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I. INTRODUCTION TO REQUEST FOR INFORMATION PROCESS

Arlington County, Virginia, is requesting information from Respondents having experience and abilities in the areas identified in this solicitation. This Request for Information (RFI) is for research and budget planning purposes only. It is not a competitive solicitation and will not result in a contract for any products or services. Responding to this RFI will not prequalify vendors nor will it preclude vendors from responding to any future RFP related to the areas identified in this solicitation.

Respondents who wish to suggest a product and/or related information for consideration are requested to submit relevant information as outlined in this RFI.

Information realized as a result of this RFI may be used as part of a competitive process for the selection of such goods and services and may be used to construct a list of prospective vendors. The County may request demonstrations of the Respondent's products or solutions. There is no commitment implied or otherwise by Arlington County to continue with a procurement process. It is not the intent to restrict the competitive process. Those vendors not responding to this RFI can respond to a Request for Proposal (RFP), if issued.

Respondents are cautioned not to rely on any written, electronic, or oral representations made by any County representative or other person, including the County's technical contact, that appear to change any portion of the solicitation, unless the change is ratified by a written Addendum to this solicitation issued by the Office of the Purchasing Agent.

III. INTRODUCTION TO REQUEST FOR INFORMATION NO. 22-DES-RFI-593

The intent of this solicitation is to obtain information from Respondents to determine the market availability of companies that have the willingness, experience, capability, equipment, and funding capacity necessary to provide Zero Emission Transit Buses (ZEB) and Charging/Fueling Infrastructure as a service, purchase, lease or other to Arlington Transit. Potential Contractor(s) would be required to work with the Arlington Transit Bureau in partnership with the Department of Environmental Services (DES) in pursuing a pilot of Battery Electric Buses (BEBs), Fuel Cell Electric Buses (FCEBs) and/or other Zero Emission technologies that may exist at the time of this RFI initiative. This information provided for this initiative should include providing 35' or 40' ZEB transit buses (minimum of one), charging/fueling infrastructure, energy storage, operational management, and maintenance of the charging/fueling infrastructure for a minimum of 3months with the potential of extending to 9 months. The County is interested in a full-service solution, as well as an understanding of components of the whole, so we encourage Contractors to provide information on these and bundled solutions as well.

This RFI will be used to understand the state of the industry, market interest and proven creative Zero Emission Transit Buses and Charging Infrastructure solutions that don't require major capital expenditure by Arlington County. The information received from this RFI, and other research may be used to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) or any other option procurement method options the County has.

BACKGROUND/PURPOSE OF SOLICITATION

Over the next few years Arlington Transit (ART) will need to replace several existing transit buses that have reached the end of their useful life. It is anticipated that replacement buses and all new expansion buses will be ZEBs. Furthermore, ART is in the process of designing and constructing a new administration, operations, and maintenance facility at 2629 Shirlington Road in Arlington which is slated to be open by the spring/summer of 2025 or sooner. ART currently does not have any ZEBs nor ZEB infrastructure and is seeking the availability of Zero Emission Transit Buses and Charging/Fueling Infrastructure as a pilot prior to substantial completion of this facility.

INTRODUCTION TO ARLINGTON COUNTY

Arlington Transit (ART) is Arlington's local bus service which is provided by Arlington, Virginia. ART is committed to the people we serve and is honored to serve Arlington residents, commuters, businesses, schools, and visitors on our buses each day. With a fleet of 78 buses, ART operates on Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) and are fully ADA accessible with wheelchair ramps and priority seating. ART improves the quality of life within our community by moving and connecting people throughout Arlington and to the Washington Metropolitan Area and reducing traffic congestion. With 16 routes, ART serves many destinations around Arlington. Many ART routes connect with Metrorail, Metrobus, Virginia Railway Express, DC Circulator, Alexandria DASH, Fairfax Connector, OmniRide, and Loudoun County Transit service. Every year, millions of riders use ART as a stress-free solution to get to work, school, shopping, restaurants, medical appointments, and connect with the rest of the region. Arlington Transit Bureau along

with its contract service provider, First Transit, maintains the transit infrastructure supportive of the Arlington Transit, including planning, scheduling, and managing Arlington's bus system.

Arlington Transit currently operates from 4 locations:

Arlington Transit Light Maintenance Facility (Arlington Owned) – 3201 South Eads Street, Arlington, VA 22202

- Parking for 37 buses
- CNG Fueling
- Minor maintenance & repairs
- Dispatch and administration building across the street

Arlington Transit Shirlington Road Bus Parking (Arlington owned) – 2629 South Shirlington Road, Arlington, VA 22206

- Site soon to be under construction, future site for Arlington Transit's Administrative, Operations, and Maintenance Facility + bus storage (approximately 59 buses)
- Parking for over 50 buses and dispatch trailer (existing)

Arlington Transit Maintenance Facility (Leased) – 6100B Farrington Ave, Alexandria, VA 22304

- Five maintenance bays
- Lot for bus parking

Temporary Bus Parking & Dispatch – 1429 N Quincy St, Arlington, VA, 22207

• Site for temp bus parking (approximately 29 buses) and dispatch while 2629 South Shirlington Road is under construction (spring/summer 2022 – spring/summer 2025)

IV. RESPONSE REQUIREMENTS

Responses submitted in response to this solicitation should be accurate and grammatically correct and should not contain spelling errors.

4. UNNECESSARILY ELABORATE RESPONSES

The County may view unnecessarily elaborate brochures or other presentations, including elaborate or expensive artwork, visuals, and other presentations, as an indication of the Respondent's lack of cost consciousness.
