INTRODUCTION

A. PURPOSE OF THIS REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The purpose of the Request for Proposal (RFP) is to solicit sealed proposals to establish a contract through competitive negotiations for the procurement of direct youth services for FY24. The contract term will be for one year. Actual contract date will be dependent upon the City of Raton obtaining approval from CYFD to subcontract these services.

B. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City of Raton is the fiscal agent for the grant funding received from CYFD. The goal of the grant is to improve the Juvenile Justice System and decrease the incidences of juvenile delinquency in the community while increasing the emphasis on prevention and early intervention in juvenile justice services. The objective is to provide a continuum of cost effective services and temporary, non-secure alternatives to detention in the City of Raton, Colfax County and Union County for youth who have been arrested or referred to the juvenile probation office or are at risk of such referral. The Girls Circle and Boys Council Programs may be a prevention tool to serve youth before entering the system. To meet this objective, the City of Raton employs a part-time Continuum Coordinator and has a Community Advisory Board that oversees the programs. The City of Raton, contingent upon CYFD funding, agrees to Sub-Contract with a Sub-Contractor to provide the direct youth services through the Girls Circle and Boys Council.

C. SCOPE OF PROCURMENT

Minimum proposed services should include:

- The Sub-Contractor will work with the Continuum Coordinator who is independent from the Sub-Contractor and hired by the City of Raton to ensure compliance with all program requirements and to coordinate with the Sub-Contractor's program facilitator(s).
- The Sub-Contractor will employ two Girls Circle facilitators and two Boy's Council facilitators.
- The Contractor and Sub-Contractor will also be required to receive the mandated trauma responsive care and service delivery training per the terms of CYFD Agreement #21-690-3200-20841 amendment Four (4) Attachment 3 - Trauma Responsive Care and Services Training Requirement in accordance with KEVIN S., et. al. v. BLALOCK, et al., No. 1:18-cv-00896.
- The Sub-Contractor will pay for all training costs that are necessary to ensure certified facilitators and for the mandated trauma training.

- The total amount of the monies payable to the Sub-Contractor under this agreement for fiscal year 2024 shall not exceed the following:

GIRLS CIRCLE (\$165 x 469 circles)	\$ 77,385.00
BOYS COUNCIL (\$165 x 200 sessions)	\$ <u>33,000.00</u>
<i>GC/BC based on serving 125 youth</i>	110,385.00

The Sub-contractor will be required to serve a total of 469 group sessions per the Girls Circle Program, 200 group sessions per Boys Council Program.

- The City of Raton Continuum, to include the Sub-Contractor, shall be required to source a minimum of forty percent (40%) of the total budgeted grant amount with local matching funds. The Sub-Contractor is required to report all expenses not covered by the FY24 Grant as a Match Contribution. The local matching funds may consist of money, land, equipment or in-kind services to be reported to the Continuum Coordinator every month with monthly invoicing by the Sub-contractor. Invoicing will be due to the Continuum Coordinator by the 5th of every month for the month prior. Upon receiving Sub-Contract approval, the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator will meet with the selected Sub-Contractor and will train all staff and program management about the Match Requirements and will distribute a schedule for the FY24 Contract that must be met and Signatures of all in attendance will be obtained on the training record sheet provided by the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator and a copy will be given to every individual in attendance as proof for individual records and Sub-Contractor record.
- The Sub-Contractor will have a system in place to purchase the necessary supplies for all program sessions which is included in the reimbursable fee per service amounts. The Budget Fee Per Service Schedule is the following:
 \$165.00 x 469 Girls Circle Sessions
 \$165.00 x 200 Boys Council Session
 The Sub-Contractor will be required to complete the Girls Circle and the Boys Council intakes provided by www.onecirclefoundation.org, pre/post surveys, and will be required to share all data with the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator.
- The Sub-Contractor shall not bill any insurance for the services provided in the Girls Circle and Boys Council.
- The City of Raton will bind Sub-Contractor to the terms of the Agreement No. 21-690-3200-20841 and all amendments provided by the State of New Mexico Children, Youth and families department agreement. (see Appendix G)
- The Sub-Contractor will be responsible for having an electronic copy and a hard copy of all Contracts, Notes, Participant Demographics, Data, and Trainings.
- The Sub-Contractor will ensure facilitators are available to attend all City of Raton Continuum Advisory Board Meetings to give Program Updates and Upcoming Events Information, if unable to be in attendance, the subcontractor is required to email a monthly update to the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator.

- The Sub-Contractor will work with the Continuum Coordinator on Referrals for Participants of each Program and will provide all data necessary to allow the Contractor to be able to measure Outcomes and Performance measures as set in the Agreement No. 21-690-3200-20841 and amendment Four (5) between the City of Raton and CYFD.
- The Sub-Contractor will provide all monthly notes to the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator to measure monthly progress in each program and will include dates and Participant Information/Demographics.
- The Sub-Contractor will have a system in place to receive all referrals via e-scan or fax and will email referrals to the Continuum Coordinator no later than three (3) days after receiving the referral.
- The Sub-Contractor will ensure the facilitators are available for a Scheduled Team Meeting once every month to ensure the success of the programs and sustainability.
- The Sub-Contractor and the Continuum Coordinator will work together to schedule upcoming groups to ensure the timeline is met for FY24.
- The Sub-Contractor shall submit certified and documented invoices and vouchers monthly for actual work performed and expenses incurred to the Contractor. The Sub-Contractor's failure to submit such payment vouchers, invoices, and supporting documentation within 5 days after they are due the 5th of every month, may result in the non-availability of funds for payment and/or denial of payment by the City of Raton.
- The Sub-Contractor will provide services in all locations in Colfax and Union Counties as outlined in the Monthly Schedule provided to the facilitators by the Continuum Coordinator and provided once per month by email.
- The Sub-Contractor will maintain all Collaborative Partnerships with a Positive Attitude and Continuing Collaborative Efforts to ensure the success of the Programs in the Girls Circle, and the Boys Council Programs.
- The Sub-Contractor will provide program services to all participants who may be referred by self, by parent, by school, by JPO, and by any Collaborative Partner.
- Pursuant to Article VIII, the Sub-contractor will be subject to Maintenance of Records and Financial Audit of Agreement Number 21-690-3200-20841.
- The City of Raton has the right to terminate services with a 30-day written notice to the Sub-Contractor if any areas of the scope of work are not being fulfilled per the terms of the executed Sub-contract.

Proposals will be evaluated, and an award made to the most responsible, responsive offeror submitting the proposal most advantageous to the City of Raton. The City of Raton reserves the right to reject any or all proposals or any portion thereof as deemed in the best interest of the City.

D. PROCUREMENT MANAGER

Any inquiries or requests regarding this procurement should be submitted, in writing, to the Procurement Manager. Offerors may contact only the Procurement Manager regarding this procurement. Evaluation Committee members do not have the authority to respond on behalf of the City of Raton.

Any bidder or offeror who is aggrieved in connection with a solicitation or award of a contract may protest to the Procurement Manager. The protest shall be submitted in writing within fifteen calendar days after knowledge of the facts or occurrences giving rise to the protest. Protests of the solicitation or award must be delivered by mail to the Procurement Manager. Only protests delivered directly to the Procurement Manager in writing and in a timely fashion will be considered to have been submitted properly and in accordance with statute, rule, and this Request for Proposals. Emailed protests will not be considered.

B. EXPLANATION OF EVENTS

The following paragraphs describe the activities listed in the sequence of events shown in Section II. A. above.

1. Issuance of RFP

This RFP is being issued on behalf of the City of Raton on June 1, 2023.

2. Acknowledgement of Receipt

Potential Offerors should hand deliver, return by facsimile, regular mail or email the “acknowledgement of Receipt of Request for Proposals Form” that accompanies this document (Appendix A) to have their organization placed on the procurement distribution list. The form should be signed by an authorized representative of the organization, dated, and returned to the Procurement Manager by 5:00 pm MST on **June 9, 2023**.

The procurement distribution list will be used for distribution of written responses to questions. Failure to return the Acknowledgement of Receipt form shall constitute a presumption of receipt and rejection of the RFP, and the potential Offeror’s organization name shall not appear on the distribution list.

3. Deadline to Submit Written Questions

Potential Offerors may submit written questions to the Procurement Manager as to the intent or clarity of this RFP until 5:00 p.m. MST on June 14, 2023 as indicated in the sequence of events. All written questions must be addressed to the Procurement Manager as declared in Section I, Paragraph D. Questions shall be clearly labeled and shall cite the Section(s) in the RFP or other documents which form the basis of question.

4. Response to Written Questions

Written responses to written questions will be distributed as indicated in the sequence of events to all potential Offerors whose organization name appears on the procurement distribution list. An e-mail copy will be sent to all Offeror’s that provide Acknowledgement of Receipt Forms described in II.B.2 before the deadline. Additional copies will be posted to: www.ratonnm.gov

5. Submission of Proposal

All proposals must be received by the City no later than the date and time specified. **Proposals received after the deadline will not be accepted.** The date and time of receipt will be recorded on each proposal. Proposals must be hand delivered or mailed to:

Offeror must submit 1 original and (3) copies of its proposal in a sealed envelope or container labeled on the outside to clearly indicate that they are in response to

the City of Raton Direct Youth Services Girls Circle and Boys Council RFP # 2023-06-1. Submittals are due by 5 p.m., Tuesday June 20, 2023 in the Office of the City Clerk.

Proposals received after this deadline will not be accepted. The date and time of receipt will be recorded on each proposal. Proposals submitted by facsimile, or other electronic means will not be accepted.

A public log will be kept of the names of all Offeror organizations that submitted proposals. Pursuant to NMSA 1978 13-1-116, the contents of proposals shall not be disclosed to competing potential offerors during the negotiation process. The negotiation process is deemed to be in effect until the contract is awarded pursuant to this Request for Proposals. Awarded in this context means the final required City of Raton signature on the contract(s) resulting from the procurement has been obtained.

6. Proposal Evaluation

An Evaluation Committee will perform the evaluation of proposals. This process will take place as indicated in the sequence of events, depending upon the number of proposals received. During this time, the Procurement Manager may initiate discussions with Offerors who submit responsive or potentially responsive proposals for clarifying aspects of the proposals. However, proposals may be accepted and evaluated without such discussion. Discussions SHALL NOT be initiated by the Offerors.

7. Finalize Contractual Agreements

Any Contractual agreement resulting from this RFP will be finalized with the most advantageous Offeror(s) as per schedule Section II.A. Sequence of Events or as soon thereafter as possible. This date is subject to change at the discretion of the City of Raton. In the event mutually agreeable terms cannot be reached with the apparent most advantageous Offeror in the time specified, the City of Raton reserves the right to finalize a contractual agreement with the next most advantageous Offeror(s) without undertaking a new procurement process.

8. Contract Awards

After review of the Evaluation Committee Report and the signed contractual agreement, the Agency Procurement office will award as per the schedule in Section II. A., Sequence of Events or as soon as possible thereafter. This date is subject to change at the discretion of the City of Raton.

The contract shall be awarded to the Offeror whose proposal is the most advantageous to the City of Raton, taking into consideration the evaluation factors set forth in this RFP. The most advantageous proposal may or may not have received the most points. The award is also subject to appropriate City

Commission approval. The selected sub-contractor will be required to provide their NM Business Taxpayer Identification Number (BTIN #), Federal EIN # and be actively registered with Sam.gov and provide Unique Entity ID (UEI).

9. Protest Deadline

Any protest by an Offeror must be timely and in conformance with NMSA 13-1-172 and applicable procurement regulations. Only protests delivered directly to the Protest Manager in writing and in a timely fashion will be considered to have been submitted properly and in accordance with statute, rule, and this Request for Proposals. The 15-calendar day protest period shall begin on the day following the award of contracts and will end at 5:00 PM MST on the 15th day. Protests must be written and must include the name and address of the protestor and the request for proposal number. It must also contain a statement of the grounds for protest including appropriate supporting exhibits and it must specify the ruling requested from the party listed below.

Protests received after the deadline will not be accepted.

C. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Acceptance of Conditions Governing the Procurement

Potential Offerors must indicate their acceptance of the Conditions Governing the Procurement section in the letter of transmittal. Submission of a proposal constitutes acceptance of the Evaluation Factors contained in Section V of this RFP.

2. Incurring Cost

Any cost incurred by the Potential Offeror in preparation, transmittal, and/or presentation of any proposal or material submitted in response to this RFP shall be borne solely by the Offeror. Any cost incurred by the Offeror for set up and demonstration of the proposed equipment and/or system shall be borne solely by the Offeror.

3. Prime Contractor Responsibility

Any contractual agreement that may result from this RFP shall specify that the prime contractor is solely responsible for fulfillment of all requirements of the contractual agreement with the City of Raton which may derive from this

RFP. The City of Raton entering into a contractual agreement with a vendor will make payments to only the prime contractor.

4. Amended Proposals

An Offeror may submit an amended proposal before the deadline for receipt of proposals. Such amended proposals must be complete replacements for a previously submitted proposal and must be clearly identified as such in the transmittal letter. The Agency personnel will not merge, collate, or assemble proposal materials.

5. Offeror's Rights to Withdraw Proposal

Offerors will be allowed to withdraw their proposals at any time prior to the deadline for receipts of proposals. The Offeror must submit a written withdrawal request addressed to the Procurement Manager and signed by the Offeror's duly authorized representative. The approval or denial of withdrawal requests received after the deadline for receipts of the proposals is governed by the applicable procurement regulations.

6. Proposal Offer Firm

Responses to this RFP, including proposal prices for services, will be considered firm for one hundred twenty (120) days after the due date for receipt of proposals or ninety (90) days after the due date for the receipt of a best and final offer, if the Offeror is invited or required to submit one.

7. Disclosure of Proposal Contents

- A. Proposals will be kept confidential until negotiations and the award are completed by the Agency. At that time, all proposals and documents pertaining to the proposals will be open to the public, except for material that is clearly marked proprietary or confidential. The Procurement Manager will not disclose or make public any pages of proposal on which the potential Offeror has stamped or imprinted "proprietary" or "confidential" subject to the following requirements.
- B. Proprietary or confidential data shall be readily separable from the proposal to facilitate eventual public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the proposal.
- C. Confidential data is restricted to:
 - 1. Confidential financial information concerning the Offeror's organization;
 - 2. and data that qualifies as a trade secret in accordance with the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, NMSA 1978 57-3A-1 to 57-3A-

3. PLEASE NOTE: The price of products offered, or the cost of services proposed **shall not be designated** as proprietary or confidential information.

If a request is received for disclosure of data for which an Offeror has made a written request for confidentiality, the Agency shall examine the Offeror's request and make a written determination that specifies which portions of the proposal should be disclosed. Unless the Offeror takes legal action to prevent the disclosure, the proposal will be so disclosed. The proposal shall be open to public inspection subject to any continuing prohibition of the disclosure of confidential data.

8. No Obligation

This RFP in no manner obligates the City of Raton to the use of any Offeror's services until a valid written contract is awarded and approved by appropriate authorities.

9. Termination

This RFP may be canceled at any time and all proposals may be rejected in whole or in part when the agency determines such action to be in the best interest of the City of Raton.

10. Sufficient Appropriation

Any contract awarded because of this RFP process may be terminated if sufficient appropriations or authorizations do not exist. Such terminations will be affected by sending written notice to the contractor. The Agency's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations and authorizations are available will be accepted by the contractor as final.

11. Legal Review

The Agency requires that all Offerors agree to be bound by the General Requirements contained in this RFP. Any Offeror's concerns must be promptly submitted in writing to the attention of the Procurement Manager.

12. Governing Law

This RFP and any agreement with an Offeror which may result from this procurement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico.

13. Basis for Proposal

Only information supplied, in writing, by the Agency through the Procurement Manager or in this RFP should be used as the basis for the preparation of Offeror proposals.

14. Contract Terms and Conditions

The Contract between an agency and a contractor will follow the format specified by the Agency. However, the contracting agency reserves the right to negotiate provisions in addition to those contained in this RFP with any Offeror. The contents of this RFP, as revised and/or supplemented, and the successful Offeror's proposal will be incorporated in to and become part of any resultant contract. (sample subcontract -Appendix E)

The Agency discourages exceptions from the contract terms and conditions. Such exceptions may cause a proposal to be rejected as nonresponsive when, in the sole judgment of the Agency (and its evaluation team), the proposal appears to be conditioned on the exception, or correction of what is deemed to be a deficiency, or an unacceptable exception is proposed which would require a substantial proposal rewrite to correct.

Should an Offeror object to any of the terms and conditions as set forth in the RFP strongly enough to propose alternate terms and conditions despite the above, the Offeror must propose specific alternative language. The Agency may or may not accept the alternative language. General references to the Offeror's terms and conditions or attempts at complete substitutions are not acceptable to the Agency and will result in disqualification of the Offeror's proposal.

15. Offeror's Terms and Conditions

Offerors must submit with the proposal a complete set of any additional terms and conditions they expect to have included in a contract negotiated with the Agency.

16. Contract Deviations

Any additional terms and conditions, which may be the subject of negotiation, will be discussed only between the Agency and the Offeror selected and shall not be deemed an opportunity to amend the Offeror's proposal.

17. Offeror Qualifications

The Evaluation Committee may make such investigations as necessary to determine the ability of the potential Offeror to adhere to the requirements specified within this RFP. The Evaluation Committee will reject the proposal of any potential Offeror who is not a Responsible Offeror or fails to submit a responsive offer as defined in NMSA 1978, 13-1-83 and 13-1-85.

18. Right to Waive Minor Irregularities

The Evaluation Committee reserves the right to waive minor irregularities. The Evaluation Committee also reserves the right to waive mandatory requirements if all the otherwise responsive proposals failed to meet the mandatory requirements and the failure to do so does not otherwise materially affect the procurement. This right is at the sole discretion of the Evaluation Committee.

19. Change in Contractor Representatives

The Agency reserves the right to require a change in contractor representatives if the assigned representative(s) is (are) not, in the opinion of the Agency, adequately meeting the needs of the Agency.

20. Notice of Penalties

The Procurement Code, NMSA 1978, 13-1-28 through 13-1-199, imposes civil, misdemeanor and felony criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for bribes, gratuities, and kickbacks.

21. Agency Rights

The Agency in agreement with the Evaluation Committee reserves the right to accept all or a portion of a potential Offeror's proposal.

22. Right to Publish

Throughout the duration of this procurement process and contract term, Offeror's and contractors must secure from the agency written approval prior to the release of any information that pertains to the potential work or activities covered by this procurement and/or agency contracts deriving from this procurement. Failure to adhere to this requirement may result in disqualification of the Offeror's proposal or removal from the contract.

23. Ownership of Proposals

All documents submitted in response to the RFP shall become property of the City of Raton.

24. Confidentiality

Any confidential information provided to, or developed by, the contractor in the performance of the contract resulting from this RFP shall be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the contractor without the prior written approval of the Agency.

The Contractor(s) agrees to protect the confidentiality of all confidential information and not to publish or disclose such information to any third party without the procuring Agency's written permission.

25. Electronic mail address required

A large part of the communication regarding this procurement will be conducted by electronic mail (e-mail). Offeror must have a valid e-mail address to receive this correspondence. (See also Section II.B.4, Response to Written Questions).

26. Use of Electronic Versions of this RFP

This RFP is being made available by electronic means. In the event of conflict between a version of the RFP in the Offeror's possession and the version maintained by the agency, the Offeror acknowledges that the version maintained by the agency shall govern.

27. Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form

Offeror must complete, sign, and return the Campaign Contribution Disclosure Form, Appendix B, as a part of their proposal. This requirement applies regardless whether a covered contribution was made or not made for the positions of Governor and Lt. Governor or other identified official. Failure to complete and return the signed unaltered form will result in disqualification.

28. Letter of Transmittal

Offeror's proposal must be accompanied by the Letter of Transmittal Form located in Appendix C which must be completed and signed by an individual person authorized to obligate the company. The letter of transmittal MUST:

1. Identify the submitting business entity.
2. Identify the name, title, telephone, and e-mail address of the person authorized by the Offeror organization to contractually obligate the business entity providing the Offer.
3. Identify the name, title, telephone, and e-mail address of the person authorized to negotiate the contract on behalf of the organization (if different than (2) above).
4. Identify the names, titles, telephone, and e-mail addresses of persons to be contacted for clarification/questions regarding proposal content.
5. Identify sub-contractors (if any) anticipated to be utilized in the performance of any resultant contract award.
6. Describe the relationship with any other entity which will be used in the performance of any resultant contract award.

7. Identify the following with a check mark and signature where required:
 - a. Explicitly indicate acceptance of the Conditions Governing the Procurement stated in Section II.C.1;
 - b. Acceptance of Section V of this RFP; and
 - c. Acknowledge receipt of all amendments to this RFP.
8. Be signed by the person identified in paragraph 2 above.

29. Conflict of Interest: Governmental Conduct Act.

The Offeror warrants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance or services required under the Agreement. The Offeror certifies requirements of the Governmental Conduct Act, Sections 10-16-1 through 10-16-18, NMSA 1978, regarding contracting with a public officer or state employee or former state employee have been followed. The Conflict-of-Interest Certification form (Appendix D) must be included with proposal.

30. Disclosure Regarding Responsibility

- A. Any prospective Contract and any of its Principals who enter into a contract greater than sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) with any state agency or local public body for professional services, tangible personal property, services or construction agrees to disclose whether the Contractor, or any principal of the Contractor's company:
 1. Is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, or declared ineligible for award of contract by any federal entity, state agency or local public body.
 2. Has within a three-year period preceding this offer, been convicted in a criminal matter or had a civil judgment rendered against them for:
 - a. The commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) contract or sub-contract.
 - b. Violation of Federal or state antitrust statutes related to the submission of offers; or
 - c. The commission in any federal or state jurisdiction of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification, or destruction of records, making false statements, tax evasion, violation of Federal criminal tax law, or receiving stolen property.
 3. Is presently indicted for, or otherwise criminally or civilly charge by any (federal state or local) government entity with the commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph A of this disclosure;
 4. Has, preceding this offer, been notified of any delinquent Federal or state taxes in an amount that exceeds \$3,000.00 of which the liability remains unsatisfied. Taxes are considered delinquent if the following criteria apply.

- a. The tax liability is finally determined. The liability is finally determined if it has been assessed. A liability is not finally determined if there is a pending administrative or judicial challenge. In the case of a judicial challenge of liability, the liability is not finally determined until all judicial appeal rights have been exhausted.
 - b. The taxpayer is delinquent in making payment. A taxpayer is delinquent if the taxpayer has failed to pay the tax liability when full payment was due and required. A taxpayer is not delinquent in cases where enforced collection action is precluded.
 - c. Have within a three-year period preceding this offer, had one or more contracts terminated for default by any federal or state agency or local public body.)
- B. Principal, for this disclosure, means an officer, director, owner, partner, or a person having primary management or supervisory responsibilities within a business entity or related entities.
- C. The Contractor shall provide immediate written notice to the Procurement Manager or other party to this Agreement if, at any time during the term of this Agreement, the Contractor learns that the Contractor's disclosure was at any time erroneous or became erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
- D. A disclosure that any of the items in this requirement exist will not necessarily result in termination of this Agreement. However, the disclosure will be considered in the determination of the Contractor's responsibility and ability to perform under this Agreement. Failure of the Contractor to finish a disclosure or provide additional information as requested will render the Offeror nonresponsive.
- E. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records to render, in good faith, the disclosure required by this document. The knowledge and information of a Contractor is not required to exceed that which is the normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.
- F. The disclosure requirement provided is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when making an award and is a continuing material representation of the facts during the term of this Agreement. If during the performance of the contract, the Contractor is indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by any contract, the Contractor is indicted for other otherwise criminally or civilly charged by any government entity (federal, state or local) with commission of any offenses named in this document the Contractor must provide immediate written notice the City of Raton. If it is later determined that the Contractor knowingly rendered an erroneous disclosure, in addition to the

other remedies available to the Government, the City of Raton Purchasing Agent may terminate the involved contract for cause. Still further the City of Raton Purchasing Agent may suspend or debar the Contractor from eligibility for future solicitation until the matter is resolved to the satisfaction of the City of Raton Purchasing Agent.

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this _____ day of _____ 2023, by and between **THE CITY OF RATON**, a New Mexico Municipal Corporation, (hereinafter referred to "City") the Contractor, _____, (hereinafter referred to as "_____, Inc.", the Subcontractor).

WHEREAS, the City approved acceptance and executed Agreement with the State of New Mexico, ex rel Children, Youth and Families Department (CYFD) on _____; and

WHEREAS, It is the intent of the parties that the Contractor be the fiscal agent for those funds to be distributed pursuant to Agreement Number 21-690-3200-20841 starting July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor will enter into a sub-contract with _____ to provide the direct youth services starting July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024. The contract term will be for one year.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Article XVI - the Contractor has received written approval by the State of New Mexico, ex rel Children, Youth and Family Department allowing services to be subcontracted to _____ under Agreement Number 21-690-3200-20841 (copies of which are attached hereto); and

WHEREAS, the Subcontractor is willing to perform the duties as defined thereunder,

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED THAT:

1. The Contractor, contingent upon CYFD funding, hereby agrees to subcontract with _____ in the amount of \$110,385.00 as defined by the FY24 budget attached hereto as "Attachment 2" and to provide the direct youth services through the Girls Circle Program and Boys Council Program as set forth in the scope of work attached hereto as "Attachment 1". The total amount of the monies payable to the Sub-Contractor for providing the specified number of sessions shall not exceed the following:

GIRLS CIRCLE (\$165 x 469 circles)	\$ 77,385.00
BOYS COUNCIL (\$165 x 200 sessions)	\$ <u>33,000.00</u>
<i>GC/BC based on serving 125 youth</i>	\$110,385.00

2. Subcontractor shall provide the agreed upon services and comply with all requirements of the attachments or agreements between the City and the State of New Mexico, ex rel Children, Youth and Families Department.

3. Subcontractor agrees to perform within the approved budget, and to comply with all necessary requirements for approval of the funds that have been earmarked for this agreement, and any other funds that may be appropriated.

4. Pursuant to Article VIII, the subcontractor will be subject to Maintenance of Records and Financial Audit of Agreement Number 21-690-3200-20841.

5. Subcontractor and any persons acting under them, are independent contractors, and shall not accrue any rights as to retirement, benefits, or anything else, otherwise conveyed by the City to its employees and shall be subject to all applicable sales taxes, State and Federal Income taxes.

6. The City, contingent upon CYFD funding, will employ a part-time JJAC Coordinator position for the City of Raton Continuum Advisory Board making this position independent from the subcontractor. The JJAC Coordinator will report to this board and to the Contractor to ensure compliance with all program requirements.

7. The Sub-Contractor will work with the Continuum Coordinator who is independent from the Sub-Contractor and hired by the City of Raton to ensure compliance with all program requirements and to coordinate with the Sub-Contractor's JJAC program facilitators.

8. The Sub-Contractor will employ two (2) Girls Circle Facilitators and two (2) Boy's Council facilitators. The number of facilitators and group size is subject to coordination with the City of Raton Continuum Advisory Board.

9. The Contractor and Sub-Contractor will also be required to receive the mandated trauma responsive care and service delivery training per the terms of CYFD Agreement #21-690-3200-20841 amendment Four (4) Attachment 3 - Trauma Responsive Care and Services Training Requirement in accordance with KEVIN S., et. al. v. BLALOCK, et al., No. 1:18-cv-00896.

10. The City of Raton Continuum to include the Sub-Contractor shall be required to source a minimum of forty-percent (40%) of the total budgeted grant amount with local matching funds. The Sub-Contractor is required to report all expenses not covered by the FY24 Grant as a Match Contribution to the \$110,385.00 of Grant Funding. Match must be used to support the Agency funded projects and must be verifiable. The local matching funds may consist of money, land, equipment or in-kind services to be reported to the Continuum Coordinator every month with monthly invoicing by the Subcontractor. Invoicing will be due to the Continuum Coordinator by the 5th of every month for the month prior.

11. Upon receiving Sub-Contract approval, the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator will meet with the FY24 Sub-Contractor and will train all staff and program management about the Match Requirements and will distribute a schedule for the FY24 Contract that must be met and Signatures of all in attendance will be obtained on the training record sheet provided by the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator and a copy will be given to every individual in attendance as proof for individual records and Sub-Contractor record.

12. The Sub-Contractor will have a system in place to purchase the necessary supplies for all program sessions. These costs are included in the Budget Fee Per Service Schedule: \$165.00 per Girls Circle Session and \$165.00 per Boys Council Session.

13. The Sub-Contractor shall not bill any insurance for the services provided in the Girls Circle and Boy's Council.

14. The Sub-Contractor will be required to complete the Girls Circle and Boys Council intakes provided by www.onecirclefoundation.org, CYFD Salesforce surveys and will be required to share all data with the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator.

15. The City of Raton will bind Sub-Contractor to the terms of the Agreement No. 21-690-3200-20841 provided by the State of New Mexico Children, Youth and families department agreement amendment Four (5) (copies of which are attached hereto)

16. The Sub-Contractor will be responsible for having an electronic copy and a hard copy of all Contracts, Notes, Participant Demographics, Data, and Trainings.

17. The Sub-Contractor will ensure the facilitators are available to attend all City of Raton Continuum Advisory Board Meetings to give Program Updates and Upcoming Events information, if unable to be in attendance at the CORCAB Meetings, the subcontractor is required to email a monthly update to the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator.

18. The Sub-Contractor will work with the Continuum Coordinator on Referrals for Participants of each Program and will provide all data necessary to allow the Contractor to be able to measure Outcomes and Performance measures as set in the Agreement No. 21-690-3200-20841 between the City of Raton and CYFD.

19. The Sub-Contractor will provide all monthly notes to the City of Raton Continuum Coordinator to measure monthly progress in each program and will include dates and Participant Information/Demographics.

21. The Sub-Contractor and the Continuum Coordinator will work together to schedule upcoming groups to ensure the timeline is met for FY24.

22. The Sub-Contractor will have a system in place to receive all referrals via e-scan or fax and will email referrals to the Continuum Coordinator no later than (3) days after receiving the referral.

23. The Sub-Contractor will ensure the facilitators are available for a Scheduled Team Meeting once every month to ensure the success of the programs and sustainability.

24. The Sub-Contractor shall submit certified and documented invoices and vouchers monthly for actual work performed and expenses incurred to the Contractor. The Sub-Contractor's failure to submit such payment vouchers, invoices, and supporting documentation within 5 days after they are due the 5th of every month, may result in the non-availability of funds for payment and/or denial of payment by the City of Raton.

25. The Sub-Contractor will provide services in all locations in Colfax and Union Counties as outlined in the Monthly Schedule provided to the facilitators by the Continuum Coordinator and provided once per month by email.

26. The Sub-Contractor will maintain all Collaborative Partnerships with a positive attitude and Continuing Collaborative Efforts to ensure the success of the Programs in the Girls Circle and Boy's Council Programs.

27. The Sub-Contractor will provide program services to all participants who may be referred by self, by parent, by school, by JPO, and by any Collaborative Partner.

28. The Contractor has the right to terminate services with a 30-day written notice to the Sub-Contractor if any areas of the scope of work are not being fulfilled. The Sub-Contractor must also provide a 30-day written notice if terminating services under this contract.

29. This sub-contract does not relieve the City from any obligations and liabilities under its agreement with CYFD. The City, with the assistance of its JJAC Coordinator and the Raton Continuum Board, will perform all other required duties as defined by Agreement Number 21-690-3200-20841.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the State of New Mexico, **CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES DEPARTMENT**, hereinafter referred to as the “Agency,” and **City of Raton** hereinafter referred to as the “Contractor,” and is effective as of the date set forth below upon which it is executed by the Agency.

WHEREAS, the Agency is the State agency designated to receive and administer federal funds and desires to engage and the contractor is willing to provide the services outlined pursuant to Article II - Scope of Work.

NOW THEREFORE, the Agency and the Contractor in consideration of mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, do hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. Term of Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE ON THE DATE UPON WHICH IT IS EXECUTED BY THE AGENCY SECRETARY OR DESIGNEE. This Agreement shall terminate on **June 30, 2025** unless terminated pursuant to Article VI (Termination of Agreement), or Article XXIII (Appropriations).

ARTICLE II. Scope of Work

The Contractor shall provide the program of services as set forth in the scope of work which is attached hereto as “**Attachment 1 – Scope of Work**” and incorporated herein by reference, unless amended or terminated pursuant to Article VI (Termination of Agreement), or Article XXIII (Appropriations), *infra*. In consideration for the provision of those services, the Agency agrees to purchase and the Contractor agrees to perform the services identified in the Scope of Work.

If applicable to the performance of the scope of work herein (direct service delivery to a child or other care recipient by staff and employees of child-care facilities, including every facility or program having primary custody of children for twenty hours or more per week, juvenile treatment facilities, and direct provider of care for children in the following settings: Children’s behavioral health services and licensed and registered child care, including shelter care), or if the performance of the scope of work places Contractor in the position of coming into contact with client data, Contractor and its staff and employees, and other prospective subcontractors are required to obtain a Background Check (a screen of the Children, Youth and Families Department’s information databases, state and federal criminal records and any other reasonably reliable information about an applicant) in accordance with 8.8.3.2 NMAC - Rp, 8.8.3.2 NMAC, 03/31/06.

ARTICLE III. Limitation of Cost

The Agency shall pay to the Contractor for services satisfactorily performed as outlined in the budget which is made part of this Agreement as **Attachment 2 – Budget**. The total amount of the monies payable to the Contractor under this Agreement shall not exceed **Four Hundred Seventy Four Thousand Six Hundred Dollars and Zero Cents (\$474,600.00)**. The annual budget is attached hereto as “**Attachment 2 – Budget**” and incorporated herein by reference.

ARTICLE IV. Payment

The Agency shall make monthly payments to the Contractor for services and costs specified in **Attachment 2 - Budget**. The Contractor shall submit certified and documented invoices and vouchers monthly for actual work performed and expenses incurred to the Agency. The Contractor’s failure to submit such payment vouchers, invoices, and supporting documentation within fifteen (15) days after they are due may result in the non-availability of funds for payment and/or the denial of payment by the Agency.

ARTICLE V. Return of Funds

Upon termination of this Agreement, or after the services provided for herein have been rendered, surplus money, if any, shall be returned by the Contractor to the Agency.

ARTICLE VI. Termination of Agreement

A. Grounds. The Agency may terminate this Agreement for convenience or cause. The Contractor may only terminate this Agreement based upon the Agency’s uncured, material breach of this Agreement.

B. Notice: Agency Opportunity to Cure.

1. Except as otherwise provided in Article (VI)(B)(3), the Agency shall give Contractor written notice of termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination.

2. Contractor shall give Agency written notice of termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination, which notice shall (i) identify all the Agency’s material breaches of this Agreement upon which the termination is based and (ii) state what the Agency must do to cure such material breaches. Contractor’s notice of termination shall only be effective (i) if the Agency does not cure all material breaches within the thirty (30) day notice period or (ii) in the case of material breaches that cannot be cured within thirty (30) days, the Agency does not, within the thirty (30) day notice period, notify the Contractor of its intent to cure and begin with due diligence to cure the material breach.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement may be terminated immediately upon written notice to the Contractor (i) if the Contractor becomes unable to perform the services contracted for, as determined by the Agency; (ii) if, during the term of this Agreement, the Contractor is suspended or debarred by the State Purchasing Agent; or (iii) the Agreement is terminated pursuant to Article XXIII, “Appropriations”, of this Agreement.

C. Liability. Except as otherwise expressly allowed or provided under this Agreement, the Agency’s sole liability upon termination shall be to pay for acceptable work performed prior to the Contractor’s receipt or issuance of a notice of termination; provided, however, that a notice of termination shall not nullify or otherwise affect either party’s liability for pre-termination defaults under or breaches of this Agreement. The Contractor shall submit an invoice for such work within thirty (30) days of receiving or sending the notice of termination. *THIS PROVISION IS NOT EXCLUSIVE AND DOES NOT WAIVE THE AGENCY’S OTHER LEGAL RIGHTS AND REMEDIES CAUSED BY THE CONTRACTOR’S DEFAULT/BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT.*

D. Termination Management. If this agreement is terminated pursuant to its provisions, or if the parties mutually agree to discontinue their contractual relationship, or upon expiration of the term of the AGREEMENT, immediately upon expiration or receipt by either the Agency or the Contractor of notice of termination of this agreement, the Contractor shall: 1) not incur any further obligations for salaries, services or any other expenditure of funds under this agreement without

written approval of the Agency, except as provided in part (4) of this paragraph, below; 2) comply with all directives issued by the Agency in the notice of termination as to the performance of work under this agreement; and 3) take such action as the Agency shall direct for the protection, preservation, retention or transfer of all property titled to the Agency and records generated under this agreement, and 4) if providing health services or client support as part of the scope of work of this agreement, continue to provide essential services and supports to ensure the health and safety of individual clients as directed by the Agency during the period of termination management. This requirement is not avoided by an inadvertent expiration of term for the agreement. In this event the Agency may temporarily extend the term, enter into a new short-term agreement or otherwise enter into an agreement, consistent with the New Mexico Procurement Code until all transition of services are completed. As of the date of termination of this agreement, the Contractor shall furnish to the Agency: (a) a complete detailed inventory of nonexpendable Agency property or equipment provided to or purchased by the Contractor with agreement funds as defined in Article 31 (Property) of this agreement, and (b) a final closing of the financial records and books of accounts which were required to be kept by the Contractor under the provisions of this agreement regarding financial records. Any non-expendable personal property or equipment provided to or purchased by the Contractor with agreement funds shall become property of the Agency upon termination and shall be submitted to the agency as soon as practicable.

ARTICLE VII. Funds Accountability

The parties shall provide for strict accountability of all monies made subject to this Agreement. The Contractor shall maintain fiscal records, follow generally accepted accounting principles, and account for all receipts and disbursements of funds transferred to the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement. The Contractor will include all monies made subject to this Agreement in the annual audit and will provide the Agency with a copy of the annual audit.

ARTICLE VIII. Maintenance of Records

A. The Contractor shall maintain detailed time and expenditure records that indicate the date; time, nature and cost of services rendered during the agreement's term and effect and retain them for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment under this agreement. The records shall be subject to inspection by the Agency, the Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. The Agency shall have the right to audit billings both before and after payment. Payment under this agreement shall not foreclose the right of the Agency to recover excessive or illegal payments.

B. If Contractor receiving state or federal funds from the Agency shall comply, if applicable, with auditing requirements under the Single Audit Act (31 U.S.C. §7501, et seq.) and the New Mexico State Auditor's rules and regulations. If the Contractor is determined to be a sub recipient and not a vendor under the federal Single Audit Act, the Contractor shall comply with the audit requirements of the Single Audit Act. This includes the Contractor retaining its financial records for a period five years after the time the audit was released.

C. If the Contractor receives more than \$250,000 in federal funding, or more than \$750,000 from the Agency, in any single fiscal year, the Contractor shall prepare annual financial statements and obtain an audit of, or an opinion on, the financial statements from an external Certified Public Accountant.

D. The Contractor shall maintain the financial statements for a period of no less than six years and shall make the financial statements and the CPA's audit or opinion available to the Agency upon request.

E. Applicable annual financial reports shall be submitted to the Agency no later than six months following the close of the Contractor's fiscal year.

F. To ensure proper delivery and receipt, the Contractor shall submit their annual audit report or financial reports (if no audit was required to):

G. The Agency may take corrective action as deemed necessary for Contractor’s failure to comply with 19-A through 19-F above. Corrective action may include, but is not limited to, termination of agreement and preclusion from engaging Contractor in the future.

ARTICLE IX. Confidentiality

Any confidential information provided to or developed by the Contractor in the performance of this Agreement shall be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the Contractor without the prior written approval of the Agency.

The Contractor shall maintain complete confidential records for the benefit of clients, sufficient to fulfill the provisions of the Scope of Work, and to document the services rendered under the Scope of Work. All records maintained pursuant to this provision shall be available for inspection by the Agency. The Contractor shall comply with the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996, the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act of 2009 (HITECH Act) and applicable regulations and all other state and federal rules, regulations and laws protecting the confidentiality of information. If the Contractor may reasonably be expected to have access to Agency’s Protected Health Information (PHI) and will perform business associate functions as defined by HIPAA, Contractor shall execute the HIPAA/HITECH Business Associate Agreement as a separately executed mandatory agreement which is hereby incorporated by reference into and made part of this agreement. Failure to execute the HIPAA/HITECH Business Associate Agreement when required by the Agency shall constitute grounds for termination of this agreement in accordance with Article 4 (Termination) of this agreement.

ARTICLE X. Amendments

A. This Agreement shall not be altered, changed or amended except by instrument in writing executed by the parties hereto and all other required signatories.

B. If the Agency proposes an amendment to the Agreement to unilaterally reduce funding due to budget or other considerations, the Contractor shall, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the proposed Amendment, have the option to terminate the Agreement, pursuant to the termination provisions as set forth in Article VI herein, or to agree to the reduced funding.

ARTICLE XI. Assignment

The Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement or assign any claims for money due or to become due under this Agreement without the prior written approval of the Agency.

ARTICLE XII. Applicable Law

The laws of the State of New Mexico shall govern this Agreement, without giving effect to its choice of law provisions. Venue shall be proper only in a New Mexico court of competent jurisdiction in

accordance with Section 38-3-1 (G) NMSA 1978. By execution of this Agreement, Contractor acknowledges and agrees to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the State of New Mexico over any and all lawsuits arising under or out of any term of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XIII. Acquisition of Property

The parties agree that neither party shall acquire any property as the result of this Agreement, unless approved by the Agency or defined in the scope of work.

ARTICLE XIV. Liability

Each party shall be solely responsible for fiscal or other sanctions occasioned as a result of its own violation or alleged violation or requirements applicable to the performance of the Agreement. Each party shall be liable for its actions according to this Agreement subject to the immunities and limitations of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act, Sections 41-4-1, et. seq., NMSA 1978, as amended.

ARTICLE XV. Execution of Documents

The Agency and the Contractor agree to execute any document(s) necessary to implement the terms of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XVI. Sub-Contracts

The Contractor shall not subcontract any portion of the services to be performed under this Agreement without the prior written approval by the Agency Secretary or Designee. No such subcontract shall relieve the primary Contractor from any obligations and liabilities under this Agreement, nor shall subcontract obligate direct payment from the Agency. Contractor must notify subcontractors that they are subject to Article VIII - Maintenance of Records of this agreement.

ARTICLE XVII. Equal Opportunity Compliance

The Contractor agrees to abide by all federal and state laws, rules and regulations, and executive orders of the Governor of the State of New Mexico, pertaining to equal employment opportunity. In accordance with all such laws of the State of New Mexico, the Contractor assures that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, age, physical or mental handicap, or serious medical condition, spousal affiliation, sexual orientation or gender identity, be excluded from employment with or participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity performed under this Agreement. If Contractor is found not to be in compliance with these requirements during the life of this Agreement, Contractor agrees to take appropriate steps to correct these deficiencies.

ARTICLE XVIII. Workers' Compensation

The Contractor agrees to comply with state laws and rules applicable to workers' compensation benefits for its employees. If the Contractor fails to comply with the Workers' Compensation Act and applicable rules when required to do so, this Agreement may be terminated by the Agency.

ARTICLE XIX. Lobbying Certification

The Contractor, by signing below, certifies to the best of his/her knowledge and belief, that:

No federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid by or on the behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been

paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit a Standard Form LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying", in accordance with its instructions. The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award document for sub-awards at all tiers (including sub-contracts, sub-grants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly. This certification is a material representation of facts upon which reliance is placed when this transaction is made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by Section 1352, Title 31, U.S.C. (United States Code). Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000.00 and not more than \$100,000.00 for each such failure.

ARTICLE XX. New Mexico Employees Health Coverage
(Governmental entities are excluded from this provision)

A. If Contractor has, or grows to, six (6) or more employees who work, or who are expected to work, an average of at least 20 hours per week over a six (6) month period during the term of the contract, Contractor certifies, by signing this agreement, to have in place, and agrees to maintain for the term of the contract, health insurance for those employees and offer that health insurance to those employees no later than July 1, 2010 if the expected annual value in the aggregate of any and all contracts between Contractor and the State exceed \$250,000 dollars.

B. Contractor agrees to maintain a record of the number of employees who have (a) accepted health insurance; (b) declined health insurance due to other health insurance coverage already in place; or (c) declined health insurance for other reasons. These records are subject to review and audit by a representative of the State of New Mexico.

C. Contractor agrees to advise all employees of the availability of State publicly financed health care coverage programs.

ARTICLE XXI. Background Checks

Agency contractors that have or could have primary custody of children for at least twenty hours per week are required to comply with NMAC 8.8.3 et. seq. requiring background checks on any employee, staff, volunteer or student intern, that has direct care responsibilities or potential unsupervised physical access to clients. Additionally, all Information Technology (IT) contractors are required to have a background check. The contractor must submit to Agency Background Check Unit fingerprint cards and the appropriate fee for such employees, volunteers or staff required to have background checks. The Agency Background Check Unit will conduct nationwide, state and abuse and neglect background checks on required staff or volunteers in accordance with NMAC 8.8.3 standards. An Agency eligibility letter must be in the employee, volunteer or staff member's personnel file prior to that individual having any unsupervised direct contact or unsupervised potential access to clients.

ARTICLE XXII. Product of Service -- Copyright.

A. All materials developed or acquired by the Contractor under this Agreement shall become the property of the State of New Mexico and shall be delivered to the Agency no later than the termination date of this Agreement. Nothing developed or produced, in whole or in part, by the

Contractor under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright or other claim of ownership by or on behalf of the Contractor.

B. Client information developed under this agreement may not be used by the Contractor or be transferred to a third party in any form, including aggregate data, without the express written permission of the Agency, except to fulfill the provisions of the Scope of Work under this agreement.

ARTICLE XXIII. Appropriations

The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made by the Legislature of New Mexico for the performance of this Agreement. If sufficient appropriations and authorization are not made by the Legislature, this Agreement shall terminate immediately upon written notice being given by the Agency to the Contractor. The Agency's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations are available shall be accepted by the Contractor and shall be final. If the Agency proposes an amendment to the Agreement to unilaterally reduce funding, the Contractor shall have the option to terminate the Agreement or to agree to the reduced funding, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the proposed amendment.

ARTICLE XXIV. Property

A. Title to all property furnished by the Agency shall remain in the Agency. Title to all property acquired by the Contractor, including acquisition through lease-purchase agreement, for the cost of which the Contractor is to be reimbursed as a direct item of cost under this agreement shall immediately vest in the Agency upon delivery of such property to the Contractor. Title to other property, the costs of which is to be reimbursed to the Contractor under this agreement, shall immediately vest in the Agency upon 1) issuance for use of such property in the performance of this agreement or 2) use of such property in the performance of this agreement or 3) reimbursement of the cost thereof by the Agency, whichever first occurs.

B. Title to the Agency property shall not be affected or lose its identity by reason of affixation to any realty or attachment at law.

C. The Contractor shall maintain a property inventory and administer a program of maintenance, repair, and protection of Agency property so as to assure its full availability and usefulness for performance under this agreement. In the event the Contractor is indemnified, reimbursed, or otherwise compensated for any loss or destruction of, or damage to Agency property during the period of this agreement, it shall use the proceeds to repair or replace the Agency property.

ARTICLE XXV. Licensure

If required for the performance of the Scope of Work herein, the Contractor agrees to retain professional licensure, accreditation, credentialing or continuing education required to perform the scope of professional services provided for the Agency. The Contractor agrees to make evidence of licensure or other regulatory requirements for the scope of professional services available to the Agency if requested in writing.

ARTICLE XXVI. Federal Grant or Other Federally Funded Agreements.

A. Lobbying. The Contractor shall not use any funds provided under this agreement, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of conducting lobbying activities or hiring a lobbyist or lobbyists on its behalf at the federal, state, or local government level, as defined in the Lobbyist

Regulation Act, NMSA 1978, Sections 2-11-1, *et. seq.*, and applicable federal law. No federal appropriated funds can be paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the Contractor, or any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Department, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any federal agreement, or the making of any federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, or modification of any federal agreement, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement. If any funds other than federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Department, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection of any applicable federal agreement, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the Contractor shall complete and submit Standard Form LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

B. Suspension and Debarment. For agreements that involve the expenditure of federal funds, each party represents that neither it, nor any of its management or any other employees or independent contractors who will have any involvement in the services or products supplied under this agreement, have been excluded from participation in any government healthcare program, debarred from or under any other federal program (including but not limited to debarment under the Generic Drug Enforcement Act), or convicted of any offense defined in 42 U.S.C. Section 1320a-7, and that it, its employees, and independent contractors are not otherwise ineligible for participation in federal healthcare or education programs. Further, each party represents that it is not aware of any such pending action(s) (including criminal actions) against it or its employees or independent contractors. Each party shall notify the other party immediately upon becoming aware of any pending or final action in any of these areas.

C. Fiscal and Administrative Standards. Contractors shall adhere to all local, state and federal regulations as applicable to their operations. For Agreements that involve the expenditure of federal funds, Contractors shall adhere to fiscal and administrative standards in accordance with:



Attachment 1 – Scope of Work
City of Raton

Goal:

To improve the Juvenile Justice System and decrease the incidences of juvenile delinquency in the community while increasing the emphasis on prevention and early intervention in juvenile justice services.

Objective:

To provide a continuum of cost effective services and temporary, non-secure alternatives to detention for youth who have been arrested or referred to the juvenile probation office or are at risk of such referral.

Activities:

The Contractor shall:

- A. Develop and maintain a juvenile justice advisory board, herein referred to as the “Community Advisory Board (CAB)”, as required by statute under the Juvenile Continuum Act and the New Mexico Administrative Code 8.14.13.7(E). The Contractor, through the Juvenile Justice Continuum Coordinator (refer to paragraph B), will organize and coordinate regular meetings of the CAB.

The CAB will:

- 1. Develop and improve the “Comprehensive Strategic Plan” for juvenile justice and detention reform in City of Raton to be updated a minimum of once per year;
- 2. Set policy for the Comprehensive Strategic Plan and the activities supported under this Agreement;
- 3. Determine the duties and responsibilities of the Juvenile Justice Continuum Coordinator, in accordance with the Scope of Work;
- 4. Provide oversight for the programs/service identified in the Scope of Work;
- 5. Continue to collaborate with the City and County to ensure improvements in the operational collaboration of local resources and service providers; and
- 6. Maintain a plan for sustainability of the programs/services implemented by the CAB.
- 7. Comply with, plan and implement strategies to address racial and ethnic disparities among youth who come into contact with the juvenile justice system, to assure equal treatment for all of the State’s youth; and
- 8. Help jurisdictions through, Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative, establish more effective and efficient systems, so youth involved in the juvenile justice system will have opportunities to develop into healthy adults.

- B. Contract with or hire a Juvenile Justice Continuum Coordinator who will:

- 1. Organize, coordinate and provide staff support for the CAB; this will include board development activities in conjunction with the CAB chair;

2. Inform the Agency’s Program Manager of the date of each meeting and submit a copy of the written minutes of each meeting, within thirty (30) days of the meeting;
3. Coordinate/oversee the programmatic delivery of subcontract requirements of local Continuum service providers;
4. Submit to the Agency’s Program Manager monthly requests for reimbursement. Such requests will be submitted on Agency Program Invoice and Expenditure Report forms, signed and dated by an authorized agent of the Contractor, to ensure that requests for reimbursement are submitted by the due date of the fifteenth (15) day of the following month, unless otherwise approved by the Agency’s Program Manager, in advance;



The Agency, by written notice, has the right to deny any amendment request. All final BAR forms must be submitted to the Agency no later than forty-five (45) days prior to the end of the fiscal year. Requests submitted after that date may not be accepted or approved. Upon BAR approval the line items in Attachment 2-Budget will be updated. A contract amendment will be processed in the event that the total compensation is increased or decreased.







Attachment 3 – Trauma Responsive Care and Services Training Requirements

Revised 04.29.2022

The Children, Youth and Families Department (CYFD) seeks to achieve safety, permanency, and well-being of children by implementing systems and services that are *trauma responsive*; providing *community-based therapeutic supports in the most family-like setting*; understanding the importance of and maintaining the *cultural connections and tribal sovereignty* of children, families, and tribes; honoring and centering *youth and family voice and choice*; and ensuring we use *collaborative, team-based* decision-making with families. We are committed to building a workforce worthy of trust through continual *professional growth and development* and a standard of *cultural humility practice*.

To achieve this, CYFD contracted Contractors must understand and apply the required principles of trauma responsive care to their programing, policy and procedures and interactions with all children/youth and their families, especially those children/youth in or at risk of entering state custody and their families. Those who contract with CYFD are mandated to:

1. Complete training on trauma responsive care and service delivery. Contractor staff will complete the curriculum determined to be most appropriate for their job position and level of interaction with children/youth and families as identified by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee (Human Services Department and CYFD representatives). Training shall be completed within the first three (3) months of hire and annually thereafter.
2. Approved trainings and training requirements on trauma responsive care and service delivery, as identified by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee. CYFD will provide a list of approved trainings to Contractors prior to the effective date of the Agreement, and quarterly or upon request thereafter.
 - a. For trainings on trauma responsive care and service delivery not previously identified/or approved by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee, Contractors may submit request to its Program Manager for approval by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee which meets quarterly.
 - b. The list of approved trainings will include those that are of no cost to the Contractor. Funding for Contractor Loss of Productivity will be negotiated between the Contractor and Program Manager for inclusion in the budget.
3. Contractor staff includes those who have direct contact with children/youth (ages 0-21) in state custody or at-risk children/youth, administrative staff and Management or Executive level position (“leaders”).
4. On a monthly basis, Contractors will provide a Trauma Training Tracking Sheet with their invoice or encounter submission that includes the following information:
 - a. Report current leaders and staff who have direct contact with children who have worked for the Contractor for more than three months, and
 - b. Provide certification of completion for those who have completed the initial training requirements.
5. At least seventy (70) percent of the Contractor’s staff must have completed required trauma responsive training as identified by Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee within three (3) months of hire for Contractor to continue billing for services.

6. Trauma responsive care and service delivery training completed by Contractor staff prior to hire, and if taken less than six (6) months prior to hire, may be submitted for approval of the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee, via the Contractor's Program Manager.
7. When scope of work is being performed by Subcontractor or Subawardee, Contractors are responsible for ensuring that the Subcontractor or Subawardee's staff receive the mandated trauma responsive care and service delivery training as outlined above.

CYFD Program Managers will:

1. Facilitate access to the mandated trauma responsive care and service delivery training so Contractor staff can meet the minimum requirements.
2. For trainings on trauma responsive care and service delivery not previously identified/or approved by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee, Contractor may submit request to its Program Manager. The Program Manager will route the request to Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee for approval and provide written notice of the Committee's decision to the Contractor within ten (10) working days following the Committee's quarterly meeting.

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the State of New Mexico, **CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES DEPARTMENT**, hereinafter referred to as the "Agency," and **City of Raton** hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor," and is effective as of the date set forth below upon which it is executed by the Agency.

PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

1. Amend **ARTICLE III Limitation of Cost** to reflect an update in language and an increase of **Thirty-One Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars and Zero Cents (\$31,866.00)** for short term cycle funding anticipated through FY23 and an increase of **Thirty-One Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (\$31,268.00)** for FY24 total of **Sixty Three Thousand One Hundred Thirty-Four Dollars and Zero Cents (\$63,134.00)**, and a new contract total of **Seven Hundred Eighty-Four Thousand Thirteen Dollars and Zero Cents (\$784,013.00)**
2. Amend Attachment 2 – Budget to reflect increase in compensation.

IT IS MUTALLY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS OF THE ABOVE-REFERENCE CONTRACT ARE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

1. **ARTICLE III Limitation of Cost** is hereby amended to read as follows:
The total compensation hereunder will not exceed **Seven Hundred Eighty-Four Thousand Thirteen Dollars and Zero Cents (\$784,013.00)** including New Mexico gross receipts tax. This amount is the maximum total amount; it is not a guarantee that the work to be performed by Contractor, and the total of the corresponding payments that Procuring Agency pays to Contractor, will equal the maximum total amount. However, the Parties do not intend for Contractor to continue to deliver the Deliverables without compensation once the total compensation amount has been reached. Therefore, Contractor must notify Procuring Agency before the price of a Deliverable reaches the compensation amount for that Deliverable stated in the SOW. In no event will Procuring Agency pay Contractor for any Deliverables in an amount that exceeds the maximum total amount without this Agreement being amended in writing prior to Contractor's continued delivery of the Deliverables.

Contractor shall utilize the dollars allocated within the service components listed in Attachment 2 to best meet the needs of the Clients. Funding may be shifted between service components with the prior written approval of the Agency's Special Programs Manager and/or Division Deputy Director of an approved Budget Adjustment Form submitted by

Contractor. Approved Budget Adjustments shall result in an updated Attachment 2 with any adjustment in total compensation, increase or decrease, made by amendment to the contract. Procuring Agency will pay Contractor upon Procuring Agency's Acceptance of each Deliverable according to Article 4, below, and upon the receipt and Acceptance of Contractor's detailed and certified Payment Invoice(s). Procuring Agency will forward its payments to Contractor's designated mailing address, stated in Article 28, below. In accordance with Section 13-1-158 NMSA 1978, Procuring Agency will tender payment to Contractor within thirty (30) days of the date of Procuring Agency's written certification of Acceptance. All Payment Invoices MUST BE received by Procuring Agency no later than fifteen (15) days after the termination of this Agreement. Contractor's Payment Invoices received by Procuring Agency later than fifteen (15) days after the termination of this Agreement WILL NOT BE PAID.

Attachment 3 – Trauma Responsive Care and Services Training Requirements

Revised 04.29.2022

The Children, Youth and Families Department (CYFD) seeks to achieve safety, permanency, and well-being of children by implementing systems and services that are *trauma responsive*; providing *community-based therapeutic supports in the most family-like setting*; understanding the importance of and maintaining the *cultural connections and tribal sovereignty* of children, families, and tribes; honoring and centering *youth and family voice and choice*; and ensuring we use *collaborative, team-based* decision-making with families. We are committed to building a workforce worthy of trust through continual *professional growth and development* and a standard of *cultural humility practice*.

To achieve this, CYFD contracted Contractors must understand and apply the required principles of trauma responsive care to their programing, policy and procedures and interactions with all children/youth and their families, especially those children/youth in or at risk of entering state custody and their families. Those who contract with CYFD are mandated to:

1. Complete training on trauma responsive care and service delivery. Contractor staff will complete the curriculum determined to be most appropriate for their job position and level of interaction with children/youth and families as identified by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee (Human Services Department and CYFD representatives). Training shall be completed within the first three (3) months of hire and annually thereafter.
2. Approved trainings and training requirements on trauma responsive care and service delivery, as identified by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee. CYFD will provide a list of approved trainings to Contractors prior to the effective date of the Agreement, and quarterly or upon request thereafter.
 - a. For trainings on trauma responsive care and service delivery not previously identified/or approved by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee, Contractors may submit request to its Program Manager for approval by the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee which meets quarterly.
 - b. The list of approved trainings will include those that are of no cost to the Contractor. Funding for Contractor Loss of Productivity will be negotiated between the Contractor and Program Manager for inclusion in the budget.
3. Contractor staff includes those who have direct contact with children/youth (ages 0-21) in state custody or at-risk children/youth, administrative staff and Management or Executive level position (“leaders”).
4. On a monthly basis, Contractors will provide a Trauma Training Tracking Sheet with their invoice or encounter submission that includes the following information:
 - a. Report current leaders and staff who have direct contact with children who have worked for the Contractor for more than three months, and
 - b. Provide certification of completion for those who have completed the initial training requirements.
5. At least seventy (70) percent of the Contractor’s staff must have completed required trauma responsive training as identified by Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee within three (3) months of hire for Contractor to continue billing for services.

6. Trauma responsive care and service delivery training completed by Contractor staff prior to hire, and if taken less than six (6) months prior to hire, may be submitted for approval of the Cross-Departmental Training Review Committee, via the Contractor's Program Manager.
7. When scope of work is being performed by Subcontractor or Subawardee, Contractors are responsible for ensuring that the Subcontractor or Subawardee's staff receive the mandated trauma responsive care and service delivery training as outlined above.

CYFD Program Managers will:
