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I. SCOPE OF SOLICITATION

ACQUIRE SERVICES & SUPPLIES / EQUIPMENT: The purpose of this solicitation is to acquire services and supplies or equipment complying with the enclosed description and/or specifications and conditions. [01-1005-1].

Horry County Schools intends to replace the existing bleachers in four (4) schools over the next four (4) years (one set per year), starting with the Socastee High School gymnasium in 2021.

Offers (bids) will only be accepted directly from manufacturers or from dealers expressly authorized to bid on behalf of a manufacturer.

FUNDS NOT AVAILABLE: The District's obligation under this contract is contingent upon the availability of funds from which payment for contract purposes can be made. [01-1035-1]

MAXIMUM CONTRACT PERIOD – (ESTIMATED): Start date: 4/12/2021 End date: 4/11/2025.

Dates provided are estimates only. Any resulting contract will begin on the date specified in the notice of award. See clause entitled "Term of Contract – Effective Date / Initial Contract Period". [01-1040-1]

The contract resulting from this solicitation will be a one (1) year contract with three (3) additional one-year renewal options. The maximum potential contract life is four years.

III. SCOPE OF WORK / SPECIFICATIONS:

SCOPE OF WORK:

It is the intent of the Horry County Schools, hereafter referred to as the "District" or "HCSD" to solicit offers from qualified contractors to provide total gymnasium bleacher replacement at four (4) schools over a four (4) year term, starting with the Socastee High School in 2021. The other three (3) schools requiring replacement under this contract are as follows: Green Sea Floyds High School, Loris High School, and St. James Middle School. It is anticipated that one (1) school will receive a bleacher replacement each year of this contract. This is a turnkey project which includes removal and disposal of existing gym bleachers, protection of existing gymnasium floor, the manufacture, delivery, and installation of an electrically operated telescopic seating system of multiple-tiered seating rows (wall attached, typically) comprising of seat, deck components, understructure that permits closing without requiring dismantling, into a nested configuration for storing or for moving purposes in accordance with applicable codes, the following specifications. Installation is anticipated to be during the summer months while school is not in session (June through August). Offers (bids) will only be accepted directly from manufacturers or from dealers expressly authorized to bid on behalf of a manufacturer. (documentation of expressed authority must be submitted/attached to your bid response).

Install Sheridan Seating Motorized Telescopic Bleachers Model M200, or an approved equal, to replace existing bleachers as specified. - 1.4 Verify that area to receive new bleachers is free of impediments interfering with installation and that condition of substrates is acceptable to receive bleachers in accordance with bleacher manufacturer's recommendations;
- 1.5 Confirm adequate wall strength for attachment and operation of wall attached telescopic system;
- 1.6 Provide wiring and electrical work required from junction box to bleacher operating components;
- 1.7 Take all necessary precautions to protect existing gymnasium flooring and finish during operations associated with bleacher installation; damage to wood floor shall be repaired by qualified persons and cost for repairs will be charged to Contractor;
- 1.8 Miscellaneous work not specifically mentioned but necessary to satisfy the scope of work;
- 1.9 Properly supervise and adequately man the project with an experienced crew of appropriate size. The contractor shall be responsible for the supervision and direction of the work performed by their employees. Workers shall be qualified to operate and/or use the equipment necessary to complete this work. The bidder shall have a supervisor/representative on the work site at all times, who shall be thoroughly knowledgeable of all specifications and other contract documents and who has authority to act in the Contractor's behalf;
- 1.10 Exercise precautions at all times for the protection of persons (including employees) and property. This may include, but is not limited to, using proper safety barricades, protective and covering devices to divert traffic and protect personnel. Normal safety signs, necessary lighting, and temporary fencing/barricades around work areas shall be installed and maintained.

The telescopic seating system specified herein shall comply with the International Code Council ICC-300 2017, National Fire Protection Association NFPA 102 Standard for Grandstands, Folding and Telescopic Seating, Tents, and Membrane Structures (most recent edition); and specifically with Chapter 5, Folding and Telescopic Seating, except where additional requirements are indicated or imposed by authorities having such jurisdiction.
- c. The telescopic seating system manufacturer shall employ a registered, professional engineer to certify that equipment to be supplied meets and/or exceeds the design criteria of these specifications.
- d. The telescopic seating system manufacturer shall have all welding done in a CWB/AWB certified shop.
- e. Equipment under these specifications shall be the Manufacturer's current standard commercial production. All items must be new and meet all manufacturer's specifications. New is to be defined as the latest manufacturer's model production that is currently manufactured on an active assembly line.
- e. For purposes of evaluation, the bidder must indicate any and all variances from specifications, terms, and/or conditions regardless of how slight, written or implied. If variations are not stated, it shall be assumed that the product or service fully complies with the specifications, terms and conditions herein.

2.2 Acceptable Installer

- a. Installers to be recognized, trained, and certified by the telescoping bleacher seating manufacturer proposed which on a day-to-day basis regularly provide the equipment offered.

3. DESIGN CRITERIA

- 3.1 Gymnasium seat assembly is designed to support, in addition to its own weight, a live load in excess of 120 lbs. per linear foot or 100 lbs. per square foot (whichever affect is greater), front to rear sway in excess of 10lbs. per linear foot and a parallel sway load in excess of 24 lbs. per linear foot of row.
- 3.2 Guard railings are engineered to withstand a load of 200 lbs. per foot at top rail and an intermediate load of 150 lbs. per foot.
- 3.3 Steel structure must be free standing when installed and include 4 steel columns per row, per section. Those manufacturers which only include 2 columns per row and section and/or slanted/angled columns are not acceptable.
- 3.4 Steel columns must be fabricated from structural high tensile steel tubing; minimum size of tubing will be 1 ½" x 3" x 10ga. Those manufacturers providing formed steel or angle iron columns in place of structural tubing are not acceptable. Maximum spacing between columns shall be 11'-6".
- 3.5 Last Row columns shall be no more than 40" from end of bleacher decking, nosing, and riser.
- 3.6 Two (2) row locks per row, per bleacher section manufactured from ¼" hot rolled steel to prevent racking of bleachers as they are retracting are required.
- 3.7 Footboards shall be produced from ¾" plywood with top facing. Voids or boat patching on top facing is not acceptable. Top facing shall receive 3 coats of colored, opaque, catalyzed epoxy coating.
- 3.8 Aluminum trim shall be installed on all exposed edges. Extruded aluminum joiners shall be placed between adjacent footboards.
- 3.9 Molded seats shall be one-piece, 18" wide of high-density polyethylene structural foam with full perimeter interlock and concealed mounting hardware. End caps shall be provided at all ends, aisle ways and ADA locations. Colors are bright without excessive streaking. "Waterfall" coloring will not be acceptable. Indents for numbers and letters shall be standard.
- 3.10 Molded seats shall not have a back to front curve along the face.
- 3.11 Custom color seat inlay at all locations.
- 3.12 No less than 4" diameter x 1 ¼" soft faced, non-marking rubber wheels to support understructure system shall be provided with sintered metal bearings and clips for easy replacement.

- 3.13 Nose beam shall be formed from 14ga. minimum galvanized steel. Steel shall have G90 galvanized coating or better. These will encapsulate $\frac{3}{4}$ " plywood decks.
- 3.14 Rear riser shall be formed from 14ga. minimum galvanized steel. Steel shall have G90 galvanized coating or better.
- 3.15 Handicap seating provisions: Provide recoverable first tier cutouts as required by ADA. Include manufacturer's standard front guardrail and closure panel below. Show drawings will reflect locations.

4. **ACCESORIES.** To be provided as per applicable codes and requirements:

- 4.1 Handicap seating provisions: Provide first tier handicap cutouts to comply with American Disabilities Act (ADA). All handicap cutouts shall have required railings. Center cutouts will be recoverable.
- 4.2 Scorer's table 15" x 96". Table shall be self-supporting and portable to be used anywhere within the bleacher system or on the gymnasium floor.
- 4.3 End railings shall be designed to withstand the following horizontal forces applied separately:
 - a. A concentrated load of 200 lbs. applied at any point and in any direction along the top railing member
 - b. A uniform load of 50lbs/ft. applied vertically downward at the top of the guardrail

Rails shall be permanently mounted to the bleachers and automatically extend and stack with the bleachers when the bleachers are operated. The top rails shall have a design angle of 78 degrees outward from vertical to allow the end rail system to automatically extend and slack with bleachers.

Intermediate self-storing end railings shall be 51 inches high when mounted to the deck board. Rail mount should be one-piece which will sandwich the deck board. The rail shall be 36 inches high when measured vertically from center of seat or seat board surface. The end rail shall be 20 inches wide. The vertical members of the guardrail shall be made from one-inch square, 14-ga. tubular steel with mandrel formed radius edges. The stiffener racket shall be of formed steel to withstand the required impact loads and the steel tubes shall be welded with full perimeter fillet welds on all four sides.

Each end rail shall be reinforced by a stiffener bracket clamped to the rail at seat board level and attached to the bleacher seat board with three (3) 2 – $\frac{1}{4}$ " elevator bolts. The bracket shall be $\frac{1}{8}$ " thick by 1" wide with a saddle clamp welded to one end to clamp a vertical structural member. The clamp shall be fastened to the vertical member with two $\frac{1}{4}$ " hex head bolts. All attaching hardware shall be zinc plated.

Top row end rails shall attach to the last intermediate end rail with two clamps on the adjoining vertical members and a stiffener bracket clamped to the rail at seat board level and attached to the bleacher seat board with three (3) 2 – $\frac{1}{4}$ " elevator bolts. The top row rail shall be 9 inches wide. The vertical members of the guardrail shall be made from one-inch square, 14-ga. tubular steel with mandrel formed radius edges.

The five vertical structural members of the end rail shall be spaced so that the vertical openings between the members shall be such as to prevent passage of a 4-inch diameter sphere. Vertical structural members shall be 14-ga. tubular steel. Angle steel and/or round tubular steel is unacceptable.

End rail and bracket finish shall be a specially formulated epoxy powder coated surface that is resistant to rust, scratching, peeling, and abrasions. Color choice shall be recommended by the contractor and selected by the HCS Project Manager.

End rails are to be self-storing, nesting inside each other while bleachers open/close, without any action by the operator.

- 4.4 Obstructions: Note any obstructions (columns, drainage pipes, overhead ducts, etc.) on final shop drawings.
- 4.5 Self-storing "P" aisle rails shall be permanently mounted to the bleacher by a single pedestal mount with a minimum height of 34" high. Handrails shall be attached to a socket which shall rotate 90° for easy storage in socket. Aisle handrails that are detached from the socket, removed from the mounting bracket, or designed to lay down in the

socket for storage are not acceptable. Spring loaded rails sockets for storage are not acceptable. Aisle rails are to mount to bleacher in at least 2 locations, including foot/deck board and riser/nose beam.

Railings, posts, and sockets designed to withstand the following horizontal forces applied separately:

- a. A concentrated load of 200 lbs. applied at any point and in any direction along the top railing member.
 - b. A uniform load of 50 lbs./ft. applied vertically downward at the top of the guardrail.
- 4.6 Rail and bracket finish shall be a specially formulated epoxy powder coated surface that is resistant to rust, scratching, peeling, and abrasions. Color choice shall be recommended by the contractor and selected by the HCS Project Manager.

5. FABRICATION

5.1 Understructure Fabrication

- a. Structural high-tensile steel columns fabricated from minimum size 1 ½" x 3" x 10ga. structural tubing
- b. Bracing: 1 ½" square, structural tubing
- c. Row Locks: Provide two per each row, per bleacher section made of ¼" plate, hot rolled steel.
- d. Wheels shall be 4" diameter x 1 ¼" width.
- e. Maximum spacing between columns shall be 11'-6".
- f. Last Row columns shall be no more than 40" from end of bleacher decking, nosing and riser.
- g. Finish: Provide manufacturers' black, semi-gloss, machinery enamel.
- h. Slanted/angled column system is unacceptable.

5.2 Deck System

- a. Footboard shall be ¾" plywood with top facing. All surfaces shall be thoroughly sealed. Top facing shall receive three coats of colored, opaque, catalyzed epoxy coating. Aluminum trim shall be installed on exposed edges. Adjacent footboards shall be joined by means of extruded aluminum joiner beam sized for ¾" footboards. The use of ½" or 5/8" footboards are unacceptable.
- b. Provide thru-bolt fastening through galvanized steel riser beams at locations of splices in rear riser. Front deck connection shall be provided using front steel nose beams.

5.3 Decking and Riser Supports – Shall form rigid closed deck structure. Tapered deck stiffeners shall be bolted through the front and back.

5.4 Seat System

- a. Molded Structural Foam: Provide one-piece, high density structural polyethylene foam. Scuff resistant, textured solid color with anatomically correct tops. Color(s) for the seat modules shall be determined by the Project Manager by providing color charts. Contrasting color effects can be created with custom colors.

5.5 Electrical System

- a. Friction Drive System: A series of electric drives are located under the first row in sufficient quantities. Each tractor drive shall consist of two 12" wide x 6" diameter cylinder wheels covered with a specially formulated white 60 durometer soft-faced rubber grooved for positive grip and low wear while reducing stress on floor.
- b. The tractor is operated by a minimum ¼" HP gear reduction motor built into a height adjustable steel framework and containing additional weight plates for added traction where necessary. These drives operate from one central control box and a single plug-in, hand-held, low-voltage remote pendant controller which has operator management of stop, start, forward, and reverse control of the power operation. The standard system operates with 3 phase, 208 volt, 60 Hz power. Option power source can be provided as required.

6. EXECUTION

6.1 General

- a. Manufacturer's representative or bleacher system installer shall demonstrate the proper method of operation of the bleacher system to the Owner upon completion of the work.

- b. Telescopic Seating Subcontractor shall verify that all areas are free of impediments interfering with the installation and that substrates are acceptable to receive seating in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.
- c. Electrical wiring within the building as required for power operation of the bleachers shall be provided by the Owner.

6.2 Installation

- a. Seating shall be installed accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and final shop drawings. Telescopic Seating Subcontractor will install all accessories, anchors, inserts, and other items for installation of seating and for permanent attachment to adjoining construction.
- b. Adjustment and Cleaning: Upon completion of installation, Telescopic Seating Subcontractor shall adjust each seating assembly to operate in compliance with manufacturer's recommendations. Telescopic Seating Subcontractor shall clean installed seating on exposed or semi-exposed surfaces and touch-up all exposed finishes.
- c. The manufacturer reserves the right to incorporate design changes and material substitutions as it sees fit to improve the overall product assuming prior approval by the HCS Project Manager.

9. WARRANTY

 - a. The manufacturer shall guarantee all work performed under these specifications to be free from defects for a period of one (1) full year.
 - b. Replacement structural steel components, nuts, bolts, axles, and wheels as necessary to maintain the integrity of the original installation to be provided at no charge for a period of twenty (20) years.

CONTRACT VIOLATION: During the term of the contract, contractors who violate this contract will be considered in breach and subject to cancellation for cause. Contractors may be suspended or debarred from doing business with the District. Examples of vendor violations, include, but are not limited to: (1) Adding items to the contract without approval. (2) Increasing contract price without approval. (3) Misrepresentation of the contract to any District entity.

DISCOUNT FOR PROMPT PAYMENT: (a) Discounts for prompt payment will not be considered in the evaluation of offers. However, any offered discount will form a part of the award, and will be taken if payment is made within the discount period indicated in the offer by the Offeror. As an alternative to offering a discount for prompt payment in conjunction with the offer, Offerors awarded contracts may include discounts for prompt payment on individual invoices. (b) In connection with any discount offered for prompt payment, time shall be computed from the date of the invoice. If the Contractor has not placed a date on the invoice, the due date shall be calculated from the date the designated billing office receives a proper invoice, provided HCS annotates such invoice with the date of receipt at the time of receipt. For the purpose of computing the discount earned, payment shall be considered to have been made on the date that appears on the payment check or, for an electronic funds transfer, the specified payment date. When the discount date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday when Federal Government offices are closed and Government business is not expected to be conducted, payment may be made on the following business day. [07-7A020-1]

DISPUTES: (1) Choice-of-Forum. All disputes, claims, or controversies relating to the Agreement shall be resolved exclusively by the appropriate Chief Procurement Officer in accordance with Title 11, Chapter 35, Article 17 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, or in the absence of jurisdiction, only in the Court of Common Pleas for, or a federal court located in, Florence County, State of South Carolina. Contractor agrees that any act by the Government regarding the Agreement is not a waiver of either the Government's sovereign immunity or the Government's immunity under the Eleventh Amendment of the United States' Constitution. As used in this paragraph, the term "Agreement" means any transaction or agreement arising out of, relating to, or contemplated by the solicitation. (2) Service of Process. Contractor consents that any papers, notices, or process necessary or proper for the initiation or continuation of any disputes, claims, or controversies relating to the Agreement; for any court action in connection therewith; or for the entry of judgment on any award made, may be served on Contractor by certified mail (return receipt requested) addressed to Contractor at the address provided as the Notice Address on Page Two or by personal service or by any other manner that is permitted by law, in or outside South Carolina. Notice by certified mail is deemed duly given upon deposit in the United States mail. [07-7A025-1]

FALSE CLAIMS: According to the S.C. Code of Laws § 16-13-240, "a person who by false pretense or representation obtains the signature of a person to a written instrument or obtains from another person any chattel, money, valuable security, or other property, real or personal, with intent to cheat and defraud a person of that property is guilty" of a crime. [07-7A035-1]

FIXED PRICING REQUIRED: Any pricing provided by contractor shall include all costs for performing the work associated with that price. Contractor's price shall be fixed for the duration of this contract, including option terms, except as otherwise provided in this solicitation. This clause does not prohibit contractor from offering lower pricing after award. [07-7A040-1]

NO INDEMNITY OR DEFENSE: Any term or condition is void to the extent it requires HCS to indemnify, defend, or pay attorney's fees to anyone for any reason. [07-7A045-2]

NOTICE: (A) After award, any notices shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given (1) upon actual delivery, if delivery is by hand, (2) upon receipt by the transmitting party of automated confirmation or answer back from the recipient's device if delivery is by telex, telegram, facsimile, or electronic mail, or (3) upon deposit into the United States mail, if postage is prepaid, a return receipt is requested, and either registered or certified mail is used. (B) Notice to contractor shall be to the address identified on Cover Page. Notice to HCS shall be to the Procurement Specialist 's address on the Cover Page. Either party may designate a different address for notice by giving notice in accordance with this paragraph. [07-7A050-1]

OPEN TRADE (JUN 2015): During the contract term, including any renewals or extensions, Contractor will not engage in the boycott of a person or an entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with whom South Carolina can enjoy open trade, as defined in SC Code Section 11-35-5300. [07-7A053-1]

PAYMENT & INTEREST: HCS shall pay the Contractor, after the submission of proper invoices or vouchers, the prices stipulated in this contract for supplies delivered and accepted or services rendered and accepted, less any deductions provided in this contract. Unless otherwise specified herein, including the purchase order, payment shall not be made on partial deliveries accepted by HCS. (b) Unless otherwise provided herein, including the purchase order, payment will be made by check mailed to the payment address on "Page Two." (c) Notwithstanding any other provision, payment shall be made in

accordance with S.C. Code Section 11-35-45, or Chapter 6 of Title 29 (real property improvements) when applicable, which provides the Contractor's exclusive means of recovering any type of interest from the Owner. Contractor waives imposition of an interest penalty unless the invoice submitted specifies that the late penalty is applicable. Except as set forth in this paragraph, HCS shall not be liable for the payment of interest on any debt or claim arising out of or related to this contract for any reason. (d) Amounts due to HCS shall bear interest at the rate of interest established by the South Carolina Comptroller General pursuant to Section 11-35-45 ("an amount not to exceed fifteen percent each year"), as amended, unless otherwise required by Section 29-6-30. (e) Any other basis for interest, including but not limited to general (pre- and post-judgment) or specific interest statutes, including S.C. Code Ann. § 34-31-20, are expressly waived by both parties. If a court, despite this agreement and waiver, requires that interest be paid on any debt by either party other than as provided by items (c) and (d) above, the parties further agree that the applicable interest rate for any given calendar year shall be the lowest prime rate as listed in the first edition of the Wall Street Journal published for each year, applied as simple interest without compounding. (f) The District shall have all of its common law equitable and statutory rights of set-off. [07-7A055-3]

PAYMENT WITH PROPER INVOICE: Invoices submitted for payment for goods or services provided under this contract shall contain, as a minimum, the following information:

- Name of business concern
- Contract number or other authorization for delivery of service or property
- Complete description per individual line item
- Price and quantity of property or service actually delivered or executed.
- Shipping and payment terms.
- Name where applicable
- Title, telephone number and complete mailing address of responsible official to whom payment is to be sent; and
- Other substantiating documentation of information as required by the contract.

Invoices shall be provided to Horry County Schools at the address below. An itemized invoice shall be provided even if payment is made with a District purchase card.

During the term of the contract, if the District identifies items that have been overcharged, the contractor shall reimburse the District the difference in the overcharge(s) plus an additional ten percent of the overages. Repeated instances of overcharging the HCS's may result in the contract being terminated.

PUBLICITY: Contractor shall not publish any comments or quotes HCS employees, or include HCS in either news releases or a published list of customers, without the prior written approval of the Procurement Specialist. [07-7A060-1]

PURCHASE ORDERS: CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT PERFORM ANY WORK PRIOR TO THE RECEIPT OF A PURCHASE ORDER FROM HORRY COUNTY SCHOOLS. The District shall order any supplies or services to be furnished under this contract by issuing a purchase order. Purchase orders may be used to elect any options available under this contract, e.g., quantity, item, delivery date, payment method, but are subject to all terms and conditions of this contract. Purchase orders may be electronic. No particular form is required. An order placed pursuant to the purchasing card provision qualifies as a purchase order. [07-7A065-1]

RECORDS RETENTION AND RIGHT TO AUDIT: Horry County Schools has the right to audit the books and records of the vendors they pertain to this purchase order, both independent of, and pursuant to, the District Procurement Code. Such books and records shall be maintained for three (3) years from the date of final payment under the purchase order.

The District may conduct, or have conducted, performance audits of the vendor. The District may conduct, or have conducted, audits of specific requirements of this bid as determined necessary by the District.

Pertaining to all audits, vendor shall make available to the District access to its computer files containing the history of purchase order performance and all other documents related to the audit. Additionally, any software used by the vendor shall be made available for auditing purposes at no cost to the District.

SURVIVAL OF OBLIGATIONS: The Parties' rights and obligations which, by their nature, would continue beyond the termination, cancellation, rejection, or expiration of this contract shall survive such termination, cancellation, rejection, or expiration, including, but not limited to, the rights and obligations created by the following clauses: Indemnification - Third Party Claims, Intellectual Property Indemnification, and any provisions regarding warranty or audit. [07-7A075-1]

TAXES: Any tax the contractor may be required to collect or pay upon the sale, use or delivery of the products shall be paid by HCS, and such sums shall be due and payable to the contractor upon acceptance. Any personal property taxes levied after delivery shall be paid by HCS. It shall be solely HCS' obligation, after payment to contractor, to challenge the applicability of any tax by negotiation with, or action against, the taxing authority. Contractor agrees to refund any tax collected, which is subsequently determined not to be proper and for which a refund has been paid to contractor by the taxing authority. In the event that the contractor fails to pay, or delays in paying, to any taxing authorities, sums paid by HCS to contractor, contractor shall be liable to HCS for any loss (such as the assessment of additional interest) caused by virtue of this failure or delay. Taxes based on Contractor's net income or assets shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor. [07-7A080-1]

TERMINATION DUE TO UNAVAILABILITY OF FUNDS: Payment and performance obligations for succeeding fiscal periods shall be subject to the availability and appropriation of funds therefore. When funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal period, the contract shall be canceled. In the event of a cancellation pursuant to this paragraph, contractor will be reimbursed the resulting unamortized, reasonably incurred, nonrecurring costs. Contractor will not be reimbursed any costs amortized beyond the initial contract term. [07-7A085-1]

THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY: This Contract is made solely and specifically among and for the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective successors and assigns, and no other person will have any rights, interest, or claims hereunder or be entitled to any benefits under or on account of this Contract as a third party beneficiary or otherwise. [07-7A090-1]

WAIVER: HCS does not waive any prior or subsequent breach of the terms of the Contract by making payments on the Contract, by failing to terminate the Contract for lack of performance, or by failing to strictly or promptly insist upon any term of the Contract. Only the Procurement Specialist has actual authority to waive any of HCS' rights under this Contract. Any waiver must be in writing. [07-7A095-1]

VII. TERMS AND CONDITIONS – B. SPECIAL:

CHANGES: (1) Contract Modification. By a written order, at any time, and without notice to any surety, the Procurement Specialist may, subject to all appropriate adjustments, make changes within the general scope of this contract in any one or more of the following:

- (a) Drawings, designs, or specifications, if the supplies to be furnished are to be specially manufactured for HCS in accordance therewith;
- (b) Method of shipment or packing;
- (c) Place of delivery;
- (d) Description of services to be performed;
- (e) Time of performance (i.e., hours of the day, days of the week, etc.); or,
- (f) Place of performance of the services.
- (g) Product upgrades and new products that are offered by manufacturer.

Subparagraphs (a) to (c) apply only if supplies are furnished under this contract. Subparagraphs (d) to (f) apply only if services are performed under this contract.

(2) Adjustments of Price or Time for Performance. If any such change increases or decreases the contractor's cost of, or the time required for, performance of any part of the work under this contract, whether or not changed by the order, an adjustment shall be made in the contract price, the delivery schedule, or both, and the contract modified in writing accordingly. Any adjustment in contract price made pursuant to this clause shall be determined in accordance with the Price Adjustment Clause of this contract. Failure of the parties to agree to an adjustment shall not excuse the contractor from proceeding with the contract as changed, provided that the District promptly and duly make such provisional adjustments in payment or time for performance as may be reasonable. By proceeding with the work, the contractor shall not be deemed to have prejudiced any claim for additional compensation, or an extension of time for completion.

(3) Time Period for Claim. Within 30 days after receipt of a written contract modification under Paragraph (1) of this clause, unless such period is extended by the Procurement Specialist in writing, the contractor shall file notice of intent to assert a claim for an adjustment. Later notification shall not bar the contractor's claim unless the District is prejudiced by the delay in notification.

(4) Claim Barred After Final Payment. No claim by the contractor for an adjustment hereunder shall be allowed if notice is not given prior to final payment under this contract. [07-7B025-1 Revised 2017 06]

CISG: The parties expressly agree that the UN Convention on the International Sale of Goods shall not apply to this agreement. [07-7B030-1]

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: During the term of the contract, contractor shall comply with all applicable provisions of laws, codes, ordinances, rules, regulations, and tariffs. [07-7B035-1]

CONFERENCE – PRE-PERFORMANCE: Unless waived by the Procurement Specialist, a pre-performance conference between the contractor, district and Procurement Specialist shall be held at a location selected by the district within five (5) days after final award, and prior to commencement of work under the contract. The responsibilities of all parties involved will be discussed to assure a meeting of the minds of all concerned. The successful contractor or his duly authorized representative shall be required to attend at contractor's expense. [07-7B040-1]

CONTRACTOR'S LIABILITY INSURANCE – GENERAL(FEB 2015) (MODIFIED):(a) Without limiting any of the obligations or liabilities of Contractor, Contractor shall procure from a company or companies lawfully authorized to do business in South Carolina and with a current A.M. Best rating of no less than A: VII, and maintain for the duration of the contract, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work and the results of that work by the contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

(b) Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

(1) Commercial General Liability (CGL): Insurance Services Office (ISO) Form CG 00 01 12 07 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products-completed operations, personal and advertising injury, with limits no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. This contract shall be considered to be an "insured contract" as defined in the policy.

(2) Auto Liability: ISO Form Number CA 00 01 covering any auto (Code 1), or if Contractor has no owned autos, hired, (Code 8) and non-owned autos (Code 9), with limits no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.

(3) Worker's Compensation: As required by the State of South Carolina, with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limit of no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.

(c) Horry County Schools, and the officers, officials, employees and volunteers, must be covered as additional insureds on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided

in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or if not available, through the addition of both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 if a later edition is used.

(d) For any claims related to this contract, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the District, and the officers, officials, employees and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the District, or the officers, officials, employees and volunteers, shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

(e) Prior to commencement of the work, the Contractor shall furnish the District if requested with original certificates and amendatory endorsements or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this section. However, failure to obtain the required documents prior to the work beginning shall not waive the Contractor's obligation to provide them. The District reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by this section, at any time.

(f) Should any of the above described policies be cancelled before the expiration date thereof, notice will be delivered in accordance with the policy provisions. In addition, the Contractor shall notify the District immediately upon receiving any information that any of the coverages required by this section are or will be changed, cancelled, or replaced.

(g) Contractor hereby grants to the District a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of said Contractor may acquire against the District by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Contractor agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to effect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the District has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer.

(h) Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the District. The District may require the Contractor to purchase coverage with a lower deductible or retention or provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses within the retention.

(i) The District reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage, or other special circumstances. [07-7B056-2]

CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL: The Contractor shall enforce strict discipline and good order among the Contractor's employees and other persons carrying out the Contract. The Contractor shall not permit employment of unfit persons or persons not skilled in tasks assigned to them. [07-7B060-1]

CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL - OBLIGATION: Contractors are responsible for the conduct of their employees, representatives and agents and for their subcontractors' and sub-subcontractors' employees, representative and agents. Suppliers are considered contractors, subcontractors or sub-subcontractors when the performance of their work (including deliveries) is conducted on District property. All such businesses/individuals shall comply with the following:

1. No drugs, alcohol, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, knives, firearms or other weapons on District property.
2. No fraternizing with, threats to, use of abusive or profane language or improper attire or actions while on District property or adjacent thereto.
3. Take all necessary precautions to ensure the safety of children and employees when performing contracted work or making/accepting deliveries on District property.
4. Secure SLED (State Law Enforcement Division) criminal background checks on every employee, representative and agent performing work, making deliveries or in any other way conducting business on District property. Ensure that no person having been convicted of violent crimes, crimes against children, illegal drug distribution, or other crimes of moral turpitude is assigned or performs work on District property. SLED background checks shall be maintained on file at the main office of the Contractor and made available to District personnel or the District's legal counsel immediately upon request.
5. Not employ or contract with, during the performance of the contract, any illegal alien workers or otherwise violate the provisions of the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as may be amended.

6. Not violate the provisions of the South Carolina Illegal Immigration Reform Act, as may be amended, beginning January 1, 2009, and abide by this Act regardless of the number of employees employed. Participation in E-Verify through the Dept. of Homeland Security is required by the District regardless of the number of employees you employ.
7. Provide picture ID badges for all persons performing work on District property and ensure they are worn at all times. The ID shall include the name of the individual, his/her picture and the name of their employer.

Contractors are to ensure that their subcontractors, sub-subcontractors, as well as suppliers who meet the "contractor, subcontractor or sub-subcontractor" definition above are advised of these requirements and comply with them. These are mandatory conditions for doing business (whether directly or indirectly) with Horry County Schools. The District, at its discretion, may perform random compliance checks. Any Contractor, subcontractor, sub-subcontractor, or supplier found not to be in compliance with these requirements shall result in termination of any existing contract or non-award of a contract.

CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATION – GENERAL: The contractor shall provide and pay for all materials, tools, equipment, labor and professional and non-professional services, and shall perform all other acts and supply all other things necessary, to fully and properly perform and complete the work. The contractor must act as the prime contractor and assume full responsibility for any subcontractor's performance. The contractor will be considered the sole point of contact with regard to all situations, including payment of all charges and the meeting of all other requirements. [07-7B065-1]

DEFAULT: (a)(1) HCS may, subject to paragraphs (c) and (d) of this clause, by written notice of default to the Contractor, terminate this contract in whole or in part if the Contractor fails to-(i) Deliver the supplies or to perform the services within the time specified in this contract or any extension; (ii) Make progress, so as to endanger performance of this contract (but see paragraph (a)(2) of this clause); or (iii) Perform any of the other material provisions of this contract (but see paragraph (a)(2) of this clause). (2) The State's right to terminate this contract under subdivisions (a)(1)(ii) and (1)(iii) of this clause, may be exercised if the Contractor does not cure such failure within 10 days (or more if authorized in writing by the Procurement Specialist) after receipt of the notice from the Procurement Specialist specifying the failure.

(b) If HCS terminates this contract in whole or in part, it may acquire, under the terms and in the manner the Procurement Specialist considers appropriate, supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor will be liable to the District for any excess costs for those supplies or services. However, the Contractor shall continue the work not terminated.

(c) Except for defaults of subcontractors at any tier, the Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs if the failure to perform the contract arises from causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor. Examples of such causes include (1) acts of God or of the public enemy, (2) acts of the State in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, (3) fires, (4) floods, (5) epidemics, (6) quarantine restrictions, (7) strikes, (8) freight embargoes, and (9) unusually severe weather. In each instance the failure to perform must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor.

(d) If the failure to perform is caused by the default of a subcontractor at any tier, and if the cause of the default is beyond the control of both the Contractor and subcontractor, and without the fault or negligence of either, the Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs for failure to perform, unless the subcontracted supplies or services were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time for the Contractor to meet the required delivery schedule.

(e) If this contract is terminated for default, HCS may require the Contractor to transfer title and deliver to the District, as directed by the Procurement Specialist, any (1) completed supplies, and (2) partially completed supplies and materials, parts, tools, dies, jigs, fixtures, plans, drawings, information, and contract rights (collectively referred to as "manufacturing materials" in this clause) that the Contractor has specifically produced or acquired for the terminated portion of this contract. Upon direction of the Procurement Specialist, the Contractor shall also protect and preserve property in its possession in which HCS has an interest.

(f) HCS shall pay contract price for completed supplies delivered and accepted. The Contractor and Procurement Specialist shall agree on the amount of payment for manufacturing materials delivered and accepted and for the protection and preservation of the property; if the parties fail to agree, the Procurement Specialist shall set an amount subject to the Contractor's rights under the Disputes clause. Failure to agree will be a dispute under the Disputes clause. HCS may withhold from these amounts any sum the Procurement Specialist determines to be necessary to protect the District against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of former lien holders.

(g) If, after termination, it is determined that the Contractor was not in default, or that the default was excusable, the rights and obligations of the parties shall, if the contract contains a clause providing for termination for convenience of HCS, be the same

as if the termination had been issued for the convenience of HCS. If, in the foregoing circumstances, this contract does not contain a clause providing for termination for convenience of HCS, the contract shall be adjusted to compensate for such termination and the contract modified accordingly subject to the contractor's rights under the Disputes clause.

(h) The rights and remedies of HCS in this clause are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this contract. [07-7B075-1]

DISPOSAL OF PACKAGING: Contractor shall dispose of all wrappings, crating, and other disposable materials pertaining to this contract at the end of each working day and upon completion of installation. [07-7B085-1]

ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION: (An overview is available at www.procurement.sc.gov) By signing your offer, you certify that you will comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14 of the South Carolina Code of Laws and agree to provide to the District upon request any documentation required to establish either:

(a) that Title 8, Chapter 14 is inapplicable to you and your subcontractors or sub-subcontractors; or

(b) that you and your subcontractors or sub-subcontractors are in compliance with Title 8, Chapter 14. Pursuant to Section 8-14-60, "A person who knowingly makes or files any false, fictitious, or fraudulent document, statement, or report pursuant to this chapter is guilty of a felony, and, upon conviction, must be fined within the discretion of the court or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both." You agree to include in any contracts with your subcontractors language requiring your subcontractors to (a) comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14, and (b) include in their contracts with the sub-subcontractors language requiring the sub-subcontractors to comply with the applicable requirements of Title 8, Chapter 14. [07-7B097-1]

INDEMNIFICATION - THIRD PARTY CLAIMS - GENERAL: Notwithstanding any limitation in this agreement, and to the fullest extent permitted by law, Contractor shall defend and hold harmless Indemnitees for and against any and all suits or claims of any character (and all related damages, settlement payments, attorneys' fees, costs, expenses, losses or liabilities) by a third party which are attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property arising out of or in connection with the goods or services acquired hereunder or caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of contractor, its subcontractors, their employees, workmen, servants, agents, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not caused in part by an Indemnitee, and whether or not such claims are made by a third party or an Indemnitee; however, if an Indemnitee's negligent act or omission is subsequently determined to be the sole proximate cause of a suit or claim, the Indemnitee shall not be entitled to indemnification hereunder. Contractor shall be given timely written notice of any suit or claim. Contractor's obligations hereunder are in no way limited by any protection afforded under workers' compensation acts, disability benefits acts, or other employee benefit acts. This clause shall not negate, abridge, or reduce any other rights or obligations of indemnity which would otherwise exist. The obligations of this paragraph shall survive termination, cancelation, or expiration of the parties' agreement. This provision shall be construed fairly and reasonably, neither strongly for nor against either party, and without regard to any clause regarding insurance. As used in this clause, "Indemnitees" means Horry County Schools, its instrumentalities, agencies, departments, boards, and all their respective officers, agents and employees. [07-7B100-2]

INDEMNIFICATION - INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY: (a) Without limitation and notwithstanding any provision in this agreement, Contractor shall, upon receipt of notification, defend and indemnify the District, its instrumentalities, agencies, departments, boards, political subdivisions and all their respective officers, agents and employees against all actions, proceedings or claims of any nature (and all damages, settlement payments, attorneys' fees (including inside counsel), costs, expenses, losses or liabilities attributable thereto) by any third party asserting or involving an IP right related to an acquired item. District shall allow Contractor to defend such claim so long as the defense is diligently and capably prosecuted. District shall allow Contractor to settle such claim so long as (i) all settlement payments are made by Contractor, and (ii) the settlement imposes no non-monetary obligation upon District. District shall reasonably cooperate with Contractor's defense of such claim.

(iv) any other reasonable costs that have resulted from the termination.
