III. SPECIFICATIONS

SCOPE

To provide material, labor and equipment only to replace four (4) existing wood poles supporting the existing traffic signals at intersection of Central Avenue West and South Main Street in Springfield, Tennessee with self-supporting steel strain poles, and furnish and install two(2) new five-head signals for northbound and southbound left-turn capability from Central Avenue onto South Main Street. The contractor will design and install footings as required. Contractor will transfer existing traffic signal assembly for entire intersection to new steel poles.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The following equipment and materials were installed on a previous state project and are not required for this job. Eight phase controller, traffic detection loops, traffic signal heads and pedestrian signal indications. The traffic signals and pedestrian signal indications are wired into pull boxes near existing wood poles, then into the new controller. Contractor will be required to furnish and install four (4) steel strain poles, footings with anchor bolts, strain wire, conduits required for feed into/out of pull boxes (from new steel poles), two (2) new five (5) head signals to match existing and located as shown on drawing. All connections are to be made to this equipment, by the contractor, at the completion of this project.

REQUESTED WORK

Purchase and install all materials needed to complete traffic signal installation at the above intersection:

1. Footings for four (4) steel strain poles (2-30' and 2-33'). The contractor and signal support manufacturer shall design the footings as required.
2. Steel traffic light strain poles, 2- 30' poles and 2-33' poles
3. Traffic signals; Two (2) - 5 head, with strain wire attachments
4. Approximately 400' of 7 conductor signal cable as needed
5. All miscellaneous wire and connectors required to complete connections in the existing traffic controller.

Remove:

1. Old poles, strain wire, anchors and down guys from the intersection once new installation is complete.
2. All waste and debris.

V. CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into on this ____ day of _____, 2020.

by the CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, TENNESSEE, as administered by the Department of Electricity (hereinafter called DEPARTMENT) and _____, an independent CONTRACTOR (hereinafter called CONTRACTOR).

That for and in consideration of the mutual agreements and covenants herein contained, the parties agree and bind themselves as set out below:

1. CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish all supervision, labor, tools, transportation, equipment and materials for the sole purpose of FURNISHING AND INSTALLATION OF FOUR (4) STEEL STRAIN POLES, FOOTINGS, TWO (2) NEW FIVE-HEAD TRAFFIC SIGNALS AND ASSOCIATED MATERIAL AND TRANSFER EXISTING TRAFFIC SIGNAL ASSEMBLY per the contract scope.

2. CONTRACTOR agrees to perform all work in accordance with all federal, municipal, county, state, and other local laws, ordinances, and regulations applicable to said work. All work shall be performed in accordance with such of the following as may be applicable:

A. All construction work shall be done in accordance with DEPARTMENT directives and in conformity with all local codes and permissions obtained.

B. Materials and methods to be used for all construction work shall be mutually determined by the parties hereto.

3. CONTRACTOR agrees that its personnel and equipment shall at all times present a neat appearance, and all work shall be done, and all complaints handled by CONTRACTOR with due regard for DEPARTMENT'S public relations. CONTRACTOR'S personnel shall be expected to conduct themselves in a professional and courteous manner.

4. CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for any property damage caused by its workers or subcontractors during the term of this contract.

5. CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless DEPARTMENT, its agents and employees, from and against all claims, damage, losses and expenses, including attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from CONTRACTOR'S performance of the work required herein.

6. CONTRACTOR shall install and maintain the necessary guards and protective equipment at locations where work is being performed to prevent accidents to the public or damage to the property and personnel of DEPARTMENT or the general public.

7. CONTRACTOR shall purchase and maintain such comprehensive general liability and other insurance as is appropriate for the work being performed and furnished and will provide protection for any claim which may arise out of or result from CONTRACTOR'S performance of the work and the furnishing of materials and CONTRACTOR'S other obligations under the Contract Documents, whether it is to be performed or furnished by CONTRACTOR or by anyone for whose acts CONTRACTOR may be liable including but not limited to the following:

- A. Claims under workers' or workman's compensation, disability, benefits and other similar employee benefit acts;
- B. Claims for damage because of bodily injury, occupational sickness, or disease, or death of CONTRACTOR'S employees;
- C. Claims for damages because of bodily injury, sickness or disease, or death of any person other than CONTRACTOR'S employees;
- D. Claims for damages insured by personal injury liability coverage which are sustained (a) by any person as a result of any offense directly or indirectly related to the employment of such person by CONTRACTOR or (b) by any other person for any other reason;
- E. Claims for damages, other than to the work itself, because of the injury to or destruction of tangible property wherever located, including loss of use resulting therefrom.
- F. Claims arising out of operation of Laws or Regulations for damages

because of bodily injury or death of any person or for damage to property; and

- G. Claims or damages because of bodily injury or death of any person or property damage arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of any motor vehicle.

CONTRACTOR'S general liability insurance shall also include coverage for the indemnification obligation to DEPARTMENT assumed under Section 6 hereof.

The insurance required hereby shall include the specific coverage and be written for not less than following stated limits of liability and coverage or limits of liability and coverage required by law, whichever is greater:

Comprehensive General Liability

- Bodily Injury (including completed operations and products liability) and Property Damage. Combined single limit of each occurrence and aggregate (\$1,000,000).
- Property damage liability (\$100,000 per occurrence).
- Personal injury, with employment exclusion deleted: combined single limited of \$350,000 each occurrence and aggregate.

Comprehensive Automobile Liability

Combined single limit of \$500,000 each occurrence.

Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability

Statutory Limits.

All such insurance shall remain in effect at all times during the term of this Agreement and when CONTRACTOR may be performing the work.

8. This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their heirs, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns. CONTRACTOR shall not assign any of its rights or duties under this agreement, or subcontract the whole or any part of the work performed hereunder,

without first having obtained the written consent of DEPARTMENT authorizing such assignment or subcontract.

9. This agreement is not intended to constitute a compensation or unemployment compensation law, any old age benefit law, or any similar law, and it shall not be so construed. CONTRACTOR agrees to accept full and exclusive liability for the payment of contributions or taxes imposed under such laws by the Federal and/or State Government which are measured by remuneration paid to CONTRACTOR'S employees.

10. CONTRACTOR shall complete all work under this contract within one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days from the date of this contract.

11. Should CONTRACTOR fail to carry out work or to comply with any of the provisions of this agreement, DEPARTMENT may terminate this agreement upon 24-hours' written notice to CONTRACTOR.

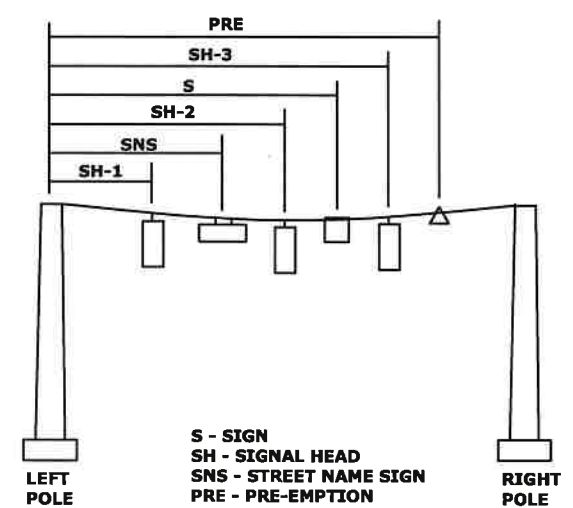
CENTRAL AVENUE AT SOUTH MAIN STREET



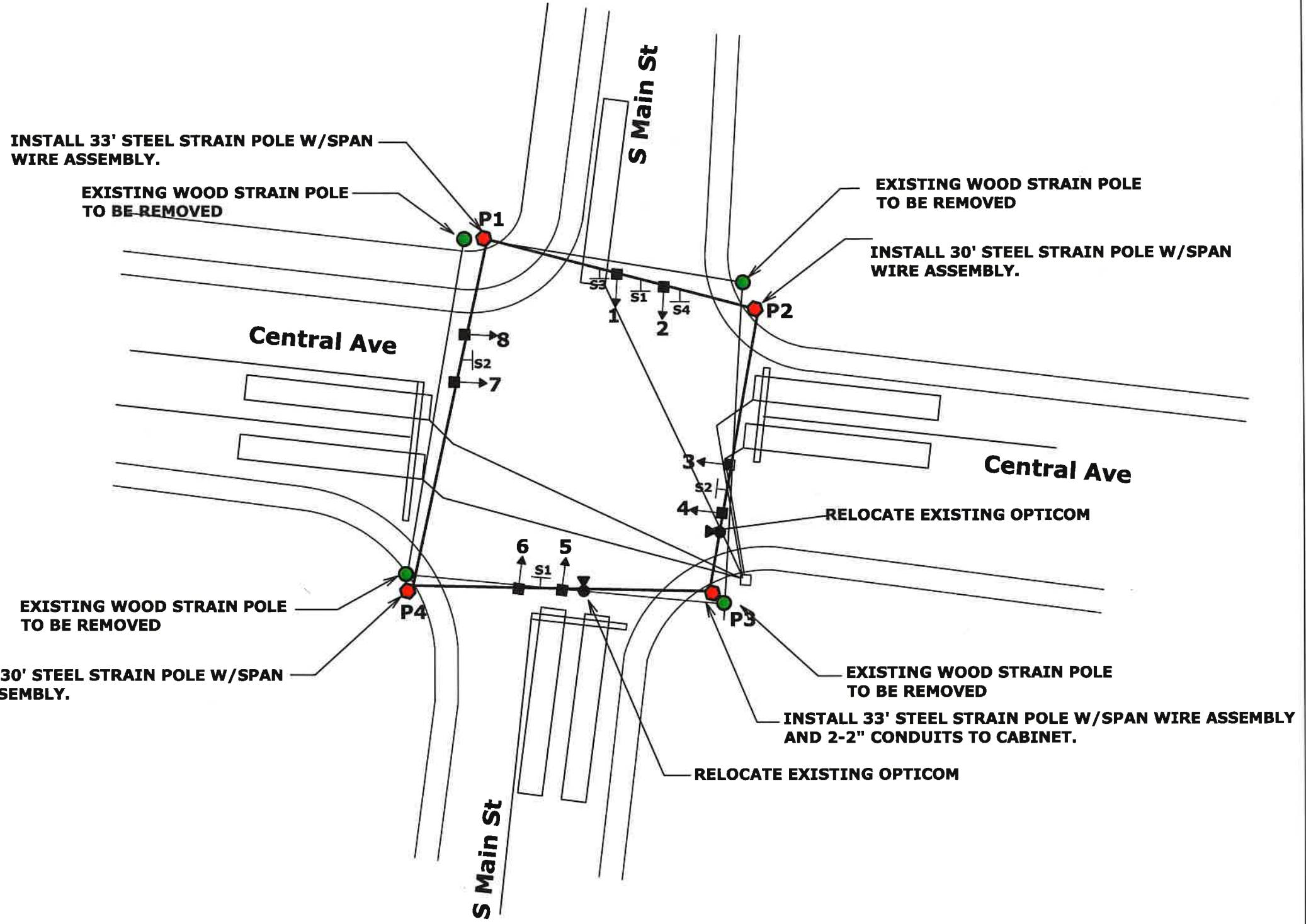

NOTICE
