INVITATION TO BID NO. 24-DES-ITBPW-432

ADDENDUM NO. 2

Arlington County Invitation to Bid No. 24-DES-ITBPW-432 for electrical panelboard replacements is amended as follows:

- I. ATTACHMENT C – PRICING SHEET, IS HEREBY REPLACED WITH THE ATTACHED ATTACHMENT C – PRICING SHEET REVISED**

- II. ELECTRONIC SEALED BIDS WILL BE RECEIVED BY ARLINGTON COUNTY VIA VENDOR REGISTRY UNTIL 2:00 P.M. ON WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 21ST, 2024.**

Arlington County Invitation to Bid No. 24-DES-ITBPW-432 for electrical panelboard replacements received the following questions:

1. Can the sign-in sheet from the site visit be shared?
 - a. The sign-sheet is provided.
2. Will there be a laydown area located indoor for the storage of materials on site?
 - a. No, it will be an outdoor area in the outside parking spaces to store materials on site and Contractors are responsible to secure and provide shelter for the storage area.
3. The given pricing sheet is not exclusive to all materials required to complete this project in the manner that we envision the project being completed. How are we to incorporate items that are not shown on the pricing sheet?
 - a. Bidders are required to utilize the revised/updated pricing sheet provided as an addendum.
4. Our take-off quantities of material do not match the given quantities for some of the given items. For example, the listed CLF/LF of conduit/wire do not match the quantities that we have estimated. Are we to price only the given footage?
 - a. Bidders are required to utilize the revised/updated pricing sheet provided as an addendum. Bidders shall provide their own quantities in the revised pricing sheet.
5. Please clarify the meaning of the unit "CLF".
 - a. Hundred Linear Feet. Bidders are required to utilize the revised/updated pricing sheet provided as an addendum.
6. Under C. New Work, Item 24, is 250 CLF correct for the ¾" branch circuit extension or should it be 250 LF?
 - a. Bidders are required to utilize the revised/updated pricing sheet provided as an addendum.

7. What is the intent of the units in the Attachment A Pricing Sheet? Please clarify if the intent is for these units to be utilized for additional work and/or deletion of work. If these units are for addition/deletion of work, we request that additional columns be added to the pricing sheet to reflect an add price of unit versus a deduct of a unit.
 - a. There shouldn't be a difference between add or deduct pricing units. Bidders are required to utilize the revised/updated pricing sheet provided as an addendum.
8. Would it be possible to only provide three (3) prices at the time of bid for Mobilization/Demobilization, Demolition Work, and New Work? If needed, the Attachment A pricing sheet could be provided after the time of bid by the apparent low bidder.
 - a. As stated in the pricing sheet, Bidders shall include a bid price for all items including labor costs in the cells highlighted in blue. Failure to provide a price for all items, or any modifications or additions to the bid form may result in bid rejection.
9. As this is written, does it mean the County can add and/or subtract items from the contract as listed in the Attachment A Pricing Sheet?
 - a. Yes. Bidders are required to utilize the revised/updated pricing sheet provided as an addendum.
10. Are the quantities and pricing given on the Attachment A Pricing Sheet used for additional and/or deletion of work on the contract?
 - a. Yes. Bidders are required to utilize the revised/updated pricing sheet provided as an addendum
11. Panel PPD, LPD and the Transformer in the Pilot Room are listed to be Class 1, Div. 2 to fit the future parameters of the space to become a solid testing lab. Please confirm that our only responsibility is the panels and transformer themselves. Do we need to install seal off fittings on the new and/or existing conduits at the panels where they are required by code to meet the Class 1, Div 1 requirements? Does any of the existing conduit in the Pilot Room/ Future Lab need to be replaced to meet the future hazardous requirements?
 - a. Contractor is responsible for meeting hazardous location requirements for all electrical system including panels, transformers, and conduits with explosion proof seals. Yes, explosion proof seals are required. Part of the existing incoming conduit may need to be replaced to meet the hazardous requirements and all new conduits in the room shall meet hazardous requirements.
12. Is there a badging process for Contractor staff?
 - a. WPCB/County will provide limited number of temporary access badges for the contractor, where all badges will need to be returned upon the completion of the project. The badges will be assigned to Contractor's identified personnel, and WPCB will require for badges not to be shared for none-assigned personnel.
13. Is there a lockup process for the panel boxes?
 - a. Contractor is responsible for safe operating conditions.

The balance of the solicitation remains unchanged.
