Answers to Questions
September 15, 2022

1. Is it a requirement that each location/park have its own separate internet connection (1Gig)?
As long as the originating connection is rated at gigabit it is not required that they all have a dedicated internet connection per site if coverage can be shared from one of the other locations, such as East Bay and Morgan Parks.

2. East Bay Park - It was said the Bobby Alford Center (the metal building) will have some renovations in the future.
 - a. Will the light pole and street lamp on the NW corner of the building remain there after the renovations?
The renovations to the Bobby Alford Center may impact the light pole located near the northwestern corner of the building. It is not advised to include this pole in any plans to attached equipment or receive power. There are two poles located on the southeast side of the building that will not be impacted by the renovations that can be considered.

South of the building there is a black chain link fence with a power outlet nearby.
 - b. Does the outlet work and will it remain there after the renovations?
The renovations to the Bobby Alford Center may impact the power outlet near the black chain link fence on the south side of the building. It is not advised to include this outlet in any plans to power the equipment.

3. Morgan Park - There is no power but there are existing cameras on the light pole.
 - a. For the power solution we provide, do we need to account for those cameras and equipment in the power budget?

4. For the smaller parks on Front St. - If a post or H-frame is needed but not available.
 - a. If the location is practical, will the wall of a building be an option to mount equipment?
The City does not own any of the buildings surrounding the parks, so the vendor would need to provide a structure to mount to.
