On a Bi-Weekly basis

The City of Chattanooga is seeking bids from Qualified Contractors to Process and remove all ground material on a-per ton price to be measured on the out bound scale at 3925 North Hawthorne Street facility. This shall be a one year contract with a two additional year option if mutually agreed upon by both parties. This work shall be performed on a bi-weekly basis except in the event of an emergency situation. Grinding shall be performed at any time as the successful bidder will be given a key to the gate, it shall be the responsibility of the vendor to secure this gate whenever they exit the facility. Material can only be removed Monday through Saturday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

This bid should include Grinder and all equipment necessary to process this material and Haul away from our site, shall include all manpower and fuel with no provisions for adjustments for any damages incurred while this operation is being performed. Contractor shall be liable for any damages they cause while on this site.

- 1. All products produced shall be placed in the designated area and will be removed by successful bidder within one week of Grinding. All ground material shall be placed in the Outgoing Product Pile in an area designated by the City.
- a. If the Outgoing Product Pile area exceeds 3,500 cubic yards (CY) at the end of any given week during the performance of this contract, the City at its discretion will measure the stockpile to verify the size of the stockpile.
- b. The City at its discretion, after giving proper notice under the contract, can hire another contractor to remove the excess Outgoing Product Pile

and back charge all actual and administrative costs incurred back to Contractor.

The City of Chattanooga will retain a separate stockpile of mulch for use by the City and its residents; this will be at no additional cost. Approximately 1,000 tons annually.

All Mulch presently ground shall be the responsibility of the City of Chattanooga to remove.

All material will be ground to a size no larger than $1'' \times 1''$ to comply with the Tennessee Department of Agriculture requirements.

The Contractor must notify the City 24 hours in advance of commencing any work at the 3925 Hawthorne Street Facility.

The Contractor shall perform this work with its own workers, equipment and tools.

The Contractor shall not at any time utilize City staff, workers, equipment and or tools to execute their contract without written approval.

The Contractor shall provide appropriate dust control and the appropriate BMPs to prevent unintended discharges of wash water during all grinding, stockpiling and cleaning activities.

The Contractor shall comply with OSHA and ANSI (American National Standards Institute) standards for the type of work being performed. Contractor shall plan and conduct work in a manner safeguarding all persons from injury and take all precautions required. Contractor's staff shall wear OSHA-approved safety equipment at all times.

The Contractor shall invoice the City at mutually agreeable times. A report will accompany and support the invoice, which will include an itemized tabulation of the following with respect to Tons ground and removed from the facility with outbound weight tickets from our Scales

All logo's and identification shall be covered while on the City Site, No exception. Equipment can be left at City site while not grinding or hauling, the City will not be liable for any damages.

All bidders shall provide sufficient proof of general liability:

REQUIREMENTS FOR INSURANCE COVERAGE

The Contractor shall not commence work under these Contract Documents until he has obtained all insurance required herein nor shall the Contractor allow any Subcontractor to commence work on his subcontract until similar insurance required of the Subcontractor has been obtained by the Subcontractor. Insurance shall be placed by the Contractor with one or more insurance carriers licensed to do business in the State of Tennessee. Each insurance policy shall be renewed ten (10) days before the expiration date of the policy.

Certificates of Insurance shall be filed with the City prior to commencement of the work. These certificates shall contain a provision that coverage's afforded under the policies will not be changed or canceled unless at least fifteen (15) days' written notice has been given to the City. The Contract shall not be binding upon the City until the insurance coverage required herein has been obtained and certificates have been filed with the City.

Adequate insurance coverage shall be maintained by the Contractor at all times. Failure to maintain adequate coverage shall not relieve the Contractor of any responsibilities or obligations under these

Contract Documents. In the event any insurance coverage is canceled or allowed to lapse, the Contractor will not be permitted to prosecute the work until adequate and satisfactory insurance has been obtained and Certificates of Insurance furnished to the City. Failure to keep insurance policies in effect will not be cause for any claims for extension of time under these Contract Documents.

All such policies shall be subject to approval by the City Attorney. Should the City Attorney at any time in his sole discretion determine that the insurance policies and certificate provided may not be sufficient to protect the interests of the City because of the insulvency of the insurance company or otherwise, the Contractor shall replace such policies with policies meeting his approval.

The Contractor shall procure and maintain at his own expense, during the Contract Time, insurance as hereinafter specified:

Workmen's Compensation Insurance that shall protect the Contractor against all claims under applicable state workmen's compensation laws shall be maintained. The Contractor shall also be protected against claims for injury, disease or death of employees which, for any reason, may not fall within the provisions of a workmen's compensation law. This policy shall also include an endorsement providing coverage in all States in which work is performed. The Contractor shall require all the Subcontractors to provide similar Workmen's Compensation Insurance for all the Subcontractors' employees on the work unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor. The liability limits shall not be less than that required by statute.

General Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance that shall be written in comprehensive form and shall protect the Contractor against all claims arising from injuries including death, to members of the public or damage to property of others arising out of any act or omission of the Contractor or his agents, employees, or Subcontractors. In addition, this policy shall specifically insure the contractual liability assumed by the successful bidder to defend and indemnify the City of Chattanooga against such claims or suits.

To the extent that the work may require blasting, explosive conditions or underground operation, the comprehensive general public liability and property damage coverage shall contain no exclusion relative to blasting, explosion, collapse of buildings, or damage to underground property.

The comprehensive general public liability and property damage coverage shall also protect the Contractor against all claims from damage to:

- 1. Private driveways, walks, shrubbery and plantings;
- 2. Public utility facilities; and
- 3. U.S Government monuments.

The liability limits shall not be less than?

Property Damage

The general public liability and property damage insurance shall carry an endorsement in form satisfactory to the City to the effect that the Contractor shall save harmless the City from any claims and damages whatsoever, including patent infringement. General public liability and property damage insurance shall be kept in force at all times during the course of the work until such time as the work covered by these Contract Documents has been completed and accepted by the City.

Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Liability and Property Damage Insurance that shall be written in comprehensive form and shall protect the Contractor against all claims for injuries to members of the public and damage to property of others arising from the use of motor vehicles, and shall cover operation on or off the site of all motor vehicles licensed for highway use, whether they are owned, non-owned, or hired.
