- 1. <u>Criteria for Award</u>: Award shall be based on the lowest responsible bid price which meets all specifications. The Board of Curry County Commissioners reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any technicalities and to accept the bid(s) which in its judgment is most advantageous to the County.
- <u>Guaranteed Performance</u>: The bidder, if awarded a contract as a result of this bid, guarantees that services will conform to the specifications in this bid. Failure of the bidder to comply with providing a service which meets minimum specifications may result in termination of the award of that item or termination of the contract.

SCOPE OF WORK

Bidder shall provide street and storm drainage improvements, including construction of paving, and other miscellaneous items of work in compliance with the Plans, Specifications, Contract Documents for this project. Bidders are required to remove obstructions including concrete sidewalks and curbs as noted in the project plans. Installation shall include roadway surfacing, concrete drive pads, curbs, gutters, site lighting, irrigation, landscaping, etc. that will be paid on a unit price basis and the bidder will be paid for actual quantities installed.

Bidder shall subgrade and construct base course with asphalt and concrete pavement surfacing to designated areas as shown in the project plans.

Bidder shall ensure the site is cleaned and properly maintained at all times.

Prices bid shall include all major labor, equipment, materials and preparation costs to construct the parking lot improvements at the listed project site.

The bidder is responsible for on-site inspections and to bid this appropriately. County will not be responsible for any mistakes that are made in bidder's figures and computations.

GENERAL

Bid Prices shall include all major labor, equipment, materials and preparation

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costs to construct the parking lot at the listed project site.

Bidder agrees to comply with state laws and rules pertaining to Worker's Compensation insurance coverage for its employees. If bidder fails to comply with the Worker's Compensation Act and applicable rules, when required to do so, the contract may be cancelled effective immediately.

All bids shall be subject to the requirements of Section 102 of the New Mexico State Department of Transportation <u>Standard Specifications for Highway and</u> <u>Bridge Construction</u>, Edition of 2014.

PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS

The Plans and Specifications are attached to this Invitation to Bid and may be obtained for public inspection at the Curry County Administration Office, 417 Gidding Street, Suite 100 and at the office of Lydick Engineers and Surveyors, Inc., 205 E 2nd Street, Clovis, NM. These Bid documents, plans, specifications and all addenda supplementary plans, specifications and documents, if any, are essential parts of the contract. They are intended to be complementary, to describe and provide for complete work. In case of discrepancy, figured dimensions, unless obviously incorrect, shall govern over scaled dimensions.

The bidder shall not take advantage of any apparent error or omission in the Plans and Specifications. In the case the bidder discovers an apparent error or discrepancy, they shall immediately email the Purchasing Agent for clarification and issuance of an addendum.

CONTRACT

The contract shall become effective April 12, 2022, contingent upon approval by the Board of County Commissioners, and the terms and conditions herein shall be binding upon and continue until terminated by either party, as set forth herein. Bidder agrees to begin the project within ten (10) calendar days from issuance of the Notice to Proceed from County and agrees to complete the project no later than 90 calendar days after receipt of Notice to Proceed.

The contract shall not become effective until the same is approved in writing by the Curry County Board of County Commissioners. The successful bidder shall, within ten (10) days execute and deliver to the County the agreement and other required forms included in the Invitation to Bid. The successful bidder shall furnish surety bonds in a sum not less than the amount of the Contract as awarded, as security for the faithful performance of the Contract, and for the payment of all persons, firms or corporations to whom the bidder may become legally indebted for labor, materials, tools, equipment, or services of any nature, including utility and transportation services employed or used in performing the work. The current power of attorney for the person who signs for any surety company shall be attached to such bond. The bonds shall be issued by a Surety licensed to conduct business in the State of New Mexico and named in the current list of "Surety Companies Acceptable on Federal Bonds' as published in the Federal Register by the Audit Staff, bureau of Accounts, U.S. Treasury Department.

If a successful bidder fails to execute the agreement, other required forms,

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and the required bonds within ten days after the prescribed forms are presented for signature (or within an extended time period as the County may grant), the County may either award the Contract to the next lowest responsible bidder or re-advertise for bids and may charge against the bidder the amount of the bid security, not as a penalty, but in liquidation of damages sustained. If a more favorable bid is received by re-advertising, the defaulting bidder shall have no claim against the County for a refund.

TERMINATION

In the event of termination pursuant to this paragraph, the County's only liability shall be to pay bidder for acceptable goods delivered and services rendered before the termination date.

The contract may also be terminated by either party hereto for cause upon fifteen (15) calendar day's written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms of the contract through no fault of the terminating party.

Upon receipt of notice of termination from County, bidder shall discontinue the services unless otherwise directed and upon final payment from County deliver to the County the required data, reports, summaries, and such other information and materials as may have been accumulated by bidder.

PRE-BID CONFERENCE

A pre-bid conference is not scheduled. Should you have questions regarding the scope of work, please contact Lorraine Schlimm by email at <u>lschlimm@currycounty.org</u>. Curry County highly encourages bidders to make a site visit and familiarize themselves with the area, as they will be held responsible for all requirements, as outlined in the scope of work.

BID SECURITY

Each bidder shall submit a certified check or a satisfactory bid bond provided by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of New Mexico in an amount equal to (5%) five percent of the total amount of the bid, with each bid proposal. The security is required as outlined in Section 13-1-146 NMSA 1978.

PERFORMANCE BOND

This (performance bond) shall be required on any contract awarded in excess of (\$25,000) twenty-five thousand dollars. The successful bidder shall supply the County with a performance bond executed by a surety company authorized to do business in the state of New Mexico with said surety to be approved by the State Board of Finance in the amount of 100% of the total bid price. This bond is required as outlined in Section 13-4-18 (A)(1) of NMSA 1978.

PAYMENT BOND

This (payment bond) shall be required on any contract awarded in excess of (\$25,000) twenty-five thousand dollars. The successful bidder shall supply

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the County with a payment bond executed by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of New Mexico with said surety to be approved by the State Board of Finance in the amount of 100% of the total bid price. This bond is for the protection of all persons supplying labor and materials to the contractor or its subcontractors for the performance of the work provided in the contract and is required as outlined in Section 13-4-18 (A)(2) of NMSA 1978.

NOTICE TO PROCEED

The Bidder shall proceed with work within ten (10) working days from issuance of the notice to proceed, unless arrangements have been made with the successful bidder prior to contract execution. The County anticipates issuing the notice to proceed on April 12, 2022 and bidder is expected to start working within ten (10) working days from issuance.

WARRANTIES

Upon and as a condition of County's acceptance of the completed work, bidder shall provide County with a written one (1) full year warranty on all materials and labor for the work performed by the bidder.

Said one (1) year full contractor workmanship warranty shall commence upon the date of the signed report of acceptance from County. Any problems, defects, or issues discovered by County or brought to the County's attention during said one (1) year period will be conveyed in writing to the bidder and bidder shall respond and repair or replace any and all said problems, defects or issues as quickly as possible, but no later than ten (10) working days after notification from County. In the event of an emergency, bidder agrees to repair said problems, defects or issues within seventy-two (72) hours of being notified by County. Said one (1) year workmanship warranty encompasses any and all problems, defects or issues that are discovered by County and for which notice has been given to bidder within said one (1) year period. Bidder shall repair and resolve any problems, defects or issues which it has been notified of regardless of whether the actual work occurs after the expiration of the one (1) year warranty or not.

Bidder shall also take whatever action is necessary to complete and ensure that all said manufacturers warranties used for completion of work are transferred/assigned in writing to County once the work has been completed and accepted by County.

WATER

The bidder shall provide and make arrangements for water required.

VARIATIONS

Any variations from, or exceptions to, the conditions and specifications of this bid must be listed on a separate sheet labeled "Exception(s) to Bid Conditions", and attached to the bid.

QUOTATION SHEETS

Bidders shall use the attached Quotation Sheet(s) to submit their bids. The

Quotation Sheet(s) must be signed.

NEW MEXICO BIDDER'S PREFERENCE

Pursuant to Sections 13-1-21 & 13-4-2 NMSA 1978, and GSD Rule 1.4.1 NMAC, bidders claiming the 5% preference must be certified prior to the bid opening. The number must appear on the Quotation Sheet(s) in the space provided in order to receive the preference.

BID OPENING

Competitive bids will be accepted until March 22, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. In the wake of the covid-19 public health emergency and to minimize public health risk, bids must be submitted electronically through curry county's procurement provider, vendor registry. Registration and access to all documents is free of charge. To register, please visit:

Bids will be time-stamped in the vendor registry system when bidder submits. The bidder will receive an email of the submission for their records. Such electronic submission will be considered sealed bids in conformance with statute.

RESERVATIONS

The Curry County Commission reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any technicalities, to accept in whole or in part such bid or bids as may be deemed in the best interest of the County.

BIDDER'S PRE-START REPRESENTATIONS

Bidders represent that they have familiarized themselves with and assumes full responsibility for having familiarized themselves with the nature and extent of the contract documents, work, locality, and with all local conditions including weather conditions, and federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations that may in any manner affect performance of the work and represents that they have correlated their study and observations with the requirements of the contract documents.

Bidders are responsible for on-site inspections and to bid appropriately. County will not be responsible for any mistakes that are made in the bidder's figures and computations. Bidders shall visit the site of the proposed work, fully acquaint himself/herself with the existing conditions relating to the construction of the project, the facilities involved and the difficulties and restrictions attending the performance of the contract. Bidders shall thoroughly examine and familiarize themselves with the Plans, Specifications, and other Contract Documents. Bidders by the execution of the Contract shall not be relieved of any obligation thereunder due to failure to examine any

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form or legal instrument or to visit the site and acquaint himself with the conditions there existing. Any claims may be rejected based on facts regarding which should have been on notice as a result thereof.

UNIT PRICES

The Unit Price for each of the several items bid shall include its pro-rate share of overhead anticipated profit and other indirect costs that the sum of the products obtained by multiplying the quantity shown for each item by the Unit Price Bid represents the total bid. Any bid not conforming to this requirement may be rejected as irregular. In the event of an error in extensions in the amount column, the written price shall govern.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

It shall be the contractor's responsibility to provide for the safety of its workers and the public in compliance with the requirements of insurance and public health and safety standards.

With respect to all work performed, all bidder's shall:

- Comply with the safety standard provisions of applicable laws, building and construction codes and the Manual of Accident prevention for Construction, the requirements of the Occupation Safety Health Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-596) and the requirements of Title 29 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Section 1518 as published in the "Federal Register", Volume 36, No. 75, Saturday, April 17, 1971;
- 2. Exercise every precaution at all times for the prevention of accidents and the protection of person (including employees) and property;
- 3. Maintain at its office or other well-known place at the job site, all articles necessary for giving first aid to the injured, and shall make standing arrangements for the immediate removal to a hospital or a doctor's care of persons (including employees), who may be injured on the job site. In no case shall employees be permitted to work at a job site before the employer has made a standing arrangement for removal of injured persons to a hospital or a doctor's care.

PUBLIC WORKS

This solicitation is for a Public Works Project and subject to the public works statues of the State of New Mexico (13-4-1 to 13-4-43 NMSA 1978); Construction Industries Licensing Act (60-13-1 et seq. NMSA 1978); CID Rules and Regulations; Applicable Federal, State and Local Statues and Laws; and the City of Clovis Ordinances.

SUBMITTALS

Each Bidder will furnish, when requested, printed literature and manufacturers specifications sheets that fully describe the material they propose to furnish the

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County. The acceptance or rejection of equals or equivalents shall be determined solely by the County or its representative.

SUBCONTRACTORS

The listing threshold for subcontractors for this project is **\$5,000** and shall be submitted in compliance with 13-4-32 thru 13-4-43 NMSA 1978. There shall be only one subcontractor listed for each classification. If subcontractors change according to bid options/additive alternates accepted than list the subcontractors and the bid lots where they are to be used.

The County reserves the right to disqualify subcontractors and suppliers in accordance with the conditions of the bid and contract. All bidders agree that they are fully responsible to the County for the acts and omissions of its subcontractors and or persons either directly or indirectly employed by them, as the bidder is for the acts and omissions of persons directly employed by the bidder. Nothing contained in the contract documents shall create any contractual relationship between any subcontractor and the County.

The bidder may be required to establish the reliability and responsibility of the proposed subcontracts or of any manufacturer to furnish and perform the work in accordance with the contract documents and completion schedule and may also be required to require performance and payment bonds of some or all subcontractors in conformance with sec. 13-4-37 NMSA 1978.

LICENSE AND PERMITS

Bidder shall insure that any and all subcontractors, suppliers and other persons/entities involved in the project comply with all laws, rules and regulations in effect, including, but not limited to the New Mexico Workman's Compensation laws. Bidder shall obtain or at least ensure that all permits, licenses and inspections that are necessary or required for any work on the project are properly obtained and performed. Bidder must have its GA98 Contractors license.

CODE COMPLIANCE

Complete installation must meet federal, state, and local laws, codes and regulations.

INSPECTION

The County or its designee shall at all times have the right to inspect and approve the work and materials.

WAGES

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Wages will be paid in accordance with the State of New Mexico Public Works Statues regarding Wage Rates. The Wage Decision number for this project is CU-22-0361-A. A Wage Rate Schedule is enclosed with this Bid. Contractor and all tiers of subcontractors will submit certified weekly payrolls to the County Public Services Directly (BI-Weekly).

AWARD

The award may be made to the bidder providing a responsive, responsible bid that meets and satisfies all of the requirements herein and results in the lowest overall cost to the County. The award will be made by the Curry County Commission at their regularly scheduled meeting. Bid prices must be good for ninety (90) days subsequent to date of opening. The lowest bid will be based on the total aggregate bid of all lots and alternates.

PROTEST

Any bidder who is aggrieved in connection with this solicitation or award of a contract may protest to the County Finance Director. The protest shall be submitted in writing within fifteen (15) calendar days after contract award. Protests shall be written and shall include the name and address of the protestor and the Invitation to Bid number. It shall also contain a statement of grounds for protest including appropriate support exhibits, and it shall specify the ruling requested from the Finance Director. The protest shall be delivered to the Curry County Finance Director, 417 Gidding Street, Suite 100, Clovis, NM 88101.

CHANGED WORK

The County may from time-to-time order additions, deletions or revisions in the work; these will be authorized by a written change order prepared and signed by the County.

Additional work performed without authorization of a written and executed change order will not entitle bidder to an increase of contract price or an extension of contract time.

If notice of a change affecting the general scope of work or change in contract price is required by the provisions of any bond to be given to the surety, it will be the bidder's responsibility to notify the surety, and the amount of each applicable bond shall be adjusted accordingly.

QUESTIONS

Questions regarding the specifications stated within the bid or the bidding process should be directed to Lorraine Schlimm, Purchasing Agent at <u>lschilmm@currycounty.org</u>. Written questions/requests must be submitted no later than 2:00 PM (Mountain Daylight Time) on March 11, 2022 and must include the bidder's name, mailing address, email address, telephone and firm he/she represents. Only written questions/requests that are sent to the aforementioned

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email address will be considered. Oral questions/requests will not be considered. Written oral questions/request submitted to any other Department or contact will not be considered.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Bid Forms: All pages included in this Invitation to Bid that are marked "**BID FORM**" must be completed and returned as part of the bid document. All bids must be completed and securely sealed prior to submitting to the purchasing office. No un-sealed, faxed or e-mailed bids are acceptable.
- Bids Binding Ninety (90) days: Unless otherwise specified all formal bids submitted shall be binding for ninety (90) calendar days following bid opening date, unless the bidder(s), upon request of the County Manager, agrees to an extension.
- 3. Payment Terms: For all goods/services provided by bidder, payment shall be made net thirty (30) days from invoice date after receipt of goods/services unless otherwise specified on bid form or as otherwise agreed by both parties. All invoices shall be submitted directly to the Curry County Finance Department at 417 Gidding, Suite 100, Clovis, NM 88101. The successful bidder must submit and have a completed W9 form on file with the County prior to any payments being issued.

For all services paid by Credit Card, standard payments are usually made within 3-5 business days. All services made by credit card require a receipt. Invoices shall not be submitted separately if payment is made with credit card. Curry County shall not pay any fees when utilizing a credit card for payment.

- 4. Equivalency: The County hereby reserves the right to approve as equivalent, or to reject as not being equivalent, any item the bidder proposes to furnish which contains variations from specification requirements but may comply substantially therewith. Such decisions are strictly at the discretion of the County.
- 5. If there is any clarification, problem, ambiguity or question regarding this bid, you must contact the Purchasing Agent or designee prior to the bid opening. Clarifications and addenda will be considered prior to the bid opening. Answers provided regarding the bid specifications or bid package MUST be answered by the Purchasing Agent or designee. Questions answered by any other person or County official shall be considered completely non-applicable to the legal provisions of this bid, except as specifically authorized by the Purchasing Agent. Every request for interpretation shall be made in writing to the Purchasing Agent. Any inquiry received ten (10) or more days prior to the date fixed for opening of Bids will be given consideration. Every interpretation made to a bidder will be in the form of an Addendum to the Invitation to Bid, and when issued, will be on file at the County and in the office of the Engineer at least two (2) days before bid closing. In addition, all Addenda will be mailed to each person holding Contract Documents, but it shall be the bidder's responsibility to make inquiry as to any Addenda issued. All such Addenda

shall become part of the Contract and all bidders shall be bound by such Addenda.

- 6. Restrictive Specifications: It is the responsibility of the prospective bidder to review the entire Invitation to Bid (ITB) packet and to notify the purchasing department if the specifications are formulated in a manner which would unnecessarily restrict competition. Any such protest or question regarding the specifications or bidding procedures must be received in the purchasing department not less than seventy-two (72) hours prior to the time set for bid opening.
- 7. An in-state resident or resident veteran preference will be given to all resident New Mexico businesses that have been issued certification by the State of New Mexico. To qualify for the preference, the bidder must list a valid resident business certificate number and shall submit a copy of the certificate with the bid. If you have a question regarding a Resident Business (or Resident Veteran Business) Certification, or wish to be given a number, you may contact the New Mexico State Department of Taxation and Revenue at 505-827-0951. This number is valuable to have as it allows the county to consider your bid at five to ten percent less than the amount submitted, and could mean a difference in award. Please note that this number is NOT your State CRS Number (i.e. 01-503047-004). In addition, any preference numbers issued by the NM State Purchasing Office were valid only through December 31, 2011 and <u>must</u> be re-issued through the Taxation and Revenue Department.
- Bidders shall list on a separate sheet of paper any variations from or exceptions to the conditions and specifications of this bid. <u>This sheet shall</u> <u>be labeled "Exception(s) to Bid Conditions" and shall be included with</u> <u>bid.</u>
- 9. Non-collusion: Bidders, by submitting a signed bid, certify that the accompanying bid or proposal is not the result of, or affected by, any unlawful act of collusion with any other person or company engaged in the same line of business or commerce, or any other fraudulent act punishable under New Mexico or United States law.
- 10. Non-discrimination Statement: Curry County in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award. Please refer to complete Curry County Title VI Plan, specifically Appendices A and E at <u>http://www.currycounty.org/dr/miscellaneous</u>.
- 11. Qualifications of Bidders: The County Purchasing Officer may make such investigations as he/she deems necessary to determine the ability of the

bidder to perform the work, and the bidder shall furnish to the County all such information and data for this purpose as the County may request. The County reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of, such bidder fails to satisfy the County that such bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work contemplated therein.

- 12. The State of New Mexico's Procurement Code, Section 13-1-28 through Section 13-1-199 NMSA 1978, imposes civil and criminal penalties for its violations. In addition, the New Mexico Criminal Statutes impose felony penalties for illegal bribes, gratuities and kickbacks.
- 13. Curry County reserves the right to reject any bid from a bidder who previously failed to perform properly, or complete on time, contracts of similar nature, or to reject the bid of a bidder who is not in a position to perform such a contract satisfactorily. Such is at the discretion of the County.
- 14. The successful bidder agrees to protect, defend and save the County, its elected and appointed officials, agents, and employees, while acting within the scope of their duties as such, harmless from and against all claims, demands, causes of action of any kind or character, including the cost of defense thereof, arising in favor of the contractor's employees or third parties on account of bodily or personal injuries, death, or damage to property arising out of services performed or omissions of services or in any way resulting from the acts or omissions of the contractor and/or its agents, employees, representatives, assigns, subcontractors, except the sole negligence of the County under this agreement.
- 15. If a bidder to whom a bid is awarded refuses to accept the award or, fails to deliver in accordance with the contract terms and conditions, the County may, in its discretion, suspend the bidder/contractor for a period of time from entering into any contracts with Curry County.
- 16. This solicitation is governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico. By signing and submitting a bid, the parties agree that any litigation concerning this bid, request for proposal, limited solicitation, or subsequent contract or purchase order, must be brought in the Ninth Judicial District in and for Curry County, State of New Mexico, and each party shall pay its own costs and attorney fees.

Pole Shaft

The pole shall be a one section design fabricated from standard 11 gauge (0.1196*) or 7 gauge (0.1793*) steel. Each section shall be fabricated from high strength low alloy steel conforming to ASTM A500 Grade B, with minimum yield strength of 46,000 psi. Each pole will have a full-length longitudinal weld and will be square in cross-section.

Base Plate

The base plate is fabricated from a structural quality hot rolled carbon steel plate that meets or exceeds ASTM A-35 with a minimum yield of strength of 35,000 psi. The base plate telescopes the pole shaft and is circumferential welded top and bottom. The base plate has slotted bolt holes.





Pole Shaft

The pole shall be a one section design fabricated from standard 11 gauge (0.1196") or 7 gauge (0.1793") steel. Each section shall be fabricated from high strength low alloy steel conforming to ASTM A500 Grade B, with minimum yield strength of 46,000 psi. Each pole will have a full-length longitudinal weld and will be square in cross-section.

Base Plate

Base Plate The base plate is fabricated from a structural quality hot rolled carbon steel plate that meets or exceeds ASTM A-36 with a minimum yield of strength of 36,000 psi. The base plate telescopes the pole shaft and is circumferential welded top and bottom. The base plate has slotted bolt holes.

Hand Hole A reinforced hand hole, having a nominal 3" x 5" opening, will be installed 18" above the base plate on all poles. A hand hole cover and attaching hardware is included with each hand hole assembly. A ground lug will be welded either on the hand hole frame or on the inside of the pole opposite the hand hole depending on the design.

Anchor Bolts

Anchor bolts are fabricated from a commercial quality hot rolled carbon steel bar that meets or exceeds minimum yield strength of 55,000 psi. Anchor bolts are sized according to each pole design and are turnished with 2 galvanized heavy hex nuts and 2 galvanized flat washers. Anchor bolts shall be galvanized a minimum of 4" on the threaded end in accordance with ASTM A-153. Anchor bolts will ship with the poles unless otherwise specified.

Welding


Pole Top Each pole will be side-drilled with a removable pole cap or have a 2-3/8" O.D. x 4" tenon top (other sizes available).

All welds shall be of the highest quality and performed by American Welding Society certified welders conforming to the latest version of the American Welding Society specification AWS D1.1.

Finish All poles, mounting brackets and platforms are furnished with a coating of either red oxide/zinc primer, factory painted, powder coated or hot-dip galvanized to ASTM A-123. Miscellaneous hardware will be galvanized to ASTM A-153. Exterior finish coatings are avail-able by request.

Note

Anchor bolt patterns are subject to change. Please consult factory prior to construction.



Poles should be monitored frequently for signs of harmonic vibration, which may cause structural fatigue. Consult factory for a damping device that can help minimize the effects of vibration.



Installation Guide

Sidewalk Shield is best used on new or young plantings. The shield can be utilized on young plantings if it can be installed without disrupting existing root growth. It is possible to use Sidewalk Shield on older plantings if it can be installed without cutting major roots.

Establishing a tree pit for new plantings.


Tree pits can be installed directly around the tree or comprise a larger green area. Surround pits are installed directly around the tree and enclose a single tree. Linear or continuous pits are longer pits design to contain multiple trees and a larger green space. Tree pits should be as large as possible to allow for ample growing space for tree roots and continuous tree pits are advantageous whenever possible.



Installation Guide - Sidewalk Shield

Excavate entire area for a surround pit or perimeter for a continuous pit. Confirm subgrade is at the proper depth to allow the barrier to come to the top of the curb but to exceed curb or sidewalk height. Line the outside of the desired planting area for the tree with Sidewalk Shield. Angle the shield at a 10-degree position where the top of the barrier is closer to the tree and the bottom is further away. Replace soil in succeeding 6" layers compacting as you proceed.

Two most important aspects when installing Sidewalk Shield




1. Allowing proper spacing for tree health.

The drip line of a tree is the outermost area that water is capable of dripping off of the limbs. The Sidewalk Shield should be installed no less than half the distance of the mature drip line. For example, if the drip line of the tree is 10' across, the Sidewalk Shield enclosure should be at least 5' diameter. Not all planting areas are circular, but Sidewalk Shield can accommodate by making a comparable growing area in rectangular or odd sshaped areas. The ultimate objective is controlling tree roots but allowing enough space for tree health.

2. Proper installation angle

The purpose of Sidewalk Shield is to direct the root growth downward instead of out along the surface where they can do harm to sidewalks, driveways. septic systems, etc. The material is position in a 10-degree downward slope. The top (portion closer to the soil surface) should be closer to the tree than the bottom. This creates a funnel to direct roots in a downward growth pattern.








2022 SUBSISTENCE, ZONE AND INCENTIVE PAY RATES

All contractors are required to pay subsistence, zone, and incentive pay according to the particular trade

Asbestos workers or heat and frost insulators

- (1) Zone 1 shall consist of the area lying within the city limits of a circle whose radius is 66 miles from the city hall in Albuquerque or the city hall in El Paso \$0.00 per day.
- (2) Zone 2 shall consist of Los Alamos county \$40.00 per day if not furnished a company owned vehicle.
- (3) Zone 3 shall consist of the area lying beyond a circle whose radius is over 66 miles from the city hall in Albuquerque or the city hall in El Paso \$85.00 per day.

Boilermakers/Blacksmiths

- (1) Per diem is calculated from city hall of the dispatch city or the employee's home address, whichever is closer to the job location,
- (2) Per diem is \$55.00 per day for travel between 70 and 120 miles and \$85.00 per day for travel over 120 miles.

Bricklayers

- (1) Between 70 and 120 miles, \$55.00 per day
- (2) 121 or more miles, \$70.00 per day

Cement Masons

- (1) For employees who travel to Santa Fe from Albuquerque or vice versa, \$20.00 per day.
- In all other work performed more than 50 miles from the employer's main office, \$50.00 per day.
- (3) Mutually agreed-upon lodging or transportation paid for by the employer will substitute for subsistence pay.

Drywall Finishers and Tapers

- (1) \$40.00 per day (\$5.00 per hour for eight hours work) for over 60 miles over the most typically traveled route, or other mutually agreed upon suitable lodging or transportation.
- (2) Special provision for Santa Fe and Albuquerque: Employees who travel between Santa Fe and Albuquerque will be paid \$15.00 per day or other mutually agreed upon lodging or transportation.



Electricians (inside classifications)

- (1) For Albuquerque only:
 - (a) Zone 1 is classified as being within 40 miles from the main post office.
 - (b) Zone 2 shall extend up to 10 miles beyond zone 1. Work performed within zone 2 shall be compensated nine percent above the journeyman rate for zone 1.
 - (c) Zone 3 shall extend up to 20 miles beyond zone 1. Work performed within zone 3 shall be compensated fifteen percent above the journeyman rate for zone 1.
 - (d) Zone 4 shall extend 20 miles or more beyond zone 1. Work performed within zone 4 shall be compensated twenty six percent above the journeyman rate for zone 1.

(2) For Los Alamos County only: work performed within the county shall be compensated fifteen percent above the zone 1 journeyman rate.

- (3) For all other counties:
 - (a) Zone 1 is:
 - (i) within six miles from the main post office for Raton, Tucumcari, and Farmington.
 - (ii) within eight miles from the main post office for Las Vegas.
 - (iii) within ten miles from the main post office for Santa Fe and Gallup.
 - (iv) within twelve miles from the main post office for Belen, Carrizozo, Clovis, Los Lunas, Portales, Roswell, Ruidoso, Artesia, Carlsbad, Hobbs, and Lovington.
 - (v) within fourteen miles from the main post office for Espanola.
 - (b) Zone 2 shall extend up to 20 miles beyond zone 1. Work performed within zone 2 shall be compensated nine percent above the journeyman rate for zone 1.
 - (c) Zone 3 shall extend up to 30 miles from zone 1. Work performed within zone 3 shall be compensated fifteen percent above the journeyman rate for zone 1.
 - (d) Zone 4 shall extend beyond 30 miles from zone 1. Work performed within zone 4 shall be compensated twenty six percent above the journeyman rate for zone 1.

Electricians (outside classification)

Zone 2: \$50.00 per diem to be paid for work 30 miles outside of Santa Fe and 60 miles outside of Albuquerque.



Glaziers

- (1) When out-of-town travel is required, the employer shall pay the employee for suitable lodging with no more than two people per room and \$20.00 per night for food.
- (2) Employees required to use a personal vehicle for travel to a jobsite beyond a 30 mile radius of the main post office in town where the employer's shop is located shall be compensated at the current Internal Revenue Service (IRS) rate for actual mileage incurred beyond the 30 mile radius, plus their regular rate of pay for travel time.

Ironworkers

- (1) Travel more than 50 miles from the interchange of Interstate 40 and Interstate 25 or from the employee's home should be paid at \$8.00 per hour.
- (2) If travel is within Santa Fe county, travel time shall be paid at \$3.00 per hour.

Laborers

- (1) Type A
 - (a) Work travel between 50 and 85 miles from the employer's primary address should be compensated at \$3.50 per hour.
 - (b) Work travel 86 miles or greater from the employer's primary address should be compensated at \$5.00 per hour.
- (2) Types B and C:
 - (a) Work travel under 50 miles is a "free zone";
 - (b) The municipal limit of the city of Santa Fe is \$30.00 per day;
 - (c) Work travel between 50 and 75 miles from the union hall to include the municipal limits of Estancia, Grants, and Socorro is \$40.00 per day.
 - (d) All work over 75 miles from the union hall is \$50.00 per day.
- (3) Type H no zone subsistence pay
- (4) If an employer provides the employee transportation and mutually agreeable, suitable lodging in areas where overnight stays are necessary, subsistence rates do not apply.

Millwrights

- (1) Work travel between 76 and 150 miles should be compensated at \$50.00 per day.
- (2) Work travel greater than 150 miles should be compensated at \$75.00 per day.



Operating Engineers

- (1) Type A operators should be compensated for zone and subsistence as follows:
 - (a) Work travel between 50 and 85 miles from the interchange of Interstate
 25 and Interstate 40 in Albuquerque, or from the Farmington City Hall in
 Farmington, should be compensated at \$2.50 per hour.
 - (b) Work travel 86 miles or more from the interchange of Interstate 25 and Interstate 40 in Albuquerque or from the Farmington City Hall in Farmington, should be compensated at \$4.00 per hour.
- (2) Type B and C operators:
 - (a) Base points for operators are 30 miles and beyond:
 - (i) Bernalillo county courthouse in Albuquerque;
 - (ii) State capital building in Santa Fe;
 - (iii) City hall in Farmington.
 - (b) Zone and subsistence for Albuquerque and Santa Fe are as follows:
 - (i) work travel between 30 and 50 miles from the base point compensated at \$20.00 per day;
 - (ii) work travel between 51 and 100 miles from the base point compensated at \$45.00 per day;
 - (iii) work travel over 100 miles from the base point that involves an overnight stay compensated at \$75.00 per day.
 - (c) Zone and subsistence for Los Alamos county, \$50.00 per day.
 - (d) If an employer provides the employee transportation and mutually agreeable, suitable lodging in areas where overnight stays are necessary, subsistence rates do not apply.
- (3) Type H operators are not eligible for zone and subsistence pay.

Painters

- Zone 1: Base pay for an area within a 30 mile radius from the main post office in the city or town where the employee permanently resides. Albuquerque, Santa Fe, and Belen shall be considered Zone I.
- (2) Zone 2: Work travel between 30 and 75 miles from the main post office in the town where an employee permanently resides shall be compensated at \$1.00 per hour above base pay.
- (3) Zone 3: Work travel 75 miles or more from the main post office in the town where an employee permanently resides shall be compensated at \$2.50 per hour above base pay.
- (4) When the employee is required to stay overnight, the employer should provide and pay for suitable lodging.
- (5) Employer will furnish transportation or gasoline for all work performed beyond the 30 mile radius that encompasses the free cities of Albuquerque, Santa Fe or Belen.



Paper hangers

- (1) Zone 1: Base pay for an area within a 30 mile radius from the main post office in the city or town where the employee permanently resides. Albuquerque, Santa Fe, and Belen shall be considered Zone I.
- (2) Zone 2: Work travel between 30 and 75 miles from the main post office in the town where an employee permanently resides shall be compensated at \$1.00 per hour above base pay.
- (3) Zone 3: Work travel 75 miles or more from the main post office in the town where an employee permanently resides shall be compensated at \$2.50 per hour above base pay.
- (4) When the employee is required to stay overnight, the employer should provide and pay for suitable lodging.
- (5) Employer will furnish transportation or gasoline for all work performed beyond the 30 mile radius that encompasses the free cities of Albuquerque, Santa Fe or Belen.

Plasterers

- (1) Employees who travel from Albuquerque to Santa Fe should be compensated at \$20.00 per day.
- (2) Except for employees who travel from Santa Fe to Albuquerque, work travel 75 miles or more from the employer's office over the most typically traveled route should be compensated at \$5.00 per hour and capped at \$40.00 per day.

Plumbers and pipefitters

- (1) Work travel for 90 or more miles from an employee's primary residence, and involving an overnight stay, should be compensated at \$80.00 per day.
- (2) No zone or subsistence pay is required should the employer elect to cover the room cost.
- (3) Los Alamos county workers receive \$0.80 per hour incentive pay plus base and fringe.

Roofers

Work travel requiring an overnight stay should be compensated at \$35.00 per day for food. Employer should provide and pay for a suitable hotel. When employees are assigned to jobs located 60 or more miles from the employer's place of business, transportation to and from the job site must be provided.



Sheet metal workers

- (1) Work travel 90 miles or more from contractor's home base and employee's home, should be paid at \$80.00 per day subsistence pay plus base and fringe, regardless of county.
- (2) Los Alamos county: \$2.00 per hour incentive pay plus base and fringe.
- (3) Workers living 60 or more miles from a San Juan county job site receive \$3.00 per hour subsistence pay plus base and fringe.

Soft floor layer

- (1) Zone 1: Base pay for an area within a 30 mile radius from the main post office in the city or town where the employee permanently resides. Albuquerque, Santa Fe, and Belen shall be considered Zone I.
- (2) Zone 2: Work travel between 30 and 75 miles from the main post office in the town where an employee permanently resides shall be compensated at \$1.00 per hour above base pay.
- (3) Zone 3: Work travel 75 miles or more from the main post office in the town where an employee permanently resides shall be compensated at \$3.13 per hour above base pay.
- (4) Employer will furnish transportation or gasoline for all work performed beyond the 30 mile radius that encompasses the free cities of Albuquerque, Santa Fe or Belen.

Sprinkler fitters

- (1) Work travel between 60 and 80 miles from the employee's primary residence should be compensated at \$21.00 per day.
- (2) Work travel between 81 and 100 miles from the employee's primary residence should be compensated at \$31.00 per day.
- (3) Work travel of 101 miles or more from the employee's primary residence should be compensated at \$115.00 per day, plus \$0.54 per mile when driving directly from home to the job site, and directly from job site to home or next job site, as assigned by the employer.
- (4) No zone or subsistence pay shall be paid when the employer provides daily transportation and the employee elects to travel back and forth from home.
