1. Welcome by Craig Lewis and Chris Story

- a. Steering Committee established to execute a high-quality enhancement to a valued public space of Morgan Square
- b. The block of west Main Street was closed to vehicles that has accommodated outdoor dining, that has been very well received by the community
- c. Morgan Square has always been the central location, but it's even more prominent in the psychology now, and how to facilitate community needs are up to your professional design support
- d. Some uncertainties to navigate through:
 - i. City will dedicate resources for the improvement
 - ii. Some assumption to private funding
 - iii. As a result, there's no finite budget now

2. Presentation by Craig Lewis

a. History of the Square

- i. Technically a triangle but has always been a public space
- ii. General Daniel Morgan Statue (has moved around in the location)

b. Key Projects Issues

- i. The square boundary is beyond the square, and we're looking to expand design solutions from building face to building face (Dunbar St. to Main St)
- ii. There was discussion about closing Dunbar Streets, but decided to keep it open due to logistics of deliveries, event set ups, and other service needs
- iii. Square is missing activation and seamless connections
- iv. Opportunity to utilize the existing canopy, creating a place for seating and reprise
- v. Western Entry opening it up
- vi. Church Street entrance busy street but not inhospitable, a stage on this edge was previously explored
- vii. Main Street –explore if the street should remain close for food and beverage spillover?
 - Full closure preferred by the public and city council approved it for the next two years
- viii. Sidewalk expansion to allow for curb side dining, varied expansion explored including merging with the plaza.
 - Fire access to be integrated
- ix. The water fountain is an important feature to maintain but poses challenges in obscuring vision and sound during events
- x. Retaining walls restrict movement and visibility

c. Key Project Goals

- i. Activate the edges and establish an ease of movement b/w Morgan Sq and Main/Dunbar Streets
- ii. Eliminate visual and physical barriers
- iii. Introduce interactive features
- iv. Integrate lighting
- v. Achieve comfort b/w sun and shade to promote comfort of use
- vi. Accommodate flexible programming



- vii. Honor the history and accentuate local character through materials, signage, public art, etc.
- d. Next Steps
 - i. We're in Step 2 Issuing an RFP & Hire Design Consultant
 - Step 3 will be Schematic design process
 - Step 4 Public input on Schematic Design Options
 - ii. This is a city of Spartanburg project and will be overseen by the established Steering Committee
 - CRTKL will be the point of contact for this project and help coordinate meetings with the city and for public engagement
 - iii. Looking for a multi-disciplinary design team, ability to bring the project through construction documents
 - iv. Project Scope Tasks
 - Project Management
 - Data Collections & Field Surveys
 - Stakeholder & Community Engagement (mostly facilitated by City and CRTKL, but design team provides materials)
 - Re-visioning & Schematic Design
 - Design Development
 - v. Schedule
