Specifications for Firearm Use-of-Force Training Simulator

The Chattanooga Police Department is requesting bids to provide a mobile firearm training simulator for the Firing Range.

CPD has identified the Training Lab simulator offered by Ti Training as having suitable performance and capabilities. Vendors are invited to offer training simulators having performance and capabilities equal to or better than the simulator offered by Ti Training.

Such simulators will have the following features and accessories:

(A) Firearm Simulator – life-sized, fully-immersive, featuring high-definition video, surround sound, and capable of simulating a wide variety of scenarios under various lighting and environmental conditions. Vendors should specify the number and types of scenarios included and their policy regarding provision of new scenarios. Simulators should provide recording of heart-rate, breathing-rate, and other responses of trainees. Simulators should support the training of six trainees simultaneously. Software should allow CPD to create scenarios from video files. All hardware and software should be included to create a complete stand-alone system requiring only electrical connectivity.

(B) Laser-fitted OC Canisters for training

(C) Tactical Flashlights, black with IR filters

(D) Air-recoil conversion kits for AR-15 with one magazine

(E) Air-recoil conversion kits for Glock handgun with one magazine

(F) Additional magazines for rifle recoil kits

(G) Additional magazines for handgun recoil kits

(H) Taser X-26 Laser-fitted with cartridge

(I) Laser training pistols

(J) Four-year warranty with CPU upgrade and laser refurbishment

3. The Contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he/she has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the Contractor's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
4. During the term of this contract the following non-discriminatory hiring practices shall be employed to provide employment opportunities for minorities and women:
 - a. All help wanted ads placed in newspapers or other publications shall contain the phrase "Equal Employment Opportunity Employer".
 - b. Seek and maintain contracts with minority groups and human relations organizations as available.
 - c. Encourage present employees to refer qualified minority group and female applicants for employment opportunities.
 - d. Use only recruitment sources which state in writing that they practice equal opportunity. Advise all recruitment sources that qualified minority group

members and women will be sought for consideration for all positions when vacancies occur.

5. Minority statistics are subject to audit by City of Chattanooga staff or other governmental agency.
6. The Contractor agrees to notify the City of Chattanooga of any claim or investigation by State or Federal agencies as to discrimination.

REQUIREMENTS FOR INSURANCE COVERAGE

The Contractor shall not commence work under these Contract Documents until he has obtained all insurance required herein nor shall the Contractor allow any Subcontractor to commence work on his subcontract until similar insurance required of the Subcontractor has been obtained by the Subcontractor. Insurance shall be placed by the Contractor with one or more insurance carriers licensed to do business in the State of Tennessee. Each insurance policy shall be renewed ten (10) days before the expiration date of the policy.

Certificates of insurance shall be filed with the City prior to commencement of the work. These certificates shall contain a provision that coverage's afforded under the policies will not be changed or canceled unless at least fifteen (15) days' written notice has been given to the city. The Contract shall not be binding upon the city until the insurance coverage required herein has been obtained and certificates have been filed with the City.

Adequate insurance coverage shall be maintained by the Contractor at all times. Failure to maintain adequate coverage shall not relieve the Contractor of any responsibilities or obligations under these Contract Documents. In the event any insurance coverage is canceled or allowed to lapse, the Contractor will not be permitted to prosecute the work until adequate and satisfactory insurance has been obtained and certificates of insurance furnished to the City. Failure to keep insurance policies in effect will not be cause for any claims for extension of time under these Contract Documents.

All such policies shall be subject to approval by the City Attorney. Should the City Attorney at any time in his sole discretion determine that the insurance policies and certificate provided may not be sufficient to protect the interests of the City because of the insolvency of the insurance company or otherwise, the Contractor shall replace such policies with policies meeting his approval.

The Contractor shall procure and maintain at his own expense, during the Contract Time, insurance as hereinafter specified:

Workmen's Compensation Insurance that shall protect the Contractor against all claims under applicable state workmen's compensation laws shall be maintained. The Contractor shall also be protected against claims for injury, disease or death of employees which, for any reason, may not fall within the provisions of a workmen's compensation law. This policy shall also include an endorsement providing coverage in all states in which work is performed. The Contractor shall require all the Subcontractors to provide similar Workmen's Compensation Insurance for all the Subcontractors' employees on the work unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor. The liability limits shall not be less than that required by statute.

General Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance that shall be written in comprehensive form and shall protect the Contractor against all claims arising from injuries including death, to members of the public or damage to property of others arising out of any act or omission of the Contractor or his agents, employees, or Subcontractors. In addition, this policy shall specifically insure the contractual liability assumed by the successful bidder to defend and indemnify the City of Chattanooga against such claims or suits.

To the extent that the work may require blasting, explosive conditions or underground operation, the comprehensive general public liability and property damage coverage shall contain no exclusion relative to blasting, explosion, collapse of buildings, or damage to underground property.

The comprehensive general public liability and property damage coverage shall also protect the Contractor against all claims resulting from damage to:

1. Private driveways, walks, shrubbery and plantings;
2. Public utility facilities; and
3. U.S. Government monuments.

The liability limits shall not be less than:

Bodily Injury	\$ 500,000 each person \$1,000,000 each occurrence
Property Damage	\$ 250,000 each occurrence \$ 500,000 aggregate

The general public liability and property damage insurance shall carry an endorsement in form satisfactory to the City to the effect that the Contractor shall save harmless the City from any claims and damage whatsoever, including patent infringement. General public liability and property damage insurance shall be kept in force at all times during the course of the work until such time as the work covered by these Contract Documents has been completed and accepted by the City.

Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Liability and Property Damage Insurance that shall be written in comprehensive form and shall protect the Contractor against all claims for injuries to members of the public and damage to property of others arising from the use of motor vehicles, and shall cover operation on or off the site of all motor vehicles licensed for highway use, whether they are owned, non-owned, or hired.

The liability limits shall not be less than:

Bodily Injury	\$ 250,000 each person \$ 500,000 each occurrence
Property Damage	\$ 100,000 each occurrence

Instructions to Bidders

(6) Tennessee Law (Tenn. Code Ann. Section 12-12-106) prohibits municipalities from contracting with business entities which engage in investment activities with Iran.
