# AGREEMENT NO. 18-213-9 AMENDMENT NUMBER 4

This Amendment Number 4 is made on the date of execution by the County and amends Agreement Number 18-213-9 ("Main Agreement") dated June 25, 2019, between Future Systems, Inc. ("Contractor") and the County Board of Arlington County, Virginia ("County").

The County and the Contractor agree to amend the main contract called for under the Main Agreement as follows:

#### Section 2: Scope of Work

The Contractor shall provide four bay shelters, eight bay shelters in accordance with the signed and sealed drawings dated 10/29/2021 and calculations dated 11/29/2021, flag poles and benches per the approved drawings dated 10/28/2021 and calculations dated 11/29/2021 with pricing and a milestone delivery schedule for a modified Future Systems Type II Integra bus shelter that includes:

- 1. 316 non-directional finished stainless-steel frame and supports with adjustable base shoes and Luminator hanging brackets
- 2. Glass panel roof
- 3. Glass windscreen panels
- 4. Interior LED lighting fixtures, handholes and raceways for the provision of wiring the shelters.
  - a. Provide mounting brackets for installing Luminator Real Time Passenger Information (RTPI) Type A2 real time LED signs (provided by others) on the shelter structure.
     Provide handholes and raceways to internally run electrical and/or fiber connections to the display. Wiring to be done by others.
- 5. 316 non-directional finished stainless-steel station flag pole including brackets for owner provided flag sign.
- 6. Double-sided Map Case to be incorporated on a rear or side glass windscreen panel.
- 7. Area(s) to include station name within the shelter(s).
- 8. 316 stainless steel benches with custom perforated directionally polished seat pans and non-directional polished seat frame with intermediate arm rests.
- 9. Modified shelters shall be provided in two (2) module sizes: 4 Bay (14'-9" L x 6'-3" W and 8 Bay (28'-6" L x 6'-3" W) Note some stations will require 2 8 Bay assemblies (Extended Stations) with 4' W or 2' W side windscreens mounted to the gantry post on each end of the shelter. In locations where the platform area is constrained, the side windscreens may not be required.

- 10. All shelters and amenities shall comply with the accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- 11. The station shelters and amenities shall be bolt down. The recommended fasteners and concrete thickness for the fasteners will be installed and shall be included with the design (anchors to be provided by others).
- 12. Include leaf guards on gutters
- 13. Shelters shall meet Buy America requirements.
- 14. Onsite installation instruction

#### Deliverables:

- 1. Meeting minutes for milestone events 1 and 4.
- 2. Printed detailed installation instructions.
- 3. On site installation instruction
- 4. Six (8) bay shelters with wide side windscreens.
- 5. Two (2) four bay shelters with wide side windscreens.
- 6. Twenty (20) three seat benches.
- 7. Eight (8) flag signs.
- 8. Price Schedule for the two module configurations and amenities selected by the County.
- 9. Production & Delivery schedule.

The County intends to issue additional Purchase Orders for the remaining fifteen stations in phases as the station platforms become available for shelter installation.

#### Section 4: Term of the Work

The Term for of the work to be performed shall be December 24, 2021 through May 12, 2022 pending the Notice to Proceed and a County valid Purchase Order.

#### Section 6: Contract Amount

This is a Fixed-Priced Contract Amendment in the Not-To-Exceed amount of \$1,105,111.30 for this portion of the work (See Exhibit A). Additional work for the project shall not be authorized without an amendment to the original Contract executed by the Purchasing Agent.

## Added section: Contract Price Adjustments

The Contract Amount/unit price(s) will remain firm. To request a price adjustment, the Contractor or the County must submit a written request to the other party not less than 60 days before the Price Adjustment Date. Adjustments to the Contract Amount/unit price(s) will not exceed the percentage of change in the Producer Price Index (PPI).

Any Contract Amount/unit price(s) that result from this provision will become effective the day after the Price Adjustment Date and will be binding for the set period agreed upon by the parties.

All other terms remain in effect.

SUBJECT:	Columbia Pike Transit Stations (MA36), Future Systems Integra Shelter Fabrication and Delivery

### **Background:**

The County awarded Contract #18-213-9 to Future Systems, Inc. (FSI) as a result of fair and open competition utilizing the County's prescribed best value procurement method for fabrication/manufacturing delivery of twenty-three (23) Transit Stations Structures and amenities for the Columbia Pike Corridor.

Arlington County issued a fabrication and delivery Scope of Work to Future Systems on December 12, 2021. Future Systems provided their modified drawings on October 29, 2021and calculations to their standard Integra shelters on November 29, 2021. The County and Future Systems agreed on a timeline to fabricate and deliver the first eight shelters and amenities within one hundred-forty (140) calendar days from the date of the Notice to Proceed and issuance of the Purchase Order.

## **Justification:**

Future Systems provided a revised proposal for fabrication and delivery of the modified Integra shelters and amenities defined in the mutually agreed Scope of Work on December 7, 2021 in the amount of \$1,105,111.30.

The County prepared an Independent Cost Estimate (ICE) for fabricating and delivering modified Integra shelters and amenities for the first eight station locations that totaled \$1,042,500. The Future Systems proposal is within 6% of ICE estimate.

Given the above, the proposed cost of \$1,105,111,30 is found to be fair and reasonable.

Therefore, I hereby determine, based upon the findings above:

- (a) Funds are available,
- (b) The increase to the amount Future Systems contract fulfills an existing need of Arlington County,
- (c) The price that was submitted is fair and reasonable.
