The purpose of addendum #1 is to answer questions received to date and to replace page 14 of the bid.

Contractor must acknowledge receipt of all addenda with submittal on the form provided herein.

- 1. Would the City consider an alternate disposal method by approving the use of a FDEP approved bio solids treatment facility, per 62-640? Answer: Yes, as long as it is approved by FDEP.
- 2. Would the City approve of the use of a bio solids treatment facility, and the final treated bio solids, which are treated to meet Class AA-Bio solids requirements specified in 40 CFR Part 503, may be distributed and marketed, or disposed of in a Class I solid waste landfill. [62-620.320(6)] Answer: Yes, as long as it is approved by FDEP.
- 3. Who is the current contractor performing this work? Answer: H & H Sludge Disposal Inc.
- 4. What is the price per ton that the current contractor is charging? Answer: \$29.45 per wet ton.
- 5. Are the bio solid materials generated at both City Wastewater Treatment Facilities being land applied as a class B bio solid? Answer: Yes
- 6. Will the City fuel the yard dog that is left on-site? Answer: Yes
- 7. Will the yard dogs be shut off between moves? Answer: Yes
- 8. Will the yard dogs be left running, as the City is not responsible for the fuel burn? Answer: No the yard dogs will not be left running.
- 9. Is a yard dog required at both facilities? Answer: 2 Yard dogs are needed one for each facility.
- 10. Are dewatered bio solids produced at both the St. Margaret and the Kicklighter facilities?

 Answer: Yes
- 11. What does Kicklighter WWTF do with its solids? Answer: Same as St. Margarets, they are land applied or land filled.

- 12. Are Kicklighers bio solids hauled via liquid to St. Margarets WWTF? Answer: No Kicklighter has its own dewatering unit.
- 13. Do both Facilities produce dewatered cake bio solids? Answer: Yes, averaging 18% solids.
- 14. Why is the Kicklighter facility not listed on the bid sheet? Answer: Please see the revised sheet attached. You should substitute the sheet attached for the original page 14 of the bid documents.
- 15. Are the 3,840 tons listed on the bid sheet the sum total of both facilities? Answer: Yes, this would cover both facilities.
- 16. What are the annual tons produced at both facilities for the past 3 years? Answer: St. Margarets has produced 686 (dry tons) and Kicklighter has produced one load of bio solids which was 20 (wet tons) since being put in operation in April, 2018.
