PURPOSE

1.0 PURPOSE

It is the intent of this Request for Proposal (RFP) and resulting annual contract to obtain the “as needed” services from qualified asbestos, lead paint, and indoor air quality inspectors for services related to the location and identification of asbestos-containing materials (ACM), lead based paint (LBP), and microbial contaminants in County-owned buildings as required for pre-demolition, renovation, and/or indoor environmental remediation projects. The Contractor may also be expected to provide the County with indoor environmental assessments and necessary documentation to design any needed pre-demolition and/or renovation abatement or remediation measures. Services shall include, but are not limited to, inspection services, sample analysis, reporting, project design, and project monitoring.

The initial period of this contract is for one (1) year with up to four (4) possible automatic annual renewals subject to the County’s satisfaction with the contracted firm(s), up to a possible maximum contract period of five (5) years.

At the County’s discretion, the County has the right to select multiple firms for award.

2.0 COMPETITION INTENDED

It is the County’s intent that this Request for Proposal (RFP) permits competition. It shall be the offeror’s responsibility to advise the Purchasing Agent in writing if any language requirement, specification, etc., or any combination thereof, inadvertently restricts or limits the requirements stated in this RFP to a single source. Such notification must be received by the Purchasing Agent no later than the inquiry cut-off time.

3.0 SCOPE OF WORK

Services by the Contractor are divided into responsibilities as outlined below. The County reserves the right to expand the Scope of Work identified herein, add additional tasks, or terminate services

at any stage/phase.

A. INSPECTION SERVICES

The inspector shall conduct comprehensive inspections of structures identified by the County within ten (10) working days from the time of notification by the County's Project Manager. The Project Manager shall describe the extent and nature of the intended renovation/demolition with respect to properties to be inspected.

Inspections shall be conducted in accordance with all Federal, State, and Local regulations. Only qualified and licensed inspector(s) who are licensed in the State of South Carolina shall be utilized. The inspector shall ensure that all potential asbestos-containing materials and lead based paint which may be disturbed during the renovation/demolition are identified. If requested, the inspector shall also test the building(s) for indoor air quality.

The County desires to minimize unnecessary bulk sampling and analytical costs. To best accomplish this, the inspector shall use the following procedures for asbestos testing:

1. Multiple samples from a given homogenous area of suspected hazardous materials shall be identified and submitted for analysis in such a manner as to ensure that no subsequent analysis are performed for that homogeneous area after any one sample has been positively identified.
2. The inspector shall not collect samples in excess of the number required by Federal, State, and Local regulations for ACM detection, or more than necessary to determine average percentages of lead paint, or other hazardous materials.
3. All materials, supplies, supervision and equipment shall be provided to perform project monitoring/management of asbestos, lead and/or microbial contaminant abatement using the Contractor's procedures and personnel to ensure continuous compliance with written specifications and applicable safety requirements.

B. INSPECTION REPORTS

Within five (5) working days from the date of the inspection, the inspector shall provide a written report for each location to the County's Project Manager. The report shall include, as a minimum, the following information:

1. The address of the property that was inspected. If street numbers are not available, the inspector shall request other descriptive identification from the Project Manager. The same location description of the property shall be used consistently in all project documentation.
2. An approximate-scale, plan-view drawing of the structure(s), denoting all interior partitions and exterior walls. The location of all ACM bulk, and lead paint samples collected shall be noted on this drawing.
3. A narrative description of the date of the inspection, the names and asbestos inspector license numbers of the inspection team members, the areas of the structure(s) inspected, suspected hazardous materials encountered, and

contaminated materials confirmed by analysis.

4. The location of all hazardous materials shall be noted on the drawings by symbol. An explanatory legend for these symbols shall appear on the drawing or on an attached page.
5. A table listing the forms of hazardous materials identified the locations of the materials and the approximate quantity of the materials. Units of square feet for surfacing or sheet material and liner feet for pipe insulation shall be used. Report shall include estimate of abatement costs and shall be submitted in duplicate.
6. Other significant findings. This shall include, but is not limited to, the condition of ACM/LBP, condition of indoor air quality, the presence and extent of soil contamination from deteriorated asbestos, obstructions impediments to removal, areas for any reason not inspected within the structure, and description of any non-ACM materials (as confirmed by analysis) which may be easily confused with ACM present.
7. The original of the laboratory reports for bulk analysis. These reports shall have the signature of the analyst, a brief description of the analytical method used, and a statement of the current laboratory accreditation. The report identification number for bulk samples shall correspond to the number used on the drawings and the project location.

C. PROJECT DESIGN

Once it is determined how much and what type of asbestos/lead based paint is present, as well as its condition and the degree of hazard to human health which it poses, project activities will be designed and developed to remediate the problem.

The outcome of this phase may include providing project contract documents, specifications, and drawings which govern how a project will be accomplished. Under the supervision of project managers, the Contractor shall provide overall guidance regarding organization and implementation of the project.

Important elements to the project design shall include prioritizing which hazardous materials will be abated, estimating the cost of abatement, developing project drawings and blueprints, developing bid documents used in the contractor selection process, establishing a project schedule that meets the client's needs, and recommending the most cost-effective solution (e.g., removal versus enclosure/maintenance). The Contractor shall be available for general consultation throughout the design/development process.

D. PROJECT MONITORING

After remedial activities have been designed and implemented, the Contractor will be responsible for monitoring all abatement procedures to ensure that they comply with applicable Federal, State, and Local laws and regulations, as well as the requirements of specific project specifications. Appropriate notes, letters, and filings with regulatory agencies shall be kept by the Contractor.

As a part of monitoring services, the Contractor shall determine airborne fiber concentrations of ACM and air and surface concentrations of lead and/or microbial contaminants on site before, during, and after the completion of abatement activity. The Contractor shall provide, if necessary, public relations assistance to address any concerns/questions from the employees/public regarding the abatement procedures.

E. FINAL REPORTING

Once all abatement activities have been satisfactorily performed, the Contractor shall provide the County with a final bound report, which is a permanent record of the abatement process, and the status of any ACM, LBP, or microbial contaminant still remaining at a project site. The report shall be a comprehensive record of the project from preliminary planning through final results. It shall include all documented records related to the project, such as notifications to appropriate regulatory agencies, waste disposal manifests, medical monitoring and training records of the Contractor's employees, and records of air and wipe sample analysis, as well as any recommendations to prevent future contamination.

F. ESTIMATE OF COST

The County may require a written cost estimate for inspection services. The estimate shall include a maximum number of man-hours for inspection, an estimated quantity of samples, and administrative and documentation fees based upon the rates quoted herein. The cost estimate shall be furnished within five (5) working days of request.

G. RESTRICTIONS

The Contractor may not bid or provide services for abatement for those facilities which he has inspected.

H. BIDDER QUALIFICATIONS

Offerors must be responsible parties, regularly and practically engaged in this class of work and known to possess ample facilities for doing this work.

It shall be the offeror's responsibility to assure that the competency requirements set forth in the Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations, part 61, and State regulation 61-86.1 enforced by the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (SCDHEC), along with Title 29 Code of Regulations, part 1926.1101, enforced by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), and all Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) asbestos-related and lead-based paint laws and regulations are followed by all of the Offeror's inspectors and staff.

The offeror shall submit with their proposal a copy of the SCDHEC Asbestos Inspector's License for each inspector the offeror proposes to use in the performance of this contract. Offerors shall also submit a copy of experience/qualifications for each inspector for lead paint.

I. LABORATORIES

The offeror shall submit with his proposal a list of the laboratories that the offeror proposes to use in the performance of the work. Laboratories to be used shall be accredited under the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NITS) Quality Assurance Program for Bulk Asbestos Analysis; the offeror shall submit current documentation of accreditation. The Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that all analysis are performed using the

4.0 TASK ORDER PROCEDURES

- 1) The Contractor shall perform work assigned under this Contract as directed in task orders issued by the COUNTY Contracting Officer in accordance with the terms and conditions of the task order or as specified elsewhere in the Contract. Task orders will be executed in writing through a bilateral agreement between the Contractor and COUNTY. Upon execution of task orders, the Contractor shall provide the personnel, facilities, equipment, and other materials and services necessary to perform the work set forth in the task order.
- 2) Task orders shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Contract. In the event of conflict between a task order and this Contract, the Contract shall control.
- 3) Task Orders shall be subject to appropriation and availability of funds as described in clause no. 7, "Non-Appropriation" in the General Terms and Conditions included in the Contract. In no event, shall the Contractor be authorized to incur costs under an individual task order in excess of the total amount of funds obligated against that task order. The Contractor shall not exceed the ceiling price approved for each individual task order unless authorized by the COUNTY Contracting Officer in writing by an approved Change Order.
- 4) Task orders shall be negotiated. Task orders may be issued from the effective date of this Contract through completion or termination of the Contract. Any task order issued during the effective period of this Contract and not completed within that time shall be completed by the Contractor within the time specified in the task order. The task order and the Contract shall govern the Contractor's and COUNTY's rights and obligations with respect to that task order to the same extent as if the task order were completed during the Contract's effective period.
- 5) There is no limit on the number of task orders that may be issued against this Contract, if and when needed.
- 6) In the event that fewer direct labor hours or estimated total costs are used by the Contractor accomplishing the prescribed work under individual task orders than were obligated by the executed task orders, the Contractor shall generate a letter addressed to the Project Manager requesting the closure of the task order. The Contracting Officer and Accounts Payable shall be copied. Unused funds shall be restored to the unassigned funds for the Contract. The parties agree that any downward price/cost adjustment shall reflect actual work performed.

5.0 SPECIFIC PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Offerors shall provide one (1) electronic, reproducible RFP submittal in pdf format, clearly labeled with your company's name and the bid number. The RFP response must be complete, clear and concise, not to exceed fifty (50) 8 ½" x 11" pages (may be fewer) and numbered at the bottom right hand corner of the page. The submittal shall use a minimum 12-point Times New Roman font. All sections shall be clearly labeled as listed below for ease of evaluation. The last section entitled "Mandatory Forms" will not count towards the page limitation. All other pages will apply to the

page limitation. Non-conforming submissions may be deemed “Non-Responsive” and be removed from consideration.

5.1 Cover Letter

A cover letter shall be included with each proposal and contain the following information:

- Name of Firm, Contact’s Name, Contact’s Title, Physical Address, Mailing Address (if different), Contact’s Telephone Number, and Contact’s email address. The Contact provided will be used for all bid inquiries and bid/contract related correspondence.
- Type of business entity (e.g. corporation, partnership, etc.) and number of years established.
- Any additional introductory information that the Proposer wishes to provide. An individual authorized to bind the Contractor must sign the letter.

5.2 Table of Contents

Provide a one to two-page table of contents reflecting page numbers for each section.

5.3 Background and Project Summary

The Background and Project Summary Section should describe your understanding of the County, the work to be performed, and the objectives to be accomplished. Refer to the “Scope of Work” of this RFP.

5.4 Methodology

Provide a detailed description of the approach and methodology to be used to accomplish the “Scope of Work” of this RFP. The Methodology Section should include the following:

- a. An implementation plan that describes in detail the methods, including controls by which your firm manages projects of the type sought by this RFP and any other project management or implementation strategies or techniques that the respondent intends to employ in carrying out the work.
- b. Detailed description of efforts your firm will undertake to achieve client satisfaction and to satisfy the requirements of the “Scope of Work” Section.
- c. Detailed project schedule, identifying all tasks and deliverables to be performed, durations for each task, and overall time of completion for each task assigned.
- d. Detailed description of specific tasks you will require from County staff. Explain what the respective roles of County staff and your staff would be to complete the tasks specified herein.

5.5 Staffing

Provide a list of individual(s) who will be working on this project and indicate the level/title of each member, and the function that each will perform. Include a resume for each designated individual. Describe five (5) past projects for each key personnel and explain their responsibilities for each project.

Upon award and during the contract period, if the Contractor chooses to assign different personnel to the project, the Contractor must submit their names and qualifications including information listed above to the County for approval before they may begin work.

5.6 Qualifications

The information requested in this section should describe the qualifications of the firm and their subcontractors in performing projects within the past five (5) years that are similar in size and scope to that requested in the RFP. Information shall include the following:

- a. A summary of the firm's demonstrated capability, including length of time that the firm has provided the services being requested herein.
- b. Provide at least five (5) references that received similar services from your organization. The County reserves the right to contact any of the organization or individuals listed. Information shall include:
 - Client name
 - Project description
 - Project start and end dates
 - Client project manager name and telephone number

5.7 Fee Proposal

Provide your organization's fee schedule for the services requested in this RFP, to include hourly staff costs and detailed task oriented pricing.

5.8 Mandatory Forms

6.0 EVALUATION AND AWARD CRITERIA

The County's Evaluation Committee shall review each proposal and verify the claims and credentials of each Offeror. The Committee may elect to seek additional information from any or all proposers. While not anticipated, the Committee may elect to interview offerors to aide in their evaluation process. Therefore, Offerors shall be willing and able to travel to Georgetown County for interviews at the discretion of the Evaluation Committee. Price shall be considered, but need not be the sole determining factor. The following criteria will be used in the evaluation process:

Maximum Possible Point Score

- Background & Project Summary-Meeting all RFP Requirements and understanding of the project..... 10 pts.
 - Methodology-Implementation plan & techniques, client satisfaction, project schedule, roles of County staff.....20 pts.
 - Staffing-Educational background, work experience, resumes, and description of key personnel.....20 pts.
 - Qualifications-Capability and qualifications of the firm and their sub-contractors and references, etc.....25 pts.
 - Fee Proposal-Fee Schedule.....25 pts.
- Total Possible Points.....100 pts.

The County reserves the right to negotiate with the highest ranked offeror(s). The County of Georgetown is not required to furnish a statement of the reason(s) why a proposal was not deemed to be the most advantageous. At the discretion of the County, the County may choose to award contracts with multiple firms.

The successful firm(s) will be expected to sign a contract with the County of Georgetown. The successful firm(s) shall execute and return the contract documents to the County and provide the required Certificate of Insurance to the County within fifteen (15) days after receipt of written notice of formal award. The County reserves the right to negotiate include additional terms and provisions, as negotiated.

Impromptu, unwritten questions are permitted and verbal answers may be provided, but are only intended as general direction and will not represent the official GCPO position. The only official position of GCPO is that which is stated in writing and issued in the solicitation as addenda thereto.

No bid will be accepted thereafter. The County assumes no responsibility for delivery of bids that are mailed. Georgetown County reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informalities and technicalities in the bid process.

5. NON EXCLUSIVITY

Nothing herein is intended nor shall be construed as creating any exclusive arrangement with Contractor. Any resulting contract shall not restrict the County from acquiring similar, equal or like goods and/or services from other entities or sources, when Staff determines internally that this resulting action is in the best interest of Georgetown County.

6. No Bidder may submit more than one bid. Multiple bids for different manufacturers but represented by the same firm will not be accepted. Bids offered directly from manufacturers shall indicate if a local dealer/representative will be involved.

7. Definitions:

a) The terms “Proposer”, “Offeror”, “Vendor” or “Bidder” refer to those parties who are submitting sealed responses for the work set forth in this document to the OWNER, as distinct from a sub-bidder who provides a bid to the Bidder. The term “Contractor” refers to the successful Bidder.

b) The term “**Asbestos and Lead Based Paint Assessment Services, As Needed**” or “service” refers to the **complete set of services** as specified in this document, in every aspect.

c) The terms “Owner” and “County” refer to the County of Georgetown, South Carolina.

d) Where the words “shall” or “must” are used, it signifies an absolute minimum function or capacity that, if not satisfied, may result in disqualification.

e) Where the words “should”, “may”, or “is desirable” are used, it signifies desirable, but not mandatory functions or capacities. Bidders who are able to provide these functions or capacities may be evaluated more favorably than those who cannot.

8. Correction or Withdrawal of Bids; Cancellation of Awards

An offeror must submit in writing a request to either correct or withdraw a bid to the Procurement Officer. Each written request must document the fact that the offeror’s mistake is clearly an error that will cause him substantial loss.

a) Correction of awards : An offeror shall not be permitted to correct a bid mistake after bid opening that would cause such offeror to have the low bid unless the mistake in the judgment of the Procurement Officer is clearly evident from examining the bid document; for example, extension of unit prices or errors in addition.

b) Cancellation of awards prior to performance: When it is determined after an award has been issued but before performance has begun that Georgetown County’s requirements for the goods or services have changed or have not been met, the award or contract may be canceled and either re-awarded or a new solicitation issued.

9. Faxed or E-mailed bids will not be accepted by Georgetown County. Electronic bid submissions must be submitted through the Georgetown County Purchasing Vendor Registry page to ensure they remain sealed until the scheduled bid opening date and time.

10. If you need any reasonable accommodation for any type of disability in order to participate in this

11. Any deviations from the specifications or modification of this bid and any extra or incidental work or reductions in work shall be set forth in writing and signed by both parties prior to making such change. Any increase or decrease in the bid price resulting from such change shall be included in writing.
13. Exceptions: The bidder shall list on a separate sheet of paper any variations from, or exceptions to, the conditions and specifications of this bid. This sheet shall be labeled "Exception(s) to Bid Conditions and Specifications," and shall be attached to the bid. When Proposers find instances where they must take exception with certain requirements or specifications of the bid, all exceptions shall be clearly identified. Written explanations shall include the scope of the exceptions, the ramifications of the exceptions for the County of Georgetown, and a description of the advantage to be gained or disadvantages to be incurred by the County as a result of these exceptions. If none, write "NONE".
14. Georgetown County reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and to waive as an informality any irregularities contained in any bid as may be deemed in the best interest of the County. Georgetown County further reserves the right to reject any bid submitted, at its sole option, that the vendor may not be able to meet the service requirements of the bid.
15. Publicity releases: contractor agrees not to refer to award of any resulting contract in commercial advertising in such a manner as to state or imply that the products or services provided are endorsed or preferred by the user.
16. Material Safety Data Sheets: The County of Georgetown will not receive any materials, products, or chemicals which may be hazardous to an employee's health unless accompanied by a Material Data Sheet when received.
17. Ownership of Copyright: All right, title and interest in all copyrightable materials which vendor shall create in the performance of its obligations hereunder shall be the property of the procurer. Vendor agrees to assign and hereby does assign any and all interest it has in and to such material to procurer. Vendor agrees, upon the request of procurer to execute all papers and perform all other such acts necessary to assist procurer to obtain and register copyrights on such materials. Where applicable, works of authorship created by the vendor in the performance of its obligations hereunder, shall be considered "works for hire" as defined in the U.S. Copyright Act.

18. Ownership of Documents: Any reports, studies, photographs, negatives or other documents prepared by vendor in the performance of its obligations shall be the exclusive property of the procurer and all such material shall be remitted to the procurer by the vendor upon completion, termination or cancellation of this order. Vendor shall not use, willingly allow or cause to have such material used for any purpose other than performance of its obligations under this order without the prior written consent of the procurer.
19. Affirmative Action: The contractor will take affirmative action in complying with all Federal and State requirements concerning fair employment and employment of the handicapped, and concerning the treatment of all employees, without regard or discrimination by reason of age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin or physical handicap. The following are incorporated herein by reference: 41 C.F.R. 60-1.4, 60-250.4 and 60-741.4.
20. Inclusion and participation of disadvantaged, small, and local business entities is strongly encouraged, but minimum participation standards are not in effect for this project.
21. Federally Funded Construction Contracts Over \$2,000:
- a) Davis-Bacon Requirements. These contracts need to include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 USC 276a to a—7) and the Department of Labor implementing regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Under this Act, Contractors are required to include the contract provisions in Section 5.5 (a) of 29 CFR Part 5, and to pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the minimum wages specified in the wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, Contractors shall be required to pay wages not less than the minimum wages specified in the wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, Contractors shall be required to pay wages not less often than once a week.  - b) Contract Work Hours and Safety Standard Act Requirements. The contracts must include a provision for compliance with Sections 103 and 107 of the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 USC 327-330) as supplemented by the Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Under Section 103 of the Act, each Contractor shall be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard workweek of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard workweek is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate not less than one times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the workweek. Section 107 of the Act is applicable to construction work and provides that no laborer of mechanic shall be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous, or dangerous to health and safety as determined under construction, safety and health standards promulgated by the Secretary of Labor. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies, materials, or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.
 - c) Copeland “Anti-Kickback” Act Requirements. All construction contracts over \$2,000.00 must include a provision for compliance with the Copeland “Anti-Kickback” Act (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3). This act provides that each Contractor shall be prohibited from inducing, by any means, persons employed in the construction, completion, or repaid of public work to give up any part of their compensation.

22. Bidders must clearly mark as "confidential" each part of their bid which they consider to be proprietary information that could be exempt from disclosure under section 30-4-40, Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended (Freedom of Information Act). If any part is designated as confidential, there must be attached to that part an explanation of how this information fits within one or more categories listed in section 30-4-40. The County reserves the right to determine whether this information should be exempt from disclosure and no legal action may be brought against the County or its agents for its determination in this regard.

23. CERTIFICATION REGARDING DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE:

The contractor certifies that the vendor(s) will provide a "drug-free workplace" as that term is defined in Section 44-107-30 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, by the complying with the requirements set forth in title 44, Chapter 107.

24. Certification of Non-Segregated Facilities

The federally-assisted construction contractor certifies that he does not maintain or provide, for his employees, any segregated facilities at any of his establishments and that he does not permit his employees to perform their services at any location, under his control, where segregated facilities are maintained. The federally-assisted construction contractor certifies that he will not maintain or provide, for his employees, segregated facilities at any of his establishments and that he will not permit his employees to perform their services at any location under his control where segregated facilities are maintained. The federally-assisted construction contractor agrees that a breach of this certification is a violation of the Equal Opportunity Clause in this Contract.

As used in this certification, the term "segregated facilities" means any waiting rooms, work areas, restrooms, and washrooms, restaurants and other eating areas, time clocks, locker rooms and other storage or dressing areas, parking lots, drinking fountains, recreation or entertainment areas, transportation, and housing facilities provided for employees which are segregated on the basis of race, color, religion, or national origin because of habit, local custom, or any other reason. The federally assisted construction contractor agrees that (except where he has obtained identical certifications from proposed subcontractors for specific time periods) he will obtain identical certifications from proposed subcontractors prior to the award of subcontracts exceeding \$10,000 which are not exempt from the provisions of the Equal Opportunity Clause and that he will retain such certifications in his files.

25. Nothing herein is intended to exclude any responsible vendor, his product or service or in any way restrain or restrict competition. On the contrary, all responsible vendors are encouraged to bid and their bids are solicited.

26. Acknowledgement of Addenda

Each contractor is responsible to verify the number of total addenda issued prior to bid. **Failure to acknowledge all addenda may disqualify the bidder.** All addenda are posted by the County at the website located at www.georgetowncountysc.org, select "Bid Opportunities" from the Quick Links box. It is each proposer's responsibility to verify that all addenda have been received and acknowledged.

27. This Invitation for Bid covers the estimated requirements to provide Asbestos and Lead Based Paint Assessment Services, As Needed Services for the Georgetown County Public Services Department. The purpose is to establish a Term Contract with firm pricing and delivery under which the department may place orders as needed. The right is reserved to extend the use of this contract to any County Department.

28. **TERMS OF AGREEMENT / RENEWAL**

The County reserves the right to negotiate with the highest ranked offeror(s).

29. Bids must be made on Proposal or Bid Form furnished or will be rejected. Proposals shall be typewritten or written in ink on the form prepared by the County. The person signing the bid shall initial all corrections or erasures.

30. The successful bidder shall procure, maintain, and provide proof of, insurance coverage for injuries to persons and/or property damage as may arise from or in conjunction with, the work performed on behalf of the County by the bidder, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors. Proof of coverage as contained herein shall be submitted fifteen (15) days prior to the commencement of work and such coverage shall be maintained by the bidder for the duration of the contract period; for occurrence policies.

a. General Liability

Coverage shall be as broad as: Comprehensive General Liability endorsed to include Broad Form, Commercial General Liability form including Products/Completed Operations.

1. Minimum Limits

Coverage sufficient to cover all vehicles owned, used, or hired by the bidder, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

- \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence Limit
- \$5,000 Medical Expense Limit

c. Workers' Compensation

Limits as required by the Workers' Compensation Act of SC. Employers Liability, \$1,000,000.

d. Owners' & Contractors' Protective Liability

Policy will be in name of County. Minimum limits required are \$1,000,000.

e. Professional Liability (a/k/a Errors and Omissions)

f. Coverage Provisions

1. All deductibles or self-insured retention shall appear on the certificate(s).
2. The County of Georgetown, its officers/ officials, employees, agents and volunteers shall be added as "additional insured" as their interests may appear. This provision

does not apply to Professional Liability or Workers' Compensation/Employers' Liability.

3. The offeror's insurance shall be primary over any applicable insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County.
4. Shall provide 30 days written notice to the County before any cancellation, suspension, or void of coverage in whole or part, where such provision is reasonable.
5. All coverage for subcontractors of the bidder shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.
6. All deductibles or self-insured retention shall appear on the certificate(s) and shall be subject to approval by the County. At the option of the County, either; the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductible or self-insured retention; or the bidder shall be required to procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related claims expenses.
7. Failure to comply with any reporting provisions of the policy(s) shall not affect coverage provided the County, its officers/officials, agents, employees and volunteers.
8. The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the County, its officers/officials, agents, employees or volunteers for any act, omission or condition of premises which the parties may be held liable by reason of negligence.
9. The bidder shall furnish the County certificates of insurance including endorsements affecting coverage. The certificates are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurance company(s) to bind coverage on its' behalf, if executed by a broker, notarized copy of authorization to bind, or certify coverage must be attached.
10. All insurance shall be placed with insurers maintaining an A.M. Best rating of no less than an A:VII. If A.M. Best rating is less than A:VII, approval must be received from County's Risk Officer.

31. Workman's Compensation Coverage

Georgetown County, SC will require each contractor and service provider to maintain on file with the purchasing officer, a current Certificate of Insurance showing limits as required by the Workers' Compensation Act of SC: Employers Liability, \$1,000,000.

The law also recognizes "statutory employees." These are employees who work for a subcontractor who may be working for a business or another contractor. Employers should inquire whether or not a subcontractor working for them has workers' compensation insurance, regardless of the number of employees employed by the subcontractor. If the subcontractor does not, the subcontractor's injured employees would be covered under the employer's workers' compensation insurance. If the subcontractor does not carry workers' compensation insurance, then the owner or the principal contractor would be liable just as if the subcontractor's employee was one of their employees.

32. Hold Harmless Clause

The Contractor shall, during the term of the contract including any warranty period, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, its officials, employees, agents, and representatives thereof from all suits, actions, or claims of any kind, including attorney's fees, brought on account of any personal injuries, damages, or violations of rights, sustained by any person or property in consequence of any neglect in safeguarding contract work or on account of any act or omission by the contractor or his employees, or from any claims or amounts arising from violation of any law, bylaw, ordinance, regulation or decree. The vendor agrees that this clause shall include claims involving infringement of patent or copyright.

33. Condition of Items

All items shall be new, in first class condition, including containers suitable for shipment and storage, unless otherwise indicated herein. Verbal agreements to the contrary will not be recognized.

34. Workmanship and Inspection

All work under this contract shall be performed in a skillful and workmanlike manner. The County may, in writing, require the Contractor to remove any employee from work that the County deems incompetent or careless.

Further, the County may, from time to time, make inspections of the work performed under this contract. Any inspection by the County does not relieve the Contractor from any responsibility regarding defects or other failures to meet the contract requirements.

35. Invoicing and Payment

The Contractor shall submit invoices on a frequency to be determined, as agreed upon by the County, for each payment requested. Such invoice shall also include a detailed breakdown of all charges. All such invoices will be paid within thirty (30) days unless any items thereon are questioned, in which event payment will be withheld pending verification of the amount claimed and the validity of the claim. The firm shall provide complete cooperation during any such investigation. All invoices shall be forwarded to the following address:

An IRS W-9 form must be on file with the Purchasing Office before any payment will be issued.

36. South Carolina Sales Tax

The County of Georgetown, SC is not exempt and pays the appropriate SC sales tax on all applicable purchases.

37. Assignment of Contract

This contract may not be assigned in whole or part without the written consent of the Purchasing Officer.

38. Termination

Subject to the provisions below, the contract may be terminated by the County upon sixty (60) days advance written notice to the other party; but if any work or service hereunder is in progress, but not completed as of the date of termination, then this contract may be extended upon written approval of the County until said work or services are completed and accepted.

a. Termination for Convenience

In the event that this contract is terminated or canceled upon request and for the convenience of the County, without the required sixty (60) days advance written notice, then the County shall negotiate reasonable termination costs, if applicable.

b. Termination for Cause

Termination by the County for cause, default or negligence on the part of the contractor shall be excluded from the foregoing provision; termination costs, if any, shall not apply. The sixty (60) days advance notice requirement is waived in the event of Termination for Cause.

c. Non-Appropriation:

It is understood and agreed by the parties that in the event funds are not appropriated in the current fiscal year or any subsequent fiscal years, this contract will become null and void and the County will only be required to pay for services completed to the satisfaction of the County.

39. Default

In case of default by the contractor, for any reason whatsoever, the County may procure the goods or services from another source and hold the contractor responsible for any resulting excess cost and may seek other remedies under law.

40. Severability

In the event that any provision shall be adjudged or decreed to be invalid, such ruling shall not invalidate the entire Agreement but shall pertain only to the provision in question and the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid, binding and in full force and effect.

41. Applicable Laws

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of South Carolina, U.S.A.

42. Claims and Disputes:

All claims, disputes and other matters in question between parties arising out of, or relating to, this Agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be decided in the Circuit Court of the Fifteenth Judicial circuit in Georgetown County, South Carolina. By executing this Agreement, all parties specifically consent to venue and jurisdiction in Georgetown County, South Carolina and waive any right to contest jurisdiction and venue in said Court.

43. Rights of County

The County reserves the right to reject all or any part of any bid, waive informalities and award the contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder to best serve the interest of the County.

44. Award of Bid

In determining the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, in addition to price, there shall be considered the following:

- (a) The ability, capacity and skill of the bidder to perform the contract.
- (b) Whether the bidder can perform the contract within the time specified, without delay of interference.
- (c) The character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience and efficiency of the bidder.
- (d) The quality of performance on previous contracts.
- (e) The previous and existing compliance by the bidder with laws and ordinances relating to the contract.
- (f) The sufficiency of the financial resources to perform the contract to provide the service.

- (g) The quality, availability and adaptability of the supplies or contractual services to the particular use required.
- (h) The ability of the bidder to provide future maintenance and service.
- (i) The discount terms and conditions of the bid.
- (j) Delivery time.

45. Notice of Award

A *Notice of Intent to Award* will be mailed to all respondents.

46. Protest

Bidders may refer to Sections 2-67, 2-73, and 2-74 of Ordinance #20-32, also known as the Georgetown County, South Carolina Purchasing Policy to determine their remedies concerning this competitive process. The failure to be awarded a bid shall not be valid grounds for protest.

47. Debarment

By submitting a bid, the offeror certifies to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals, sub-contractors and assigns are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal, State or local department or agency. A copy of the County's debarment procedure in accordance with Section 2-68 of Ordinance #20-32, also known as the Georgetown County, South Carolina Purchasing Policy is available upon request.

48. Firm Pricing for County Acceptance

Bid price must be firm for County acceptance for 60 days from bid opening date. "Discount from list," bids are not acceptable unless specifically requested.

49. Quotations to be F.O.B.: Destination

Quote F.O.B.: Destination for this competitive sealed bid. As an alternate, show exact cost for delivery.

50. Unit Prices and Extension

Bid unit price on quantity specified -- extend and show total. In case of errors in extension, unit prices shall govern. Bids subject to unlimited price increases will not be considered.

51. Use of Brand Names (If Appropriate)

Unless otherwise stated in an Invitation for Bid, the name of a certain brand, make or manufacturer does not restrict bidders to the specific brand, make or manufacturer named; it conveys the general style, type, character, and quality of the article desired, and any article which the County in its sole discretion determines to be the equal of that specified, considering quality, workmanship, economy of operation, and suitability for the purpose intended, shall be accepted. Any catalog, brand name or manufacturer's reference used in bid invitation is descriptive - NOT restrictive - it is to indicate type and quality desired. Bids on brands of like nature and quality will be considered. If bidding on other than reference or specifications, bid must show manufacturer, brand or trade name, catalog number, etc. of article offered. If other than brand(s) specified is offered, illustrations and complete description must be submitted with bid. Samples may be required. If bidder makes no other bid and takes no exception to specifications or reference data, he will be required to furnish brand names, numbers, etc., as specified. Bidders must certify that item(s) bid upon meet and/or exceed specifications.

52. Delivery After Receipt of Order (ARO)

Bid must show the number of days required to place material in using agency's receiving room under normal conditions. Failure to state delivery time obligates bidder to complete delivery in fourteen (14) calendar days. Unrealistically short or long delivery promised may cause bid to be disregarded. Consistent failure to meet delivery promises without valid reason may cause removal from bid list. Delivery shall be made during normal working hours only, 9 to 5, unless prior approval has been obtained from the County.

53. Permits

The successful Offeror must be responsible for obtaining all necessary city, county, and state permits/licenses and must comply with all local codes and ordinances. Copies of such permits/licenses shall be made available to the County upon request. Building contractors working within Georgetown County must also secure a Contractor's License from the Building Department. Work within the Georgetown City Limits may require a City Business License. 54. Environmental Management:

Vendor/Supplier/Contractor will be responsible for complying with all federal, state and local environmental regulations relating to transportation, handling, storage, spillage and any other aspect of providing the services specified herein, as applicable.

The Bidder further agrees that the performance time specified is a reasonable time, having carefully considered the nature and scope of the project as aforesaid.

57. Any attempt by the vendor to influence the opinion of County Staff or County Council by discussion, promotion, advertising, misrepresentation of the submittal or purchasing process or any procedure to promote their offer will constitute a violation of the vendor submittal conditions and will cause the vendor's submittal to be declared null and void.

58. Apparent omission of a detailed description concerning any point, shall be regarded as meaning the best commercial practice is to prevail and that only material and workmanship of the finest quality are to be used.

59. Response Clarification

Georgetown County reserves the right to request additional written or oral information from Bidders in order to obtain clarification of their Responses.

RESIDENCE CERTIFICATION FOR LOCAL PREFERENCE

MANDATORY VENDOR SUBMITTAL FORM

WHEREAS, Georgetown County Council desires to further its support of local businesses when awarding contracts for the provision of supplies and construction services to the County through its established procurement procedures.

THEREFOR pursuant to Georgetown County, SC Ordinance #20-32, §2-50 Local Preference, the Georgetown County Purchasing Officer requests each offeror provide Residence Certification. The Local Preference Option provides some restrictions on the awarding of governmental contracts; provisions of which are stated below:

Sec 2-50. Local Preference

1. A vendor shall be deemed a Local Georgetown County vendor for the purposes of this Section if such vendor is an individual, partnership, association or corporation that is authorized to transact business within the State, maintains an office in Georgetown County, and maintains a representative inventory or commodities within the County on which the bid is submitted, and has paid all taxes duly assessed.
2. This option allows the lowest local Bidder whose bid is within five-percent (5%) of the lowest non-local Bidder to match the bid submitted by the non-local Bidder and thereby be awarded the contract. This preference shall apply only when (a) the total dollar purchase is greater than \$30,000; (b) the vendor has a physical business address located and operating within the limits of Georgetown County and has been doing business in the County for a period of twelve (12) months or more; and (c) the vendor provides proof of payment of all applicable Georgetown County taxes and fees if so requested.
3. Should the lowest responsible and responsive Georgetown County bidder not exercise its right to match the bid as granted herein, the next lowest qualified Georgetown County bidder shall have that right and so on. The right to exercise the right to match the bid shall be exercised within 24 hours of notification of the right to match the non-Georgetown County bidder's bid.
4. In order to qualify for the local preference authorized by this Section, the vendor seeking same shall be required to submit with its bid a statement containing relevant information which demonstrates compliance with the provisions of this Section. This statement shall be on a form provided by the County purchasing department and shall be signed under penalty of perjury. Failure to provide such affidavit at the time the bidder submits its bid shall constitute a waiver of any claim for preference.
5. For all contracts for architecture, professional engineering, or other professional services governed by Section 2-56, Architect-Engineer and Land Surveying Services – Public Announcement and Selection Process, the county shall include the local business status of a firm among the factors considered when selecting which firms are “most highly qualified.” In determining which firm is the “most qualified” for purposes of negotiating a satisfactory contract, preference shall be given to a local business where all other relevant factors are equal.

6. Local preference shall not apply to the following categories of contracts:

- (a) Goods or services provided under a cooperative purchasing agreement or similar “piggyback” contract;
- (b) Contracts for professional services except as provided for in section five (§5) above;
- (c) Purchases or contracts which are funded, in whole or in part, by a governmental or other funding entity, where the terms and conditions of receipt of the funds prohibit the preference;
- (d) Purchases or contracts made pursuant to a noncompetitive award process, unless otherwise provided by this section; or
