Scope of Services

The scope of services covered by these specifications includes all of the labor, materials, supplies and equipment necessary to monitor, repair, and maintain all existing and future alarm systems for locations specified within this document for the City of Chattanooga, City Wide.

It is the vendor's responsibility to familiarize themselves with the locations covered and under this contract (list of locations supplied) prior to placing a bid.

Basis of Award

The awarded contract shall include the following:

- *Monthly monitoring charge* (see below) for each location listed, which shall include any and all costs for wages, benefits, indirect costs, overhead and profit, insurance, and any other related direct or indirect cost.
- *Hourly charge for maintenance/repairs*, which shall be for the services of one (1) qualified security system professional and all tools necessary to perform the work described herein. Vendor may charge up to 1.5 times the regular labor cost per hour when working overtime to correct any repairs deemed an emergency by City representative.
- *Supplies*, which shall include any equipment and materials necessary for repairs or maintenance for existing and new monitoring equipment (vendor shall state percentage over cost).

The proposed monthly monitoring charge for each location shall also include the following services at no additional charge:

- Immediate addition or removal of entry codes performed remotely.
- Delivery of accurate monthly open/closure report for each site.
- Delivery of accurate open/closure report per request form City representative at any time.

Award of Contract shall also be based on evaluation of the Vendor's references, qualifications, and other factors specified in the City Code.

References

The Vendor shall submit a list of at least three (3) references for services and work similar to the requirements listed in the scope of services. The list shall include names, addresses, telephone numbers, and contact persons who are knowledgeable of services provided.

The Vendor shall submit an official document from the State Safety Regulatory Agency noting all recordable safety violations and injuries. An unacceptable safety record (more than 10% above industry safety standards) may disqualify any vendor from consideration.

Experience

The Vendor shall have a minimum of ten (10) years of experience providing all of the services described herein. This work experience shall include work in similar conditions as covered under this contract.

Compliance with Applicable Regulations

All of the services provided by the Vendor shall be completed in a good and workmanlike manner. All services provided shall be in compliance with all applicable statutes, rules, ordinances and regulations.

Timeliness of Work

Vendor shall contact City representative within twelve (12) hours of a request for service and confirm that it has been received. All standard requests shall be completed within three (3) business days of notification. Vendor shall complete any requests deemed emergencies by City representatives within twenty-four (24) hours of notification. Vendor may charge up to 1.5 times the regular labor cost per hour when completing emergency repairs.

Additional Monitoring Sites/Services

Any locations acquired by the City of Chattanooga after the bid award date will be covered under this contract. Vendor will notify buyer of the location and address to be added.

All recordable device master codes will be specified by City representative. Vendor shall only disclose master codes or keypad codes to the specified City representative.

The Vendor shall not subcontract the services or assign the contract to others without the written consent of the City. All of the services provided by the Vendor shall be completed in a good and workmanlike manner.

Inspection

The services furnished by the Vendor shall be subject to inspection and approval by the City's designated representative at any time, but the manner and method of providing the services shall be the responsibility of the vendor.

Vendor shall leave all work locations in a similar or better state than before work began.

Documentation

The Vendor shall keep a record of all services performed, dates, and times of services, and billable hours to be reviewed by City representatives monthly. These records shall be stored in a secure location at the worksite that allows review by City representatives. All invoices supplied by Vendor shall be supported by records and documentation of billable hours.

Materials and Supplies

All materials and supplies used for the installation, repair, or maintenance of the City of Chattanooga alarm systems shall be included in Vendor invoices. The markup cost of materials and supplies shall be stated as a percentage over supplier invoice cost to Vendor. Invoices for materials and supplies shall be copied and attached to Vendor invoices for review by City representatives and must state vendor cost prior to markup.

Payment of Services

The City's payment terms are net 30.

Termination of Contract

The City of Chattanooga shall have the right to terminate the awarded Contract upon a 30-day written notification to the vendor for failure to comply with any portion of the terms included in this contract.

Affirmative Action Plan

The City of Chattanooga is an equal opportunity employer and during the performance of this Contract, the Contractor agrees to abide by the equal opportunity goals of the City of Chattanooga as follows:

1. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or handicap. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and the employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or handicap. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay, or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
2. The Contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or handicap.
3. The Contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he/she has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the Contractor's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
4. In all construction contracts or subcontracts in excess of \$10,000 to be performed for the City of Chattanooga, any contractor and/or subcontractor is further required to file in duplicate within ten (10) days of being notified that it is the lowest responsible bidder, an affirmative action plan with the EEO Director of the City of Chattanooga. This plan shall state the Contractor's goals for minority and women utilization as a percentage of the work force on this project.
5. This Plan or any attachments thereto shall further provide a list of all employees annotated by job function, race, and sex who are expected to be utilized on this project. This plan or attachment thereto shall further describe the methods by which the Contractor or Subcontractor will utilize to make good faith efforts at providing employment opportunities for minorities and women.

During the term of this contract, the Contractor upon request of the City, will make available for inspection by the City of Chattanooga copies of payroll records, personnel documents and similar records or documents that may be used to verify the Contractor's compliance with these Equal Opportunity provisions.

6. The Contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph 1 and the provisions of paragraphs 1 through 6 in every subcontract so that such provisions will be requested of each subcontractor. The Contractor agrees to notify the City of Chattanooga of any subcontractor who refuses or fails to comply with these equal opportunity provisions. Any failure or refusal to comply with these provisions the Contractor and/or Subcontractor shall be a breach of this contract.

REQUIREMENTS FOR INSURANCE COVERAGE

The Contractor shall not commence work under these Contract Documents until he has obtained all insurance required herein nor shall the Contractor allow any Subcontractor to commence work on his subcontract until similar insurance required of the Subcontractor has been obtained by the Subcontractor. Insurance shall be placed by the Contractor with one or more insurance carriers licensed to do business in the State of Tennessee. Each insurance policy shall be renewed ten (10) days before the expiration date of the policy.

Certificates of Insurance shall be filed with the City prior to commencement of the work. These certificates shall contain a provision that coverage's afforded under the policies will not be changed or canceled unless at least fifteen (15) days' written notice has been given to the City. The Contract shall not be binding upon the City until the insurance coverage required herein has been obtained and certificates have been filed with the City.

Adequate insurance coverage shall be maintained by the Contractor at all times. Failure to maintain adequate coverage shall not relieve the Contractor of any responsibilities or obligations under these Contract Documents. In the event any insurance coverage is canceled or allowed to lapse, the Contractor will not be permitted to prosecute the work until adequate and satisfactory insurance has been obtained and Certificates of Insurance furnished to the City. Failure to keep insurance policies in effect will not be cause for any claims for extension of time under these Contract Documents.

All such policies shall be subject to approval by the City Attorney. Should the City Attorney at any time in his sole discretion determine that the insurance policies and certificate provided may not be sufficient to protect the interests of the City because of the insolvency of the insurance company or otherwise, the Contractor shall replace such policies with policies meeting his approval.

The Contractor shall procure and maintain at his own expense, during the Contract Time, insurance as hereinafter specified:

Workmen's Compensation Insurance that shall protect the Contractor against all claims under applicable state workmen's compensation laws shall be maintained. The Contractor shall also be protected against claims for injury, disease or death of employees which, for any reason, may not fall within the provisions of a workmen's compensation law. This policy shall also include an endorsement providing coverage in all States in which work is performed. The Contractor shall require all the Subcontractors to provide similar Workmen's Compensation Insurance for all the Subcontractors' employees on the work unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor. The liability limits shall not be less than that required by statute.

General Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance that shall be written in comprehensive form and shall protect the Contractor against all claims arising from injuries including death, to members of the public or damage to property of others arising out of any act or omission of the Contractor or his agents, employees, or Subcontractors. In addition, this policy shall specifically insure the contractual liability assumed by the successful bidder to defend and indemnify the City of Chattanooga against such claims or suits.

To the extent that the work may require blasting, explosive conditions or underground operation, the comprehensive general public liability and property damage coverage shall contain no exclusion relative to blasting, explosion, collapse of buildings, or damage to underground property.

The comprehensive general public liability and property damage coverage shall also protect the Contractor against all claims from damage to:

1. Private driveways, walks, shrubbery and plantings;
2. Public utility facilities; and
3. U.S Government monuments.

The liability limits shall not be less than:

Bodily Injury	\$ 500,000 each person \$1,000,000 each occurrence
Property Damage	\$ 250,000 each occurrence \$ 500,000 aggregate

The general public liability and property damage insurance shall carry an endorsement in form satisfactory to the City to the effect that the Contractor shall save harmless the City from any claims and damages whatsoever, including patent infringement. General public liability and property damage insurance shall be kept in force at all times during the course of the work until such time as the work covered by these Contract Documents has been completed and accepted by the City.

Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Liability and Property Damage Insurance that shall be written in comprehensive form and shall protect the Contractor against all claims for injuries to members of the public and damage to property of others arising from the use of motor vehicles, and shall cover operation on or off the site of all motor vehicles licensed for highway use, whether they are owned, non-owned, or hired.

The liability limits shall not be less than:

Bodily Injury	\$ 250,000 each person \$ 500,000 each occurrence
Property Damage	\$ 100,000 each occurrence
