## AGREEMENT BETWEEN

# U.S. ARMY 6<sup>TH</sup> RANGER TRAINING BATTALION

#### **AND**

### OKALOOSA COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Rangers have established a military training program for military Emergency Medical Technicians, hereinafter referred to as "trainees," enrolled therein to participate in field learning experiences as set forth in the program curriculum; and

WHEREAS, Okaloosa County's Emergency Medical Services ("OCEMS"), is engaged in certain field activities in which trainees enrolled in the above military program, if allowed to participate in field patient care, can obtain a part of their required field/clinical learning experiences; and

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the Rangers that trainees enrolled in the military program be permitted to participate in OCEMS field patient care to obtain a part of their required field/clinical learning experiences; and

WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of OCEMS to allow trainees enrolled in the above military program to participate in OCEMS field patient care thereby contributing to the educational preparation of a future supply of health care professionals,

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of these premises and other good and valuable considerations, the Rangers and OCEMS agree and covenant each with the other as follows:

CONTRACT: EMT TRAINING CONTRACT NO.: C00-0422-ESI-22 USA 6TH RANGER BATTALION EXPIRES: INDEFINITE

#### 1. OCEMS shall:

- a. Allow trainees to participate in EMS field patient care to obtain a part of their required field/clinical learning experience.
- b. Coordinate with the Rangers to prevent conflict of schedules and activities during field learning experience and designate an appropriate coordinating officer for this purpose. This coordination involves planning with the faculty/staff of the Rangers, the assignment of trainees to field units, including attendance at selected conferences and in-service programs conducted by OCEMS.
- c. Accept responsibility for field teaching along with guidance and supervision of field experiences for the trainees with the understanding that a Ranger instructor will be at OCEMS at regular intervals and shall be readily available for contact.

## 2. The Rangers shall:

- a. Prior to the beginning of training periods, provide the names of trainees eligible to be assigned, the dates and hours assignment is desired, and a list of skills allowed to practice.
- b. Provide faculty/staff members to OCEMS at regular intervals for supervision of trainees' field experiences. While not at the premises at all times, said faculty shall be readily available for contact.
- c. Provide supervising faculty/staff members to plan, with OCEMS coordinating officer, the assignments that may be assumed by the trainees during their field learning experiences at OCEMS, and attendance at selected conferences or in-service programs conducted by OCEMS.
- d. Provide the materials and maintain personnel records/reports necessary for the conduct and documentation of trainees' field learning experiences.
- e. Enforce such rules and regulations governing the trainees, their supervisors, and the conduct of each as may be promulgated by the Director of OCEMS.
- f. Be responsible for health examinations and such other medical examinations and protective measures as OCEMS may deem necessary.
- g. Have each trainee participating in OCEMS field patient care furnish the County with a form under the terms of which such trainees assume the risk for any injuries sustained while participating in field patient care.

- h. Require that materials compiled or published by trainees or the Rangers relative to their training and field experiences received at OCEMS, or arising from their participation in OCEMS field patient care, shall clearly state the opinions or assertions contained therein are those of the writer and are not to be construed as official or reflecting the views and opinions of the County, nor should any such materials or publications infringe on, violate, or compromise the patient's right to privacy.
- 3. It is further understood and agreed that, upon notice from the Director of OCEMS that if continued participation by a student is not desirable, the Rangers shall withdraw such trainee from participation in field learning experiences at OCEMS.
- 4. Statement of Term. The term of this agreement will be for an indefinite period beginning with the signing date of this agreement.
- 5. Termination of this agreement may be effected by either the Rangers or the County upon thirty (30) days written notice mailed or delivered to the party to whom notice is being given, at the addresses set forth below:
