General Information

1. Definitions

- a. "Requirements Contract" and "Term Bid" are standing arrangements between KCDC and a supplier in which prices and terms are agreed upon and in which KCDC may call on the supplier to deliver goods and/or services under the terms of the agreement.
- b. "Senior Asset Manager" is the manager of one or more KCDC properties. He or she may delegate the administration of the work to an "Asset Manager" or "Maintenance" employee. In any case, the Senior Asset Manager or designee will request work as needs arise.
- c. "Supplier" is inclusive of various words describing interested parties often called "vendor," "bidders," "contractors" and "proposers."

2. Background and Intent

- a. Knoxville's Community Development Corporation (KCDC) is the public housing and redevelopment agency for the City of Knoxville and for Knox County in Tennessee. KCDC's affordable housing property portfolio includes 20 sites with approximately 3,525 dwelling units. Several of the properties include Low Income Housing Tax Credits units and KCDC is both the General Partner and the management company for those sites. Those properties include Eastport LP, Five Points 1, LP; Five Points 2, LP; Five Points 3, LP; Five Points 4, LP; Lonsdale Homes, LP; Northridge Crossing, LP and The Vista at Summit Hill, LP. KCDC also oversees approximately 3,958 Section 8 Vouchers, 82 Moderate Rehabilitation units and 20 Redevelopment areas. KCDC has issued this solicitation for itself and on the behalf of the various properties that it now provides "management services" as detailed above. Any resulting awards are either for KCDC itself or are on behalf of those properties which KCDC provides "management services."
- b. KCDC issued this solicitation on behalf of the Tennessee Association Housing & Redevelopment Authorities (TAHRA). Hereafter the terms "KCDC" and "TAHRA" are used interchangeably.
- c. The various Public Housing Authorities (PHAs) in the State of Tennessee often purchase common items while furnishing their units, including household appliances. In order to obtain volume discounts, TAHRA agreed to coordinate one solicitation that any or all housing agencies (in addition to other governmental entities) may use. However, no PHA is mandated to use this agreement.
- d. Once the award is made, the successful supplier will honor orders, at the specified prices, from any TAHRA member agency, city, county or state agency or any other municipality or political subdivision choosing to participate.
- e. However, no agency or governmental entity is required to participate and may conduct separate procurements for items contained in this solicitation. Additionally, TAHRA does not guarantee any orders will be placed and assures no responsibility, financial or otherwise, for purchases made under this contract.

- f. This solicitation is to provide modern, efficient and Energy Star rated (as applicable) appliances for use by Public Housing Authorities and other government entities across the State of Tennessee.
- g. Upon award, the successful suppliers will need to market the program to the TAHRA membership. For such purposes, TAHRA will work with the suppliers to communicate award notice and materials.
- h. The successful suppliers are strongly encouraged to consider active participation in TAHRA, including attendance at its spring and fall meetings. Additionally, the supplier may want to consider becoming an affiliate member of TAHRA. Details are on TAHRA's webpage at <http://tahrnet.org/>.

3. **Changes after Award**

It is possible that after award TAHRA will need to revise the service needs or requirements specified in this document. TAHRA reserves the right to make such changes after consultation with the supplier. Should additional costs arise, the supplier must document increased costs. TAHRA reserves the right to accept or reject and negotiate these charges.

TAHRA also reserves the right to accept proposed service changes from the supplier if they will lower the cost to TAHRA and/or provide improved service.

4. **Evaluation**

- a. TAHRA alone determines (using NIGP's definition and other relevant sources as appropriate) the supplier's "responsive" and "responsible" status prior to award. Responsible means a business with the financial and technical capacity to perform the requirements of the solicitation and subsequent contract. A responsive bid is one fully conforming in all material respects to the solicitation document and all of its requirements, including all forms and substance.
- b. TAHRA reserves the right to request additional information to assist in the evaluation process. This includes references and business capacity information.
- c. TAHRA will review all bids and reserves the right to request necessary modifications, waive minor technicalities, reject all bids, reject any bid that does not meet mandatory requirement(s) or cancel this solicitation, according to TAHRA's best interests. TAHRA further reserves the right to adjust its evaluation scenario if it is in TAHRA's best interest and consistent with good business practices.

5. **General Instructions**

TAHRA does not insert "General Instructions to Vendors" in the solicitation document. These instructions are at www.kcdc.org. Click on "Procurement" and follow the link. By submitting a response to this solicitation, the supplier accepts the responsibility for downloading, reading and abiding by the terms and conditions set forth in KCDC's "General Instructions to Vendors." Suppliers may wish to review certain applicable HUD instructions also on KCDC's webpage.

6. **Invoicing/Ordering**

This section is germane to KCDC only.

- a. Until a purchase order is in place, work is not to be performed nor are goods to be delivered. KCDC has no legal obligation to pay for work performed prior to the issuance of a purchase order. Emergency situations are exempted from this statement and such situations can be approved by the Procurement Division.
- b. Suppliers are asked to email invoices with 10 days following work completion and are required to submit invoices within 90 days following the delivery of the goods or services. KCDC may deny invoices submitted after the 90-day threshold.
- c. KCDC pays by electronic transfer (ACH). Supplier's accounts receivable staff must use KCDC's Supplier Portal to ascertain payments made and to which invoices they apply.

Suppliers will set up an account in KCDC's Supplier Portal so that they receive an email with each payment detailing the invoice number and the amount paid.

KCDC is not able to routinely offer payment history assistance and so if the supplier is unable or unwilling to use KCDC's Supplier Portal to track payments, should consider whether or not to submit a response to this solicitation.

- d. Since KCDC is the managing partner for nine separate corporations under the KCDC umbrella, those separate corporations must receive separate invoices. Thus, the supplier will generally:
 - Bill each specific site for work performed or goods delivered.
 - Create separate invoices for Eastport LP, Five Points 1, LP; Five Points 2, LP; Five Points 3, LP; Five Points 4, LP; Lonsdale Homes, LP; Northridge Crossing, LP and The Vista at Summit Hill, LP showing them as the "Owner" or "Bill To" entity.
- e. Invoices must:
 - Be numbered
 - List a date on them that is after the work is completed or goods delivered
 - List the purchase order number
 - Breakdown pricing according to the award structure
 - Show the supplier's name and address

7. Length of Award

The initial award is for 12 months. The award has four one-year optional renewals that TAHRA may choose to exercise.

8. Price Structure at Renewals

- a. At the end of each award year, the successful supplier may request a price increase. Proof of increased cost to the successful supplier must accompany price increase requests. TAHRA may, at its option:

1. Accept the proposed price increase.
2. Reject the proposed price increase.

3. Suggest an alternative price increase.
- b. If TAHRA rejects a proposed price, the successful supplier may:
 1. Continue with the existing pricing.
 2. Suggest an alternative price increase.
 3. End the award.
 - c. While the supplier may offer other goods, only those specifically awarded are “on contract.” Other goods offered are not covered by the award and can only be procured through specific purchase orders identifying the special goods to be offered and the price for them. TAHRA’s and the normal procurement thresholds of other entities will apply.
 - d. If one supplier elects to not renew or TAHRA elects to not renew with a supplier, the remaining suppliers may continue with the entire award or the solicitation may be re-issued.
 - e. If Energy Star requirements change during this award or contract, TAHRA reserves the right to renegotiate the award or contract with the successful supplier(s) to meet the new standards without going out for new bids, if so desired.

9. **Quantities**

While this is an “As Needed” solicitation and no specific quantities are guaranteed and while this solicitation is intended for all members of TAHRA (see Appendix I for a listing), the following quantities are estimated to have been purchased in 2019 by TAHRA, Metropolitan Development and Housing Authority (MDHA) and the Chattanooga Housing Authority (CHA).

11. **Use of Solicitation Forms**

Suppliers are to complete the solicitation forms contained in the solicitation package. Failure to complete these forms may result in rejection of your response. Do not alter the solicitation forms without TAHRA’s approval. Suppliers are asked to use the Adobe fillable version of the pricing pages to eliminate difficulties in reading handwritten text.

Specifications

12. **General Requirements**

The supplier shall furnish all equipment and material, and it shall be commercial quality from a regular product line. This request for bid is not intentionally written around any one manufacturer and is to indicate the general size, type and description of equipment needed.

13. **Energy Star**

TAHRA is very interested in energy efficiency. Energy Star certified appliances **are required** unless there are no such models currently so certified.

14. **Delivery**

- a. Delivery shall be F.O.B. Destination, freight paid by the supplier, to the ordering entity. Delivery charges are included in the per unit cost. The driver will, at the minimum, assist PHA staff with unloading appliances to the tailgate of the delivery truck.
- b. Agencies shall have the right to mix sizes and types of products to obtain quantity pricing. Prices given are for delivery F.O.B. to any point within Tennessee for purchases made by any participating entity. Should a governmental entity outside of Tennessee desire to use this award/contract, the supplier and the entity will negotiate shipping charges.
- c. KCDC's delivery needs have changed and now deliveries are directly to KCDC sites. While some sites can easily accommodate large trucks, many cannot accept trucks longer than fourteen (14) feet. Most KCDC sites do not have docks and so the supplier will have to arrange lift gate delivery with the sites.

15. **Model and Price Change Notification**

After award, if models change and/or prices increase (see above concerning price increases), the supplier(s) must notify TAHRA. Upon approval, notification will be sent to other TAHRA members.

16. **Packing and Marking**

Packaging, packing and marking shall be in accordance with standard commercial practices and be specified in the contract or order. TAHRA encourages environmentally friendly packaging and the general reduction of packaging materials.

17. **Dishwashers**

Dishwashers are to be Same as Or Equal To the Current Models listed in Column B on the pricing sheet. TAHRA wants one model made available for purchase for its members.

18. **Electric Ranges**

Electric Ranges are to be Same as Or Equal To the Current Models listed in Column B on the pricing sheet. TAHRA wants five models made available for purchase for its members.

Operating Service is either 115/120 volts or 120/208 volts, 3-wire or 4-wire, single-phase, 60HZ.

The standard electric range connection cords will not be ordered with the ranges. Therefore, the cost of connection cords is not to be included in the price of the range.

Ranges, at a minimum, shall have one indicator light that will indicate when any of the top burners are on and one oven indicator light to show when the oven is heating.

An oven time control is not required.

Each range shall be equipped with at least four leg levelers and anti-tilt brackets or approved anti-tilt devices.

All ranges are to be equipped with two oven racks.

The range cook top, oven box, door, control panel and door exterior shall be porcelain enamel. Range side panels, oven and storage drawers, if equipped, shall be porcelain or a suitable high-temperature baked enamel.

Ranges shall have a UL listing and the supplier shall provide a copy of the UL labels in the brochures.

19. **Gas Ranges**

Gas Ranges are to be Same as Or Equal To the Current Models listed in Column B on the pricing sheet. TAHRA wants two models made available for purchase for its members.

- a. Ranges, or parts thereof, supplied under this specification shall fulfill the construction and performance requirements of the latest edition of the American National Standard Institute (ANSI) Z21.1 and Z21.20 (when applicable).

The cooking top shall be provided with four burners. Each burner shall be rated at no less than 9000 BTU.

Each top burner shall be provided with a porcelain enameled cast iron or steel grate.

All burners shall be equipped with automatic ignition of the gas. Failure of the over burner pilot shall activate a means for shutting off gas to the over burner. This shall meet the applicable requirements of the ANSI Z21.20-2014. The electric ignition system may be spark, coil, glow bar or a combination of these.

An oven thermostat control shall be provided for controlling oven temperatures down to 170°F. The baking oven and broiling section shall be porcelain enamel coated steel. The broiling section shall be either of the drop door type, pull out type or swing door type. Stops shall be provided so that oven racks cannot be completely pulled out by accident.

Ovens shall be provided with a vent designed to deflect moisture and fumes away from the wall behind the range.

At a minimum, the back guard, main top, control panel and door shall be porcelain enamel. All other exterior surfaces shall be finished in synthetic, baked-on enamel capable of withstanding 250°F. The range body, back panel, legs and/or base shall be porcelain enamel, baked-on enamel, galvanized or aluminized steel. The area under the main top may be porcelain enamel or synthetic, baked-on enamel.

Each range shall be equipped with a back splash not less than four inches higher than the top cooking surface and extending the full width of the range top.

The equipment and accessories supplied with each range, such as oven and broiler racks, shall be those normally supplied with the manufacturer's standard production for the type range ordered.

All gas ranges are to have four adjustable legs for leveling and are to be equipped with anti-tipping brackets.

The top of the range is to be lifting top for ease of cleaning under and around the top burners with a support bracket to hold the top in an elevated position, or have a lift-off top.

20. **Microwaves**

Microwaves are to be Same as Or Equal To the Current Models listed in Column B on the pricing sheet. TAHRA wants four models made available for purchase for its members.

21. **Range Hoods**

Range Hoods are to be Same as Or Equal To the Current Models listed in Column B on the pricing sheet. TAHRA wants two models made available for purchase for its members.

22. **Refrigerators**

Refrigerators are to be Same as Or Equal To the Current Models listed in Column B on the pricing sheet. TAHRA wants four models made available for purchase for its members.

Refrigerator sizes are general size requirements. Suppliers may bid nearest to the size listed (i.e. 13.9 - 15.5 cubic feet refrigerators are considered 14 cubic feet models, and 15.6 - 16.5 cubic feet refrigerators are considered 16 cubic feet models).

Refrigerators shall be the self-contained and self-defrosting, household type with electric motor driven condensing units. All refrigerators shall be furnished with shelves in the door and vegetable drawers or crisper trays.

The exterior doors shall have reversible hinges which allow for left or right swing and be equipped with a magnetic gasket.

The interior liners of food storage compartments shall be porcelain enamel on steel or plastic.

The temperature control shall be equipped with an off position and contact points or setting positions for a wide range of degree of temperature.

Each refrigerator shall include one or more vegetable drawers or crisper trays which are readily removable. These shall be constructed of steel finished with porcelain enamel, anodized aluminum or durable plastic, durable glass or non-corrosive metal.

Refrigerators are to be equipped with four rollers (for ease of moving the refrigerator without damage to the floor covering.) The two backside rollers may be stationary with the two front side rollers adjustable up and down for leveling the refrigerator.

Refrigerators must meet the December 2020, United States Department of Energy Freezer/Refrigerator Energy Star standards.

Representations, Certifications, and Other Statements of Bidders Public and Indian Housing Programs

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1. Certificate of Independent Price Determination

(a) The bidder certifies that--

(1) The prices in this bid have been arrived at independently, without, for the purpose of restricting competition, any consultation, communication, or agreement with any other bidder or competitor relating to (i) those prices, (ii) the intention to submit a bid, or (iii) the methods or factors used to calculate the prices offered;

(2) The prices in this bid have not been and will not be knowingly disclosed by the bidder, directly or indirectly, to any other bidder or competitor before bid opening (in the case of a sealed bid solicitation) or contract award (in the case of a competitive proposal solicitation) unless otherwise required by law; and

(3) No attempt has been made or will be made by the bidder to induce any other concern to submit or not to submit a bid for the purpose of restricting competition.

(b) Each signature on the bid is considered to be a certification by the signatory that the signatory--

(1) Is the person in the bidder's organization responsible for determining the prices being offered in this bid or proposal, and that the signatory has not participated and will not participate in any action contrary to subparagraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) above; or

(2) (i) Has been authorized, in writing, to act as agent for the following principals in certifying that those principals have not participated, and will not participate in any action contrary to subparagraphs (a)(1) through (a)(3) above.

(1) Each bidder shall execute, in the form provided by the PHA/IHA, an affidavit to the effect that he/she has not colluded with any other person, firm or corporation in regard to any bid submitted in response to this solicitation. If the successful bidder did not submit the affidavit with his/her bid, he/she must submit it within three (3) working days of bid opening. Failure to submit the affidavit by that date may render the bid nonresponsive. No contract award will be made without a properly executed affidavit.

(2) A fully executed "Non-collusive Affidavit" [] is, [] is not included with the bid.

2. Contingent Fee Representation and Agreement

(a) Definitions. As used in this provision:

"Bona fide employee" means a person, employed by a bidder and subject to the bidder's supervision and control as to time, place, and manner of performance, who neither exerts, nor proposes to exert improper influence to solicit or obtain contracts nor holds out as being able to obtain any contract(s) through improper influence.

"Improper influence" means any influence that induces or tends to induce a PHA/IHA employee or officer to give consideration or to act regarding a PHA/IHA contract on any basis other than the merits of the matter.

(b) The bidder represents and certifies as part of its bid that, except for full-time bona fide employees working solely for the bidder, the bidder:

(1) [] has, [] has not employed or retained any person or company to solicit or obtain this contract; and

(2) [] has, [] has not paid or agreed to pay to any person or company employed or retained to solicit or obtain this contract any commission, percentage, brokerage, or other fee contingent upon or resulting from the award of this contract.

(c) If the answer to either (a)(1) or (a)(2) above is affirmative, the bidder shall make an immediate and full written disclosure to the PHA/IHA Contracting Officer.

(d) Any misrepresentation by the bidder shall give the PHA/IHA the right to (1) terminate the contract; (2) at its discretion, deduct from contract payments the amount of any commission, percentage, brokerage, or other contingent fee; or (3) take other remedy pursuant to the contract.

3. Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (applicable to contracts exceeding \$100,000)

(a) The definitions and prohibitions contained in Section 1352 of title 31, United States Code, are hereby incorporated by reference in paragraph (b) of this certification.
