EXHIBIT 1 - STATEMENT OF WORK UPPER BASIN PRESSURE CLEANING AND WATER SEALING SERVICES

I. INTRODUCTION:

The St. Johns River Water Management District maintains public recreation sites and amenities throughout 18 counties in the state of Florida. These areas provide flood control, environmental protection, recreational opportunities to the public, and ingress/egress to District properties. Part of the regularly scheduled maintenance of recreation sites and amenities requires periodic pressure cleaning as well as water sealing of wood.

II. OBJECTIVES:

To provide a clean, safe, and healthy environment for the public, as well as District staff, and to preserve the appearance and structural integrity of each facility.

III. SCOPE OF SERVICES:

Contractor shall furnish all materials, using commercial grade high-pressure equipment, water and appropriate pressure washing solution for respective surfaces (concrete, wood, composite, etc..) and water seal to exposed wood at:

• Upper Basin Recreation Sites: The exterior and interior of restrooms, pavilions including picnic tables, BBQ grills, kiosks and concrete floors/slabs, weather shelters, observation tower, wood/concrete walkways, benches, and all information signs.

IV. TASK IDENTIFICATION:

Contractor Responsibilities;

- PRESSURE CLEANING:
 - Clean exterior and interior surfaces to remove graffiti, dirt, insect debris, algae, and animal/bird waste from the exterior and interior of restrooms pavilions including picnic tables, BBQ grills, kiosks and concrete floors/slabs, weather shelters, observation tower, wood/concrete walkways, benches, and all information signs at the following locations:
 - Three Forks Marsh Conservation Area, Tom Lawton Rec Pad: Two (2) restrooms, one (1) pavilion, one (1) entrance sign and one (1) kiosk, and all concrete pads, grills, picnic tables, and walkways
 - Three Forks Marsh Conservation Area, Engle/AIS Hammock property: one (1) pavilion, one (1) kiosk, picnic tables, and all concrete pad
 - Three Forks Marsh Conservation Area, (1) weather shelter "Willow Shelter" accessible by land
 - Three Forks Marsh Conservation Area, Kenansville Lake Parking, one (1) pavilion, picnic tables, concrete pad, and one (1) kiosk
 - River Lakes Conservation Area: One(1) Kiosk, one (1) observation tower "Mud Lake", two (2) Weather Shelters at "Oak Trees"

- Blue Cypress Marsh Conservation Area, Babcock Street Boat Ramp: One (1) restroom, one (1) pavilion, and all concrete pads, picnic tables and walkways
- Blue Cypress Marsh Conservation Area, Stick Marsh Boat Ramp: two (2) restrooms, two (2) pavilions, two (2) kiosks, One (1) concrete fish pier, one (1) entrance sign, all concrete pads, walkways, grills and benches
- Blue Cypress Marsh Conservation Area Farm Thirteen: one (1) weather shelter "M Levee Shelter", accessible by land
- Blue Cypress Marsh Conservation Area, 512 Recreational Area Boat Ramp; one (1) restroom, three (3) pavilions, one (1) kiosk, one (1) entrance sign, and all concrete pads, grills, picnic tables, and walkways
- Fort Drum Marsh Conservation Area: two (2) pavilions, one (1) kiosks, two (2) entrance signs and one (1) FWC sign, and all concrete pads, walkways, grills, picnic tables and benches
- Fellsmere Water Management Area: one (1) kiosk, one (1) restroom, and all concrete pads and walkways
- ✤ Micco Water Management Area: one (1) kiosk.

• WOOD SEALING:

- After the wood has been pressure cleaned and has thoroughly dried, seal all wood that is exposed to the elements at the pavilions, weather shelters, wooden benches, and observation tower with clear Thompson's Water Seal[®] (or equivalent product). The Three Forks Marsh Conservation Area Boy Scout Camp pavilion shall be sealed with Thompson's Water Seal[®] cedar blend.
- Contractor shall remove and properly dispose of all left over pressure cleaning materials and trash generated from the work
- Contractor is responsible for contracting the District Project Manager to perform a joint inspection of each site upon completion
- Contractor is responsible for any damage that may have been caused to District property.
- Demobilize from District property upon completion of the job

District Responsibilities:

- Provide access to District property for doing work described within this Statement of Work (SOW). A key or temporary lock combination shall be provided to Contractor for access to the project field sites
- Perform a joint inspection with Contractor of each site prior to, and upon completion of work.

V. TIMEFRAMES & DELVERABLES:

Contractor shall mobilize and initiate work within fourteen (14) days of issuance of Contract and shall be completed by September 30, 2020.

VI. **BUDGET:**

Contractor may submit invoices for completed projects no more frequently than bi-weekly.

- SJRWMD Palm Bay Service Center is located at 525 Community College Parkway SE, Palm Bay, Florida 32909
- Blue Cypress Marsh Conservation Area (Stick Marsh boat ramp). From Palm Bay or Fellsmere, Florida, take Babcock St. (CR 507) to Fellsmere Grade Road. Turn west on Fellsmere Grade Road, travel approximately six (6) miles to Blue Cypress Conservation Area
- Blue Cypress Marsh Conservation Area (512 Recreation Area boat ramp). Take Babcock Street (CR 507) south to (CR 512) turn right travel approximately eight (8) miles to 512 Recreation Area
- Three Forks Marsh Conservation Area. From Palm Bay, Florida, take Babcock Street (CR 507) to Malabar Road travel west eight (8) miles to Three Forks Marsh Conservation Area
- Fort Drum Marsh Conservation Area. From Palm Bay, Florida, take Babcock Street (CR 507) to SR-60 travel west eight (8) miles to Fort Drum Marsh Conservation Area
- River Lakes Conservation Area take I-95 from Palm Bay north to Wickham Road (CR 509) Exit turn left onto Wickham Road go approx. six (6) miles to Moccasin Island Parking Area
- Micco Water Management Area, take Babcock south to Micco Road, East on Micco Road to Fleming Grant Road, South on Fleming Grant 1.35 miles to Micco Parking Area
- Kenansville Lake take 441 South from Hwy 192 in Holopaw approx. 20 miles to Fellsmere Road, East on Fellsmere Road 11.5 miles to Kenansville Lake Parking Area




EXHIBIT 4 — INSURANCE

Contractor shall acquire and maintain until completion of the Work the insurance coverage listed below, which constitutes primary coverage. Contractor shall not commence the Work until the District receives and approves Certificates of Insurance documenting required coverage. Contractor's General Liability policy shall name the St. Johns River Water Management District (the "District") as Additional Insured. All required policies shall include: (1) endorsement that waives any right of subrogation against the District for any policy of insurance provided under this requirement or under any state or federal worker's compensation or employer's liability act; (2) endorsement to give the District no less than 30 days' notice in the event of cancellation or material change. Certificates of Insurance must be accompanied by copies of the requested endorsements.

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions above \$100,000 must be declared to and approved by the District. Approval will not be unreasonably withheld. Contractor is responsible for any deductible or self-insured retention. Insurance must be placed with insurers having an A.M. Best rating of A-V or greater. District receipt of insurance certificates providing less than the required coverage does not waive these insurance requirements.

- (a) Workers' Compensation Insurance. Workers' compensation and employer's liability coverage, including maritime worker's compensation, if applicable, in not less than the minimum limits required by Florida law. If an exemption from workers' compensation is declared, an exemption letter issued by Florida Department of Financial Services, Division of Workers' Compensation, shall be submitted to the District.
- (b) General Liability. Commercial General Liability Insurance on an "Occurrence Basis," with limits of liability not less than \$500,000 per occurrence and/or aggregate combined single limit, personal injury, bodily injury, and property damage. Coverage shall include: (1) contractual liability, (2) products and completed operations, (3) independent contractors, and (4) broad form property damage. Extensions shall be added or exclusions deleted to provide the necessary coverage. "Claims made" coverage will be accepted only after verification that "occurrence" coverage is not available.
- (c) Automobile Liability. Minimum requirements per Florida law.






