- 1. **READ ALL DOCUMENTS:** Offerors must familiarize themselves with all documents contained herein; it is mandatory that all submitted offers be in compliance with all the provisions contained in the Request for Proposal. Offerors should promptly notify the Buyer of any ambiguity, inconsistency, error, or missing attachments which they may discover upon examination of the RFP.
- 2. <u>OFFICIAL CONTACT:</u> Offerors may contact **ONLY** the Buyer regarding the terminology stated in the procurement documents. Other APS employees do not have the authority to respond on behalf of APS.
 - Offerors **MAY NOT** contact other APS departments, employees or the evaluation committee. Any contact with an APS department, employee or evaluation committee member may result in rejection of any proposal.
 - Any other verbal communication will be deemed unofficial and non-binding. Communication directed to parties other than the Buyer will have no legal bearing on this RFP or the resulting contract(s). Any response made by APS will be provided in writing to all Offerors by addendum; no verbal responses shall be authoritative.
- 3. WRITTEN QUESTIONS: Potential Offerors may submit written questions to the Buyer as to the intent or clarity of this RFP. All written questions must be addressed and submitted to the Buyer NO LATER than the date and time specified in this RFP. All times are subject to the local time zone. The Buyer will respond in a timely manner subject to the complexity of the questions. Buyer will ONLY respond to the written questions submitted and receive on or prior to the deadline in this RFP.
- 4. <u>SUBMISSION:</u> The submission of a proposal constitutes a representation by the Offeror that the Offeror has made all appropriate examinations, investigations, and analysis and has made provision as to the cost thereof in submitted proposal. By responding to this RFP, Offerors acknowledge and agree to the terms and conditions set form in this RFP.
- 5. <u>ELECTRONIC RFP DOCUMENTS:</u> This RFP is being made available by electronic means. In the event of conflict between a version of the RFP in the Offeror's possession and the version maintained by APS, the Offeror acknowledges that the version maintained by APS on the APS procurement website shall govern.
- 6. <u>INCURRING COSTS:</u> Any cost incurred by the potential Offeror in preparation, transmittal, and/or presentation of any proposal or material submitted in response to this RFP shall be borne solely by the Offeror. If applicable, any cost incurred by the Offeror for set up and demonstration of the proposed equipment and/or system shall be borne solely by the Offeror.
- 7. **PROPOSAL OFFER FIRM:** Responses to this RFP, including proposal prices for services, will be considered firm for one hundred twenty (120) days after due date. If a best and final offer is requested, the offer is good for ninety (90) days after receipt of best and final offer.
- 8. **FORMS AND ATTACHMENTS:** It is the responsibility of every Offeror to ensure they have downloaded the latest version of each RFP, including any addendum(s) which may have been issued and posted on the APS Procurement Department Website.
- 9. <u>ADDENDUM(S)</u>: No Addendum will be issued later than FIVE (5) days prior to the date for receipt of proposals, except an Addendum withdrawing the RFP or one which extends the date for receipt of proposals.

- 10. **CORRECTIONS:** Corrections shall be initialed in ink by the Offeror signing the proposal. - 12. **<u>DISTRICT DISCRETION</u>**: The District hereafter referred to as APS reserves the right, pursuant NMSA 1978, §13-1-132, in its sole discretion to waive minor informalities in proposals submitted provided that such informalities have no effect on price, quality, quantity or any matter to be evaluated in making a selection and confer no material advantage on the Offeror whose nonconformity is waived. APS reserves the right to add to or delete from the Scope of Work set forth in this RFP.
- 13. **BRAND NAMES:** Pursuant to NMSA 1978, §13-1-168, where a brand-name or equal specification is used in a solicitation, the use of a brand name is for the purpose of describing the standard of quality, performance and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition pursuant to NMSA 1978 §13-1-168. If a vendor proposes an "equal" to scope of work/specifications, APS is the sole interpreter of the scope of work/specifications and sole judge as to whether the "equal" proposed complies with the scope of work/specifications
- 14. **OFFEROR QUALIFICATIONS:** The Evaluation Committee may make such investigations as necessary to determine the ability of the potential Offeror to adhere to the requirement specified within this RFP. The Evaluation Committee may reject the proposal of any potential Offeror who is deemed not to be a responsible Offeror or fails to submit a responsive offer as defined in NMSA 1978, §13-1-83 and §13-1-85.
- 15. <u>AWARD:</u> APS reserves the right to award all, part or none of the Scope of Work set forth in this RFP. This procurement in no manner obligates Albuquerque Public Schools until a valid signed contract and/or valid Purchase Order is executed.
- 16. PREFERENCES: RFPs may be awarded preference in compliance with NMSA 1978, §13-1-21 for New Mexico In-State Resident Business and Resident Veteran Business. Offerors shall include in their proposal a copy of the certificate issued by State of New Mexico Taxation & Revenue. If Proposal is Joint Venture, Offeror shall state in submitted offer the percentage of work that will be performed by Resident Business and/or Resident Veteran Business. PLEASE NOTE: An Offeror cannot be awarded both a resident preference and a resident veteran business preference. The New Mexico Preferences shall not apply when the expenditures for this RFP includes federal funds.
- 17. <u>TIMELY SUBMISSIONS:</u> All Offeror proposals must be received for review and evaluation no later than the time and date specified in this RFP.

- 19. **RFP CANCELLATION OR REJECTION:** In accordance with NMSA 1978, §13-1-131, this RFP may be canceled or proposals may be rejected in whole or in part when it is in the best interest of Albuquerque Public Schools.
- 20. **RFP OPENING:** Submitted proposals shall not be publicly opened. The contents of the proposals shall not be disclosed during any negotiations that may occur. A public log will be kept of the names of all Offeror organizations that submitted proposals. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, §13-1-116, the contents of proposals shall not be disclosed to competing potential Offerors during the negotiation process. The negotiation process is deemed to be in effect until the contract is awarded pursuant to this Request for Proposals. Awarded in this context means the final required APS signature on the contract(s) resulting from the procurement has been obtained.
- 21. **RESPONSIBLE AND RESPONSIVE OFFER:** APS may reject the proposal of any potential Offeror who is not a responsible Offeror or fails to submit a responsive offer as defined in NMSA 1978, §13-1-83 and §13-1-85.
- 22. <u>SOLE RESPONSE:</u> Any sole response that is received may be rejected by APS depending on available competition and timely needs of APS. APS reserves the right to award the contract to the responsible Offeror submitted responsive proposals most advantageous and in the best interest of APS.
- 23. **NEGOTIATIONS:** APS reserves the right to discontinue negotiations with any Offeror.
- 24. <u>MULTI-AWARD</u>: APS reserves the right to multi-award contracts as necessary for adequate delivery or service in accordance with NMSA 1978, §13-1-153.
- 25. <u>AFTER AWARD:</u> After final contract is negotiated, approved and awarded, all proposal documents pertaining to this procurement will be open to the public, except for the material, which is proprietary or confidential. The Procurement Department will not disclose or make public any pages of a proposal on which the Offeror has stamped or imprinted "**Proprietary**" or "**Confidential**" subject to the following requirements.
 - Proprietary or confidential data shall be readily separable from the proposal in order to facilitate eventual public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the proposal. Confidential data is normally restricted to confidential financial information concerning the Offeror's organization and data that qualifies as trade secret in accordance with the Uniform Trade Act, NMSA 1978, §57-3A-7. The price of products offered or the cost of services proposed shall not be designated as proprietary or confidential information.
- 26. **ASSIGNMENT:** It is mutually understood and agreed that the successful Offeror(s) shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of the purchase order, contract, or his/her right, title of interest therein, or power to execute such purchase order or contract to any other person, company or corporation without the previous written consent of APS.
- 27. **APS SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL:** The award of this contract is not final until approved by the APS School Board (if applicable) and/or contract is signed by both parties.
- 28. **<u>DEFINITIONS</u>**: Definition of Terminology: This section contains definitions that are used throughout this procurement document, including appropriate abbreviations.
 - "Agency" shall mean Albuquerque Public Schools (APS)
 - "Award of Contract" shall mean a formal written notice by APS that a firm(s) has/have been selected to enter into a contract for services.
 - "Contract" shall mean an agreement for the procurement of items of tangible personal property or services.
 - "Contractor" shall mean the successful Offeror.

- "**Determination**" shall mean the written documentation of a decision of a procurement manager including findings of fact required to support a decision. A determination becomes part of the procurement file to which it pertains.
- "Desirable" the terms "may", "can", "should", or "prefers" identify a desirable or discretionary item or factor.
- "Evaluation Committee" shall mean a body constituted to evaluate proposals and make selection recommendation.
- "Finalist" is defined as an Offeror who meets all the mandatory specifications of the RFP and whose score on evaluation factors is sufficiently high to qualify that Offeror for further consideration by the Evaluation Committee.
- "Mandatory" the terms "must", "shall", "will", "is required", or "are required", identify a mandatory item or factor. Failure to meet a mandatory item or factor will result in the rejection of the Bidder's bid.
- "Offer" the term means "proposal", "solution", means all documents submitted to APS responding to RFP.
- "Offeror", "Bidder", or "Proposer" is any person, corporation, or partnership who chooses to submit a proposal in response to this RFP.
- "Owner" shall be Albuquerque Public Schools.
- "Purchase Order" shall mean the document, which directs a Contractor to deliver items of tangible personal property or services pursuant to an existing contract.
- "Request for Proposal" or "RFP" means all documents, including those attached or incorporated by reference, used for soliciting proposals.
- "Responsible Offeror" shall mean an Offeror who submits a responsive bid and who has furnished, when required, information and data to prove that its financial resources, production or service facilities, personnel, service reputation and experience are adequate to make satisfactory delivery of the services or items of tangible property described in the RFP.
- "Responsive Offer" or "Responsive Proposal" shall mean a bid, which conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the RFP.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>TERM:</u> APS reserves the right to procure the services/goods as described in this RFP and enter into a contract as described on RFP front cover.
- 2. <u>REQUEST(S) NOT DEFINED IN SCOPE OF WORK:</u> Contractor shall be held responsible to **NOT** fill requests which are clearly beyond the defined scope of this contract. Should such requests occur, Contractor has the responsibility of calling such violations to the attention of the APS Procurement Officer.
- 3. **PRICING ESCALATION (if applicable):** Price escalation may be considered only at yearly observance of award (anniversary date) and only upon receipt of written request from Contractor stating reason(s) for escalation and the amount being requested. Justifying documentation **MUST** accompany price escalation request.
- 4. <u>TAXES</u>: APS holds a Class 9 Nontaxable Transaction Certificate and is exempt from payment of taxes on tangible personal property. A NTTC will be issued upon request.
- 5. **NON-APPROPRIATION:** APS' obligation to make payment under the terms of this RFP is contingent upon its appropriation of sufficient funds to make those payments. If APS does not appropriate funds for the continuation of this procurement, this procurement will terminate upon written notice of that effect to the Contractor. APS determination that sufficient funds have not been appropriated is firm, binding and not subject to review.
- 6. **PROCUREMENT CODE:** The Procurement Code, NMSA 1978, §13-1-28 through §13-1-199, imposes civil and misdemeanor criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico Criminal Statutes impose felony penalties for bribes, gratuities, and kickbacks.
- 7. PROCUREMENT UNDER EXISTING CONTRACTS: In accordance with NMSA 1978, §13-1-129, Offerors are hereby notified that other governmental entities within the State of New Mexico, or as otherwise allowed by their respective governing directives, may contract for services with the awarded Offeror. Contractual engagements accomplished under this provision shall be solely between the awarded Offeror and the contracting entity with no obligation by Albuquerque Public Schools
- 8. **TERMINATION:** Either party may terminate this contract as follows:
 - A. Termination by the Contractor
 - 1. The Contractor may terminate this contract **only** if Albuquerque Public School District fails to comply with any provisions of this contract and after receiving notice of the noncompliance APS fails to cure the noncompliance within ten (10) days, or
 - 2. By written mutual agreement between the Contractor and APS.

B. Termination by APS

- 1. For Cause
 - a. The occurrence of either one of the following events will justify termination for cause:
 - i. Contractor's persistent failure to perform the work in accordance with the contract documents (including but not limited to, failure to supply sufficient skilled workers or suitable materials or equipment).
 - ii. Contractor's violation in any substantial way of any provisions of this contract.
 - b. If either one of the events identified above occur, APS may, after giving Contractor (and the surety, if any) ten (10) days written notice, terminate the service of Contractor, exclude Contractor from site, and take possession of the work. Contractor shall be paid for project costs incurred up to the date of termination but shall not be paid for loss of profits resulting from such termination.
 - c. Where Contractor's services have been so terminated by APS, the termination will not affect any rights or remedies of APS against Contractor then existing or which may thereafter

accrue. Any retention or payment of moneys due the Contractor by APS will not release the Contractor from liability.

2. For Convenience

- a. Upon ten (10) days written notice to Contractor, APS may without cause and without prejudice to any other right or remedy of APS, elect to terminate the contract.
- b. In such case, Contractor shall be paid (without duplication of any items):
 - i. For completed and acceptable work executed in accordance with the contract documents prior to the effective date of termination.
 - ii. For expenses sustained prior to the effective date of termination in performing services and furnishing labor, materials or equipment as required by the contract document in connection with uncompleted work.
- c. Contractor shall not be paid on account of loss of anticipated profits or revenue or other economic loss arising out of or resulting from such termination.
- 9. **INDEMNIFICATION:** The Offeror shall be responsible for damage to persons or property that occurs as a result of Offeror's fault or negligence, or that of any of his/her employees, agents or subcontractors. Offeror shall save and hold harmless Albuquerque Public Schools against any and all losses, cost, damage, claims, expenses or liability in connection with the performance of the contract. Any equipment or facilities damaged by the Offeror's operation shall be repaired and/or restored to their original condition at the Offeror's expense.
- 10. **INSURANCE (If Applicable):** The successful Offeror shall purchase and maintain statutory limits of Worker's Compensation, Public Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance approved by APS at the time of contract award. Albuquerque Public Schools shall be included as a loss payee and/or additional insured. Public Liability and Automobile Liability insurance shall include at least the following coverage:

11. <u>AUDIT:</u> APS reserves the right to audit the Contractor's records associated with this contract at any time during the contract period and for a period of up to three years following the expiration or termination of the agreement. Such audit may be conducted by APS personnel or a third party under contract with APS. APS

- shall give the Contractor reasonable notice prior to the conduct of any audit and upon receiving the notice from APS the Contractor agrees to fully cooperate with the auditors. If Contractor subcontracts any portion of its obligation to another party, Contractor shall guarantee APS' access to books and records of such party.
- 12. **GOVERNING LAW:** This RFP and any contract with an Offeror which may result from this procurement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico.
- 13. **INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:** The Contractor is an independent contractor performing services for APS. The Contractor shall not accrue leave, retirement, insurance, or any other benefits afforded to employees of APS as a result of this procurement.
- 14. **<u>DEBARMENT OR SUSPENSION:</u>** A business (Contractor, Subcontractor or Supplier) that has either been debarred or suspended pursuant to the requirements of NMSA 1978, §13-1-177 through §13-1-180, and §13-4-11 through §13-4-17 as amended, shall not be permitted to do business with APS and shall not be considered for award of the contract during the period for which it is debarred or suspended with APS.
- 15. **CONFLICT OF INTEREST:** By submitting a proposal, the Offeror certifies that no relationship exists between the Offeror and APS that interferes with fair competition or is a conflict of interest; and no relationship exists between such propose and another person or firm that constitutes a conflict of interest that is adverse to APS.
- 16. **NON-DISCLOSURE:** The Offeror shall not disclose any information relating to students, and employees of APS other than such information that may be authorized by the individual student or employee. Vendor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless APS from any damages, claims, liabilities, and costs including reasonable attorney fees in the event any unauthorized release of such information occurs.
- 17. **<u>DELIVERY</u>**: The goods shall be delivered free of the rightful claim of any third person, any security interest or other lien. Unless otherwise agreed all goods called for in this Bid shall be tendered in a single delivery and payment is due only upon such delivery (NET 30).
- 18. **FOB:** Unless stated otherwise, the price for goods is FOB: Destination (APS' designated address).
- 19. **<u>DELAYS IN DELIVERY</u>**: Time is of the essence and this purchase may be subject to termination for failure to deliver on time, unless delay was caused by APS. If delay in delivery is foreseen, Seller must notify the APS Requesting Department of late delivery, cause of late delivery and remedy for late delivery.
- 20. <u>INSPECTION</u>: Final inspection will be made at the destination upon completion of delivery of goods/services. Final inspection shall include any testing or inspection procedures required by the specifications.
- 21. <u>ACCEPTANCE</u>: Acceptance of delivery of goods/services shall not be considered acceptance of the goods/services furnished. Acceptance occurs when the Requesting Department, after a reasonable opportunity to inspect the goods/services, signifies to the seller that are goods/services are conforming and fails to make an effective rejection.
- 22. **BUYERS REVOCATION OF ACCEPTANCE:** Requesting Department can revoke acceptance of goods when it is discovered, in a reasonable time, that the Sellers nonconforming goods substantially impair the value of the goods.
- 23. <u>SELLERS RIGHT TO CURE A NONCONFORMING DELIVERY OF GOODS</u>: The Seller, upon notice of revocation of acceptance, shall correct without charge and deliver conforming goods in a reasonable time
- 24. **PAYMENT:** Any invoice received and payment made shall be subject to APS' terms and conditions (NET 30) unless specifically waived by APS in a separate written document.
- 25. <u>ASSIGNMENTS:</u> The awarded contractor shall not assign nor delegate specific duties as part of this RFP not transfer any interest not assign any claims for money due or to become due under this RFP without the written consent of APS.

- 26. **<u>DISPUTE RESOLUTION:</u>** In the event the Parties do not agree to mediate the dispute or unable to resolve the dispute through mediation, then the dispute shall be resolved by binding arbitration. Such arbitration shall be governed by the New Mexico Uniform Arbitration Act, NMSA 44-7A-1, et seq. as amended.
- 27. <u>AWARDED CONTRACT TEMPLATE:</u> The successful awarded Offeror will be awarded an APS Professional Services Agreement, template can be accessed at: https://www.aps.edu/procurement/procuring-professional-development.

PROTESTS

If any Offeror who is aggrieved in connection with a solicitation or award of an Agreement may protest to the Purchasing Office in accordance with the requirements of the Contracting Procurement Regulations and the State Procurement Code. The protest should be made in writing within twenty-four (24) hours after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto, but **NO LATER THAN** fifteen (15) calendar days after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto (NMSA1978, §13-1-172). The protest must be in writing and delivered to the Executive Director - Procurement Department, Albuquerque, New Mexico

- 1. In the event of a timely protest under this section, the Purchasing Agent and the Contracting Agency shall not proceed further with the procurement unless the Purchasing Agent makes a determination that the award of Agreement is necessary to protect substantial interests of the Contracting Agency (NMSA 1978, §13-1-173).
- 2. The Purchasing Agent or his/her Designee shall have the authority to take any action reasonably necessary to resolve a protest of an aggrieved Offeror concerning a procurement. This authority shall be exercised in accordance with adopted regulations, but shall not include the authority to award money damages or attorneys' fees (NMSA 1978, §13-1-174).
- 3. The Purchasing Agent or his/her Designee shall promptly issue a determination relating to the protest. The determination shall:
 - A. State the reasons for the action taken; and
 - B. Inform the protestant of the right to judicial review of the determination pursuant to NMSA 1978, §13-1-183.
- 5. A copy of the determination issued under NMSA 1978, §13-1-175 shall immediately be mailed to the protestant and other Offerors involved in the procurement in compliance with NMSA 1978, §13-1-176.

SCOPE OF WORK

OVERVIEW

Albuquerque Public Schools is the largest school district in New Mexico and one of the nation's largest school districts, covering more than 1,230 square mile geographical area. Currently, APS has 13 high schools, 2 K-8 schools, 12 schools of choice, 27 middle schools, 88 elementary schools plus 29 APS authorized Charter schools. APS has approximately 75,000 students and 11,000 employees. An elected Board of Education composed of seven members serving staggered terms of four years each governs APS. The Superintendent is Scott Elder.

RFP SCHEDULE

The RFP Buyer will make every effort to adhere to the RFP Schedule as noted on front cover of this RFP. The schedule is subject to change by addendum. The evaluation committee **MAY** interview the Offeror(s) of the top rated proposals; however, contracts may be awarded without such interviews and based solely on written offers. Finalists will be contacted to schedule interviews if required. If an interview is requested, evaluation scores will be re-scored to reflect written response and interview response.

PURPOSE OF THIS REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

The purpose of the Request for Proposal (RFP) is to solicit sealed proposals to establish a contract through competitive negotiations for the procurement of Energy Management Services.

BACKGROUND

1. APS Energy Team/Energy Center: To address the daunting task of energy and resource management within their large building footprint, APS assembled a group of select employees with dedicated specialties who monitor, analyze, regulate, and improve all aspects of water and energy use throughout the District. These personnel operate out of a centralized APS Energy Center equipped with monitoring platforms and database interfaces that allow efficient implementation of their assigned tasks.

The team currently consists of:

- <u>Energy Efficiency Coordinator</u> Oversees efforts of the Energy Team; interfaces with APS executive leadership to collaboratively accomplish the District's conservation goals; ensures conservation priorities are reflected in APS Design Standards for building construction and renovation; coordinates activities of WECC committee (see below).
- <u>Building Automation Controls Specialists (2)</u> Monitor, program and repair Building Automation Systems (BAS) and Direct Digital Controls (DDC) for all District systems; ensure consistency of programming and functionality of controls from initial installation through ongoing operation; work with Energy Team to explore and implement new controls-based efficiency strategies.
- <u>Energy Education Specialist</u> Engages the end users of APS properties (students, teachers, administrators, custodians) in the conservation process; integrates energy education within existing classroom curriculum; creates and helps facilitate student teams at schools who proactively monitor and improve their environments on a daily basis.
- <u>Facility Usage Specialist</u> Manages all aspects of facility usage for after-hours activities and outside groups using APS facilities; has ultimate responsibility for scheduling of spaces for such uses; interfaces with Maintenance & Operations staff as well as school administration to ensure building systems (lighting, heating, cooling, etc.) are 'turned on' when needed and 'turned off' when unoccupied.
- <u>Special Systems Project Manager</u> Initiates and manages identified conservation projects pertaining to special systems and technology, including metering, monitoring, HVAC/electrical/lighting controls, network cabling/connections, and renewable energy systems; interfaces with system vendors and APS Information Technology Dept. to ensure continuous monitoring and visibility of these systems.
- <u>Utility Analyst</u> Monitors utility bills, meters and sub-meters, Building Automation Systems, solar PV production platforms, and other resources to identify trends and changes in building performance;

- interfaces with Maintenance & Operations staff to address needed corrections and create efficiency strategies; manages utility rebate applications for conservation projects.
- Water Resource Specialist Manages District Central Irrigation Controller(s), including monitoring for system alarms and programming irrigation schedules; identifies and helps control 'water budgets' used for irrigation; monitors monthly water bills and hourly water usage at facilities throughout the District; works closely with Water Authority to identify and address metering problems, and to strategize consolidation/separation of meters for maximum efficiency; interfaces with Maintenance & Operations staff to quickly address leaks and recommend efficiency strategies; manages rebate applications for water conservation projects.
- 2. Water and Energy Conservation Committee (WECC): This advisory body is comprised of members from within and outside of APS, including the APS Energy Team, executive directors and other staff from multiple APS departments (Maintenance & Operations, Facilities Design & Construction, Capital Master Plan, Information Technology, Finance, etc.), all Albuquerque utility providers, and the NM State Energy Office. Trade associations and non-profit conservation groups are also represented, as well as facility managers from other educational, municipal and private organizations. WECC holds bi-monthly meetings to review conservation efforts and evaluate 'Progress Against Plan' regarding the District's conservation goals (see below).

3. Board-Mandated Energy Conservation Goals

On October 15, 2014, the Albuquerque Public Schools Board of Education adopted the following Energy and Water Conservation Policy. This policy is the impetus and authority for the work performed by WECC, the APS Energy Team, and the Energy Management consultant selected by this solicitation:

Albuquerque Public Schools shall reduce net water consumption by twenty percent (20%) and net energy consumption by twenty percent (20%) by the end of the 2023-2024 school year as compared to an established 2013-2014 school year baseline. To support this effort, the superintendent shall ensure full commitment by all employees and involved entities, including administrators, teachers, students, support personnel, contractors, suppliers and communities using APS facilities.

For purposes of this policy, "consumption" means, the overall units of consumption. For water consumption, the unit of measure shall be **total gallons per student**, calculated in whole for the entire school district. Number of students for each year shall be the Fortieth Day Student Enrollment as reported by APS Capital Master Plan. For energy consumption, the unit of measure shall be kBtu per square foot, also known as EUI (Energy Usage Intensity), calculated in whole for the entire school district: **[total kBtu]** / **[total square footage]**. This includes both electricity and natural gas, normalized to a common unit of energy.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Performing as a contracted entity to Albuquerque Public Schools, assist in realizing the District's water and energy conservation goals by working collaboratively with the APS Energy Team, the APS Water and Energy Conservation Committee (WECC), and all key APS stakeholders to implement effective conservation strategies District-wide.

APS will rely on the selected Energy Manager to provide the following:

- 1. Leadership -- Through teamwork, effective communication, collaboration and organization, be the keeper of the 'big picture' conservation plan for APS. Provide foresight in assessing and defining organizational functions, roles, responsibilities, and key metrics. Help define and prioritize deliverables. Create simple standard processes for communication, coordination and advance executive approval. Look constantly for undiscovered opportunities to collaborate, increase efficiency, and eliminate waste.
- **2. Documentation** -- Capture and organize all information concerning the APS conservation effort. This will include building performance data, lists of conservation projects with deadlines and calculated/anticipated savings, Building Automation System trend logs, minutes from strategic meetings with identified action items, and a transparent, defensible back up of data supporting reported conservation results.

- **3. Analysis** -- Evaluate existing APS energy measurement/monitoring tools and determine how best to translate available data into useable, actionable information. Audit individual schools to gain a thorough understanding of the capabilities and limitations of the APS environments in which systems are maintained and energy is consumed. Set up appropriate trends in APS' Building Automation Systems to allow 'deep-dive' trouble shooting of equipment and systems. Compile and compare data from divergent sources to build a more comprehensive problem-solving picture.
- **4. Reporting --** Work with the APS Energy Team to establish monthly Report Cards -- with repeatable and transparent metrics -- that communicate ongoing results and 'Progress Against Plan.' These Report Cards will be assembled and presented to the APS Water and Energy Conservation Committee at their bi-monthly meetings, as well as annually to the APS Board of Education. Provide other specific presentations (e.g. individual conservation strategy calculations/results, year-by-year/month-by-month performance comparisons, etc.) as needed and whenever requested, in order to engage stakeholders and garner support necessary for the program.
- **5.** Advocacy -- Participate in regular and periodic meetings with WECC, the APS Energy Team, APS department personnel, vendors, utilities, etc. Present the positive face of APS' conservation efforts broadly, to continually build alliances and gain support. Seek opportunities to showcase the group's accomplishments both within and outside of APS.
- 6. **Team Member** -- The Energy Management consultant selected from this solicitation will become an ongoing member of the APS team, helping to address day-to-day management/optimization of systems District-wide. The consultant will also help analyze detailed functionality/efficiency of equipment and systems as needed.

NOTE: This service is **not** being solicited as an Energy Services Performance Contract (ESPC), which is a site-based and/or project-based model that addresses *specific* identified need(s) and is paid from savings generated by the project(s). For an ESPC, when the project is done, their role is complete.

Instead, this solicitation is for an ongoing consulting partner whose broad and varied services (outlined above) are paid with a monthly retainer fee plus hourly consulting rates and materials reimbursements for the duration of the contract.

NOTE: Offeror shall be prepared, upon request, to provide documentation of achieved conservation results for projects previously or currently managed.

3. Offeror shall hold the ANSI-recognized Certified Energy Manager (CEM) designation as administered by the Association of Energy Engineers.
