b. Approach and means and methods Respondent intends to utilize to ensure safety on the Project.

For Section C.5.a Safety, please submit a narrative describing the DBE's safety plan, specific to the Project scope, site conditions, and Project specifics set forth in the Contract Documents.

Appendix E describes the District's SLBE and SELBE programs. These programs give 4% or 5% bidding preference for construction and professional services. If a DBE can meet the program requirements (by properly submitting the Self-Certification Affidavit included in Exhibit E), the DBE can receive "extra credit" points added to its score. The scoring of those points is changed as follows:

DBE is a Certified SLEB or SELBE: Additional points equaling 5% of

the DBE's total score

25% of subcontractors are SLEB or SELBE: Additional points equaling 4% of the

DBE's total score

Subcontractors can include A/E firms (design team firms) and Designated Subcontractors.




Existing Floor Plan

UM03 Design Direction Meeting - Meeting Notes June 6, 2019

The following should be incorporated into the SD Deliverable package.

GENERAL ITEMS

- Shelled spaces for future Gender Neutral Bathrooms can still be used for gender neutral changing areas. Need to find a way to insure that these will not be taken over by storage.
- Security needs to be integrated into an operations discussion. Cameras are not allowed where faculty are present.
- Request facility standards at DD phase for coordination
- Larger discussion on furnishings and equipment selection needs to occur in DD phase

ENTRY

- Glass could be a security concern.
- Idea of sliding doors is great, but the door needs to open completely.
- People may try to pry the door open during off hours.
 - Design team will look at swing doors

ENTRY RAMPS

• Prefer to remove secondary double doors at the bottom of ramps, but final decision needs to be integrated into security and operations discussion.

COMMON AREA

- Ability to install monitor for announcements on wall
 - Needs to be controlled by Joy and Carlos
 - Encased behind glass?
 - Design team to look at how to provide power to monitor. Most likely surface mounted conduit.
 - Like the birds of paradise wallcovering needs to be brighter
 - Include whiteboard and corkboard for flyers

HALLWAY

- Sightline from Joy's office is key. Modify windows and/or office location to provide greater sightline into the hallway.
- Provide slider window at Joy's office into hallway and women's locker room
- Provide wall base or wall protection equipment carts
- Alcove benchtop same material as plywood seating

TEAM ROOMS

- Needs Laney Eagles logo somewhere
 - o Graphic on lockers?

- o Graphic on floor?
- Graphic on floor will be hard to maintain. Design team will explore a wall/locker application
- Team room needs TV and dry erase board
- Include seating
 - > Design team will reorganize team room/showers for a more efficient layout. Team rooms will be larger to allow for stools.
 - New layout will be forwarded to staff for review.

TRAINING ROOM

- Needs more storage
- Remove wing wall between whirlpools and training tables
- Like the idea of storefront windows, but make half height with solid wall below. Allow for shelving/storage.
 - Design team will enlarge training room to allow for more storage spaces and better sightlines.
 - New layout will be forwarded to staff for review.

MEETING PURPOSE

Review preliminary layout of Locker Room Remodel and present proposed access and egress plans for comment and review.

MEETING NOTES

GENERAL COMMENTS

- 1. Design team to locate and provide original DSA project number for Laney College Campus to verify that the building is DSA Certified.
 - a. Original drawings submitted under application number 28951
 - b. Women's Locker Room Accessible Upgrades submitted under application number 111245.
- 2. Project may fall under a Technical Infeasibility Hardship. Design team to work with Kris Wen to develop analysis and submit with project documents to DSA for review.
- 3. Project does not need to go to district Fire Department for review. DSA will provide review. Please indicate fire department access to site, fire hydrant location, and fire department connection location on the site plan.

ACCESSIBILITY

1. Accessible path of travel requires upgrades. Currently this scope is under a separate contract not under the scope of the Locker Room Remodel Project. Design team to follow up with Kris Wen on how to submit Locker Room Remodel Project in conjunction with access upgrade project.



- 2. Accessible lockers are required but code does not indicate the number of required accessible benches. Design team will provide 5% accessible lockers as required by code, and provide accessible benches wherever possible relative to the accessible lockers.
- 3. A fully compliant accessible means of egress will not be included in the project due to various extensive structural and mechanical alterations that will affect areas outside of our project scope. These alterations will outlined in the Technical Infeasibility Analysis.

FIRE LIFE SAFETY

- 1. Building is considered A-3 Occupancy
- 2. Corridors are not required to be fire rated construction due to low occupant load. (To be verified based on full project Code Analysis)
- 3. 3 exits are required. 2 exits are required to be 1/3 distance of max diagonal of project area.
- 4. Conversion of existing shower spaces to storage areas are acceptable if project is going the more restrictive route. Entire project area will be considered A-3 occupancy.

ENTRANCE RAMPS

- 1. Proposed modifications: add code compliant handrails and door hardware
- 2. Full demolition and rebuild to compliant ramp would be a hardship to the project
 - a. Extending ramps and adding level landings would require modifications to existing concrete slab and gym doors outside of project area. Gym doors are located in a concrete wall.
- 3. Closest entry access from accessible parking area along 7th Street
- 4. Existing Women's Restroom will be remodeled to all-gender accessible restroom that will serve dance studio

DSA MEETING COMMENTS:

- 1. Building is considered an existing structure, therefore only one accessible entry is required.
- 2. Handrails appear to be compliant, design team will verify.

EXIT STAIR TO PLAZA


- 1. Proposed modifications: add code compliant handrails and door hardware
- 2. Full demolition and rebuild to compliant exit stair would be a hardship to the project
 - a. Stairs are completely concrete and between two large retaining walls.

DSA MEETING COMMENTS:

1. This area is considered an existing non-conforming stair.

BACK RAMP TO PLAZA EXIT STAIR

- 1. Proposed modification:
 - a. Add code compliant handrails
- 2. Full demolition and rebuild to compliant ramp would be a hardship to the project
 - a. Existing ramp is very steep location does not have the required area or length to meet height differential with a ramp that meets code requirements





b. Door to existing mechanical room would need to be moved – no viable way to do this without a major reconfiguration of that portion of the project area, including the mechanical room

DSA MEETING COMMENTS:

1. This area is considered an existing non-conforming ramp.

2. Only one accessible entry is required for the project. Ramp is not required to be accessible.
