INVITATION FOR BID STATESBORO/BULLOCH COUNTY PARKS & RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The Bulloch County Board of Commissioners (herein after referred to as the "County") is accepting **COMPETITIVE SEALED BIDS** for:

Material or Service: Furnish and install automatic slide door equipment for the renovation of the front entrance to the Honey Bowen Building located at 1 Max Lockwood Drive, Statesboro GA 30458.

Mandatory Pre-Bid: There will be a **mandatory pre-bid meeting** on June 15, 2021 at 10:00 AM, at the Honey Bowen Building located at 1 Max Lockwood Drive, Statesboro GA 30415. All vendors wishing to submit a bid must attend this pre-bid meeting. If the contractor or a representative of the contractor does not attend this meeting any submission for this project will be rejected.

Bid Submission Deadline: The deadline for receipt of sealed bids is 3:00 PM, June 24, 2021. Late bids will not be considered. Prospective bidders shall file all documents necessary to support their bids. **FAXED OR E-MAILED BIDS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

Time and Place for Submission and Opening of Bids: Bidders are responsible for the actual delivery of sealed bids during normal business hours to the Bulloch County Board of Commissioners, 115 North Main Street, Statesboro, Georgia 30458. The original bid and two (2) copies along with supporting documents must be submitted in a sealed clearly marked envelope. At the time and date of the bid deadline, the bids will be publicly opened and cost components read aloud at the Bulloch County Commissioners North Main Annex, in Conference Room 102 at the above-referenced address. The bids will be reviewed to determine conformity with the specifications and other criteria. Upon closure of the review, the Buildings and Facilities Manager will recommend the selection of a bid or bids most advantageous to the County or the rejection of all bids, which final decision will be approved by the Board of Commissioners.

Obtaining a Copy of Bid Package: A bid package may be requested by contacting Faye Bragg, Purchasing Manager, at fbragg@bullochcounty.net or retrieved from the County's website at http://bullochcounty.net/procurement/. Any addenda to this solicitation will be issued through the purchasing office, and it will be the sole responsibility of the bidder to periodically check the County's website for any addenda for this project. Failure to include a signed copy of any

addenda issued for this project in the submitted bid package will result in the submitted bid not being considered for this project.

Bid Identification: The outside of the sealed envelope shall include the wording: Honey Bowen Bldg. Renovation; Bid Opening: June 24, 2021 @ 3:00 PM; Attn: Faye Bragg, Purchasing Manager.

Check List: There is a checklist on **page 17** that lists the forms that **must** be included in the sealed bid submission. Failure to return any of the items on the check list will be just cause for non-acceptance of the submitted sealed bid.

Local Buying Preference: This solicitation is for a Public Works Construction Project, the County's local vendor pricing preference which allows for such a vendor to match the lowest price bid if within 5% *shall not be applicable*.

Award and Reservations: It is understood and agreed that in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and No/100 (\$1.00) cash in hand paid, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the bidder agrees that this bid shall be an option, which is hereby given to the County to accept or reject this bid at any time within sixty (60) calendar days from the date on which it is opened and read. It is expressly covenanted and agreed that this proposal is not subject to withdrawal by the bidder during the term of said option. The bidder is solely responsible for delivering its sealed bid to the exact location and by the time stated. The County reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive technicalities and informalities in bids, and to accept, in whole or in part, such bid or bids that may be deemed in the best interest of the County. The County reserves the right to use or not use any alternate bid associated with this solicitation.

Exceptions to Specifications: Any contract resulting from this invitation shall bind the bidder to all terms, conditions and specifications set forth in this invitation. Bidders whose bids do not conform shall so note on the "Exceptions to Specifications" sheet provided. While the County reserves the right to make an award to a nonconforming bidder when in the best interest of the County, such awards will not be readily made, and bidders are urged to conform to the greatest extent possible. No exceptions will be considered to have been taken by a bidder unless it is properly set out as provided above, and no exception will be deemed to have been taken by the County unless incorporated in a contract resulting from this invitation and so stated.

If awarded, an award will be made to that responsive and responsible bidder or bidders with the most advantageous bid or bids to the County, price and other factors considered. Time is of the essence.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Changes: No change shall be made to this invitation except by written modification by the Purchasing Department.

Fob Destination Point: Bid prices shall include shipping to the Honey Bowen Building located at 1 Max Lockwood Drive, Statesboro, Georgia 30458. Title to remain with vendor until fully accepted by County. Goods damaged or not meeting specifications will be rejected.

Compliance: The County's failure to insist on compliance with any of the terms or conditions of this Invitation to Bid shall not be deemed a waiver of the County's right to insist at any time on full compliance with any of the terms and conditions stated herein.

Disqualification: Bids may be disqualified for: a) receipt of the bid by the County past the stated deadline; b) any irregularities; c) unbalanced unit price or extensions; d) unbalanced value of any items; or, e) failure to complete bid information correctly. If in the opinion of the County, the bidder is not in a position to perform the contract, the bid may be disqualified and rejected. The County reserves the right to waive any minor informalities or irregularities.

Lawsuits/Bribery/Conflicts of Interest/Defaults: Prospective bidders shall disclose any record of pending lawsuits, criminal violations and/or convictions, conflicts of interest, or contract defaults.

Liability: The County is not liable for any cost incurred in the preparation of the bid. Nor is the County bound by any information provided to bidders prior to the bid opening unless reduced to writing and distributed as a written addendum.

Clarification of Submittals: The County reserves the right to seek clarification of any point in a bidder's sealed bid submission, or to obtain additional information.

Exceptions: Conditional bids or those that take exception to the specifications will be considered only at the discretion of the Project Manager.

Correction or Withdrawal of Bids, Cancellation of Awards: Correction or withdrawal of bids after the deadline for submitting bids has passed, or cancellation of awards or contracts may be permitted only to the extent that the bidder can show by clear and convincing evidence that a clerical mistake of non-judgmental character was made, or where the withdrawal or cancellation is in the best interest of the County.

County Obligations: The County has a standing policy to disqualify or withhold compensation to vendors, contractors and professional consultants if there are existing obligations to the County for any liens, ad valorem taxes, licenses or other financial remittances due to the County.

Award: If awarded, the award will be made to that responsive and responsible bidder or bidders whose bid is most advantageous to the County, price and other factors considered. The County specifically reserves the right to make an award to more than one bidder if the County determines that it is in the County's best interest to do so, and to reject any and all bids. The

bidder or bidders to whom the award is made will be notified at the earliest possible date.

Project Schedule: The project shall be defined in the notice to proceed and be complete according to the time schedule set forth in the contract.

License: All bidders must be licensed contractors as required by the State of Georgia

Insurance Requirements: The Contractor must submit with bidding documents, a Certificate of Liability Insurance indicating required insurance coverages. This insurance will be kept in force during the duration of the contract. Failure to provide and maintain insurance may cause cancellation of contract. Contractor shall purchase from and maintain with a company or companies authorized to do business in the state of Georgia the following types of insurance:

- A. Statutorily required workers' compensation insurance.
- B. Commercial general liability insurance, Commercial general liability insurance, with an endorsement naming the County and its officials, officers, and employees as additional insureds, and with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$2,000,000.00 aggregate.
- C. Motor vehicle liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury to or death of one person in any one accident, and not less than \$2,000,000.00 because of bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and not less than \$250,000.00 because of injury to or destruction of property.

Builder's Risk Insurance: The awarded contractor will also have to provide Builder's Risk Insurance as described in the attached contract.

Payment: Payments will be made upon completion of all work and acceptance by the County on invoices submitted and approved by the proper County representative within (30) thirty days of receipt of invoice. Itemize all invoices in full. Be sure our order number is on your invoice.

Inquiries Regarding Payment: All inquiries regarding payment of invoices are to be directed to Accounts Payable, (912) 764-6245.

Regulatory Agencies: Successful bidder will be responsible for all required permits or licenses required by any regulatory agency of the City, County, State or Federal Governments.

Anti-Discrimination Clause: Bulloch County does not discriminate against any person because of race, color, gender, religion, national origin, or handicap in employment or services provided

Commodity Status: It is understood and agreed that materials delivered shall be new, of latest design, and in first quality condition, that all bags, containers, etc., shall be new and suitable for storage, unless otherwise stated by Bulloch County.

Delivery: Delivery shall be made to the Honey Bowen Building, 1 Max Lockwood Drive, Statesboro, GA 30458.

Product Compliance: Bidders must submit with their bid, the printed specifications on the door unit they propose to furnish.

Questions: All questions concerning this invitation shall be directed to the Purchasing Manager in writing (email is preferable). Questions not asked at the mandatory pre-bid meeting will be directed to the Purchasing Manager no later than June 16, 2021 by 4:00 PM. Responses to questions will be addressed no later than June 17, 2021 by 4:00 PM.

Quality: Any brand names or trade names used in the specifications are for the purpose of describing and establishing general quality levels.

Bid Reservations: The County reserves the right to reject any or all Bids, to award in whole or in part and to waive minor immaterial defects in Bids. Negotiations may be necessary to complete the contract.

Contract Termination: County's Right to Terminate Contract.

A. <u>Termination for Cause.</u> Should the Contractor neglect to prosecute the work properly, or fail to perform any provision of the contract, the County, after seven (7) days' written notice to the Contractor and its surety, if any, may, without prejudice to any other remedy the County may have, make good the deficiencies and may deduct the cost thereof from the payment then or thereafter due the Contractor or, at the County's option, may terminate the contract and take possession of all materials, tools and appliances, and finish the Project by such means as the County sees fit; and if the unpaid balance of the Contract Sum exceeds the expense of finishing the Project, such excess shall be paid to the Contractor, but if such expense exceeds such unpaid balance, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the County.

B. <u>Termination for Convenience.</u> The County shall also have the right to terminate this contract at any time for any reason by giving at least thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor. In such event, the Contractor will be paid a fair and reasonable payment as determined by the County for the work completed as of the date of termination.

Indemnification: The Contractor agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the County, its officials, and employees (hereinafter collectively "the indemnitees") from and against any and all claims, damages, liabilities, suits, proceedings, costs, and expenses of litigation (including, without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees) related to or arising in any way out of the performance of this Agreement, unless such is attributable to the sole negligence of the indemnitees. The indemnity obligation of the Contractor will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

Immigration: On July 1, 2009, the Georgia Security and Immigration Compliance Act (SB 529, Section 2) became effective. All employers, contractors and subcontractors entering into a contract or performing work for Georgia's public employers in the amount of \$2,500 or more

must sign an affidavit that he/she has used the E-verify System. This includes out-of-state contractors. E-verify is a no-cost federal employment verification system to insure employment eligibility. For more information on E-verify please go to http://www.dhs.gov/e-verify. An affidavit is enclosed in this solicitation. All Proposers are to read and complete the E-verify Contractor Affidavit enclosed to be returned with response. Failure to do so will result in your solicitation response being rejected as non-responsive.

If you use a third party administrator, do not enter their name in place of the Federal Work Authorization E-verify Company ID#; the administrator's name does not replace the actual number. You must contact your administrator for the number and the date of authorization (when the number became effective).

If you only include the third party administrators name and not your company's actual authorization number this will result in your solicitation response being rejected as nonresponsive.

Bidders will be fully responsible for the delivery of their bids in a timely manner. Reliance upon U.S. Mail or other carriers is at the bidder's risk. Late bids will not be considered.

SECTION 08 42 29 SLIDING AUTOMATIC ENTRANCES

Part 1 - GENERAL

1.1 DESCRIPTION

A. Furnish and install automatic slide door equipment as indicated on drawings and specifications.

1.2 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Manufacturer's Qualifications: Manufacturer to have at least (5) five years of experience in the fabrication of automatic and manual entrance systems.
- B. Installer's Qualifications: Products specified shall be represented by a factory authorized and trained distributor. Distributor shall be AAADM Certified, maintain a parts inventory and have trained service personnel with experience installing and maintaining units indicated for this project.
- C. All automatic equipment to comply with UL325 (USA).
- D. All automatic equipment to comply with ANSI A156.10.

1.3 SUBMITTALS

- A. Product Data: Submit manufacturer's product and complete installation data for all materials covered in this section.
- B. Shop Drawings: Submit complete elevations, details and methods of anchorage to location; installation of hardware; size, shape, joints and connections; and details of joining with other construction.
- C. Templates and Diagrams: As needed shall be furnished to fabricators and installers of related work for coordination of door system installation with concrete work, masonry, and other related work.
- D. A copy of appropriate manual shall be provided to owner / contractor upon completion of installation.

1.4 SUBSTITUTIONS

A. Equipment as manufactured by NABCO Entrances, Inc. has been specified and shall be the basis of Design. Proposals for substitution products may be submitted by the bidders a minimum of 10 days prior to bid due date. The proposed substitution shall meet the quality and performance standards described in this specification.

1.5 JOB SITE CONDITIONS

- A. Site Survey: Verify site conditions including, but not limited to the following; opening sizes, floor conditions, plumb and level mounting surfaces (substrates shall be of proper dimension and material).
- B. Coordinate installation with glass, glazing, hardware and other trades to avoid construction delays.

1.6 WARRANTY

A. Materials shall be free of defects in material and workmanship for a period of one

year from date of substantial completion. During the warranty period the Owner will request Manufacturer's factory-trained technicians to perform service. Owner to receive warranty after completion of installation.

1.7 COMPLIANCE

A. A completed American Association of Automatic Door Manufacturer (AAADM) compliance form shall be submitted as proof of compliance with ANSI A156.10 Standard for power operated pedestrian doors.

PART 2-PRODUCTS

2.1 APPROVED MANUFACTURER

A. All door equipment shall be manufactured by NABCO Entrances Inc. or approved equal.

2.2 AUTOMATIC SLIDING DOOR SYSTEM

A. Model: NABCO GT1175 Sliding Door System

- B. Mode of operation:
 - a. An electro-mechanical operator with a microcomputer control system shall drive sliding door. The door will be pulled from closed to open and open to close position stopping the door in both directions by electrically reducing the voltage, stalling door against mechanical stop. Opening, closing speeds and hold open time shall be adjustable. A reinforced timing belt shall be used to convert rotating motion from the operator sprocket into horizontal motion of the door.
- C. Types / Configurations:
 - a. Bi-part FSL

D. Product Components:

- a. Aluminum doors, sidelites, operator housing and frame.
 - i. Door panel(s) and sidelite(s) panel shall be factory assembled with 3/8"-16 threaded tie rods spanning full length of top and bottom rails. Snap-in glass stop with integral extruded vinyl standoff to accommodate glass flexing. A horizontal muntin bar to provide glass protection. Available in narrow stile 2-1/8" (51mm).
 - Operator housing section shall be two-piece construction 6-1/2" (165mm) by 7-1/2" (191mm) extrusion with end caps. All header sections shall have a minimum thickness of 0.140" (4mm) and shall be fabricated of 6063-T5 aluminum alloy.
 - iii. Sidelite & Transom configuration shall be fixed.
 - iv. Finish: Aluminum shall have a standard finish of AA-M12-C22-A31 (204R1, clear) or AA-M12-C22-A44 (dark bronze). Black and special finishes available upon request.
 - v. Vertical jambs shall be of 1-3/4" (44mm) by 4-1/2" (114mm) extruded aluminum tubes. 1-3/4" (44mm) by 6-3/8" (162mm) for pocket type units. Optional framing available.
- b. Rollers-support, anti-riser and guide.
 - i. The door assembly shall ride on two steel, urethane coated support rollers incorporating lubricated sealed ball bearings. The door shall be held on

the track by means of two 2-1/2" (64mm) anti-riser rollers. Lateral adjustment of the door assembly shall provide positive sealing at door edges. Door height shall be adjustable by 9/32" (7mm).

- ii. Fixed Sidelite Units Each door shall include one guide assembly incorporating double rollers with sleeve bushings. Guide assembly shall be attached to the door with 10 gage (3mm) thick-formed guide bracket. All steel brackets and fittings shall be plated for corrosion resistance.
- iii. Full Open Units Each door shall include one guide assembly incorporating one roller and guide piston riding in a surface or recessed floor track assembly.
- c. Door carrier hanger assembly, breakaway latch, limiting arm and door lock.
 - Entrance systems shall have door panels attached to a door carrier hanger assembly by means of an adjustable support rod pivot assembly and corrosion resistant adjustable breakaway release latch holding panel in the closed position under normal automatic operation. The support rod pivot assembly allows the door panel to be broken outward at any point in the door's opening or closing cycle allowing for safe emergency egress in compliance with NFPA 101 and ANSI A156.10. The door panel in the breakout mode disconnects the power to the control circuit inhibiting automatic door operation. The control circuit shall be resettable by reengaging the door panel with the door carrier hanger assembly. Breakaway pressure shall be field adjustable from 5 to 50 lbs. (22N to 222N) to meet local building code requirements but will be factory set at 50 lbs. (222N) maximum.
 - ii. Door assembly shall have a limiting arm to control the door as it swings in the direction of egress.
 - iii. The active door will incorporate a two-point lock securing the lead stiles and door carrier hanger assembly. The lock assembly will incorporate a key cylinder on the exterior and a thumb turn on the interior in accordance with NFPA 101. Optional three point locking available.
- d. Air infiltration and intrusion protection equipment.
 - i. Double pile weather-stripping on the lead edge of the sliding door(s) .36" thick (9mm) including the area of the lock.
 - ii. 11/16" (17mm) wide nylon brush weather-stripping on the vertical stile of both the sliding door panel(s) and sidelite(s) panels
 - iii. 11/16" (17mm) wide nylon brush weather-stripping mounted on door bottom.
- e. Nabco power open/close operator with microcomputer control.
 - i. Nabco VS-150 High Voltage Brushless Motor/Operator: Completely assembled and sealed unit which shall include gear-driven transmission, and bearings, all located in cast aluminum housing and filled with special lubricant for extreme temperature conditions. Attached to transmission system with sealed ball bearings shall be a 1/4 peak HP high voltage brushless motor for maintenance free, high torque performance. Drives that utilize motors with brushes will not be approved. Motor shall operate

from 115- volt supply and require less than 5 amps at full stall.

- ii. Nabco Opus Controller: Controller shall be equipped with multiple programmable inputs and outputs to enable custom door performance to meet specific jobsite requirements. Controller be microprocessor based with LCD on board programming display and rotary dial. LCD display to indicate current operational status of inputs and outputs and history data in real time. To facilitate remote control and ease of programming controller shall also be Bluetooth compatible. The microprocessor control shall allow the opening speed, closing speed; back check speed, latch check speed and back check and latch check positions to be adjusted separately and independently from each other to meet specific door widths and site conditions. The control system shall also be capable of providing transistor output signals at the door closed or door open positions to facilitate interaction with security and access control systems. A single input shall be available to initiate an emergency close and lock whereby the door immediately closes upon that circuit activation. Normally open or normally closed activation and safety signal inputs shall be available and able to be switched programmatically. Non-critical error resetting to be accomplished via cycling of On/Off Mode Switch. The processor shall be capable of providing information on the number of operations and error codes for maintenance purposes. Adjustable opening and closing speeds shall be set in accordance with ANSI 156.10. All adjustments shall be specific and reproducible.
- f. Access Security Equipment (Optional)
 - i. Access Security Equipment: Shall consist of Gyro Tech 24 VDC power locking device. Lock shall be concealed in header. Sliding door shall be capable of being fitted with optional panic hardware equipment complete with concealed vertical rods. To facilitate smooth door operation lock release and engagement shall be governed by microprocessor control.

2.3 SENSOR DEVICES

- A. Acusensor: Manufactured by NABCO ENTRANCES, INC.
 - a. Sensors for door activation and threshold sensing shall provide a rectangular shaped pattern with a sensing area next to the door system. To provide optimum coverage to meet specific site conditions the sensing pattern shall be adjustable both in width and depth of coverage while remaining at a full power setting. Units shall be supplied and installed on both sides of the operator housing to activate doors for single or two-way traffic. Units shall be sealed for protection against dust and moisture. An optional rain cover shall be available for sensors directly exposed to the elements.
- B. Acuzone: Sold by NABCO ENTRANCES, INC.
 - a. Sensors for door activation and threshold sensing shall provide a rectangular shaped pattern with a sensing area next to the door system. To provide optimum coverage to meet specific site conditions the sensing pattern shall be adjustable both in width and depth of coverage while remaining at a full power setting. Acuzone uses two technologies for activation and presence sensing. The

activation is achieved by Doppler microwave for long range sensing. Presence sensing is achieved by active infrared. Unit shall have separate outputs for microwave and infrared signals. Sensors combining both microwave and infrared signals on one output only shall not be allowed. The Acuzone can also look back through the threshold to provide additional safety coverage when the door is open. Units shall be supplied and installed on one or both sides of the operator housing to activate doors for single or two-way traffic. Units shall be sealed for protection against dust and moisture. An optional rain cover shall be available for sensors directly exposed to the elements.

- C. Redundant safety:
 - a. In addition to the presence sensors on both sides of the header, unit shall include minimum one set of infrared safety beams across the walk-through opening to prevent the door from closing if there are any obstructions. This is for redundant threshold protection. Products without redundant threshold protection shall not be approved.
- D. Specification options for consideration:
 - a. Wall Switches
 - b. For others see product catalog.

PART 3-EXECUTION

3.1 INSTALLATION

A. Door equipment shall be installed by manufacturer-approved, factory-trained installers in compliance with manufacturer's recommendations and approved shop drawings.

3.2 CLEANING AND PROTECTION


A. After installation, clean framing members as recommended by manufacturer. Aluminum surfaces in contact with masonry, concrete, or steel shall be protected from contact by use of neoprene gaskets where indicated or a coat of bituminous paint to prevent galvanic or corrosive action. Advise general contractor to protect unit from damage during subsequent construction activities.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into this _____ day of ______, 20___, by and between **BULLOCH COUNTY**, a political subdivision of the state of Georgia, acting by and through its governing authority, the Bulloch County Board of Commissioners (hereinafter "the County") and ______ (hereinafter "the Contractor").

The County and the Contractor hereby agree as follows:

1. <u>Scope of Work; Specifications.</u> The Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, and equipment and perform all of the work for the Project described as

Furnish and install automatic slide door equipment for the renovation of the front entrance to the Honey Bowen Building located at 1 Max Lockwood Drive, Statesboro GA 30458.

as set forth in this Agreement and in the scope of work, specifications, drawings, or other documents identified as:

- A. Invitation to Bid
- B. Bid Form
- C. Diagram A1 4-19-21

The above-described documents are incorporated herein by reference and are as much a part of this Agreement as if fully set forth herein. Provided, however, that in the event of any conflict or ambiguity between the body of this Agreement and any above-described document, the body of this Agreement shall govern.

2. <u>Time for Completion.</u> The work shall commence no later than <u>15</u> calendar days of the County's issuance of a notice to proceed and shall be completed no later than <u>30</u> calendar days thereafter. Time is of the essence of this contract.

3. <u>Contract Sum.</u> The County shall pay the Contractor for the performance of the work in total the sum of \$_____.

4. <u>Progress Payments.</u> The County shall make monthly progress payments on account of the contract, less retainage of 0%, based upon the Contractor's submission to the County of an invoice detailing the work completed. The period covered by each invoice shall be one calendar month ending on the last day of the month, and payment shall be due within fifteen (15) days of the County's receipt of the invoice; provided, however, that payments otherwise due may be withheld by the County on account of, but not necessarily limited to, the following reasons: unsatisfactory job progress; defective construction which has not been remedied; disputed work; third-party

claims filed or reasonable evidence that a claim will be filed; failure of the Contractor or its subcontractors to make timely payments for labor, equipment, and materials; damage caused by the Contractor to the County, other contractors, or subcontractors; or reasonable evidence that the contract cannot be completed for the unpaid balance of the Contract Sum.

5. <u>Acceptance and Final Payment.</u> Final payment shall be due thirty (30) days after completion of the work and acceptance by the County, subject to the County's right to withhold payment for the reasons stated in Section 4 of this Agreement.

6. <u>Contract Documents.</u> The contract includes this Agreement and any scope of work, specifications, drawings, or other documents incorporated herein by reference. This includes, but is not necessarily limited to, any documents attached to this Agreement as an exhibit. The intent of these documents is to include all labor, materials, appliances and services of every kind necessary for the proper execution of the work, and the terms and conditions of payment therefor. The documents are to be considered as one, and whatever is called for by any one of the documents shall be as binding as if called for by all. Any conflict or ambiguity between the body of this Agreement and any document incorporated herein by reference shall be governed by the body of this Agreement. The Contractor shall be responsible for verifying any and all measurements set forth in the Contract Documents before commencing any work hereunder.

7. <u>Materials, Appliances and Employees.</u> Except as otherwise noted, the Contractor shall provide and pay for all materials, labor, tools, water, power and other items necessary to complete the work. Unless otherwise specified, all material shall be new, and both workmanship and materials shall be of good quality. All workmen and subcontractors shall be skilled in their trades.

8. <u>Permits, Licenses and Regulations.</u> The Contractor shall secure and pay for all permits and licenses necessary for the prosecution of the work. The Contractor shall comply with all laws and regulations bearing on the conduct of the work and shall notify the County if the Contract Documents are at variance therewith.

9. <u>Protection of Work, Property and Persons.</u> The Contractor shall adequately protect the work, adjacent property and the public and shall be responsible for any damage or injury due to his act or neglect.

10. <u>Access to Work.</u> The Contractor shall permit and facilitate the observation of the work by the County and its agents and public authorities at all times.

11. <u>Changes in the Work.</u> The County may order changes in the work, the Contract Sum and time for completion being adjusted accordingly. All such orders and adjustments shall be in the form of a written change order to the contract executed by both the County and the Contractor. Claims by the Contractor for extra cost must be made in writing before executing the work involved.

12. <u>Correction of Work.</u> The Contractor shall re-execute any work that fails to conform to the requirements of the contract and that appears during the progress of the work, and shall remedy any defects due to faulty materials or workmanship which appear within a period of one year from the

date of completion of the contract and final acceptance of the work by the County unless the manufacturer of the equipment or materials has a warranty for a longer period of time, which warranties shall be assigned by Contractor to County. The provisions of this article apply to work done by subcontractors as well as to work done by direct employees of the Contractor.

13. Liquidated Damages. The County and the Contractor agree that time is of the essence of this contract and that the County's damages will be difficult or impossible to estimate should the Contractor fail to complete the Project within the specified time. Therefore, should the Contractor fail to complete the Project within the specified time, the County and the Contractor agree that the Contractor shall pay to the County the sum of \$ **0** per day as liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, for each calendar day that the Project continues beyond the specified completion date. The County shall have the right to withhold any liquidated damages from amounts otherwise due the Contractor.

14. <u>No Damages for Delay</u>. In the event that the Contractor is delayed in the performance of the Project for any reason whatsoever, including but not limited to action or inaction of the County, another contractor or subcontractor, the Contractor shall not be entitled to any damages from the County for such delay, but the Contractor's sole remedy shall be an extension of time.

15. <u>County's Right to Terminate Contract.</u>

A. <u>Termination for Cause.</u> Should the Contractor neglect to prosecute the work properly, or fail to perform any provision of the contract, the County, after seven (7) days' written notice to the Contractor and its surety, if any, may, without prejudice to any other remedy the County may have, make good the deficiencies and may deduct the cost thereof from the payment then or thereafter due the Contractor or, at the County's option, may terminate the contract and take possession of all materials, tools and appliances, and finish the Project by such means as the County sees fit; and if the unpaid balance of the Contractor, but if such expense of finishing the Project, such excess shall be paid to the Contractor, but if such expense exceeds such unpaid balance, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the County.

B. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>. The County shall also have the right to terminate this contract at any time for any reason by giving at least thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor. In such event, the Contractor will be paid a fair and reasonable payment as determined by the County for the work completed as of the date of termination.

16. <u>Insurance.</u> Contractor shall purchase from and maintain with a company or companies authorized to do business in the state of Georgia the following types of insurance:

- A. Statutorily required workers' compensation insurance.
- B. Commercial general liability insurance, with an endorsement naming the County as an additional insured, and with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$2,000,000.00 aggregate.

C. Motor vehicle liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury to or death of one person in any one accident, and not less than \$2,000,000.00 because of bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and not less than \$250,000.00 because of injury to or destruction of property.

Builder's Risk Insurance. If required, as indicated below, either the County or the 17. Contractor shall purchase and maintain, with a company authorized to do business in the state of Georgia, property insurance written on a builder's risk "all-risk" or equivalent policy form in the amount of the initial Contract Sum, plus value of subsequent contract modifications and cost of materials supplied or installed by others, comprising total value for the entire Project at the site on a replacement cost basis without optional deductibles. Such property insurance shall be maintained, unless otherwise agreed in writing by all persons and entities who are beneficiaries of such insurance, until final payment has been made or until no person or entity other than the County has an insurable interest in the Project. The insurance shall include interests of the County, the Contractor, Subcontractors and Sub-subcontractors in the Project and shall include, without limitation, insurance against the perils of fire (with extended coverage) and physical loss or damage including, without duplication of coverage, theft, vandalism, malicious mischief, collapse, earthquake, flood, windstorm, falsework, testing and startup, temporary buildings and debris removal including demolition occasioned by enforcement of any applicable legal requirements. The County's purchase of builder's risk through the ACCG-IRMA interlocal risk pool shall satisfy any obligation the County may have under this Section. Builder's Risk Insurance shall be provided as follows:

18. <u>Payment and Performance Bonds.</u> If indicated below, the Contractor shall furnish to the County prior to the start of construction payment and performance bonds in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Sum from a surety licensed to do business in the state of Georgia.

19. <u>Separate Contracts.</u> The County has the right to let other contracts in connection with the Project and the Contractor shall properly cooperate with any such other contractors.

20. <u>Attorney's Fees and Expenses.</u> Should the Contractor default in any of the provisions of this Agreement, and should the County employ an attorney to enforce any provision hereof or to collect damages for breach of this Agreement or to recover on any payment or performance bond furnished by the Contractor, the Contractor and its surety agree to pay the County such reasonable

attorney's fees and expenses of litigation as the County may expend herein.

21. <u>Cleaning Up.</u> The Contractor shall keep the premises free from accumulation of waste material and rubbish and at the completion of the Project he shall remove from the premises all rubbish, implements and surplus materials and leave the Project premises broom-clean.

22. <u>Indemnification.</u> The Contractor agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the County, its officials, and employees (hereinafter collectively "the indemnitees") from and against any and all claims, damages, liabilities, suits, proceedings, costs, and expenses of litigation (including, without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees) related to or arising in any way out of the performance of this Agreement, unless such is attributable to the sole negligence of the indemnitees. The indemnity obligation of the Contractor will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

23. <u>Prevailing Wages.</u> The hourly minimum rate of wage which may be paid to laborers, workers or mechanics in each trade or occupation to be employed in the performance of this Agreement shall not be less than such specified hourly minimum rate of wage in the performance of this Agreement as required by law.

24. <u>Notices.</u> Any notices required or permitted pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and may be affected by U.S. mail or by facsimile. Mailed notices shall be deemed to have been received on the date of acknowledgment on any return receipt or three days after deposit in the U.S. mail with proper postage affixed, whichever date is earlier. Notices by facsimile shall be deemed to have been received on the date on the sending party's facsimile confirmation sheet.

25. <u>No Waiver</u>. No failure on the part of either party to this Agreement at any time to require performance by the other party of any term of this Agreement shall be taken or held to be a waiver of such term or in any way affect such party's right to enforce such term, and no waiver on the part of either party of any term of this Agreement shall be taken or held to be a waiver of any other term hereof or the breach thereof.

26. <u>Assignment.</u> This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the written consent of the other party, and any purported assignment without such written consent shall be null and void. In the event of a valid assignment, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

27. <u>Immunity.</u> Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed or deemed to be a waiver of any immunity to which the parties, their officials, or employees are legally entitled.

28. <u>Legal Construction; Severability.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the state of Georgia. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Agreement and this Agreement shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in it.

29. <u>Entire Agreement; Amendment.</u> This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and all prior agreements relating to the subject matter hereof, whether written or oral, are nullified and superseded hereby, and neither party shall have any further rights or obligations under such superseded agreements. This Agreement may be amended or supplemented only by the mutual consent of the contracting parties in writing signed by all parties to this Agreement.
