as an element of this project, with those cost being included as part of the overall project budget. Power and water will be available on site.

Project Schedule

The project is already in the Village's entitlement process. To expedite this process, this project is proposed as a phased project. The first phase will consist of artist selection with the final selected artist completing all research and design requirement for the commissioned piece at the cost of no more that 5% of the total project budget, up to a maximum of \$ 2,500. The second phase will be the fabrication and installation phase of the project. The second phase shall be completed by no later than October 26, 2018.

Payment to Proposer/Artist

The Village will pay the artist/artist team for work completed based on milestones completed and accepted by the Village. The Village shall make sole and final determination if a milestone as described above is complete and acceptable for payment.

1. Invoices for each milestone will specifically identify job title, person-hours, and costs incurred and previously completed by each task. These invoices will need to be mailed to Attn: Maria Pineda, Community and Economic Director, Village of Palmetto Bay, 9705 E. Hibiscus Street, Palmetto Bay, Florida 33157.

2. The artist/artist team shall not perform any work beyond the scope of service in the “Agreement for Professional Contractor/Artist Services,” unless a change order has been created by the Village and it is to the Village’s intent to change the price budgeted for this project.
3. The artist/artist team shall receive no compensation for any re-work necessary as result of the artist’s errors and/or omissions.
4. **Governmental Restrictions:** in the event any governmental restrictions may be imposed which would necessitate alteration of the material quality, workmanship, or performance of the items offered on this RFP/P prior to their delivery, it shall be the responsibility of the successful Proposer/artist to notify the Village at once, indicating in their letter the specific regulation which required an alteration. The Village reserves the right to accept any such alteration, including any price adjustments occasioned thereby, or to cancel at no further expense to the Village.
5. **Copyrights and / or Patent Rights:** Artist warrants that there has been no violation of copyrights or patent rights in manufacturing, producing or selling of goods shipped or ordered, as a result of this RFP/P. The seller agrees to indemnify Village from any and all liability, loss, or expense occasioned by any such violation.
6. **Safety Standards:** The Artist warrants that the product(s) supplied to the Village conforms in all respects to the standards set forth in the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) and its amendments. Proposals must be accompanied by a materials data safety sheet (M.S.D.S.) when applicable.
7. **Taxes:** Artist shall include all applicable taxes in response to the RFP.
8. **Mistake:** if there is a discrepancy in the lump sum and parts that make up the lump sum, the part(s) will prevail and the extensions adjusted to coincide. Proposers/Artists are responsible for checking their calculations. Failure to do so will be at the artist's risk, and errors will not release the artist from their responsibility as noted herein.

4.01 Indemnification

Proposer shall indemnify and hold harmless the Village and its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities from any and all liability, losses or damages, including attorneys' fees and costs of defense, which the Village or its officers, employees, agents or instrumentalities may incur as a result of claims, demands, suits, causes of actions or proceedings of any kind or nature arising out of, relating to or resulting from the performance of this Agreement by the proposer or its employees, agents, servants, partners, principals or sub-contractors. Proposer shall pay all claims and losses in connection therewith and shall investigate and defend all claims, suits or actions of any kind or nature in the name of the Village, where applicable, including appellate proceedings, and shall pay all costs, judgments, and attorney's fees which may issue thereon. Proposer expressly understands and agrees that any insurance protection required by this Agreement or otherwise provided by Proposer shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep and

save harmless and defend the Village or its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities as herein provided. 1% of the contract amount shall represent the consideration to be provided for this indemnification. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a waiver of sovereign immunity.

SECTION 5.0: Submittal Requirements and Selection

Time and Place for Submittal of Proposals

Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, the rules under section 1446 require a partnership to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the section 1446 withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid section 1446 withholding on your share of partnership income.
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
