General Information

1. Background and Intent

- a. Knoxville's Community Development Corporation (KCDC) is the public housing and redevelopment agency for the City of Knoxville and for Knox County in Tennessee. KCDC's affordable housing property portfolio includes 20 sites with approximately 3,525 dwelling units. Several of the properties include Low Income Housing Tax Credits units and KCDC is both the General Partner and the management company for those sites. Those properties include Eastport LP, Five Points 1, LP; Lonsdale Homes, LP; Northridge Crossing, LP and The Vista at Summit Hill, LP. KCDC also oversees approximately 3,958 Section 8 Vouchers, 82 Moderate Rehabilitation units and 20 Redevelopment areas.
- b. The intent of this solicitation is to have one supplier to provide Low Income Housing Tax Credit file monitoring services for KCDC. Details of desired services are in the Scope of Work section.

2. Changes after Award

It is possible that after award KCDC will need to revise the service needs or requirements specified in this document. KCDC reserves the right to make such changes after consultation with the supplier. Should additional costs arise, the supplier must document increased costs. KCDC reserves the right to accept and negotiate these charges.

3. Contact Policy

The supplier may not contact an officer, agent or employee of KCDC other than the KCDC's Procurement Division about matters pertaining to this solicitation, from the issuance of this solicitation until its award. Information obtained from an unauthorized officer, agent or employee of KCDC will not affect the risks or obligations assumed by the supplier or relieve the supplier from fulfilling any of the conditions of the project. Such contact can disqualify the supplier from participation in the solicitation process.

4. Evaluation

KCDC will evaluate this proposal as detailed below. KCDC alone determines (using NIGP's definition and other relevant sources as appropriate) the supplier's "responsive" and "responsible" status prior to award. Responsible means a business with the financial and technical capacity to perform the requirements of the solicitation and subsequent contract. A responsive proposal is one that fully conforms in all material respects to the solicitation document and all of its requirements, including all form and substance. KCDC reserves the right to request additional information to assist in the evaluation process; this includes references and business capacity information.

a. KCDC will review all proposals and reserves the right to request necessary modifications, waive minor technicalities, reject all proposals, reject any proposal that does not meet mandatory requirement(s) or cancel this RFP, according to KCDC's best interests.

b. KCDC's Evaluation Team may elect to interview one or more suppliers before making an award. Interviews may include an in person examination of the proposed product. KCDC shall not reimburse the supplier for the costs associated with the interview process.

c. The selection of a supplier is subject to the approval of any tax credit partners KCDC may have.

5. **General Instructions**

KCDC does not insert "General Instructions to Suppliers" in solicitation documents. These instructions are at www.kcdc.org. Click on "Procurement" and the link to the instructions. The supplier's submittal means acceptance of the terms and conditions set forth in KCDC's "General Instructions to Suppliers."

6. **Insurance**

The proposer agrees to maintain at its sole expense during the term of this agreement insurance coverages and limits in accordance with the proposer's standard business practices and acceptable to KCDC. Proposer shall provide KCDC with Certificates of Insurance evidencing such insurance prior to contract execution.

7. Invoicing/Ordering

- a. Until a purchase order is in place, work is not to be performed nor are goods to be delivered. KCDC has no legal obligation to pay for work performed prior to the issuance of a purchase order.
- b. Suppliers must submit invoices within 90 days of the delivery of goods or services. KCDC may deny invoices submitted after the 90 day threshold. KCDC prefers invoices arrive electronically within 10 days following the end of the month in which goods or services were supplied.
- c. KCDC's purchases of goods are exempt from Tennessee sales and use tax pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated 67-6-329(a) (4) and KCDC is generally exempt from the Federal Excise tax. Upon the placement of a purchase order or the award of a contract, KCDC will provide a State of Tennessee Sales Tax Exemption form to the supplier. KCDC will not pay taxes on invoices.
- d. KCDC pays by electronic transfer (ACH) only. Supplier's accounts receivable staff must use KCDC's Vendor Portal to ascertain payments made and to which invoices they apply. Suppliers will set up an account in KCDC's Vendor Portal so that they receive an email with each payment detailing the amount and invoice paid.
- e. Since KCDC is the managing partner for four separate corporations under the KCDC umbrella, those separate corporations must receive separate invoices. Thus the supplier will generally:

- Bill each specific site for work performed or goods delivered
- With KCDC's permission, generate one monthly master invoice showing all locations and their individual costs (except for those listed below)
- Create separate invoices for Five Points I, Lonsdale Homes, North Ridge Crossing and The Vista

8. Length of Award

The length of the contract will be twelve months with four optional annual renewals that KCDC may exercise at its discretion.

9. **Price Structure**

- a. At the end of each twelve month period, the awarded supplier may request a change to the percentage and/or specific item charged to KCDC. The supplier must provide proof of increased cost, in the form of Producer Price Index (PPI) increase for Knoxville to the Procurement Division. KCDC will decide whether to accept a price increase. If the price increase is accepted, the bid file will be so noted. If the price increase is not accepted, the supplier may:
 - 1. Continue with the existing pricing
 - 2. Suggest an alternative price increase
 - 3. End the award
- b. Suppliers may decrease prices at any time with or without notice.

Scope of Work

12. General Requirements

The selected supplier will review LIHTC tenant files for compliance with Section 42 of the Internal Revenue Code and to ensure that the household is qualified for the LIHTC program. This includes:

- Appropriate rent and income limits
- Appropriate utility allowance as provided by the property
- Household members defined
- Appropriate set aside limits as provided by the property
- Third party verification forms identified by the application and/or questionnaire
- Tenant affidavit forms as needed
- Other supporting documents such as tax returns, bank statements, pay stubs
- Completion and computation of all income and assets
- Correct actual household income limit on TIC
- TIC effective date
- Household student status
- Appropriate lease terms
- Required signatures
- IRS and state agency LIHTC compliance protocol
- Management's overall policies; procedures, and understanding of compliance requirements
- Compliance with gross rent requirements
- Unit mix and set aside requirements
- Compliance with age requirements for designated senior housing developments.

13. **Guidelines and Requirements**

Supplier will use the guidelines and requirements:

- Set forth by the IRS
- Of the state agency responsible for monitoring LIHTC compliance
- Industry standards
- Best Practices

14. Procedures

- a. Supplier will review the LIHTC files uploaded by KCDC for compliance with the LIHTC program and Section 42 requirements. Any findings or deficiencies identified will be recorded in a LIHTC file review report. Upon completion, the LIHTC file review report will be provided back to KCDC. Any files noted as having a deficiency will need to have the deficiencies corrected by KCDC. Corrected files that are resubmitted will be reviewed by the supplier and the results will be provided to KCDC.
- b. Supplier will not hold up approval of files based on minor compliance issues (as long as they do not affect eligibility).

c. Standard reviews are completed within two weeks from receipt.

15. Optional Services

KCDC desires pricing for certain optional services that it may require. These include:

a. Applicant File Pre-Approvals

This is for new properties leasing up for the first time or for existing properties as units tum over. Under this work, pending move-in files are reviewed for LIHTC eligibility.

b. Acquisition Rehab-Expedited Review of Existing Tenants

This service is available for properties with existing tenants that are funded using acquisition/rehab credits. In most cases, owners want to have all existing households certified within 120 days of the acquisition.

- c. Final Compliance Review (After Expedited Review)
 With this scope the site will send signed lease and TIC forms to the supplier for review.
- d. Investor Tenant File Annual Compliance Review This service provides a sampling of tenant files reviewed each year to ensure strong LIHTC compliance procedures are being applied by management staff.
- e. Acquisition Rehab-Standard Review of Existing Tenants
 This service is for properties with existing tenants that are funded using acquisition/rehab credits.

2. Contingent Fee Representation and Agreement

(a) Definitions. As used in this provision:

"Bona fide employee" means a person, employed by a bidder and subject to the bidder's supervision and control as to time, place, and manner of performance, who neither exerts, nor proposes to exert improper influence to solicit or obtain contracts nor holds out as being able to obtain any contract(s) through improper influence.

"Improper influence" means any influence that induces or tends to induce a PHA/IHA employee or officer to give consideration or to act regarding a PHA/IHA contract on any basis other than the merits of the matter.

- (b) The bidder represents and certifies as part of its bid that, except for full-time bona fide employees working solely for the bidder, the bidder:

6. Minimum Bid Acceptance Period

- (b) This provision supersedes any language pertaining to the acceptance period that may appear elsewhere in this solicitation.
- (c) The PHA/IHA requires a minimum acceptance period of 90 calendar days.
- (d) In the space provided immediately below, bidders may specify a longer acceptance period than the PHA's/IHA's minimum requirement. The bidder allows the following acceptance period:
- (e) A bid allowing less than the PHA's/IHA's minimum acceptance period will be rejected.
- (f) The bidder agrees to execute all that it has undertaken to do, in compliance with its bid, if that bid is accepted in writing within (1) the acceptance period stated in paragraph (c) above or (2) any longer acceptance period stated in paragraph (d) above.
