OVERVIEW:

Public Art Chattanooga is seeking qualifications from artists or artist teams for the commission and installation of two murals on the East and West entrances of the Wilcox Tunnel located in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Up to three finalists will be selected to develop proposals for this project. Each finalist will be paid a \$1,000 stipend. The project budget for the selected commission is \$53,000. The Wilcox Tunnel Murals will provide a transformative and dynamic visual anchor and entry into the Eastdale neighborhood and surrounding communities. This project is made possible with generous grants from the Benwood Foundation, the Footprint Foundation and the City of Chattanooga.

PROJECT DETAILS:

Through PAC's Art in the Neighborhoods program, the Eastdale neighborhood association was awarded funding to develop a meaningful public art project in their community. PAC has worked actively with the Eastdale neighborhood association, gathering community input and laying the groundwork for this public art project. PAC will commission an artist/artist team to design and install murals on both entrances to Wilcox Tunnel-- one of the oldest and busiest tunnels in the Chattanooga area.

Future artwork designs should address both the East and West entrances to the tunnel. See page 10 for tunnel entrance schematics. Since Wilcox tunnel is an essential connector between city districts, short-listed artists will need to address installation methods/techniques in detail and be willing to work with the City to provide a proposed installation schedule that limits the amount of time the tunnel will need to be closed. It is imperative that citizens and businesses are minimally impacted by closures of the tunnel. Successful applicants must also demonstrate the technical knowledge related to best practices for wall preparation techniques including experience with mural cloth and other applications that will reduce onsite paint time.

(FUTURE) ARTWORK VISION:

The neighborhood would like to see a mural that celebrates their community. The mural should also attract and draw residents and patrons to the area creating a vibrant entryway into the neighborhood's commercial corridor.

(FUTURE) ARTWORK GOALS:

Serve as a strong visual anchor.

- Speak to rebirth, revitalization, and renewal.
- Artwork should celebrate the community and spirit of the neighborhood.
- Add life and color to the neighborhood.
- Fit well within the context of the site (in terms of scale and design or theme).
- Be durable to outdoor weather conditions, graffiti resistant, and should not cause any damage to the structure or surface on which it is installed.
- Add to the diversity of the City of Chattanooga's growing public art collection.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

ABOUT EASTDALE & WILCOX TUNNEL:

Eastdale is located just east of Missionary Ridge in the Brainerd area. Its central location provides residents with convenient access to Chattanooga's major commercial centers. Many of the issues facing Eastdale and its neighboring communities are similar to those encountered by other neighborhoods in Chattanooga's

older suburbs. Commercial development has steadily decreased over the course of the last decade, but community members hope to see businesses return and improvements made to increase pedestrian access from neighborhoods to commercial centers, schools, and recreational centers.

In September of 2013, the City of Chattanooga asked the community what would make the biggest impact for the people who live nearby and travel through the tunnel on a regular basis. Residents in Foxwood Heights, Avondale, Wheeler, and Eastdale provided feedback on the lighting, cleanliness, safety, and water leakage. That collected feedback was used to prioritize the tunnel's improvements. The substantial renovations to the tunnel include safety improvements, major lighting upgrades and a new inner tunnel liner to halt water into the tunnel. The City of Chattanooga Department of Transportation plans to coincide additional beautification efforts with the installation of the Eastdale Mural Project--adding plantings at the entrances on either side of the tunnel in Fall 2017.

ABOUT ART IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS:

Art in the Neighborhoods (AIN) is a pilot program within the City of Chattanooga's department of Economic and Community Development (ECD). Because public art is a proven a tool for positive economic and community impact, the purpose of AIN is to help neighborhoods generate unique public art projects in their community that have the ability to beautify and enliven streets, parks and community centers; enhance and improve public spaces; and create neighborhood identity and community pride. AIN is co-produced by ECD's Neighborhood University and Public Art Chattanooga (PAC), managed by PAC, and funded by the City of Chattanooga, the Benwood Foundation and the Footprint Foundation.

SELECTION PROCESS & CRITERIA:

An ad hoc selection panel including representatives from the Eastdale Neighborhood Association, the Public Art Committee, neighborhood residents and business owners will review all submissions for the project and will select three finalists to develop site specific proposals.

Panelists will use the following criteria in the selection process:

- Artistic Excellence;
- Originality: creativity and uniqueness demonstrated in previous projects;
- Quality and craftsmanship exhibited by past work;
- Appropriateness of artwork media and scale relative to site;
- Maintainability: structural and surface soundness, durability and resistance to vandalism, weathering, excessive maintenance, repair costs;
- Appropriateness for placement in an urban setting; (continued next page)

- Public safety;
- Feasibility: artist's proven track record/ability to complete the work on time and within the budget;
- Submittal of all required application materials as outlined in this RFQ.

ELIGIBILITY:

This RFQ is open to all professional artists and artist teams over the age of 18, who currently reside in the United States. Local artists are strongly encouraged to apply.

APPLICATION DEADLINE:

Applications must be received (electronically, hand delivered, or mailed) no later than April 20th 2017, 4:00 pm EST. No exceptions. Refer to pages 5 and 6 for application procedures. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Proposals must be submitted electronically, by mail, or hand delivered and must include <u>two copies</u> of all printed materials. Materials should be single-sided and must include the following:

- Completed and signed cover page (included on page 1), completed and signed application form (included at the end of this RFP on page 8), <u>AND</u> completed and signed any and all addenda pages (addenda pages are additional instructions that can be added to a solicitation until 48 hours before the due date).
- 2. Current Résumé (two-page limit).
- 3. Letter of Interest briefly addressing how you would approach the project. This document should be no longer than one page (single-spaced, 1-inch margins, 12 pt. font). Please be sure to include a description and specifications for the type of paints, anti-graffiti coatings and any other materials you may plan to use should you be selected for this commission.
- 4. List of professional references (at least three): Please include name, address, phone number, and email address for each individual. If submitting as a team, please include one resume for each team member.
- 5. Files <u>must</u> be PC Compatible.
- 6. If you are submitting electronically, you must either use the shared Google folder (instructions included below) or send a flash drive. We do not have readers for any other type of electronic storage, including CD discs. To use the shared Google folder, you may be asked to set up a Google account. To submit electronically using a Google folder, a Google account is required (which is free of charge). If you are not willing to set up a Google account, you must submit your proposal by other means.
- 7. All flash drives must be labeled with the applicant's name.
- 8. Every image file must be titled first with the number of the image in the order to be viewed (use "0" in front of single-digit numbers), followed by the artist's last name [for example: 01_Smith; 02_Smith]. The numbers must correspond to the annotated image list.
- 9. Annotated Image List: Please include the artist's name as a heading, and a brief description of each image, including title and original medium.
- 10. Please do not submit paper materials in plastic covers, binders, or folders. Use only paper clips to bind your materials.
