General Information

1. Background and Intent

- a. Knoxville's Community Development Corporation (KCDC) is the public housing and redevelopment agency for the City of Knoxville and for Knox County in Tennessee.
- b. KCDC uses "supplier" as inclusive of various words describing interested parties often called "supplier," "bidders," "contractors" and "suppliers."
- c. "Partners Development" is KCDC's owner's representative for the Bell Street property project and they manage the mechanics of the project including the delivery of the appliances in this solicitation.
- d. The purpose of this solicitation is to make an award to one (though KCDC reserves the right to make multiple awards) supplier for providing these appliances delivered to The Flats at Bell Street. The general address for this property is 331 Harriet Tubman Street, Knoxville, Tennessee, 37915.
- e. This new property, called "The Flats at Bell Street," will have 105 dwelling units and will require an additional refrigerator for an amenity room. This property is scheduled to begin leasing the first units in early July 2021.
- f. Facts about this appliance purchase include:

These deliveries are **critical** to KCDC's ability to rent the units. - h. While KCDC has specified brands and models, suppliers may price other equal brands/models. However, note "equal" is solely KCDC's determination. Also note, size and major features must match those in specified models. If you bid a different brand/model, submit detailed specification sheets with your bid.

2. Changes After Award

It is possible that after award KCDC will need to revise the service needs or requirements specified in this document. KCDC reserves the right to make such changes after consultation with the supplier. Should additional costs arise, the supplier must document increased costs. KCDC reserves the right to accept and negotiate these charges.

3. Contact Policy

Contact only KCDC's Procurement Division about this solicitation from the issuance of this RFP until its award. Information obtained from any other person will not affect the risks or obligations assumed by the supplier or relieve the supplier from fulfilling any of the conditions of the resulting award. Such contact can disqualify the supplier from the solicitation process.

5. Damage

The supplier is responsible for all damage to buildings, equipment, grounds, premises and all other types of potential damage resulting from the provision of the services requested herein.

6. Evaluation

Responsible means a business with the financial and technical capacity to perform the requirements of the solicitation and subsequent contract. A responsive proposal is one that fully conforms in all material respects to the solicitation document and all of its requirements, including all form and substance.
- b. KCDC will review all bids and reserves the right to request necessary modifications, waive minor technicalities, reject all bids, reject any bid that does not meet mandatory requirement(s) or cancel this solicitation, according to KCDC's best interests. KCDC further reserves the right to adjust its evaluation scenario if this is in KCDC's best interest and consistent with good business practices.

7. General Instructions

8. Invoicing/Ordering

- a. Until a purchase order is in place, work is not to be performed nor are goods to be delivered. KCDC has no legal obligation to pay for work performed prior to the issuance of a purchase order.
- b. Suppliers are to email invoices with 10 days following work completion and are required to submit invoices within 90 days following the delivery of the goods or services. KCDC may deny invoices submitted after the 90-day threshold.
- c. KCDC pays by electronic transfer (ACH). Supplier's accounts receivable staff must use KCDC's Supplier Portal to ascertain payments made and to which invoices they apply. Suppliers will set up an account in KCDC's Supplier Portal so that they receive an email with each payment detailing the invoice number and the amount paid.

KCDC is not able to routinely offer payment history assistance and so if the supplier is unable or unwilling to use KCDC's Supplier Portal to track payments, should consider whether to submit a response to this solicitation.

(e) A bid allowing less than the PHA's/IHA's minimum acceptance period will be rejected.

(f) The bidder agrees to execute all that it has undertaken to do, in compliance with its bid, if that bid is accepted in writing within (1) the acceptance period stated in paragraph (c) above or (2) any longer acceptance period stated in paragraph (d) above.

(c) By the submission of this bid, the bidder certifies that it does not and will not maintain or provide for its employees any segregated facilities at any of its establishments, and that it does not and will not permit its employees to perform their services at any location under its control where segregated facilities are maintained. The bidder agrees that a breach of this certification is a violation of the Equal Employment Opportunity clause in the contract.

(d) The bidder further agrees that (except where it has obtained identical certifications from proposed subcontractors for specific time periods) prior to entering into subcontracts which exceed \$10,000 and are not exempt from the requirements of the Equal Employment Opportunity clause, it will:

- (1) Obtain identical certifications from the proposed subcontractors;
- (2) Retain the certifications in its files; and
