# Oak Hills Mural Project

#### **OVERVIEW:**

Public Art Chattanooga is seeking qualifications from artists or artist teams for the commission and installation of a mural at Milliken Park in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Up to three finalists will be selected to develop concept proposals for this project. Each finalist will be paid a \$500 stipend for concept designs. The project budget for the awarded commission is \$15,000. The Oak Hills Mural will provide a transformative and dynamic visual anchor to this neighborhood park. This project is made possible with generous grants from the Benwood Foundation, the Footprint Foundation and the City of Chattanooga.

## **PROJECT DETAILS:**

Through PAC's Art in the Neighborhoods program, the Oak Hills neighborhood association was awarded funding to develop meaningful public art project(s) in their community. PAC has worked actively with the Oak Hills neighborhood association, gathering community input and laying the groundwork for public art projects within Oak Hills. As the second of two projects, PAC will commission an artist/artist team to design and install a mural on two newly constructed walls at the entrance of Milliken Park--a recently revitalized park that includes large shade trees, a playground, walking trail, and ballfields.

Two walls measuring 5' H x 30' L will extend in both directions from an existing brick entry at the corner of W 45th Street and Central Avenue. See page 10 for wall construction materials. Construction of these walls will begin late February to March. Artist designs should address both sides of the wall, facing the playground as well as the street. Successful applicants must also demonstrate the technical knowledge related to best practices for wall preparation techniques.

#### (FUTURE) **ARTWORK VISION**:

The neighborhood would like to see a mural that celebrates their community. The mural should also attract and draw Oak Hills residents to the park creating a vibrant and safe space for play and recreation in an industrial part of the neighborhood.

#### (FUTURE) ARTWORK GOALS:

- Serve as a strong visual anchor.
- Speak to rebirth, revitalization, and renewal.
- Artwork should celebrate the community and spirit of the neighborhood.

- Add life and color to the neighborhood.
- Fit well within the context of the site (in terms of scale and design or theme).
- Be durable to outdoor weather conditions, graffiti resistant, and should not cause any damage to the structure or surface on which it is installed.
- Add to the diversity of the City of Chattanooga's growing public art collection.

#### PROJECT BACKGROUND

#### ABOUT OAK HILLS NEIGHBORHOOD:

Oak Hills is a small neighborhood located within Alton Park, South Chattanooga and nestled between St. Elmo, Downtown Chattanooga, and Rossville, GA. Its story echoes that of many former industrial areas. At the end of the nineteenth century, two large farms occupied the broad valley south of the Chattanooga city limits between Chattanooga Creek and Hawkins Ridge. Due to the level land and the proximity to Chattanooga Creek, the area attracted the attention of manufacturing as Chattanooga's industrial output surged at the turn of the 20th Century. Its access to rail and road transportation, utilities and a large workforce in the surrounding community made Oak Hills & Alton Park uniquely positioned to sustain industrial development. At one time, Alton Park was served with three railroads, including an extension from the Central of Georgia and the TAG Railroad that went down through Chattanooga Valley to Gadsden, Ala.

Since Chattanooga's manufacturing sector began to decline in the 1970s, the area has continued to see economic decline and faced the challenges that come along with it. Today, the neighborhood's demographics are 95% African-American, 67% are family households, and 43% of those families have children under 18. The neighborhood has taken initiative to enliven their own community by participating in the City's Neighborhood University program. The City of Chattanooga has recently invested in the area through the redevelopment of Bell Park and a \$2.2 million greenway along an old rail line which will connect Alton Park & Oak Hills with the Tennessee Riverwalk.

#### ABOUT ART IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS:

Art in the Neighborhoods (AIN) is a pilot program within the City of Chattanooga's department of Economic and Community Development (ECD). Because public art is a proven a tool for positive economic and community impact, the purpose of AIN is to help neighborhoods generate unique

public art projects in their community that have the ability to beautify and enliven streets, parks and community centers; enhance and improve public spaces; and create neighborhood identity and community pride. AIN is co-produced by ECD's Neighborhood University and Public Art Chattanooga (PAC), managed by PAC, and funded by the City of Chattanooga, the Benwood Foundation and the Footprint Foundation.

An ad hoc selection panel including representatives from Oak Hills Neighborhood Association, the Public Art Committee, neighborhood residents and business owners will review all submissions for the project and will select up to three artists to develop site specific proposals.

Panelists will use the following criteria in the selection process:

- Artistic Excellence;
- Originality: creativity and uniqueness demonstrated in previous projects;
- Quality and craftsmanship exhibited by past work;
- Appropriateness of artwork media and scale relative to site;
- Maintainability: structural and surface soundness, durability and resistance to vandalism, weathering, excessive maintenance, repair costs;
- Consideration of the Oak Hills community;
- Appropriateness for placement in an urban setting;
- Public safety;
- Feasibility: artist's proven track record/ability to complete the work on time and within the budget;
- Submittal of all required application materials as outlined in this RFQ.

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

This RFQ is open to all professional artists and artist teams over the age of 18, who currently reside in the United States. Local artists are strongly encouraged to apply.

#### **APPLICATION DEADLINE:**

## **SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:**

Proposals must be submitted electronically, by mail, or hand delivered and must include <u>two copies</u> of all printed materials. Materials should be single-sided and must include the following:
