- 6. Bidders shall note that prices previously submitted via any informal quotation (verbal or in writing) are hereby superseded and will not be considered for award. If you have previously submitted an informal quotation, you must participate in this bid to be considered for an award.
- 7. Any inquiries or requests regarding clarification of this bid document shall be submitted to the buyer in writing. Bidders may contact ONLY the buyer regarding the terminology stated in the procurement documents. Other APS employees do not have the authority to respond on behalf of the District. Any contact with an APS Department or School may automatically result in a rejection of bid. Any other communication will be considered unofficial and non-binding. Please note the last day for questions in the sequence of events above (#5).
- 8. Bidders should promptly notify the buyer of any ambiguity, inconsistency, error, or missing attachments which they may discover upon examination of the Bid. Any response made by the District will be provided in writing to all Bidders by addendum, no verbal responses shall be authoritative.
- 9. It is the responsibility of every bidder to ensure they have downloaded the latest version of each bid, including any addendum(s) which may have been issued and posted on the APS Procurement Department Website. Bidders should revisit the website (http://www.aps.edu/procurement and click on "See Current Bids and RFPs") prior to the due date before submitting their bid to Albuquerque Public Schools. All addendums must be acknowledged in the submitted bid.
- 10. Each bid must be submitted on the prescribed form. All blank spaces for bid prices must be filled in with ink or typewritten. Corrections shall be initialed in ink by the person signing the bid.
- 11. No Addendum will be issued later than SEVEN (7) days prior to the date for receipt of Bids, except an Addendum withdrawing the Bid or one which extends the date for receipt of Bids.
- 12. APS may in its sole discretion extend the time for the submission of bids upon a finding that it is in the interest of the District to do so. Such extensions shall be by addendum, which may be issued before the submission due date.
- 13. Definition of Terminology: This section contains definitions that are used throughout this procurement document, including appropriate abbreviations:
 - "APS" shall mean Albuquerque Public Schools
 - "Bidder" is any person, corporation, or partnership who chooses to submit a bid.
 - "Contract" shall mean an agreement for the procurement of items of tangible personal property or services.
 - "Contractor" shall mean successful supplier.
 - "Determination" shall mean the written documentation of a decision of a procurement manager including findings of fact required to support a decision. A determination becomes part of the procurement file to which it pertains.

"Desirable" the terms "may", "can", "should", or "prefers" identify a desirable or discretionary item or factor.

"District" shall mean Albuquerque Public Schools

"Mandatory" the terms "must", "shall", "will", "is required", or "are required", identify a mandatory item or factor. Failure to meet a mandatory item or factor will result in the rejection of the bid.

"Purchase Order" shall mean the document, which directs a contractor to deliver items of tangible personal property or services.

"Responsible Bidder" shall mean a bidder who submits a responsive bid and who has furnished, when required, information and data to prove that its financial resources, production or service facilities, personnel, service reputation and experience are adequate to make satisfactory delivery of the services or items of tangible personal property described in the bid.

"Responsive Bid" shall mean a bid, which conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the bid.

- 14. Any exceptions to the scope of work and/or specifications shall be listed separately in the submitted bid and unless otherwise stated, specifications attached are the minimum requirements.
- 15. The District reserves the right in its sole discretion to waive minor informalities in bids submitted provided that such informalities have no effect on price, quality, quantity, fitness, delivery or any matter to be evaluated in making a selection and confer no material advantage on the Bidder whose non conformity is waived.
- 16. This bid may be canceled or may be rejected in whole or in part when it is in the best interest of Albuquerque Public Schools.
- 17. Any sole response that is received may be rejected by the District depending on available competition and timely needs of the District. The District reserves the right to award the contract to the responsible bidder submitting responsive bid with resulting agreements most advantageous and in the best interest of the District.
- 18. All costs incurred by a Bidder in connection with responding to this Bid, the selection process undertaken in connection with this procurement, and any negotiations with the District will be borne by the Bidder.
- 19. This procurement in no manner obligates Albuquerque Public Schools until a valid signed pricing agreement or valid Purchase Order is executed.
- 20. The bid will be awarded to the lowest responsible and responsive Bidder that meets or exceeds the specifications/scope of work outlined in the Bid Documents. Albuquerque Public Schools reserves the right to the sole judge to determine "meets or exceeds".

- 21. The District reserves the right to eliminate any Bidder who submits incomplete or inadequate responses or is not responsive to the requirements of this Bid.
- 22. The contents of the bid will be available to the public at bid opening. The Procurement Department will not disclose or make public any pages of a bid on which the Bidder has stamped or imprinted "proprietary" or "confidential" subject to the following requirements.
- 23. Proprietary or confidential data shall be readily separable from the bid in order to facilitate eventual public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the offer. Confidential data is normally restricted to confidential financial information concerning the Bidder's organization and data that qualifies as trade secret in accordance with the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, 57-3A-1 to 57-3A-7 NMSA 1978. The price of products offered or the cost of services proposed shall not be designated as proprietary of confidential information.
- 24. Where a brand-name or equal specification is used in a solicitation, the use of a brand name is for the purpose of describing the standard of quality, performance and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition. If a vendor proposes an "equal" to scope of work/specifications, APS is the sole interpreter of the scope of work/specifications and sole judge as to whether the "equal" proposed complies with the scope of work/specifications.
- 25. APS will not select from multiple offers on a single document. If bidder offers more than one brand/price per item, the (1) as specified or the (2) most expensive will be considered as the primary bid. Other offers will not be evaluated unless the primary bid is a low bid in its own right. If you wish to offer an alternate bid in additional to your regular bid, make extra copies of the necessary pages (including the signature pages) and submit as "Bid #2". Each bid must stand alone and comply with the terms and conditions of the contract. Bidders offering other than specified goods must submit illustrated literature and complete product data with complete citation and reference to each component part of each item for evaluation purposes.
- 26. The bid price shall be a delivered price. All materials shall be shipped F.O.B Destination Freight prepaid as specified in the Invitation to Bid. The bid price shall be valid for 60 days after opening.
- 27. APS reserves the right to negotiate pricing with successful bidder(s) for equipment/parts/materials related to this contract but which are not specifically included herein.
- 28. In the event APS receives comparable pricing structures and list prices in the same categories, then APS may choose to (1) award to the vendor who submits the more comprehensive price list or (2) make multiple awards in that category.
- 29. Albuquerque Public Schools reserves the right to award by item, group of items, or total bids; to reject any and all bids in whole or in part, if it is in the best interests of Albuquerque Public Schools. Additionally, the District reserves the right to reject any or all bids for any reason that the District determines prudent. Such rejection shall not result in any penalty to the District, but shall be deemed a cost of doing business by the bidder.
- 30. The District reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity of any item called for, add additional related items as the District deems necessary or to eliminate any item entirely.

- 31. It is mutually understood and agreed that the successful bidder(s) shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of the purchase order, contract, or his/her right, title of interest therein, or power to execute such purchase order or contract to any other person, company or corporation without the previous written consent of APS.
- 32. If this bid results in a non-exclusive discount pricing agreement, more than one award may be made. No commitment is made by the District as to quantity and frequency of purchase. Albuquerque Public Schools reserves the right to purchase items referenced under this agreement using any other method and from any other vendor as deemed necessary and in the best interest of the District.
- 33. Any resulting purchases under the bid will be made by Albuquerque Public Schools purchase order or procurement card. Quotes provided to Albuquerque Public Schools will be quoted as provided on the Invitation to Bid and will reference the Price Agreement number so verification of pricing can be made.
- 34. Bids may be awarded preference in compliance with NMSA 13-1-21 for New Mexico In-State Resident Business and Resident Veteran Business. Bidders shall include in their bid a copy of certificate issued by State of New Mexico Taxation & Revenue. If bid is Joint Venture, Bid shall state in submitted bid the percentage of work that will be performed by Resident Business and/or Resident Veteran Business. Please Note: A Bid cannot be awarded both a resident preference and a resident veteran business preference. Additionally, preferences are not applicable for federal fund purchases.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>TERM:</u> APS reserves to right to enter into a one (1) year indefinite quantity contract with awarded Bidder(s). Contract period will begin July of 2017 thru June 30, 2018. At the completion of the one (1) year, this contract will be re-bid. Please note, although this contract will be for the full term, price adjustments will be considered. See item 4 of this section, pricing escalation.
- 2. **REQUEST(S) NOT DEFINED IN SCOPE OF WORK:** Contractor shall be held responsible to NOT fill requests which are clearly beyond the defined scope of this contract. Should such requests occur, contractor has the responsibility of calling such violations to the attention of the APS Procurement Officer.
- 3. **MINIMUM AMOUNT:** Albuquerque Public Schools does not guarantee a minimum amount of purchases in conjunction with award of this invitation to bid.
- 4. **PRICING ESCALATION:** Price escalation will be considered only at yearly observance of award (anniversary date) and only upon receipt of written request from contractor stating reason for escalation and the amount being requested. Justifying documentation must accompany price escalation request.
- 5. <u>TAXES</u>: APS holds a Class 9 Nontaxable Transaction Certificate and is exempt from payment of taxes on tangible personal property. A NTTC will be issued upon request.
- 6. NON-APPROPRIATION: The District's obligation to make payment under the terms of this bid is contingent upon its appropriation of sufficient funds to make those payments. If the District does not appropriate funds for the continuation of this procurement, this procurement will terminate upon written notice of that effect to the Principal. The District determination that sufficient funds have not been appropriated is firm, binding and not subject to review.
- 7. **PROCUREMENT CODE:** The Procurement Code, Sections 13-1-28 through 13-1-199 NMSA 1978, imposes civil and misdemeanor criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for bribes, gratuities, and kickbacks.
- 8. **TERMINATION:** Either party may terminate this contract as follows:
 - A. Termination by the Contractor
 - 1. The contractor may terminate this contract only if Albuquerque Public Schools fails to comply with any provisions of this contract and after receiving notice of the noncompliance the District fails to cure the noncompliance within ten (10) days, or
 - 2. By written mutual agreement between the Contractor and the District.
 - B. Termination by the District
 - 1. For Cause
 - a. The occurrence of either one of the following events will justify termination for cause:
 - i. Contractor's persistent failure to perform the work in accordance with the contract documents (including but not limited to, failure to supply sufficient skilled workers or suitable materials or equipment).
 - ii. Contractor's violation in any substantial way of any provisions of this contract.
 - b. If either one of the events identified above occur, the District may, after giving Contractor (and the surety, if any) ten (10) days written notice, terminate the service of Contractor, exclude Contractor from site, and take possession of the work. Contractor shall be paid for

project costs incurred up to the date of termination but shall not be paid for loss of profits resulting from such termination.

c. Where Contractor's services have been so terminated by the District, the termination will not affect any rights or remedies of District against contractor then existing or which may thereafter accrue. Any retention or payment of moneys due the Contractor by the District will not release the Contractor from liability.

2. For Convenience

- a. Upon ten (10) days written notice to contractor, APS may without cause and without prejudice to any other right or remedy of APS elect to terminate the contract.
- b. In such case, Contractor shall be paid (without duplication of any items):
 - i. for completed and acceptable work executed in accordance with the contract documents prior to the effective date of termination,
 - ii. for expenses sustained prior to the effective date of termination in performing services and furnishing labor, materials or equipment as required by the contract document in connection with uncompleted work.
- c. Contractor shall not be paid on account of loss of anticipated profits or revenue or other economic loss arising out of or resulting from such termination.
- 9. **INDEMNIFICATION:** The Bidder shall be responsible for damage to persons or property that occurs as a result of his fault or negligence, or that of any of his employees, agents or subcontractors. He shall save and hold harmless Albuquerque Public Schools against any and all loss, cost, damage, claims, expense or liability in connection with the performance of the contract. Any equipment or facilities damaged by the Bidders' operation shall be repaired and/or restored to their original condition at the Bidder's expense.
- 10. <u>INSURANCE (If Applicable)</u>: The successful Bidder shall (if applicable) purchase and maintain statutory limits of Worker's Compensation, and Public Liability and Automobile Liability insurance approved by NMSU at the time of contract award. Albuquerque Public Schools shall be included as a loss payee and/or additional insured. Public Liability and Automobile Liability insurance shall include at least the following coverage:

Bodily injury, each person, excluding medical and medically related expenses	\$400,000
Medical and medically-related expenses	\$300,000
Vehicle Bodily injury, each occurrence, excluding medical and medically related expenses	\$750,000
Property Damage, each occurrence	\$200,000

Contractor shall furnish Owner with certificates of insurance with the contract documents and prior to the commencement of work.

- 11. AUDIT: The District reserves the right to audit the contractor's records associated with this contract at any time during the contract period and for a period of up to three years following the expiration or termination of the agreement. Such audit may be conducted by District personnel or a third party under contract with the District. The District shall give the contractor reasonable notice prior to the conduct of any audit and upon receiving the notice from the District the contractor agrees to fully cooperate with the auditors. If contractor subcontracts any portion of its obligation to another party, contractor shall guarantee District's access to books and records of such party.
- 12. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:</u> The Contractor is an independent contractor performing services for the District. The Contractor shall not accrue leave, retirement, insurance, or any other benefits afforded to employees of the District as a result of this procurement.
- 13. **PROCUREMENT UNDER EXISTING CONTRACTS:** In accordance with NMSA 13-1-129, Bidders are hereby notified that other governmental entities within the State of New Mexico, or as otherwise allowed by their respective governing directives, may contract for services with the awarded Bidder. Contractual engagements accomplished under this provision shall be solely between the awarded proposer and the contracting entity with no obligation by Albuquerque Public Schools.
- 14. **<u>DEBARMENT OR SUSPENSION:</u>** A business (contractor, subcontractor or supplier) that has either been debarred or suspended pursuant to the requirements of 13-1-177 through 13-1-180, and 13-4-11 through 13-4-17 NMSA 1978 as amended, shall not be permitted to do business with the District and shall not be considered for award of the contract during the period for which it is debarred or suspended with the District.
- 15. **CONFLICT OF INTEREST:** By submitting a bid, the proposer certifies that no relationship exists between the proposer and the District that interferes with fair competition or is a conflict of interest; and no relationship exists between such propose and another person or firm that constitutes a conflict of interest that is adverse to the District.
- 16. <u>NON-DISCLOSURE:</u> The proposer shall not disclose any information relating to students, and employees of APS other than such information that may be authorized by the individual student or employee. Vendor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless APS from any damages, claims, liabilities, and costs including reasonable attorney fees in the event any unauthorized release of such information occurs.

- 17. <u>DELIVERY:</u> The goods shall be delivered free of the rightful claim of any third person, any security interest or other lien. Unless otherwise agreed all goods called for in this Bid shall be tendered in a single delivery and payment is due only upon such delivery (NET 30).
- 18. **FOB:** Unless stated otherwise, the price for goods is FOB: destination (District's designated address).
- 19. <u>DELAYS IN DELIVERY:</u> Time is of the essence and this purchase may be subject to termination for failure to deliver on time, unless delay was caused by APS. If delay in delivery is foreseen, Seller must notify the APS Requesting Department of late delivery, cause of late delivery and remedy for late delivery.
- 20. **INSPECTION:** Final inspection will be made at the destination upon completion of delivery of goods/services. Final inspection shall include any testing or inspection procedures required by the specifications.
- 21. ACCEPTANCE: Acceptance of delivery of goods/services shall not be considered acceptance of the goods/services furnished. Acceptance occurs when the Requesting Department, after a reasonable opportunity to inspect the goods/services, signifies to the seller that are goods/services are conforming and fails to make an effective rejection.
- 22. <u>BUYERS REVOCATION OF ACCEPTANCE</u>: Requesting Department can revoke acceptance of goods when it is discovered, in a reasonable time, that the Sellers non-conforming goods substantially impair the value of the goods.
- 23. <u>SELLERS RIGHT TO CURE A NON-CONFORMING DELIVERY OF GOODS:</u> The Seller, upon notice of revocation of acceptance, shall correct without charge and deliver conforming goods in a reasonable time
- 24. **PROMOTIONAL GIFTS AND ACTIVITIES**: APS policy prohibits the distribution of jackets, shirts, caps, or any other clothing items with company or product logo or any other form of advertising to its employees. Furthermore, APS employees are prohibited from entering drawings, contests, or other promotional/advertising activities with vendors or potential vendors in connection with a procurement action.
- 25. **PROTEST:** Any Offeror who is aggrieved in connection with a solicitation or award of an Agreement may protest to the Purchasing Office in accordance with the requirements of the Contracting Procurement Regulations and the State Procurement Code. The protest should be made in writing within 24 hours after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto, but in no case later than 15 calendar days after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto (13-1-172 NMSA 1978). The protest must be in writing and delivered to the Executive Director Procurement Department, Albuquerque, New Mexico

In the event of a timely protest under this section, the Purchasing Agent and the Contracting Agency shall not proceed further with the procurement unless the Purchasing Agent makes a determination that the award of Agreement is necessary to protect substantial interests of the Contracting Agency (13-1-173 NMSA 1978).

The Purchasing Agent or his designee shall have the authority to take any action reasonably necessary to resolve a protest of an aggrieved Offeror concerning a procurement. This authority shall be exercised in accordance with adopted regulations, but shall not include the authority to award money damages or attorneys' fees (13-1-174 NMSA 1978).

The Purchasing Agent or his designee shall promptly issue a determination relating to the protest. The determination shall:

- I. State the reasons for the action taken; and
- II. Inform the protestant of the right to judicial review of the determination pursuant to 13-1-183 NMSA 1978.

A copy of the determination issued under 13-1-175 NMSA 1978 shall immediately be mailed to the protestant and other Offerors involved in the procurement (13-1-176 NMSA 1978)

26. <u>BIDDER ACKNOWLEDGEMENT:</u> By responding to this Bid, Bidder acknowledges and agrees to the terms and conditions set forth in this Bid and certifies that the Bidder has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into action in restraint of full competition in connection with the bid submitted to the District.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. Intent: APS invites you to bid on an indefinite quantity contract for the purchase of Frozen Produce to be supplied on demand. Specifications and requirements to follow.
- 2. Purchase Orders and Invoicing Procedures: Price Agreement (PA) will be issued to the successful bidder(s) on all awarded bid items for the duration of the contract. Actual quantities of award items requested by APS and delivered by bidder will be charged to a Purchase Order number referencing the PA. Delivery shall be ticketed separately, showing the APS Purchase Order, delivery location, and the full signature with printed name underneath of employee receiving the item(s). Initials only are not acceptable and will not be processed for payment. APS will not pay for unauthorized purchases.

Invoices must clearly state the "Price Agreement Number" assigned to your company for this fiscal year bidding, the quantity, description, individual prices and total. All information on invoice(s) must be filled out in black ink or typed and readable. Separate invoices must be issued for Food and Nonfood items. For payment purposes, APS will submit Food and Non Food orders separately.

Itemized invoices, clearly referencing appropriate pricing agreement number and bid number shall be submitted to Food and Nutrition Services, 800 Louisiana Blvd NE, Albuquerque, NM, 87108. Copies of delivery tickets, signed by the receiving employees, and other information needed to substantiate charges shall be attached to the invoice for auditor tracking purposes.

Contractor's invoicing must be easily verifiable and traceable to the contract. Product numbers, brands, models, etc. must be clearly defined. Contractor must also be prepared to furnish copies of price lists to the users as necessary. Invoices must including pricing structure as defined in the contract (list price and discount).

APS will make a good faith effort to work with your company to remedy any problems with invoices. If invoices are not generated as per contract pricing and invoiced properly per Food and Non Foods orders, APS reserves the right to request corrected invoices.

- 3. Scope of Work: APS is the largest district in New Mexico, Albuquerque Public Schools provides educational services to nearly 90,000 students, and 140 schools, serving nearly a third of the state's students in Albuquerque, Rio Rancho, Corrales, Los Ranchos de Albuquerque, Tijeras, San Antonito,

and Edgewood. The APS cafeteria services is the largest food operation in the state providing low-cost nutritional meals to students and staff at each school site and appropriate administrative sites throughout the district.

APS Food & Nutrition Services is responsible for the Nutritional School Breakfast Program, the National School Lunch program, the After School Snack Program and the Summer Food Service Program.

The specifications listed abide by the New Mexico Nutrition Rules for Competitive Foods. No substitutions of product are allowed unless approved by APS Procurement Department and Food & Nutrition Services.

APS does, however, reserve the right to negotiate with successful bidder(s) for pricing on items related to this contract but not specifically named herein. In the event a purchase is made as a result of such negotiations, the contract shall be amended to reflect the new item(s) and pricing structure. APS reserves the right to add new products within each category as they are introduced to the market.

Although, this contract is being bid on behalf of APS, vendor agrees to extend pricing to all New Mexico Publicly funded entities, in the event of requirements that can be adapted to the specified items awarded.

4. Commodities: APS receives commodities throughout the year; some have definite schedules while others do not. Based on receiving commodity shipments, APS reserves the rights to reject product(s), bid or cancel a shipment. APS also reserves the right to bid for products listed in this document, which may be needed. If contractor runs out of product, Food & Nutrition Services will notify successful contractor of this situation as soon as possible. If APS is aware of the commodity items being shipped and when, APS will not list those items on the bid. Otherwise, listed on the bid are certain items that may be ordered if the District runs out of commodity.

5. VENDOR QUALIFICATIONS:

Bid is divided into two (2) Lots – Lot 1 is for Distributors "ONLY", Lot II, is for Manufacturers Direct Delivery "ONLY".

- Lot 1 Distributors/ONLY A wholesale middleman, especially in lines where selection or exclusive distribution is common at the wholesale level and the manufacturer expects strong promotional support.
- Lot II Manufacturers Direct Delivery/ONLY A channel whereby goods and services are sold directly from producer to final user without involvement of other independent middlemen.

Bidders must have adequate organizations, facilities, equipment and personnel to ensure prompt and efficient service. Albuquerque Public Schools (APS), reserves the right before recommending any award, to inspect the facilities and organization or to take any other action necessary to determine ability to perform in accordance with specifications terms and conditions.

The Procurement Department will determine whether the evidence of ability to perform is satisfactory and will make awards only when such evidence is deemed satisfactory and reserves the right to reject

bids where evidence submitted or investigation and evaluation indicates inability of the bidder to perform. The decision as to whether a bidder meets the qualifications stated below is at the discretion of the Department of Food and Nutrition Services and the Procurement Division.

- Bidder must have or have access to and will utilize refrigerated warehouse facilities capable of holding temperatures at 35 degrees, 50 degrees and 70 degrees.
- Bidder must have or have access to and will utilize a fleet of mechanically refrigerated trucks compartments capable of holding air temperatures at 45 degrees minimum while on delivery routes.
- Bidder must have a HACCP plan in place. The district may require documentation verifying that a written HAACP plan is followed.

Awarded Price Agreement may be cancelled for failure to provide verifying documentation at the request of APS.

Food is not ordered or prepared on holidays, Christmas vacations etc. Bidders will be advised of APS closings by Cafeteria Services management and /or Procurement Division. Year round schools that are open will serve food as usual; although, the numbers of lunches may be less than during the traditional August-May time period.

APS reserves the right to add products through amendment within each category with approved contractor(s) as they are introduced into the market with prior approval from APS Purchasing department and APS Food and Nutrition Service.

- 6. Nutritional Information: Contractor's most current Nutritional information for each food item may be requested by Food and Nutrition Services Nutritionist after bid is awarded. DO NOT submit the Nutritional Information with this bid.
 - All specifications listed in this bid document are nutritionally approved products. APS for audit purposes must request from each company a "Nutrition List" of each of their product(s) awarded.
- 7. Negotiation of Related Items: During the life of the contract, APS reserves the right to negotiate with successful bidder(s) for pricing on items related to this contract but not specifically named herein.
 - APS does however; reserve the right to negotiate with successful bidder(s) for pricing on items related to this contract but not specifically named herein. In the event a purchase is made as a result of such negotiations, the contract shall be amended to reflect the new item(s) and pricing structure. APS reserves the right to add new products within each category as they are introduced to the market.
- 8. Pricing: All pricing will be F.O.B. destination including cost, insurance, and freight. F.O.B destination shall be interpreted as final site as specified by APS.
- 9. Escalation Clause: APS will require a 30 day written notice for any request for price escalations/decreases. Price escalation will be considered upon receipt of written request from contractor stating reason for the escalation request and the amount being requested for each contracted item. Any such approved increase will be confirmed by amendment. If prices should decrease in the market, APS should benefit from any market fluctuation which would derive a savings. Contractor may

refuse any renewal with no penalty and APS will rebid and/or award to the next potential bidder. No substitutions of product are allowed unless approved by APS Purchasing Department and Food & Nutrition Services. The contractor must deliver the same requests specified in the pricing sheets from this bid.

Contractor may decline a renewal with no penalty by submitting a "Letter of Withdrawal" to the Procurement Office. A letter of withdrawal will be required by bidders unable to honor pricing after bid has closed or after contract award, due to misquote by Broker, unavailability of product, unacceptable product upon delivery, etc. APS will go to the next low bidder to obtain goods in question and/or re-bid. - 10. Specification Sheets: Specification Sheets have been modified. Please review the specification sheets carefully, as to particular references are made to products. Failure to comply with required meat specifications may result in the assessment of liquidated damages. Bids are to be submitted according to pricing structure.
- 11. Bid Sheets/Electronic Copy: Please review Bid Specification Sheets carefully and fill in all required information. Every cell in each column of the items that you are bidding must be filled in by the Corporate Office of the Processor. Failure to do so may result in the rejection of your bid for that item(s). If an item has no "Product Code", indicate so in the column. Bid Specification Sheets must be typed, in order for accurate entry on bid analysis report. A CD or Thumb Drive of the excel file is required along with a hard copy of the Specification Sheets. All frozen fruits and vegetables covered by specifications for frozen foods as issued by APS shall be unconditionally guaranteed as to represented grade.

When quality is questioned, the successful vendor will furnish to APS on request, USDA Certificates of Grade. Any expense incurred in obtaining grade certification shall be the sole responsibility of the vendor and solely borne by the vendor. If any product is found to be below the grade specified, it shall be immediately replaced by the vendor.

GROCERY: Vendors shall state on the bid the packer and location of each item.

15. Pallet Requirements: Any shipments received as a result of purchase orders generated as a result of awards on this solicitation shall be palletized if the quantity of cartons in the shipment is more than twenty (20) and/or if the total shipment weight exceeds 200 pounds.

17. Food Protection: Transportation of food must meet the Food Sanitation Ordinance for General Food protection 9-6-1-3. Albuquerque code of Ordinances, which states as follows: All foods while prepared, served, displayed, stored sold at food processing and/or food-service establishments or during transportation shall be wholesome and protected from contamination. The product temperature of all potentially hazardous food be maintained at 45 degrees F. (7 degrees C.) or below or 140 degrees F. (60 degrees C) or above, except during necessary period of preparation.

It is crucial that all products be delivered on time and at the appropriate temperatures to meet health code requirement. Foods received at the wrong temperature will not be accepted.

- 18. Warranty/Guarantee: All bidders must guarantee full satisfaction of their products' use or permit unsatisfactory product to be returned collect for full money refund. Bidders will replace damaged items at no cost to APS.
- 19. The Agriculture Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year Buy American Provision of the Law: Section 104(d) of the William F. Goodling Child Nutrition Reauthorization of 1998 requires schools and institutions participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) in the contiguous United States to purchase, to the maximum extent practicable., domestic commodities or products for use in meals served under the NSLP and SBP. The legislation defines "domestic commodities or products for use in meals served under the NSLP and SBP. The legislation defines "domestic commodity or product" as one that is produced and/or processed in the United States substantially using domestic agricultural commodities. "Substantially" means that over 51% of the final processed products consist of agricultural commodities that were grown in the United States.

It is essential that all purchases of agricultural commodities and food products comply with this statutory provision.

- 20. City of Albuquerque Environmental Health Inspection Certificate: APS prefers to have a copy of your latest City of Albuquerque Environmental Health Inspection Certification submitted with your bid. If certificates are not submitted at time of bid opening. APS reserves the right to require them prior to award. All awarded bidders must submit certificates prior to award.
- 21. Use of Federal Funds: Food Services revenues are derived primarily from federal sources. Federal Law prohibits application of any residential preference when the expenditure of federal funds designated for specific purchases(s) is involved.
- 22. Request(s) NOT Defined in Scope of Work: Contractor shall be held responsible to NOT fill requests which are clearly beyond the defined scope of the proposed contract. Should such requests occur, contractor has the responsibility of calling such violations to the attention of the APS Procurement Officer.
- 23. Basis of Award: Award(s) will be based upon deepest discount/best bid pricing for comparable list/product or group of products. Delivery, comprehensiveness, and currency of price list(s), and the best interest of the District respective to walk-in trade may be factors in bid

If a particular item is determined to be "not standard in the industry" by at least half of the bidders, then that item will be deleted from the bid for evaluation purposes.

IMPLEMENTING THE BUY AMERICAN PROVISION

The Buy American provision supports the mission of the Child Nutrition Programs, which is to serve children nutritious meals and support American agriculture. SFAs are reminded that when funds are used from the nonprofit food service account, procurement transactions for food products on the commercial market must comply with the Buy American provision, whether food products are purchased by SFAs or entities that are purchasing on their behalf.

Some examples of entities purchasing on the behalf of SFAs include: food service management companies, group purchasing organizations, or cooperatives of schools purchasing shared goods and services, or through an inter-entity agreement, etc. If SFAs have difficulty ensuring that food products meet this regulation, FNS encourages a specification to be included in solicitations and contracts that only 100% domestically grown and processed products are approved for purchase.

THE BUY AMERICAN PROVISION SUPPORTS LOCAL AND SMALL BUSINESSES

Using food products from local sources supports small local farmers and provides healthy choices for children in the school meal programs. Purchasing from these entities also supports the local economy. Compliance with the Buy American provision may also encourage SFAs to work with local, or small, minority, and womenowned businesses. Federal regulations require SFAs to take all necessary affirmative steps, when possible, to assure that small, minority, and women-owned business enterprises are used (2 CFR Part 200.321). These entities may also be good sources for products of the United States, or its territories. FNS encourages purchasing food products from local and regional sources when expanding farm to school efforts as well.

LIMITED EXCEPTIONS

There are limited exceptions to the Buy American provision which allow for the purchase of products not meeting the "domestic" standard as described above ("non-domestic") in circumstances when use of the domestic products is truly not practicable. However, before utilizing an exception, alternatives to purchasing non-domestic food product should be considered. For example, SFAs should ask:

- Are there other domestic sources for this product?
- Is there a domestic product that could be easily substituted, if the non —domestic product is less expensive (e.g. substitute domestic pears for non-domestic apples)?
- Am I soliciting bids for this product at the best time of year? If I contracted earlier or later in the season, would prices and /or availability change?

Again, although exceptions to the Buy American provision exist, they are to be used as a last resort. These exceptions, as originally outlined in the 2012 guidance, are:

- The product is not produced or manufactured in the U.S. in sufficient and reasonable available quantities of a satisfactory quality; or
- Competitive bids reveal the costs of a U.S. product are significantly higher than the non-domestic product.

If a SFA is using one of the above exceptions, there is no requirement to request a waiver in order to purchase a non-domestic product. SFAs must, however, keep documentation justifying the exception(s).

Buy American

Contractor must comply with the Buy American Act (7 C.F.R. 210.21), which states that a school food authority purchase, to the maximum extent practicable, domestic commodities or products. Pursuant to the Buy American Act, the term "domestic commodity of product" means; (i) an agricultural commodity that is produced in the United States; and (ii) a food product that is processed in the United States substantially using agricultural commodities that are produced in the United States.

Buy American Requirements

The following three documents (hyperlinks) are consistent in defining the Buy American requirements.

- 1. Richard B Russell National School Lunch Act (n)1 (A) and (B)
- 2. 7 CFR 210.21 Procurement. (3)d and
- 3. SP 20-2006: Procurement questions related to the Buy American Provision

The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act provides in Section 12(n) the Buy American provision which requires that school food authorities (SFAs) operating school meals programs purchase <u>domestically produced (grown) and processed foods</u>, to the maximum extent practicable. The Buy American provision was codified in the National School Lunch Program regulations at 7 CFR 210.21(d). A "domestic commodity or product" is defined in the Federal regulations as:

- (i) an agricultural commodity that is produced in the United States (U.S.); and
- (ii) a food product that is processed in the U.S., substantially using agricultural commodities that are produced in the U.S., 7 CFR 210.21(d).

The language about 'substantially' using U.S., agricultural commodities is referring to products that are processed in the U.S., comprised of at least 51% domestic ingredients. According to the regulations, a food product must meet a two part test to be considered a domestic commodity or product: (1) the food product must be processed in the U.S.; and (2) the food product must be processed substantially using agricultural commodities that are produced in the U.S. There is no further need to determine whether 51% of a foreign product consists substantially of agricultural commodities that are produced in the U.S., because the product does not meet the first part of the test as it is not processed in the U.S.

Waivers to the Buy American provision are rare. While the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) sets the Buy American requirements by which States and SFAs must abide, keep in mind that USDA is not a part to the contract between the SFA and its food supplier. It is the responsibility of the SFA to document that there is basis for allowing an exception (waiver); it is unacceptable for exceptions to be granted without substantial evidence that either of the two following situations have occurred:

- 1) The product is not produced or manufactured in the U.S., in sufficient and reasonable available quantities of a satisfactory quality; and
- 2) Competitive bids reveal the costs of a U.S., product is significantly higher than the foreign product.

Availability, cost, and quality are factors an SFA must weigh when considering the purchase of non-domestic products. The SFA needs to review <u>current</u> market information to determine if purchasing a specific non-domestic product meets one or more of the exceptions to the Buy American provision.

SFAs are encouraged to include in their bidding process a requirement for certification similar to: "We require that suppliers certify the percentage of U.S., content in products supplied to us. If you are unable or unwilling to make such certification, we will not purchase from you." Appearing under this statement could be the sentence, "We certify that our U.S., processed ____ have at least ____ % U.S., content," with space for the supplier to fill in the name of the product and its percentage of domestic content. The SFA's active role in clarifying the Buy American provision to all contractors in the bidding process helps ensure that contractors have a clear understanding of the Federal requirements and the ingredients contained in a product during the manufacturing process do not contain significant foreign content. Additionally, the best tool an SFA has to ensure that the Buy American provision is being followed is its contract with the distributor. If an SFA writes a contract with specific provisions and administers its contract properly, many conflicts or issues with the distributor can be avoided.

It is important for both SFAs and distributors to recognize that the determination as to whether a product meets the requirements of the Buy American Contractual provision rests with the SFA; it is not enough to assume that a product with a well-recognized American brand name or a product supplied by a domestic foodservice distributor complies with the Buy American provision. Distributors/suppliers should, in good faith, facilitate this process and provide the SFA with sufficient information regarding the country of origin for each end product in order for the SFA to make a determination. These efforts will enable distributors and suppliers to provide SFAs with products tat meet the specifications of their contract. A brief description of the Buy American Requirement is printed behind the front cover of the Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs.

Furthermore, the state agency or local public body may cancel a solicitation or proposed award for a proposed contract pursuant to Section 13-1-181 NMSA 1978 or a contract that is executed may be ratified or terminated pursuant to Section 13-1-182 NMSA 1978 of the Procurement Code if: 1) a prospective contractor, a family member of the prospective contractor, or a representative of the prospective contractor gives a campaign contribution or other thing of value to an applicable public official or the applicable public official's employees during the pendency of the procurement process or 2) a prospective contractor fails to submit a fully completed disclosure statement pursuant to the law.

The state agency or local public body that procures the services or items of tangible personal property shall indicate on the form the name or names of every applicable public official, if any, for which disclosure is required by a prospective contractor.

THIS FORM MUST BE INCLUDED IN THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS AND MUST BE FILED BY ANY PROSPECTIVE CONTRACTOR WHETHER OR NOT THEY, THEIR FAMILY MEMBER, OR THEIR REPRESENTATIVE HAS MADE ANY CONTRIBUTIONS SUBJECT TO DISCLOSURE.

The following definitions apply:

"Applicable public official" means a person elected to an office or a person appointed to complete a term of an elected office, who has the authority to award or influence the award of the contract for which the prospective contractor is submitting a competitive sealed proposal or who has the authority to negotiate a sole source or small purchase contract that may be awarded without submission of a sealed competitive proposal.

"Campaign Contribution" means a gift, subscription, loan, advance or deposit of money or other thing of value, including the estimated value of an in-kind contribution, that is made to or received by an applicable public official or any person authorized to raise, collect or expend contributions on that official's behalf for the purpose of electing the official to statewide or local office. "Campaign Contribution" includes the payment of a debt incurred in an election campaign, but does not include the value of services provided without compensation or unreimbursed travel or other personal expenses of individuals who volunteer a portion or all of their time on behalf of a candidate or political committee, nor does it include the administrative or solicitation expenses of a political committee that are paid by an organization that sponsors the committee.

"Family member" means spouse, father, mother, child, father-in-law, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law or son-in-law of
(a) a prospective contractor, if the prospective contractor is a natural person; or (b) an owner of a prospective contractor.
"Pendency of the procurement process" means the time period commencing with the public notice of the request for proposals and ending with the award of the contract or the cancellation of the request for proposals.
"Prospective contractor" means a person or business that is subject to the competitive sealed proposal process set forth in the Procurement Code or is not required to submit a competitive sealed proposal because that person or business qualifies for a sole source or a small purchase contract.

"Representative of a prospective contractor" means an officer or director of a corporation, a member or manager of a limited liability corporation, a partner of a partnership or a trustee of a trust of the prospective contractor.
