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## City of Knoxville Request for Proposals

## Employee Health Program Consultant Services

#### I. Statement of Intent

The City of Knoxville is requesting submissions of qualifications from responsible firms to provide Employee Health Program Consultant Services for the following, including but not limited to, employee health, wellness, life, disability, and voluntary products. The services solicited under this Request for Proposals are for consultant services in the maintenance and continuing development of the total employee health program of the City. These services may be broader than those of similar contracts. The provider may also be involved in the implementation of and employee communication regarding various benefit plans. The contract is to provide for all compensation for the services provided under the contract. No commission, contingency fees or other compensation are to apply to the services under the contract. Duration of contract is to be for three (3) years with two optional one-year renewals.

This timetable is for the information of submitting entities. These dates are subject to change. However, in no event shall the deadline for submission of the proposals be changed except by written modification from the City of Knoxville Purchasing Division.

#### III. Background

The consultant services sought are for consulting of all employee health, life- and wellness-related benefits and programs. The City's staff is heavily and actively involved in the design, selection and implementation of these programs. The selected firm will be expected to enhance the abilities of and act as a team with City staff. These services may be broader than those of similar contracts.

The City has slightly less than 1,500 benefits-eligible employees; 1,284 of which elect coverage under medical and prescription drug plan, plus 102 covered retirees, for an approximate total of 3,200 covered lives. The City's medical plan is self-funded through BlueCross BlueShield of Tennessee. The carve-out pharmacy plan is with Capital Rx. In addition, the City partners with ARMS Rx to serve as consultant and auditor of the pharmacy contract. Several dental options exist with both BlueCross BlueShield and CIGNA DHMO. Vision benefit services are provided by EyeMed Vision Care. Basic Life and Supplemental Life are with OCHS, but underwritten by Minnesota Life. Long-term Disability is also with OCHS, underwritten by Madison National. The City has a relationship with Health Equity for FSA/HRA services; and with ENI for EAP. There are no commissions built into any of the above referenced lines of coverage. The City also has voluntary benefits with Allstate, Aflac and Fidelity/Chubb Life.

The City contracts with Premise Health to administer the City's on-site medical services, including both health services and occupational medicine. The wellness portal is currently contracted with Asset Health, a new partnership effective 1/1/2022.

The City is a charter member of HealthCare 21 (HC21) Business Coalition. The City also partners with Innovu for data warehousing through HC21.

#### IV. General Conditions

- **4.1.** The following data is intended to form the basis for submission of proposals to provide professional services for the City of Knoxville Employee Health Program Consultant Services.
- **4.2.** This material contains general conditions for the procurement process, the scope of service requested, contract requirements, instructions for submissions of proposals, and submission forms that must be included in the proposal. The RFP should be read in its entirety before preparing the proposal.
- **4.3.** All materials submitted pursuant to this RFP shall become the property of the City of Knoxville.
- 4.4. To the extent permitted by law, all documents pertaining to this Request for Proposals shall be kept confidential until the proposal evaluation is complete and a recommendation submitted to City Council for review. No information about any submission of proposals shall be released until the process is complete, except to the members of the Evaluation Committee and other appropriate City staff. All information provided shall be considered by the Evaluation Committee in making a recommendation to enter into an agreement with the selected firm.
- 4.5. Any inquiries, suggestions or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to the RFP shall be made in writing and be in the hands of the Assistant Purchasing Agent, James McKeehan by the close of the business day on March 4, 2022. The City of Knoxville is not responsible for oral interpretations given by any City employee, representative, or others. The issuance of written addenda is the only official method whereby interpretation, clarification, or additional information can be given. If any addenda are issued to this Request for Proposals, the Purchasing Division will post them to the City's website at <a href="www.knoxvilletn.gov/bids">www.knoxvilletn.gov/bids</a>. Submitting organizations are strongly encouraged to view this website often to see if addenda are posted. Failure of any proposer to receive such addendum or interpretation shall not relieve such Proposer from any obligation under his proposal as submitted. All addenda so issued shall become part of the Contract Documents.
- 4.6. The City of Knoxville reserves the right to (a) accept or reject any and/or all submissions of proposals; (b) to waive irregularities, informalities, and technicalities; and (c) to accept any alternative submission of proposals presented which, in its opinion, would best serve the interests of the City. The City shall be the sole judge of the proposals, and the resulting negotiated agreement that is in its best interest, and its decision shall be final. The City also reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any submitting entity to perform the work or service requested. Information the City deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the submitting entity. Such information may include, but is not limited to, current financial statements by an independent CPA, verification of availability of equipment and personnel, and past performance records.
- 4.7. Included in the Contract Documents is an affidavit that the undersigned has not entered into any collusion with any person in respect to this qualification. The qualifier is required to submit this affidavit with the submission. Also included is the Diversity Business Program contracting packet. Submissions must indicate on the enclosed form whether or not the proposer/qualifier intends to use subcontractors and/or suppliers from one of the defined groups. Proposers/Qualifiers are advised that the City tracks use of such use, but it does not influence or affect evaluation or award.

- **4.8.** Subsequent to the Evaluation Committee's review and the Mayor's recommendation of a firm(s), Knoxville City Council approval may be required before the final contract may be executed.
- **4.9.** All expenses for making a submission of proposal shall be borne by the submitting entity.
- 4.10. Any submission of proposals may be withdrawn up until the date and time for opening of the submissions. Any submission not so withdrawn shall, upon opening, constitute an irrevocable offer for a period of 120 days to the City of Knoxville for the services set forth in the Request for Proposals until one or more of the submissions have been duly accepted by the City.
- **4.11.** Prior to submitting their proposals, proposers are to be registered with the Purchasing Division through the City of Knoxville's online Vendor Registration system. Instructions for registering on-line are available at <a href="https://www.knoxvilletn.gov/purchasing">www.knoxvilletn.gov/purchasing</a>. **Proposals from un-registered proposers may be rejected.**
- 4.12. NO CONTACT POLICY: After the posting of this solicitation to the Purchasing Division's website, any contact initiated by any proposer with any City of Knoxville representative concerning this proposal is strictly prohibited, unless such contact is made with the Purchasing Division representative listed herein or with said representative's authorization. Any unauthorized contact may cause the disqualification of the proposer from this procurement transaction. Proposals must include a notarized No Contact/No Advocacy Affidavit (to be found in the "Submission Forms" section of this document).
- **4.13. INCLEMENT WEATHER:** During periods of inclement weather, the Purchasing Division will enact the following procedures with regard to solicitations and weather delays:
  - If City offices are closed due to inclement weather on the date that bids/proposals/qualifications/letters of interest are due into the Purchasing Office, all solicitations due that same day will be moved to the next operational business day.
  - The City of Knoxville shall not be liable for any commercial carrier's decision regarding deliveries during inclement weather.

## V. Scope of Service

The City of Knoxville is seeking proposals from responsible firms to provide services for Employee Benefit Consulting. The desired term of the contract is for three (3) years with two each one (1) year renewal options. The services sought include, but are not limited to, the following:

**5.1** Vendor must employ one or more insurance agents licensed for health, life and accident insurance according to the relevant State of Tennessee laws and regulations.

The areas of expertise sought include, but are not limited to:

- A. Medical insurance plan design
- B. Medical insurance and reinsurance
- C. Medical underwriting and cost projection
- D. Health assessment programs
- E. Plan implementation
- F. Employee/Participant communication
- G. Employee health and medical consumer education

- H. Pharmacy benefit management and pharmacy plan design
- I. Benchmarking (plan design, cost, etc)
- J. Disease management/ chronic condition management
- K. On-Site Medical Clinics
- L. Health incentive/ wellness programs
- M. Life and Disability programs
- N. Annual and Sick leave programs
- O. Mental health and Employee Assistance programs
- P. Flexible Spending Accounts/ Health Reimbursement Arrangements
- Q. ERISA, HIPAA, COBRA, FMLA, ACA Compliance
- R. Legal Advice on Employee Benefits
- S. Data warehouse knowledge, specifically Innovu
- T. Integration of all the above

The services sought include but are not limited to assistance with those detailed in Section 5.2.

- 5.2 The City of Knoxville is seeking a consultant to perform the full range of services related to the design, implementation, maintenance, communication, and improvement of the City of Knoxville's group insurance programs. This includes, but is not limited to: health and wellness programs, dental, vision, life insurance, disability, EAP, and voluntary coverages.
  The consultant would also be expected to provide assistance in coordinating a yearly vendor summit where all vendors would come together to share resources for the benefit of the City of Knoxville.
- A. As requested by the City of Knoxville, prepare bid specifications and solicit proposals, when required, from insurance markets which specialize in group insurance plans as needed. Evaluate bids and bidders, including administration, coverage, claim payment procedures, customer service, networks, reserve establishment policies, financial soundness, and identify the most cost-beneficial package from among the various bidders.
- B. Working with Law Department to develop contracts with insurance carriers to ensure they meet requested bid specifications.
- C. Assist the City of Knoxville with the implementation and communication of new programs or changes to existing programs, which will include attending and presenting information at quarterly meetings and being present at quarterly meetings with various vendors.
- D. Assist the Employee Benefits & Risk Management Department with ongoing employee communication regarding employee benefits
- E. Determine and recommend the most economical funding methods for the benefit programs and strike a balance between cost and comprehensiveness of the programs.

- F. Working within the City of Knoxville procurement guidelines to negotiate with providers on all issues including those related to premiums, benefit levels, plan design, and special terms and conditions.
- G. Assisting the Employee Benefits & Risk Management Department in administering all group insurance plans, responding to questions from and providing information to staff, and providing other consulting services during the course of the plan year, including but not limited to meeting with the Employee Benefits Advisory Committee.
- H. Review claims experience, claim service, and claim administration to ensure maximum benefit to the City of Knoxville and provide monthly reports related to experience and accruals.
- I. Meet regularly and provide reports to various City of Knoxville representatives and evaluate if the City is on target for agreed upon goals.
- J. Research any new developments in the law and employee benefit programs on an ongoing basis, to assist the City of Knoxville in complying with laws and regulations related to employee benefits, including but not limited to the Affordable Care Act, COBRA, FMLA, HIPAA, etc.
- K. Interface with current vendors as needed to assist the City of Knoxville in the resolution of problems associated with benefit programs. And be the point of contact for new vendors and programs that are interested in working with the City; and determine whether their products and services are consistent with the City's 3-and 5-year plans.
- L. Coordinate and organize an annual Vendor Summit with all vendors present for an all-day meeting for the purposes of collaboration and planning.
- M. Assist in developing communication strategies for employees and their families maximizing all resources available, including but not limited to any dollars available through vendor contracts.
- N. Evaluate our current voluntary benefit offerings to ensure best cost, value and vendor are in place.
- O. Meet weekly with Employee Benefits staff regarding all aspects of benefits to assist in decision making and a central location for all outstanding issues.
- P. Assist the City in meeting City Council deadlines for contract over \$25,000 and agree to meet deadlines accordingly.

#### VI. Contract Requirements

Submitting entities, if selected, must be willing to sign a contract with the City which will include certain provisions, among which are the following:

- **6.1. Contract Documents**. The contract shall consist of (1) the RFP; (2) the proposal submitted by the contractor to this RFP; and (3) the contract. In the event of a discrepancy between the contract, the RFP and the submitted proposal, the terms that provide the greater benefit to the City and/or impose the greater obligation to the contractor will prevail.
- **6.2. Administration**. The contract will be administered by the City of Knoxville's Employee Benefits & Risk Management Department.
- **6.3. Invoices.** Invoices for services will be submitted to the City in accordance with the contract terms.
- **6.4. Independent Contractor**. The relationship of contractor to the City will be that of independent contractor. The contractor will be solely and entirely responsible for its acts and for the acts of its

agents, employees, servants and subcontractors done during the performance of the contract. All services performed by the contractor shall be provided in an independent contractor capacity and not in the capacity of officers, agents, or employees of the City.

- **6.5. Assignment**. The contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this contract without prior written consent of the City of Knoxville.
- **6.6.** ADA Compliance. With regard to the services performed under this Agreement, the Contractor will comply with all applicable requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. § 12101, et seq. ("ADA"). The Contractor agrees that it will defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless against any and all claims, demands, suits or causes of action which arise out of any negligent and/or intentional act or omission by the Contractor, its employees, agents or representatives that violates the ADA. The Contractor agrees that the City will not be responsible for any cost or expenses arising from the Contractor's failure to comply with the ADA.
- **6.7. Indemnification and Hold Harmless**. The successful proposer will be required to sign a contract with the City which contains the following indemnification clause. This indemnification clause will not be altered in any way. Failure to agree with this indemnification clause in the contract may result in the City moving to the next responsible responsive proposer.

Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officers, employees and agents from any and all liabilities which may accrue against the City, its officers, employees and agents or any third party for any and all lawsuits, claims, demands, losses or damages alleged to have arisen from an act or omission of Contractor in performance of this Agreement or from Contractor's failure to perform this Agreement using ordinary care and skill, except where such injury, damage, or loss was caused by the sole negligence of the City, its agents or employees. The amount and type of insurance coverage requirements set forth in this Agreement will in no way be construed as limiting the scope of the indemnity in this section.

Contractor shall save, indemnify and hold the City harmless from the cost of the defense of any claim, demand, suit or cause of action made or brought against the City alleging liability referenced above, including, but not limited to, costs, fees, attorney fees, and other expenses of any kind whatsoever arising in connection with the defense of the City; and Contractor shall assume and take over the defense of the City in any such claim, demand, suit, or cause of action upon written notice and demand for same by the City. Contractor will have the right to defend the City with counsel of its choice that is satisfactory to the City, and the City will provide reasonable cooperation in the defense as Contractor may request. Contractor will not consent to the entry of any judgment or enter into any settlement with respect to an indemnified claim without the prior written consent of the City, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed. The City shall have the right to participate in the defense against the indemnified claims with counsel of its choice at its own expense.

Contractor shall save, indemnify and hold City harmless and pay judgments that shall be rendered in any such actions, suits, claims or demands against City alleging liability referenced above.

The indemnification and hold harmless provisions of this Agreement shall survive termination of the Agreement.

**6.8. Termination**. The City may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, by written notice of termination to the Contractor.

If the City terminates this Agreement, and such termination is not a result of a default by the Contractor, the Contractor shall be entitled to receive as its sole and exclusive remedy the following amounts from the City, and the City shall have no further or other obligations to the Contractor: the amount due to the Contractor for work executed through the date of termination, not including any future fees, profits, or other compensation or payments which the Contractor would have been entitled to receive if this Agreement had not been terminated.

The City may, by written notice of default to the Contractor, terminate the whole or any part of this Agreement if the Contractor fails to perform any provisions of this Agreement and does not cure such failure within a period of ten (10) days (or such longer period as the Purchasing Agent may authorize in writing) after receipt of said notice from the Purchasing Agent specifying such failure. If this Agreement is terminated in whole or in part for default, the City may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as the Purchasing Agent may deem appropriate, supplies or services similar to those terminated.

- 6.9. Insurance. When applicable and prior to the commencement of the contract, contractor must, at its sole expense, obtain and maintain in full force and effect for the duration of the Agreement and any extension hereof at least the following types and amounts of insurance for claims which may arise from or in connection with this Agreement. Contractor shall furnish the City of Knoxville with properly executed certificates of insurance which shall clearly evidence all insurance required by the City. All insurance must be underwritten by insurers with an A.M. Best rating of A-VIII or better. Such insurance shall be at a minimum the following:
  - **A. Commercial General Liability Insurance**; occurrence version commercial general liability insurance, and if necessary umbrella liability insurance, with a limit of not less than two million dollars each occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, property damage, and products and completed operations. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to the work/location in this Agreement or be no less than \$3,000,000.

#### Such insurance shall:

- (a.) Contain or be endorsed to contain a provision that includes the City, its officials, officers, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of its protection afforded to the above-listed insureds. Proof of additional insured status up to and including copies of endorsements and/or policy wording will be required.
- (b.) For any claims related to this project, Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City, its officers, officials, officers, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance programs covering the City, its officials, officers, employees, and volunteers shall be excess of Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- (c.) At the sole discretion of the City, dedicated limits of liability for this specific project may be required.
- **B.** Automobile Liability Insurance; including vehicles owned, hired, and non-owned, with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident. Such insurance shall include coverage for loading and unloading hazards. Insurance shall contain or be endorsed to contain a provision that includes the City, its officials, officers, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired, or borrowed by or on behalf of Contractor.
- C. Workers' Compensation Insurance. Contractor shall maintain workers' compensation insurance with statutory limits as required by the State of Tennessee or other applicable laws and employers' liability insurance with limits of not less than \$500,000. Contractor shall require each of its subcontractors to provide Workers' Compensation for all of the latter's employees to be engaged in such work unless such employees are covered by Contractor's workers' compensation insurance coverage.
- **D. Professional Liability** (including Errors & Omissions). Contractor shall maintain professional liability insurance covering claims arising from real or alleged errors, omissions, or negligent acts

committed in the performance of professional services under this Agreement with limits equal to the general liability requirement but no less than \$2,000,000. Coverage for contingent bodily injury and property damage should be included or endorsed onto the policy.

#### E. Other Insurance Requirements. Contractor shall:

- Prior to commencement of services, furnish the City with original certificates and amendatory
  endorsements effecting coverage required by this section and provide that such insurance
  shall not be cancelled, allowed to expire, or be materially reduced in coverage except on 30
  days' prior written notice to the City Attorney of Knoxville; P.O. Box 1631; Knoxville,
  Tennessee 37901. Proof of policy provisions regarding notice of cancellation will be
  required.
- Upon the City's request, provide certified copies of endorsements and policies if requested by the City in lieu of or in addition to certificates of insurance. Copies of policies will only be requested when contracts are deemed to be extremely or uniquely hazardous, include a dollar amount that is significant to the overall budget of the City or a City Department, or the coverage(s) may not follow standard insurance forms. A policy will only be requested after the City's Risk Manager has reviewed the contract and proof of coverage has been provided. Should the certificate of insurance refer to specific coverage wording or endorsements(s), proof of such policy wording or endorsement(s) will be required.
- Replace certificates, policies, and endorsements for any such insurance expiring prior to completion of services.
- Maintain such insurance from the time services commence until services are completed.
   Failure to maintain or renew coverage or to provide evidence of renewal may be treated by the City as a material breach of contract.
- If Contractor cannot procure insurance through an insurer having an A.M. Best rating of A-VIII, Contractor may, in the alternative, place such insurance with insurer licensed to do business in Tennessee and having A.M. Best Company ratings of no less than A. Modification of this standard may be considered upon appeal to the City Law Director.
- Require all subcontractors to maintain during the term of the Agreement Commercial General Liability insurance, Business Automobile Liability insurance, and Workers' Compensation/Employer's Liability insurance (unless subcontractor's employees are covered by Contractor's insurance) in the same manner as specified for Contractor. Contractor shall furnish subcontractors' certificates of insurance to the City without expense immediately upon request.
- <u>Large Deductibles</u>; <u>Self-Insured Retentions</u>. Any deductibles and/or self-insured retentions greater than \$50,000 must be disclosed to and approved by the City of Knoxville prior to the commencement of services. Use of large deductibles and/or self-insured retentions may require proof of financial ability as determined by the City.
- Waiver of Subrogation Required. The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the City, its officers, officials, and employees for losses arising from work performed by Contractor for the City. Proof of waiver of subrogation up to and including copies of endorsements and/or policy wording will be required.
- Occurrence Basis Requirement. All general liability policies must be written on an occurrence basis, unless the Risk Manager determines that a claims made basis is reasonable in the specific circumstance. Use of policies written on a claims made basis must be approved by the City. Risk Manager and retroactive dates and/or continuation dates must be provided to the City prior to commencement of any work performed. Professional Liability

and Environmental Liability (Pollution Coverage) are most commonly written on a claims made basis and are generally acceptable in that form.

**6.9. Ethical Standards**. Attention of all firms is directed to the following provisions contained in the Code of the City of Knoxville: Chapter 24, Article II, Section 24-33 entitled "Debts owed by persons receiving payments other than Salary;" Chapter 2, Article VIII, Division 11. the Contractor hereby takes notice of and affirms that it is not in violation of, or has not participated, and will not participate, in the violation of any of the following ethical standards prescribed by the Knoxville City Code:

#### A. Section 2-1048. Conflict of Interest.

It shall be unlawful for any employee of the city to participate, directly or indirectly, through decision, approval, disapproval, recommendation, preparation of any part of a purchase request, influencing the content of any specification or purchase standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing or otherwise, in any proceeding or application, request for ruling or other determination, claim or controversy or other matter pertaining to any contract or subcontract and any solicitation or proposal therefore, where to the employee's knowledge there is a financial interest possessed by:

- (1) the employee or the employee's immediate family;
- (2) a business other than a public agency in which the employee or member of the employee's immediate family serves as an officer, director, trustee, partner or employee; or
- (3) any person or business with whom the employee or a member of the employee's immediate family is negotiating or has an arrangement concerning prospective employment.
- B. <u>Section 2-1049</u>. <u>Receipt of Benefits from City Contracts by Council Members, Employees and Officers of the City</u>.

It shall be unlawful for any member of council, member of the board of education, officer or employee of the city to have or hold any interest in the profits or emoluments of any contract, job, work or service, either by himself or by another, directly or indirectly. Any such contract for a job, work or service for the city in which any member of council, member of the board of education, officer or employee has or holds any such interest is void.

#### C. Section 2-1050. Gratuities and Kickbacks Prohibited.

It is unlawful for any person to offer, give or agree to give to any person, while a city employee, or for any person, while a city employee, to solicit, demand, accept or agree to accept from another person, anything of a pecuniary value for or because of:

- (1) An official action taken, or to be taken, or which could be taken;
- (2) A legal duty performed, or to be performed, or which could be performed; or
- (3) A legal duty violated, or to be violated, or which could be violated by such person while a city employee.

Anything of nominal value shall be presumed not to constitute a gratuity under this section.

Kickbacks. It is unlawful for any payment, gratuity, or benefit to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor or any person associated therewith as an inducement for the award of a subcontract or order.

#### D. Section 2-1051. Covenant Relating to Contingent Fees.

(a) Representation of Contractor. Every person, before being awarded a contract in excess of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) with the city, shall represent that no other person has been retained to solicit or secure the contract with the city upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, except for bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial, selling agencies maintained by the person so representing for the purpose of securing business.

- (b) Intentional Violation Unlawful. The intentional violation of the representation specified in subsection (a) of this section is unlawful.
- E. <u>Section 2-1052</u>. <u>Restrictions on Employment of Present and Former City Employees</u>. Contemporaneous employment prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any city employee to become or be, while such employee, an employee of any party contracting with the particular department or agency in which the person is employed.

For violations of the ethical standards outlined in the Knoxville City Code, the City has the following remedies:

- (1) Oral or written warnings or reprimands;
- (2) Cancellation of transactions; and
- (3) Suspension or debarment from being a Contractor or subcontractor under city or city-funded contracts.

The value of anything transferred in violation of these ethical standards shall be recoverable by the City from such person. All procedures under this section shall be in accord with due process requirements, included but not limited to a right to notice and hearing prior to imposition of any cancellation, suspension or debarment from being a Contractor or subcontractor under a city contract.

- **6.10.** Firms must comply with the President's Executive Order No. 11246 and 11375 which prohibit discrimination in employment regarding race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Firms must also comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Copeland Anti-Kick Back Act, the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, Section 402 of the Vietnam Veterans Adjustment Act of 1974, Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, all of which are herein incorporated by reference.
- **6.11.** Firms shall give consideration to the inclusion of minority firms or individuals in this project, and shall advise the city in this proposal of their efforts to do so.
- **6.12.** Firms shall give consideration to the use of environmentally sustainable best practices, and shall advise the city in this submittal of qualifications of their efforts to do so.
- **6.13.** Federal, State, and Local Requirements. Each submitting entity is responsible for full compliance with all laws, rules and regulations which may be applicable.
- **6.14.** Licenses. Before a contract is signed by the City, the submitting entity, if selected, **must** provide the City Purchasing Division with a copy of its valid business license **or** with an affidavit explaining why it is exempt from the business licensure requirements of the city or county in which it is headquartered. If a contract is signed, the contractor's business license shall be kept current throughout the duration of the contract, and the contractor shall inform the City of changes in its business name or location. The contractor must be a licensed professional as required by the state of Tennessee, see T.C.A. Sections 62-2-101 et. seq., for any services in this contract requiring such licensure.
- **6.15. Funding**. The City's performance and obligation to pay under this contract is subject to funding contingent upon an annual appropriation.
- **6.16. Governing Law and Venue**. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of Tennessee and its conflict of laws provisions. Venue for any action arising between the City and the Contractor from the Agreement shall lie in Knox County, Tennessee.
- **6.17. Subcontracts to the Agreement**. Contractor shall not enter into a subcontract for any of the services performed under this Agreement without obtaining the prior written approval of the City.

- **6.18. Amendments**. This Agreement may be modified only by a written amendment or addendum that has been executed and approved by the appropriate officials shown on the signature page of the Agreement.
- **6.19. Captions**. The captions appearing in the Agreement are for convenience only and are not a part of the Agreement; they do not in any way limit or amplify the provisions of the Agreement.
- **6.20. Severability**. If any provision of the Agreement is determined to be unenforceable or invalid, such determination shall not affect the validity of the other provisions contained in the Agreement. Failure to enforce any provision of the Agreement does not affect the rights of the parties to enforce such provision in another circumstance, nor does it affect the rights of the parties to enforce any other provision of this Agreement at any time.
- **6.21. No Benefit for Third Parties**. The services to be performed by the Contractor pursuant to the Agreement with the City are intended solely for the benefit of the City, and no benefit is conferred hereby, nor is any contractual relationship established herewith, upon or with any person or entity not a party to the Agreement. No such person or entity shall be entitled to rely on the Contractor's performance of its services hereunder, and no right to assert a claim against the City or the Contractor, its officers, employees, agents, or contractors shall accrue to the Contractor or to any subcontractors, independently retained professional consultant, supplier, fabricator, manufacturer, lender, tenant, insurer, surety, or any other third party as a result of this Agreement or the performance or non-performance of the Contractor's services hereunder.
- **6.22. Non-Reliance of Parties**. Parties explicitly agree that they have not relied upon any earlier or outside representations other than what has been included in the Agreement. Furthermore, neither party has been induced to enter into this Agreement by anything other than the specific written terms set forth herein.
- 6.23. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any delay or failure to perform any of the services or obligations set forth in this Agreement due to causes beyond its reasonable control, and performance times shall be considered extended for a period of time equivalent to the time lost because of such delay plus a reasonable period of time to allow the parties to recommence performance of their respective obligations hereunder. Should a circumstance of force majeure last more than ninety (90) days, either party may by written notice to the other terminate this Agreement. The term "force majeure" as used herein shall means the following: acts of God; strikes, lockouts or other industrial disturbances; acts of public enemies; orders or restraints of any kind of the government of the United States or of the State or any of their departments, agencies or officials, or any civil or military authority; insurrections, riots, landslides, earthquakes, fires, storms, tornadoes, droughts, floods, explosions, breakage or accident to machinery, transmission pipes or canals; or any other cause or event not reasonably within the control of either party.
- **6.24.** EEO/AA. The City of Knoxville is an EE/AA/Title VI/Section 504/ADA/ADEA Employer.
- **6.25.** By submitting a proposal, the submitting entity agrees to all terms and conditions established in this RFP, including its contract requirements.

#### 7.4. Evaluation of Proposals

All qualified submissions received by the deadline will be analyzed by the Evaluation Committee according to the criteria outlined in these specifications. Failure to comply with the provisions of the RFP may cause any proposal to be ineligible for evaluation. Each submittal of proposals will be initially analyzed and judged according to the evaluation criteria below. The maximum score is 100 points.

The City reserves full discretion to determine the capability of proposing entities. Proposers, if asked, will provide, in a timely manner, any and all information that the City deems necessary to make such a decision. In addition to materials provided in the written responses to this RFP, the Committee may request additional material, information, references, a site visit, or a live test demonstration from the submitting entity or others.

The Evaluation Committee may or may not decide to interview any or all proposing entities at a time and date determined by the City in order to address questions and more fully ascertain how the solution to this project satisfies the evaluation criteria. Firms and/or teams responding to this Request for Proposals shall be available for interviews with the Evaluation Committee. Discussions may be conducted with responsible submitting entities for purposes of clarification to assure full understanding of and

conformance to the RFP requirements. Selection shall be based on the firms' qualifications applicable to the scope and nature of the services to be performed per this request for proposals. Determination of firms' qualifications shall be based on their written responses to this Request for Proposals and information presented to the Evaluation Committee during oral interviews, if any.

In addition to materials provided in the written responses to this Request for Proposals, the Committee may request additional material, information, or references from the submitting entity or others.

Provided it is in the best interest of the City of Knoxville, the firm or team determined to be the most responsive to the City of Knoxville, taking into consideration the evaluation factors set forth in this Request for Proposals, will be selected to begin contract negotiations. The firm or team selected will be notified at the earliest practical date and invited to submit more comprehensive information if necessary. If no satisfactory agreement can be reached with the "most responsive firm," the City may elect to negotiate with the next best and most responsive firm or team.
