1. GENERAL

1.1. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work covered by these specifications includes the supply of labor and parts for on-site maintenance, and purchase of replacement magnetic Fischer & Porter, ABB, and other related flowmeters and instrumentation at the Moccasin Bend Wastewater Treatment Plant and related pump stations in the City of Chattanooga Interceptor Sewer System as described herein. The Wastewater Treatment Plant is located at 455 Moccasin Bend Road, Chattanooga, Tennessee 37405.

1.2 LENGTH OF CONTRACT

The length of contract shall be for a period of 12 months with an option to renew for 2 additional 12 month periods by the City of Chattanooga.

1.3 QUALIFICATIONS OF SERVICE TECHNICIAN

The service technician to perform these services shall have at least 5 years of work experience with ABB, Fischer & Porter, and other instrumentation, and shall be a Certified Control Systems Technician, or equivalent. Familiarity with the City's instruments will be a major consideration.

1.4 INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

Bids for this Contract should consist of hourly rates for labor to provide the services described herein and one (1) percentage markup on materials and parts including new or replacement ABB Magmeters. The prices shall include all travel time to the job site, lodging, and any and all other related expenses.

In addition, lines are provided for Planned Project Labor and Emergency Project Labor. Upon the awarding of the contract, the Vendor shall only utilize these lines upon prior approval by the Chief Electrician. The Vendor will have the scope of work, as well as specialized labor rates, approved before beginning any work that is to be invoiced on these lines. When invoicing these lines, the Vendor shall provide a copy of their internal regulations of overtime rates that fall outside of the scope of the usual time and a half rates that are covered with the overtime rate on the contract.

1.5 GENERAL CONDITIONS

The Contractor shall comply with rules and conditions found in the City of Chattanooga, Purchasing Department's "General Conditions and Instructions to Bidders" that are a part of the invitation to Bid for the equipment or services specified herein.

1.6 WARRANTY

The service and repair work, including parts, shall be warranted for a period of 12 months from the date work is performed. Warranty shall cover defects in workmanship, materials, and installation.

2.0 SERVICES AND PARTS

2.1 PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE SERVICES

The Contractor shall provide the services of a qualified Service Technician on-site as needed whenever requested by the City.

The Service Technician, as a minimum, shall perform preventative maintenance, calibration, and repair on instruments listed in Appendix A when requested by the City. All equipment shall be inspected, tested, and/or calibrated in accordance with the manufacturer's recommended frequency schedules. Additionally, the Service Technician shall perform repairs and/or installations requested by the Moccasin Bend Wastewater Treatment Plant Chief Instrumentation/Electrical Technician and/or the Waste Resources Maintenance Manager.

2.2 CORRECTIVE MAINTENANCE SERVICES

Corrective maintenance services shall be provided during normal working hours to keep the equipment listed in proper operation. Corrective maintenance services shall be provided for the equipment listed in Appendix A and shall be in accordance with manufacturer's suggested methods of repair.

2.3 TIMESHEETS

Vendor shall provide with each invoice employee Timesheets showing time worked on the job. In the case an employee works overtime, the number of standard work hours must be included prior to any authorized overtime. Timesheets shall include all work performed, indicating the hours of work, use of specialized equipment, and/or use of approved subcontractors. City maintains the right to have Vendor's employees to clock in and out on WRD provided TimeClock. Work Order Numbers are to be specified on all Timesheets and

TimeClock transactions. TimeClock information is for WRD use only. Punching the Timeclock does not waive the requirement for employee Timesheets being attached to invoices. TimeClock reports will not be used to pay invoice.

2.4 PARTS AND REPAIR COMPONENTS

The Contractor shall provide a stock of spare parts that shall be readily available to expedite full repairs. All new flowmeters shall be manufactured by ABB or an approved equal and all new electronic transmitters shall be backwards compatible to ABB MFF magmeter flowtubes.

The vendor shall also provide a percentage markup for material as a part of the bid. Every attempt will be made by the technician to repair the flowmeter in the field but if new parts are needed, then the vendor shall provide a written estimate for the cost of those parts and after approval by the city, the parts shall be delivered and installed.

2.5 TRAINING SERVICE

The City shall provide at least one employee to work with the service technician. When possible, the City employee will perform the service work under the guidance of the Contractor's Service Technician.

3.0 EXECUTION

3.1 WORK SCHEDULE

The services provided under this contract shall be performed during the City's normal working hours (7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) and normal working week (Monday through Friday) unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the Contractor and the City.

3.2 RECORD OF MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS

The Contractor shall provide a record of all repairs and services made during each work period. A copy of this record shall be given to the Chief Instrumentation/Electrical Technician within one (1) week after the work was performed.

The Contractor shall provide a Certification of Calibration for all flow meters tested and calibrated at least annually and more frequently if required by regulatory agencies.

3.3 TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

Either party may terminate the Contract at any time provided 30 days written notice is provided of the intent to terminate the contract.

3.4 INITIATION OF WORK

Work shall begin within 30 days after receipt of the City's purchase order for this Contract. Work shall be performed on a mutually agreed upon work schedule. For all corrective and preventative maintenance, the Contractor shall supply an estimate on the City's estimate form. Each job shall be issued a release number from the Blanket Contract, and this number will appear on all paperwork associated with the job.

3.5 PAYMENT

3.5.1. The City will make payment to the Vendor according to the City's normal policies and procedures.

3.5.2. Before an order can be placed for routine transactions, City will request an Estimate from Vendor with detailed breakdown. City will require breakdown on its own form. Once City has approved the estimated price and submits Requisition for same, it will advise Vendor of the Release Number in order to place the order. Invoices that do not reference the Release Number will not be considered complete or valid.

3.5.3. Vendor's Invoice must list a valid E-Mail Address for billing questions and inquiries.

3.5.4. Invoice Date is critical and Invoices must be sent to the City on the Invoice Date in order for the City's tracking system to accurately reflect the record. The Invoice Date must not precede the Ship Date or Service Date.

3.5.5. Invoice descriptions on transaction lines must match the wording of the Purchase Order transaction lines, and reference the corresponding transaction line number of the Purchase Order. The Vendor shall not invoice the City for any item that does not correspond to a line on the Purchase Order.

3.5.6. Items being billed on Markup line must have corresponding source Invoice, and that total and Markup breakdown must be reflected on Vendor's Invoice to the City. The Markup for items purchased on the percent Markup line, is for markup of items only. No Markup is allowed for taxes or freight charges. The taxes and freight charges will be a straight reimbursement, with no Markup.

3.5.7. Markup will be calculated as the following example:

If the part costs vendor \$100.00,
and the Markup on contract is 10%,
City will reimburse Vendor \$110.00.

3.5.8. Vendor will be responsible for collecting signature and legible name of City employee when delivering goods and/or services and must be able to produce said Proof of Delivery ("POD") upon request. The POD must contain an itemized list of goods and/or services. The POD must accompany each Department's payment packet before presenting the Invoice with all necessary backup to City's Accounts Payable Division. Including copy of POD with Invoice is encouraged and speeds payment processing time.

3.5.9. Vendor's Invoices that are billed inaccurately, incompletely, or otherwise unprocessable are not considered valid.

3.5.10. When sending City a Revised Invoice, it must be clearly marked "Revised." When sending City a replacement Invoice, it must reference the Invoice Number it is replacing.

3.5.11. Invoices to the City shall reference the City Department, Release Number, Work Order Number, and the first and last name of the City employee placing the order.
