SPORTS TURF FIELD FERTILIZER AND CHEMICALS

SECTION 1 - SPECIAL CONDITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

1.1. SCOPE:

The City of Parkland (CITY) is seeking quotes for an open-end contract to provide **Sports Turf Field Fertilizer and Chemicals** in accordance with the terms, conditions, and specifications contained in this Quotation Request (QR).

The initial contract period shall start on date of award and shall terminate on September 30, 2020.

The Awarded Vendor will complete delivery and the CITY will receive delivery on any orders mailed to the Vendor prior to the date of expiration.

1.2. QUANTITIES:

No warranty or guarantee is given or implied as to the total amounts to be purchased resulting from this contract. The quantities stated in this bid are estimates of six month usage, to be used for bid comparison purposes only. All products will be ordered on an as needed basis. Each order will be a combination of a minimum of \$5,000.

All shipments shall be made in the appropriately sized unit of measure regardless of quantities ordered.

1.3. UNIT OF MEASURE:

Where specified, Vendors MUST bid on the unit of measure requested on the pricing pages regardless of the packaging size.

1.4. BASIS FOR AWARD:

The contract award shall be made to the lowest, responsive and responsible Vendor. The CITY reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids. The CITY further reserves the right to award the contract on a split order basis, lump sum, or individual item basis, or such combination as shall best serve the interest of the CITY's best economic interest. Any contract, as a result of this solicitation, will be submitted to Purchasing Director for considerations and may be submitted to the appropriate authority for their approval.

1.5. DELIVERY:

The Contractor(s) assumes the responsibility of delivering all items ordered within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of order. The Contractor(s) shall advise the using department if any items ordered are non-stock items and identify the expected delivery date of those items. All containers must be labeled and Contractor(s) must supply MSDS sheets (as described in section V.) with each delivery in accordance with OSHA Hazard Communication (29 CFR 1910.1200).

Contractor(s) must agree to accept "blanket" purchase orders, with verbal requests for partial shipments, regardless of quantity, if requested.

1.6. INVOICING:

Invoicing is to be done for each shipment. The invoice is to reflect the purchase order number, tank truck number, ordering agency, unit price, extensions, and total billed and any allowable cash discounts.

1.7. PERFORMANCE OF SERVICES:

Contractor agrees to perform contracted services in a professional and in compliance with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and permits. Only the highest quality workmanship shall be acceptable. Services, equipment and workmanship not conforming to the intent of the Agreement or meeting the approval of the CITY may be rejected. Replacements and/or rework, as required, shall be accomplished on a timely basis at no additional cost to the CITY.

Any variations from bid specifications, no matter how slight, including substitutions of products or methods, must be noted and explained fully in a submittal with bid. If no exceptions are noted, it shall be understood that the specifications will be adhered to exactly as listed in the specifications section of this document.

Where an "or equal" is specified, the CITY shall be the sole judge in determining equality. Any deviation from these specifications must be approved by the CITY in writing. If specifications are in contradiction, or if they contain any errors or omissions, Vendors shall notify the Purchasing Department in writing by the deadline specified herein to allow sufficient time to resolve all discrepancies.

1.8. COMPETENCY OF VENDORS:

Bids shall be considered only from firms that have been continuously engaged in providing products and services similar to those specified herein for a reasonable period and that are presently engaged in the provision of these services. Contract(s) will be awarded only to responsible and responsive Vendor(s) licensed and qualified by experience to do the work specified.

The Vendor shall submit, prior to award of Contract, satisfactory evidence of his experience in like work and that he is fully prepared with the necessary organization, capital, and equipment to complete the Scope of Services. Vendor shall be insured, licensed, and certified by all applicable local, county, and state agencies.

1.9. EVALUATION & SELECTION METHOD AND CRITERIA:

All bids will be reviewed and evaluated by the Purchasing Director or his designee. A recommendation for award will be submitted to the Purchasing Director for final approval. The bids shall be evaluated based on lowest price.

Award will be made only to responsible, licensed firm(s) possessing the potential ability to perform successfully under the terms and conditions of these specifications. Vendors must be regularly engaged in the trade or trades relating to the Bids submitted.

1.10. EQUIVALENCY TYPE LANGUAGE:

The CITY shall be the sole determinant power in establishing brand name or equal status of commodity offered by vendor. Use of manufacturer'(s) name(s) and/or catalog or model number(s) is for reference only to provide the Vendor with the required quality and specifications for this quotation request. Such reference is not intended to, and shall not, limit competition among potential Vendors.

If the Vendor offers an equivalent, the Vendor should enclose with this quotation request specifications, documentation, and literature that establishes the equivalency or superiority of the item offered. If a sample is to be required from the Vendor by the Purchasing Department, the sample is to be provided within three (3) business days.

1.11. SIGNED BID CONSIDERED AN OFFER:

This signed bid shall be considered an offer on the part of the Vendor, which offer shall be deemed accepted upon approval by the CITY, if required, and in case of default on the part of the Vendor or contractor after such acceptance, the CITY may take such action as it deems appropriate including legal action for the damages or specific performance.

1.12. EMPLOYEES:

Contractor shall provide licensed and insured employees as required by Local, State, and/or Federal Regulations. All work must be performed following EPA requirements and OSHA safety standards and regulations.

Contractor shall provide the CITY with an emergency contact list identifying the names, positions held, phone numbers, and emails of account manager/ supervisor.

1.13. SUPERVISION:

The Contractor is to be responsible for his employees and subcontractors, and for compliance with all laws and ordinances governing the work. He shall have at all times a competent representative available to answer questions or handle problems, who shall be satisfactory to the CITY.

1.14. DAMAGE TO PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY:

The Contractor shall take extra precaution to protect all property while conducting services. If property (public or private) is damaged while contractor is conducting services, it shall be repaired or replaced at the expense of the contractor in a manner acceptable to the CITY prior to the final acceptance of the work. Contractor will be responsible for applying and securing any permits that may be required to complete such repairs. Such property shall include but not be limited to: existing facilities and all of its components, site amenities, concrete and/or asphalt surfaces, vehicles, structures, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, driveways, utilities, etc.

Contractor must provide protection necessary to prevent damage to property being repaired or replaced.

1.15. CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS:

Contractor must familiarize itself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, locality, and all local conditions and Laws and Regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the services.

Contractor must give Purchasing Director written notice of all conflicts, errors or discrepancies that he has discovered in the Contract Documents and the written resolution thereof by Purchasing Director is acceptable to Contractor.

1.16. SAFETY PROTOCOLS:

Each delivery truck shall remain in excellent condition. Each truck shall have a capable driver, trained in the proper handling of the substance detailed herein, related use and operation of equipment for unloading and securing transfer of product.

Each shipment shall carry with it, clear identification of the material and a warning of potential danger in handling. For the tank truck shipments, information accompanying the bill of lading shall include the name of the product, net weight or

volume of the contents, the percentage, strength of the product, the name and address of the manufacturer, the lot number, brand name, if any, and shall bear such other markings as are required by applicable laws.

In compliance with Chapter 442, Florida Statutes, any item delivered from a contract resulting from this bid must be accompanied by a Safety Data Sheet (SDS). The SDS must be maintained by the using Department and must include the following information:

- A. The chemical name and the common name of the toxic substance.
- B. The hazards or other risks in the use of the toxic substance, including:
 - 1) The potential for fire, corrosion, and reactivity.
 - 2) The known acute and chronic health effects of risks from exposure, including medical conditions, which are generally recognized as being aggravated by exposure to the toxic substance.
 - 3) The primary routes of entry and symptoms of overexposure.
- C. The proper precautions, handling, practices, necessary personal protective equipment, and other safety precautions in the use of or exposure to the toxic substances, including appropriate emergency treatment in case of overexposure.
- D. The emergency procedure for spills, fire, disposal, and first aid.
- E. A description, in lay terms, of the known specific health risks posed by the toxic substance intended to alert any person reading this information.
- F. The year and month, if available, that the information was compiled and the name, address, and emergency telephone number of the manufacturer responsible for preparing the information

1.17. TESTING:

The CITY reserves the right to have the product supplied tested at any time during the contract period. An independent laboratory would do such testing. Additionally, the facilities of the Florida State Department of Agriculture Testing Laboratories may be used for any referee testing.

Failure to meet specifications will result in the testing rate costs to be borne by the supplier.

During the term of the contract, effectiveness of the product furnished must meet or exceed the performance established in the test runs. If the product furnished fails to perform as has been established, the CITY reserves the right to request product replacement, or further reserves the right to terminate the contract if characteristics of the product cause difficulties in utilization or are ineffectual in the treatment process.

SECTION 2 – ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- 2.1. **INFORMATION/CLARIFICATION:**
For information concerning this Quote contact Yasmin Teja (Purchasing Assistant), (954) 757- 4195. Such contact is to be for clarification purposes only. Changes, if any, to the technical specifications or bid procedures will only be transmitted by written addendum acknowledged by Vendor.
- 2.2. **ADDENDA, CHANGES OR INTERPRETATIONS DURING BID:**
Any inquiry or request for interpretation received prior to the last day for questions/clarification will be given consideration. Changes or interpretations may only be made by a written document in the form of an addendum and, if desired, will be mailed or sent by available means to all known prospective Vendors no later than seven (7) days prior to the established Bid Submission deadline. Each prospective Vendor shall acknowledge receipt of such addenda in the space provided in the bid form. In case any Vendor fails to acknowledge receipt of such addenda or addendum, his/her bid will nevertheless be considered as though it had been received and acknowledged and the submission of his bid will constitute acknowledgment of the receipt of same. All addenda are a part of the contract documents and each Vendor will be bound by such addenda, whether or not received by him/her. It is the responsibility of each prospective Vendor to verify that he/she has received all addenda issued before Bids are opened. No verbal interpretations may be relied upon.
- 2.3. **VENDORS' COSTS:**
The CITY shall not be liable for any costs incurred by Vendors in responding to this Quotation Request.
- 2.4. **BID ACCEPTANCE:**
Vendor warrants by virtue of submitting his/her Bid that the prices quoted will be firm for acceptance by the CITY for a period of 90 days from the date of bid opening unless otherwise stated in the Quotation Request.
- 2.5. **NO EXCLUSIVE CONTRACT/ADDITIONAL SERVICES:**
Vendor agrees and understands that, unless specifically and expressly provided for herein, the Contract shall not be construed as an exclusive arrangement and further agrees that the CITY may, at any time, secure similar or identical services at its sole option.
- 2.6. **MISTAKES:**
Vendors are cautioned to examine all terms, conditions, specifications, drawings, exhibits, addenda, delivery instructions, and special conditions pertaining to the Quotation Request. Failure of the Vendor to examine all pertinent documents shall

not entitle him to any relief from the conditions imposed in the contract and may lead to rejection of a bid.

2.7. REJECTION OF BIDS:

The CITY reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids, part of bids, and to waive minor irregularities or variations to specifications contained bids, and minor irregularities in the bid process.

2.8. RESOLUTION OF PROTESTED SOLICITATIONS AND PROPOSED AWARDS:

All bid protests shall be filed and processed as set forth in Section 2-145 of the CITY Procurement Code.

2.9. PROHIBITION OF INTEREST:

No contract will be awarded to a Vendor who has CITY elected officials, officers or employees affiliated with it, unless the Vendor has fully complied with current Florida State Statutes and CITY Ordinances relating to this issue. Vendors must disclose any such affiliation. Failure to disclose any such affiliation will result in disqualification of the Vendor and removal of the Vendor from the CITY's Vendor's List and prohibition from engaging in any business with the CITY.

2.10. PUBLIC RECORDS / CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION:

Florida law provides that municipal records shall at all times be open for personal inspection by any person, unless otherwise exempt. Information and materials received by the CITY in connection with a Vendor's response shall be deemed to be public records subject to public inspection. However, certain exemptions to the public records law are statutorily provided for in Section 119.07, F.S. Section 119.07, F.S. provides an exemption from public records law for sealed bids, bids, or replies received by an agency pursuant to a competitive solicitation until such time as the agency provides notice of an intended decision or until 30 days after opening the bids, bids, or final replies, whichever is earlier.

THE CONTRACTOR SHALL COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES WITH RESPECT TO ALL PUBLIC RECORDS.

SPECIFICALLY, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL:

1. Keep and maintain public records required by the CITY to perform the service.
2. Upon request from the CITY's custodian of public records, provide the CITY with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.
3. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the contractor does not transfer the records to the public agency.
4. Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost, to the CITY all public records in possession of the contractor or keep and maintain public records required by the CITY to perform the service. If the contractor transfers all public records to the CITY upon completion of the contract, the contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the CITY, upon request from the CITY's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the CITY.
5. Request for Records; Noncompliance.—
 - (a) A request to inspect or copy public records relating to a CITY's contract for services must be made directly to the CITY. If the CITY does not possess the requested records, the CITY shall immediately notify the CONTRACTOR of the request, and the CONTRACTOR must provide the records to the CITY or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time.
 - (b) If a CONTRACTOR does not comply with the CITY's request for records, the CITY shall enforce the contract provisions in accordance with the contract.
 - (c) A CONTRACTOR who fails to provide the public records to the CITY within a reasonable time may be subject to penalties under s. 119.10.

2.11. INDEMNIFICATION:

CONTRACTOR shall at all times hereafter indemnify, hold harmless and, at the City Attorney's option, defend or pay for an attorney selected by the City Attorney to defend CITY, its officers, agents, servants, and employees from and against any and all causes of action, demands, claims, losses, liabilities and expenditures of any kind, including attorney fees, court costs, and expenses, caused or alleged to be caused by intentional or negligent act of, or omission of, CONTRACTOR, its employees, agents, servants, or officers, or accruing, resulting from, or related to the subject matter of this Contract including, without limitation, any and all claims, losses, liabilities, expenditures, demands or causes of action of any nature whatsoever resulting from injuries or damages sustained by any person or property. In the event any lawsuit or other proceeding is brought against CITY by reason of any such claim, cause of action

or demand, CONTRACTOR shall, upon written notice from CITY, resist and defend such lawsuit or proceeding by counsel satisfactory to CITY or, at CITY's option, pay for an attorney selected by City Attorney to defend CITY. The provisions and obligations of this section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this contract. To the extent considered necessary by the Contract Administrator and the City Attorney, any sums due CONTRACTOR under this Contract may be retained by CITY until all of CITY's claims for indemnification pursuant to this Contract have been settled or otherwise resolved; and any amount withheld shall not be subject to payment of interest by CITY. Nothing herein shall be deemed a waiver or limitation of any sovereign immunity provided by law or any limitation of the CITY's liability in any statute or as otherwise provided by law.

2.12. INSURANCE (Applicable if box checked):

- To ensure the indemnification obligation contained above, CONTRACTOR shall, at a minimum, provide, pay for, and maintain in force at all times during the term of this Contract (unless otherwise provided), the insurance coverages Article. Each insurance policy shall clearly identify the foregoing indemnification as insured.
- Such policy or policies shall be without any deductible amount unless otherwise noted in this Contract and shall be issued by approved companies of process may be made in Broward County, Florida.
- CONTRACTOR shall pay all deductible amounts, if any.
- CONTRACTOR shall specifically protect CITY by naming the City of Parkland and its Officers, Agents, Employees and Commission Members as additional insured under the Commercial Liability Policy as well as on any Excess Liability Policy coverage.
- Commercial Liability Insurance. A Commercial Liability Insurance Policy shall be provided which shall contain minimum limits of one million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury liability and property damage liability and shall contain minimum limits of two million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per aggregate. Coverage must be afforded on a form no more restrictive than the latest edition of the Commercial Liability Policy, without restrictive endorsements, as filed by the Insurance Services Office and must include:
 - Premises and/or operations.
 - Independent contractors.
 - Products and/or Completed Operations for contracts.

Broad Form Contractual Coverage applicable to this specific Contract, including any hold harmless and/or indemnification Contract.

Personal Injury Coverage with Employee and Contractual Exclusions removed, with minimum limits of coverage equal to those required for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability.

- Business Automobile Liability. Business Automobile Liability shall be provided with minimum limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence, combined single limit for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability. Coverage must be afforded on a form no more restrictive than the latest edition of the Business Automobile Liability policy, without restrictive endorsements, as filed by the Insurance Services Office, and must include:

- Owned Vehicles, if applicable.
- Hired and Non-Owned Vehicles, if applicable.
- Employers' Non-Ownership, if applicable.

- Workers' Compensation Insurance. Workers' Compensation insurance to apply for all employees in compliance with Chapter 440, Florida Statutes, as may be amended from time to time, the "Workers' Compensation Law" of the State of Florida, and all applicable federal laws. In addition, the policy (s) must include:

Employers' Liability with a limit of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) each accident.

If any operations are to be undertaken on or about navigable waters, coverage must be included for the U.S. Longshoremen & Harbor Workers Act and Jones Act. Insurance shall include in addition to any other requirements, coverage for class codes 0042, 9102, and 0106.

- Errors and Omissions Liability/ Professional Liability. Errors and Omissions Liability insurance Policy shall be provided which contains minimum coverage limits of five hundred thousand (\$ 500,000.00) each occurrence

- CONTRACTOR shall furnish to CITY's PURCHASING DEPARTMENT a Certificate of Insurance or endorsements evidencing the insurance coverage specified by this Article within seven (7) business days after notification of award of the Contract. The required Certificates of Insurance shall name the types of policies provided, refer specifically to this Contract, and state that such insurance is as required by this Contract. CONTRACTOR's failure to provide to CITY the Certificates of Insurance or endorsements evidencing the insurance coverage within seven (7) business days shall provide the basis for the termination of the Contract.

- The certificate provided for the City of Parkland must cite the City of Parkland as an additional insured. Thirty (30) days written notice must be provided to the CITY via Certified Mail in the event of cancellation. The CITY

shall receive current copies of the certificate of insurance.

- Coverage is not to cease and is to remain in force (subject to cancellation notice) until all performance required of CONTRACTOR is completed. All policies must be endorsed to provide CITY with at least thirty (30) days' notice of expiration, cancellation and/or restriction. If any of the insurance coverages will expire prior to the completion of the work, copies of renewal policies shall be furnished at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of their expiration.
- CITY reserves the right to review and revise any insurance requirements at the time of renewal or amendment of this Contract, including, but not limited to, deductibles, limits, coverage, and endorsements based on insurance market conditions affecting the availability or affordability of coverage, or changes in the scope of work or specifications that affect the applicability of coverage. If CONTRACTOR uses a subcontractor, CONTRACTOR shall ensure that subcontractor names CITY as an additional insured.

2.13. CITY ORDINANCE:

City Ordinance Sections 2-141 through 2-146 as adopted on November 20, 2019 (Ordinance No, 2019-008) applies to this solicitation.
